HOKIES HEAD TO NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

- No. 13 Virginia Tech's nine qualifiers will head to Pittsburgh this week for the 2019 NCAA Championships from March 21-23 inside PPG Paints Arena.
- The ESPN family of networks will have complete coverage of the championships as every mat and every match will be streamed on WatchESPN, the morning sessions will be broadcast on ESPNU and the evening sessions will be broadcast on ESPN.
- Fellow ACC program Pitt is the host institution for the championships, which is being held in the Steel City for the first time since 1957.
- Tech will send nine wrestlers to the national tournament in back-to-back seasons for the first time in program history.
- Among the qualifiers is redshirt senior Zack Zavatsky, who is one only 14 four-time NCAA qualifiers in program history.
- The Hokies are coming off of a second-place finish at the ACC Championship in Blacksburg where they came away with three ACC champions, a second-place finisher and five third placers.
- Redshirt freshman Mekhi Lewis (165), redshirt junior David McFadden (174) and Zavatsky all won titles, giving the Hokies three or more conference champions for the third-straight season.
- 2018-19 marked the first season since 2011-12 where Virginia Tech to win either an ACC Dual Meet Championship or an ACC Championship.

- The Hokies have had three or more All-Americans at the last six national tournaments, only Iowa, Penn State, Cornell and Oklahoma State have done the same.
- Tech has had at least one All-American over the last seven years, an active streak that ranks 11th in the nation.
- After only producing seven All-Americans between 1940 and 2009, The Hokies' 28 All-American medals this decade ranks eighth in the country.

TECH TIDBITS: NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

- Redshirt senior Ryan Blee, an NCAA qualifier for the second consecutive season, will be the lone North Dakota native competing at this year's NCAA Championships.
- Freshman Mitch Moore has the second-most falls (9) among the qualifiers at 141 pounds, trailing only Mizzou's Jaydin Eierman's 16 pins.
- Mekhi Lewis' eight major decisions ranks fifth among 165-pound qualifiers.
- The Hokies are one of eight programs in this year's field with nine NCAA qualifiers.
- Tech has three four-time NCAA qualifiers in Zack Zavatsky, Tom Sleigh and Billy Miller, a total that ranks third among teams in the field this season.
- The ACC will have 41 wrestlers competing at nationals this year, tying a league record set last season.

TECH'S RECENT SUCCESS AT NCAAs

- Thanks in part to head coach Tony Robie, Virginia Tech has become a mainstay in the top 10 at the NCAA Championships over the last six years.
- The Hokies are in search of their seventh-consecutive top 10 finish at the NCAA Championships.
- Tech has also had a long run of success this decade of getting wrestlers on the podium.

3 PA NATIVES RETURN HOME

- Three of Virginia Tech's nine qualifiers are Pennsylvania natives in Korbin Myers (Boiling Springs), Tom Sleigh (DuBois) and Zack Zavatsky (Latrobe)
- Two of them, Sleigh and Zavatsky, will close out their careers in their home state.
- Zavatsky's hometown of Latrobe is 50 minutes away from the Steel City.

TECH COACHES BOAST NCAA CRED

- When the Hokies hit the mats this week in Pittsburgh, they'll have experienced coaches in their corner that have wrestled and coached on the biggest stages at the tournament.
- Of Tech's four coaches, three have wrestled in an NCAA final – Tony Robie (1997, 158 pounds), Jared Frayer (2002, 149), Devin Carter (2014, 141).
- There are 10 All-American honors between the four coaches with Carter and Ty Walz leading the way with three a piece.
- Robie has helped lead the Hokies to six-consecutive top 10 finishes at the NCAA Championships, including a fourth-place finish as associate head coach in 2016.
- Frayer was on coaching staffs at Wisconsin that led the Badgers to a fourth-place finish in 2010 and a 10th-place finish in 2011.

ZAVATSKY WINS NO. 100

- Zack Zavatsky's 18-9 major decision over Duke's Kaden Russell on Feb. 1 marked his 100th career victory.
- Zavatsky is the 12th Virginia Tech wrestler to eclipse the 100-win plateau and he currently ranked 12th on the program's all-time wins list.
- 46 of Zavatsky's 100 wins have gone for bonus points.
- The Latrobe, Pa., native is a two-time ACC champion, a three-time NCAA qualifier and was an All-American in 2018 who placed sixth in the country at 184.

ALL HE DOES IS PIN!

- Mitch Moore's win by fall over Duke's Josh Finesilver 45 seconds into the bout on Feb. 1 was the freshman's team-best ninth pin of the season.
- Seven of Moore's nine pins this year have come in the first period, with his fastest fall coming at 17 seconds against Franklin & Marshall's Patrick Quinlan on Jan. 5.
- With four duals and the postseason still to come, Moore is one more fall away from tying Bill Pfeffer (1979-80) and Jarrod Garnett (2008-09) for 10th in single season pins.
- Moore's nine falls are the most in a single season since Devin Carter registered 11 pins in 2011-12.

KORBIN NAMED ACC WRESTLER OF THE WEEK

- Korbin Myers was named ACC Wrestler of the Week on Tuesday after winning both of his matches in a 2-0 week for the Hokies.
- In his match against Phillippi, Myers led 3-2 late in the third period. Phillippi accumulated riding time of over a minute, which would have deadlocked the score 3-3 at the end of regulation. But in the final seconds, Myers scored two points on a reversal that extended his lead to 5-2. That made the riding point moot, as Myers' late moved sealed the 5-3 upset decision.
- Myers then went on to defeat Lehigh's Brandon Paetzell with a workmanlike 4-1 decision on Jan. 27.
- Myers wasn't scored on once in 14 minutes of mat time.

HOKIES WIN VA. DUALS TITLE

- Virginia Tech went 3-0 with wins over Chattanooga, Old Dominion and Virginia to win the 2019 Virginia Duals National College Division title.
- The Hokies have won four Virginia Duals titles over the last six years and two in the last three.
- Tech improved to 3-0 all-time against the 'Hoos in finals at the Virginia Duals.

- In 30 bouts at the Duals, Tech went 26-4 with 12 bonus point wins.

LaPRADE NAMED ACC WRESTLER OF THE WEEK

- Virginia Tech redshirt sophomore B.C. LaPrade was named ACC Wrestler of the Week on Jan. 15 after going 3-0 at the Virginia Duals.
- LaPrade posted three wins in leading the No. 13 Hokies to the team title at last weekend's Virginia Duals, including a win over sixth-ranked Larry Early of Old Dominion and a first-period pin of Virginia's Jake Keating.
- LaPrade was only taken down twice in three matches at the Duals. LaPrade improved to 11-4 overall and 6-1 in duals following last weekend's action. He also entered FloWrestling's 157-pound rankings this week at No. 16.

CARTER JOINS VT STAFF

- Head coach Tony Robie announced on Jan. 10 that Hokie legend Devin Carter was added to the Virginia Tech coaching staff as a volunteer assistant.
- Carter was a four-time ACC champion, a three-time All-American and a national finalist at 141 pounds for the Hokies in 2014.
- He's currently on track to earn his PhD in industrial/organizational psychology from Virginia Tech in May.
- A native of Christiansburg, Carter re-wrote the record book at Virginia Tech. He won 121 career matches with 38 pins and became the school's first NCAA finalist when he advanced to the final match at the 2014 Championships. Carter was the first three-time All-American in program history and his 19 NCAA Champions

5 HOKIES PLACE AT THE SCUFFLE

- Five Virginia Tech wrestlers placed and redshirt senior Tom Sleigh earned his 100th career win at the Southern Scuffle in Chattanooga, Tenn., Jan. 2.
- Sleigh and redshirt junior David McFadden (174) both placed third at their weights while redshirt senior Billy Miller (285) finished in sixth place at heavyweight.
- Competing unattached for the Hokies, sophomore Hunter Bolen (184) went 5-1 en route to a second-place finish and freshman Collin Gerardi (133) placed seventh.
- The 12th-ranked Hokies finished in ninth place in the team race with 46.5 points.
- Bolen defeated Oklahoma State's Jacobe Smith, 3-1, Binghamton's Lou Deprez, 3-2, and wrestled a tight match with third-ranked Shakur Rasheed of Penn State in the finals where he dropped a 4-1 decision.

3 HOKIES PLACE AT CLIFF KEEN

- Competing in the nation's toughest tournament outside of the NCAA Championships, No. 13 Virginia Tech had three wrestlers place at the Cliff Keen Invitational.
- Redshirt freshman Mekhi Lewis made a run to the finals at 165 pounds but was defeated by 10th-ranked Isaiah White of Nebraska by decision, 2-0.
- His second-place finish was the highest for a Tech individual followed by redshirt junior Zack Zavatsky's fourth place finish at 184 and redshirt senior Tom Sleigh's seventh place finish at 197.
- The Hokies finished in a tie for 11th in the team standings with 84.5 points.

- Virginia Tech head coach Tony Robie is in his second season leading the Hokie wrestling program.
- 2018-19 was Robie's 13th season in Blacksburg; two years as head coach and 11 years as associate head coach under Kevin Dresser.
- In his first season leading the program, Robie continued Virginia Tech wrestling's run of success as the Hokies won its second consecutive ACC Championship and placed eighth at the NCAA Championships.
- Robie became the first ACC wrestling coach in history to guide his team to ACC championships in his first two seasons.
- With Robie on staff, Virginia Tech has now won four ACC titles over the last seven years and seven conference trophies overall when including dual meet titles. The Hokies have also placed in the top 10 at NAAs in each of the last six years.
- Robie's 14 dual meet victories ranks second in the ACC record book for most wins by a first-year head coach behind Wade Schalles' 15 wins with Clemson in 1978.
- Robie, who started five freshmen in duals for a majority of the season, was also named a finalist for the Theraworx NWCA National Coach of the Year award.
- On March 21, 2017, Robie was promoted to head wrestling coach at Virginia Tech after serving as interim head coach since February of that year.
- During that span, Robie led the Hokies to the team title at the ACC Championships and a sixth-place finish at the 2017 NCAA Championships in St. Louis – Tech's fifth-straight top-10 finish at nationals.
- Robie was an integral part of the Virginia Tech wrestling staff for 11 seasons as associate head coach under former head coach Kevin Dresser.
- Between 2006-07 and 2016-17, the Hokies won three ACC Dual Meet Championships, three ACC tournament championships and finished in the top 10 at the NCAA Championships five times.
- One of those top 10 team finishes included a an ACC record and program best fourth place finish in 2016.
- He also helped recruit and coach 17 ACC champions and 14 All-Americans.
- Robie came to Blacksburg after serving as the head coach at Binghamton University, a program that had been discontinued after the 2003-04 school year because of budget constraints.
- Before taking over at Binghamton, he was an assistant coach for four seasons at the University of Michigan.
- In seven years as a Division I assistant coach, Robie helped coach 23 All-Americans, nine Academic All-Americans and one national champion.
- As the Wolverines' top assistant coach, Robie recruited three top-10 classes, including the No. 2 ranked class in 2004.
- His one-on-one work with Michigan student-athlete Ryan Bertin culminated with Bertin's 2003 NCAA championship - the school's first national champion in 18 years.
- In all, Michigan's team earned national top-10 status all four years that Robie was a coach there.
- Robie joined the Michigan staff after coaching stops at West Virginia (1998-99) and Edinboro (1999-00).
- From 1992-97, Robie earned All-American honors twice at Edinboro and finished with a career record of 126-24.
- Robie was a three-time EWL and PSAC champion who reached the national finals at 158 pounds in 1997.
- In 1998, ROBIE won a bronze medal at the U.S. Open Freestyle Championships.
- A native of Erie, Pa., Robie and his wife, Jennifer, reside in Christiansburg with their three children – Nate, Luke and Jake.
