- The consensus 2016 ACC Coach of the Year, Fuente was also named the top first-year FBS head coach in the nation by the Football Writers Association of America, sharing that honor with USC's Clay Helton.
- Tech finished the 2016 season ranked No. 16 in both the AP Poll and the Coaches Poll, marking the highest final mark for the Hokies since 2010 (No. 16 AP, No. 15 Coaches).
- · Virginia Tech, Penn State, Colorado, West Virginia and Western Michigan all finished in the AP Top 25 after getting zero votes in the AP Preseason Poll.
- . Tech's 10 wins were the team's most since 2011 and the most ever by a first-year Virginia Tech head coach, surpassing the previous mark of nine wins by C.P. Miles in 1905

Named Virginia Tech's head coach on Nov. 29, 2015 after orchestrating one of the more impressive program resurrections in recent college football history at Memphis.

- In three seasons under Fuente, the Hokies have gone 25-15 with three bowl game appearances and winning an ACC Coastal Division title in 2016. Fuente's 25 victories at Virginia Tech through three seasons are the most in program history. His 25 wins in just 40 games rank third in program history and are the fewest games needed to reach that plateau since B.C. Cubbage registered 25 victories in 35 games between 1921 and 1925.
- In 2018, despite the Hokies having the youngest defensive two-deep in the ACC and losing starting QB Josh Jackson to a season-ending injury only three games into the season, Fuente led the Hokies to their 26th consecutive bowl game - the longest active streak in the nation and the third longest in college football history.
- Tech also retained possession of the Commonwealth Cup after defeating in-state rival Virginia for a 15th consecutive season.
- Tech's tradition of special teams excellence continued in 2018 as the Hokies returned two blocked punts for touchdowns for the first time since 1998. Meanwhile, the Hokies allowed 350 combined punt/kickoff return yards, the sixth-lowest total in the FBS.
- Under the tutelage of Fuente and offensive coordinator Brad Cornelsen, redshirt junior QB Ryan Willis finished the regular season with 22 touchdown passes, making him the third different Virginia Tech quarterback in the Fuente Era to throw 20 or more touchdowns in a season; joining Jerod Evans (29 in 2016) and Jackson (20 in 2017)
- Tech also improved to 22-1 during Fuente's tenure when leading at halftime.
- With 19 wins in his first two seasons at Tech, Fuente owned more victories than every Tech coach has accumulated in his first three seasons with the exception of B.C. Cubbage, who guided the program to 21 victories from 1921-23.
- The Hokies finished back-to-back seasons in the final AP Poll in 2016-17 for the first time since 2010-11. The Hokies will be seeking to conclude three straight seasons in the AP Top 25 for the first time since doing it eight consecutive years under Frank Beamer (2004-11).
- Tech concluded the 2017 season with a 9-4 mark, finishing the year No. 24 in the AP Top 25 and No. 25 in the Amway USA Today Coaches Poll.

- The famed Virginia Tech Lunch Pail has come to symbolize the blue-collar approach of the Hokies' defense under longtime defensive coordinate Bud Foster.
- In 1995, Foster served as co-defensive coordinator with Rod Sharpless, whose mother-in-law found the original Lunch Pail in Mercerville, New Jersey. The pail once belonged to a coal miner and after a record-setting defensive season, the Lunch Pail became an iconic part of Hokies' lore.
- The Pail travels wherever the Hokies go and its care is only entrusted to a defensive leader.
- Before the start of every season, a signed mission statement from the defense is placed in The Pail. Then every week, unit goals, team goals and keys to success are placed in The Pail, plus the turf from any road victories.
- Since 2007, The Pail has also contained the names of the 32 fallen Hokies taken in the April 16 tragedy.
- Darryl Tapp is the only player who has ever earned lifetime possession of an incarnation of The Pail from Foster.

• Even though the namesake is no longer the big whistle in Blacksburg, Virginia Tech's BeamerBall philosophy has not waned under third-year head coach Justin Fuente.

- There have been 150 non-offensive touchdowns and 145 blocked kicks by Virginia Tech since Frank Beamer's first season as head coach in 1987.
- Under Fuente, the Hokies have scored 10 non-offensive touchdowns three punt return touchdowns, two fumble return touchdowns, two interception return touchdowns, two blocked punt return touchdowns and one blocked field goal return touchdown.
- Since Fuente's hiring, the Hokies are tied for eighth in Power Five with seven combined punt return, interception return and fumble return touchdowns.
- The Hokies have blocked more kicks over the last three seasons under Fuente (11) than the previous five seasons combined (9).



BEAMER NAMED TO COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

 Former Virginia Tech head coach Frank Beamer was named College Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2018 in his initial year of eligibility.
 The induction is set for Dec. 4 in New York City.

• The winningest coach in Virginia Tech history, Beamer's 280 victories rank sixth overall in FBS history and are the 13th most by a college football coach at any NCAA division.

• He led the Hokies to their first ever national title game appearance as part of an impressive streak of 23 consecutive bowl berths in his final 23 seasons.

• Under Beamer, the Hokies posted five top-10 finishes and became one of only six programs in college football history to go to a bowl game in at least 20-straight seasons.

• A five-time conference Coach of the Year, Beamer won three BIG EAST titles and added four ACC titles in five conference championship game appearances.

• A monument of Beamer was unveiled at Moody Plaza prior to the Notre Dame game on Oct. 6. The naming of the Beamer-Lawson Indoor Practice Facility was also approved on Oct. 6.

THE GENESIS OF "BIG PLAY" TRÉ

 In 2018, freshman WR Tré Turner turned into a key target when the Hokies needed a "money play" - a play resulting in a first down or a touchdown - and he even got his first taste of BeamerBall against Virginia (11/23/18).

• After making an acrobatic, one-handed touchdown catch in the first quarter against UVA, Turner blocked his first career punt on the next UVA possession that was recovered in the end zone for a touchdown.

• His performance against UVA earned him the honor of wearing Frank Beamer's No. 25 vs. Marshall, where he turned in a career-high 99 receiving yards on three catches and a 45-yard TD reception.

• Of Turner's 25 career receptions, 17 have gone for a first down and three have been touchdowns.

• Turner's first eight catches of his career went for first downs.

• His 20.6 yards per reception finished third among FBS true freshmen in 2018.

LANE STADIUM - HOME OF THE HOKIES

Rising high into the mountainous sky of the New River Valley, Virginia Tech's Lane Stadium enters its 53rd year of football competition in 2017. The Tech football team has enjoyed over two decades of success, going to 24 straight bowl games and winning 10 or more games eight straight seasons from 2004-11. A big part of that success is the home-field advantage the Hokies enjoy at Lane Stadium/Worsham Field.

Sitting at roughly 2,057 feet above sea level, the stadium is the second-highest among all FBS schools in the eastern United States, trailing only Appalachian State (3,300). Completed in 1965, Lane Stadium/Worsham Field has gone through numerous changes, renovations and additions. But through it all, it has always been regarded as one of the finest places to watch – and toughest places for opponents to play – a college football game.

THE HOKIE STONE

Before each home football game, Virginia Tech football players and coaching staff enter Lane Stadium through a tunnel. On the stadium-side entrance to Worsham Field, they pass beneath a Hokie Stone, which they touch for good luck and is flanked by these words: "For those who have passed. For those to come ... Reach for Excellence.

ENTER SANDMAN

The history behind Virginia Tech's use of Metallica's "Enter Sandman" started during the 2000 season. That summer, Tech added a new scoreboard to Lane Stadium and the athletics marketing team decided to use the song for an entrance video. The group considered "Welcome to the Jungle" by Guns N' Roses and "Sirius" by the Alan Parsons Project before settling on "Enter Sandman." As the song played on one chilly evening prior to the team's entrance, members of the Marching Virginians began to jump up and down in rhythm in an effort to stay warm. The Lane Stadium crowd followed suit and the jumping hasn't stopped since.
