HOKIES, BEARCATS MEET FOR THE FIRST TIME

- Despite never matching up before in their histories, the programs do share a connection in the form of a student-athlete who has suited up for both programs, senior attacker Julia Byrne.
- Byrne played for Cincinnatti from 2016-18 playing in 28 games and scoring 12 points (6 goals and 6 assists). While at Cincinnatti, Byrne was a team captain and three-time Big East Honor Roll nominee, a SAAC rep, AAC rep and OneTeam representative.

PETTY PICKING UP WHERE SHE LEFT OFF

- Sophomore Paige Petty, the Hokies' leading scorer has tallied back-to-back hat tricks in the Hokies' losses to ranked opposition.
- She scored three times against JMU and lead the Hokies with four tallies in against Colorado.
- The midfielder has 8 goals on the season to go with one assist. She has also tallied 11 draw controls, 12 ground balls and caused 5 turnovers.

YOUNG HOKIES GETTING PLENTY ON EXPERIENCE EARLY IN 2019

- In the season opening victory over Bucknell, six Hokies earned their first career starts, including two freshmen.
- So far in this young 2019 season eight Hokies have gotten their first starts.
- In goal, Morgan Berman, a sophomore has gotten off to a strong start, despite the results, saving seven shots against JMU and a new career best 14 in the effort against Colorado.

GRAD STUDENTS RETURN TO LINEUP

- The Hokies' lineup will be bolstered by the return of two fifth year players, midfielder Mary Claire Byrne and attacker Emma Harden.
- Both student-athletes were chosen by their teammates as captains for the 2019 season, the third consecutive selection for Byrne.

CAPTAINS SET TO LEAD

- A quartet of upperclassmen have been named captains by their peers; Mary Claire Byrne, Emma Harden, Kelci O'Donnell and Julia Bolte.
- The group has combined to play 137 games played in a Virginia Tech uniform, and accounted for 166 career points.
- Byrne and Harden are fifth year players, O'Donnell is a senior and Bolte, a junior is in her second season in Blacksburg after playing her freshman year at Oregon.

CROOKS, HOKIES OUT TO A FLYING START IN 2019

- Sophomore Emma Crooks led the Hokies with four goals in their season opening victory on Saturday. It was her third career hat trick
- The midfielder also added an assist, coralled three draws and forced two turnovers in the Hokies' 14-4 win over Bucknell.

SPREADING THE WEALTH

- Seven Hokies scored goals against Bucknell led by Crooks' four.
- A quartet of players each had two goals; Sarah Lubnow, Mary Claire Byrne Goodwin and Grace Nelson. Paige Petty and Emma Harden each scored once.
- Tech had five assists on their 14 goals.

In just two seasons in Blacksburg, John Sung has taken the Virginia Tech lacrosse program to new heights, including its first appearance in the NCAA tournament in 2018 as the Hokies advanced into the Second Round.

Sung's Hokies have reset records for wins in a season, ACC wins, goals against average, point scored and goals scored in a single season and Sung, a former goalie, helped Meagh Graham set the program record for lowest goals against average in a season at 9.64 during the 2017 campaign.

In his first season in Blacksburg, Sung engineered the best turnaround in program history winning six more games than the previous season. In 2017, the Hokies won 11 games, equaling the tally of the 1999 squad and reaching double figure wins for the first time since 2012. The team set program records in several categories including ACC wins in a season, goals scored, and points scored.

Hired on May 27, 2016, Sung joined Virginia Tech after building the Winthrop University program from scratch beginning in May of 2011. He oversaw the program's rapid ascent as a regional powerhouse after beginning competition in 2013. In the program's third season, Sung led Winthrop to a 17-4 record, as the Eagles qualified for the NCAA Tournament after winning both the Big South regular-season and tournament titles. In 2016, Winthrop went 20-3, winning the Big South Tournament championship and advancing to another NCAA Tournament. The 2016 season marked the team's second consecutive Big South regular-season and tournament titles.

The 2015 and 2016 Big South Coach of the Year, Sung formerly was the chair of the NCAA Division I Lacrosse Committee and also serves on the U.S. Lacrosse Convention Education Committee. His 2015 squad set Big South single-season records for points, goals (314), free-position goals (67), shots (633), shots on goal (459), ground balls (384), draw controls (312), and caused turnovers (213). In 2016, Winthrop scored 301 goals, including 58 free-position goals. The Eagles set Big South single-season marks for shots (662), ground balls (434), and caused turnovers (266).

In addition to compiling a 54-26 overall record at Winthrop, Sung led the Haudenosaunee Nation to the quarterfinals of the 2013 Federation of International Lacrosse World Cup held in Canada. The team finished in seventh place out of a total of 19 teams. He also coached the team in the 2009 Federation of International Lacrosse in the Czech Republic.

Sung's ascent as an NCAA coach began at Division III Adrian College in Michigan, where he started the program from the ground up and compiled a 46-19 overall record. His 2011 squad started the season 1-4 before registering 15 consecutive victories to earn a berth in the NCAA Division III Tournament. After posting a 6-7 overall record in its first season in 2008, the program went 10-4 in 2009, 14-3 in 2010 and 16-5 in 2011.

Before beginning the program at Adrian College, Sung spent five years as the assistant women's club lacrosse coach at the University of Michigan, setting the groundwork for that program to eventually become a varsity sport in the Big Ten. The Wolverines accumulated a 93-22 record during this tenure.

A longtime trainer of goalies, Sung has held various coaching positions with Birmingham Seaholm High School and the Detroit Lacrosse Club. He has been the assistant director of the Great Lakes Women's Lacrosse Camp since 1997. In addition to his work at various levels in the lacrosse community, Sung has a wealth of sales and management experience in the private sector.

Sung was the starting goalkeeper of the Oakland University lacrosse team in 1997 and 1998 and was also a two-year captain. He was also member of two International Cup U16 championship teams in 1993 and 1994. He completed his degree in Bachelor of Arts degree in communications from Oakland in 2007.

Sung, who resides in Blacksburg with his wife Tina, has three stepsons; Darek, Devin and Zachary, and a daughter, Abby.

25 YEARS OF LACROSSE AT VIRGINIA TECH

- The 2019 season represents the 25th Anniversary of the first season of varsity lacrosse at Virginia Tech. The inaugural year, 1995, the Hokies went 2-7 with wins over Hollis and Monmouth.
- The program is celebrating with a 25th Anniversary event on Saturday, Feb. 9 by inviting alums of the program to campus to cheer on the team in their season opener and then having a dinner that evening.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

- The Hokies graduated the program's most successful class in 2018, including most of the starters on the defensive side of the field and All-ACC goalie Meagh Graham.
- The 2019 roster features 12 freshmen in the class of '22.

THEY COME FROM ALL OVER

- Since Coach Sung assumed head coaching duties in 2016, the Hokies have widened their recruiting footprint. While most Hokies hail from Virginia, and Maryland, some like Carly Goetz (Minnesota), Lauren Hayes (New Hampshire) and Morgan Berman (Georgia) have traveled further to be a part of Hokie Nation.

A FAMILY AFFAIR

- This season's roster features two sets of sisters, the Byrnes and the Beaches.
- Captain MC Byrne has been a staple of the program over the past few years in the midfield. She is joined for her final year by younger sister Julia, a transfer from the University of Cincinnati. Julia is a senior attacker majoring in marketing.
- The Beach sisters are junior Payton and freshman Gabby from Grasonville, Maryland. Payton has played in five career games, scoring one goal, in a win over Radford in 2017.

WHERE HAVE WE HEARD THAT NAME BEFORE?

- Another unique aspect about the Hokies is the number of players with similar names.
- The 2019 squad features two 'MC's', Mary Claire Byrne and Mary Clare McCarthy.
- The Hokies have four players named Emma; Harden (number 20), Crooks (31), Day (39) and Hodges (41).
- Tech has two Julia's; Bolte (3) and Byrne (10).
- There is also the trio Sarah Lubnow (13), Sarah Vanadia (35) and Sara Goodwin (23).

MC BYRNE CLIMBING THE CHARTS

- Byrne is climbing the charts in terms of career caused turnovers. Her 69 is good for fifth all-time in Tech history. Her 2017 and 2018 season and third and fourth respectively for an individual season with 37 and 32 caused turnovers.

HOKIES LOOK TO END DROUGHTS

- Tech will host two perennial powers James Madison and North Carolina this season with whom the Hokies have long losing streaks against. Against JMU, the defending national champs Tech is 0-16 all-time. North Carolina has won each of the programs' 26 meetings, including all three matchups in 2018.
