TECH LOOKS TO SNAP STREAK AGAINST HEELS

- In its 25-year history and in 27 attempts, Virginia Tech has never beaten UNC in lacrosse.
- Tech had three chances a season ago, one each in the regular season, ACC Tournament and NCAA Tournament. The first meeting was a narrow 13-12 game that the Heels pulled off a comeback in in the final two minutes. Tech grabbed the lead with a five-goal run capped by Taylor Caskey's goal at 4:09 to give the Hokies a 12-11 lead. UNC tied it at 1:57 and scored the game winner at 1:26, hanging on for the victory.
- Carolina remains the only ACC program that head coach John Sung has not defeated since the beginning of his tenure in 2017.

HOKIES NOTCH FIRST RANKED VICTORY OF THE SEASON

- In Sunday's overtime thriller, Virginia Tech earned its first ranked victory of the season knocking off No. 13 Denver 15-14.
- Emma Crooks led the Hokies with six points and a season best eight draw controls.
- In the overtime period, Crooks won the openign draw which set up Tech's possession that culminated with Taylor Caskey earning a free position attempt. She passed the ball to Sara Goodwin who dodged a defender and scoored winning the game.

PETTY PICKS UP 100TH CAREER POINT

- Sophomore Paige Petty recorded the 100th point of her career in a 15-8 victory at Fresno State on Tuesday afternoon where she dropped in six goals and seven total points.
- It took the All-American just 29 games to reach the mark. She is scoring 3.6 points per game so far for her career and 4.4 in 2019.

JULIA BOLTE JOINS 100-POINT CLUB

- Junior Julia Bolte, follwed Petty into the record books with a three-assist effort in the win over Elon.
- She scored 32 points her freshman season at Oregon and has collected 30 goals and 42 assists for the Hokies in two seasons.
- Teammate Taylor Caskey (96) seems poised to be the next Hokie to reach 100 points.

THE BEST MARKS IN THE NATION

- Tech turned in a program best 41 points in a 23-3 victory at Old Dominion earlier this season. Those 41 total points are the most for a single game in the nation in 2019.
- The team recorded 18 assists in that game - also a program best and also the highest single game tally in the nation this season.

BYRNE DOING THE DIRTY WORK IN MIDFIELD

- Grad student Mary Claire Byrne has moved into third all-time at Virginia Tech for caused turnovers with 88. In 2019 she has 19, including recording three or more on five occasions.

In just two seasons in Blacksburg, John Sung has taken the Virginia Tech lacrosse program to new heights, including its first appearance in the NCAA tournament in 2018 as the Hokies advanced into the Second Round.

Sung's Hokies have reset records for wins in a season, ACC wins, goals against average, point scored and goals scored in a single season and Sung, a former goalie, helped Meagh Graham set the program record for lowest goals against average in a season at 9.64 during the 2017 campaign.

In his first season in Blacksburg, Sung engineered the best turnaround in program history winning six more games than the previous season. In 2017, the Hokies won 11 games, equaling the tally of the 1999 squad and reaching double figure wins for the first time since 2012. The team set program records in several categories including ACC wins in a season, goals scored, and points scored.

Hired on May 27, 2016, Sung joined Virginia Tech after building the Winthrop University program from scratch beginning in May of 2011. He oversaw the program's rapid ascent as a regional powerhouse after beginning competition in 2013. In the program's third season, Sung led Winthrop to a 17-4 record, as the Eagles qualified for the NCAA Tournament after winning both the Big South regular-season and tournament titles. In 2016, Winthrop went 20-3, winning the Big South Tournament championship and advancing to another NCAA Tournament. The 2016 season marked the team's second consecutive Big South regular-season and tournament titles.

The 2015 and 2016 Big South Coach of the Year, Sung formerly was the chair of the NCAA Division I Lacrosse Committee and also serves on the U.S. Lacrosse Convention Education Committee. His 2015 squad set Big South single-season records for points, goals (314), free-position goals (67), shots (633), shots on goal (459), ground balls (384), draw controls (312), and caused turnovers (213). In 2016, Winthrop scored 301 goals, including 58 free-position goals. The Eagles set Big South single-season marks for shots (662), ground balls (434), and caused turnovers (266).

In addition to compiling a 54-26 overall record at Winthrop, Sung led the Haudenosaunee Nation to the quarterfinals of the 2013 Federation of International Lacrosse World Cup held in Canada. The team finished in seventh place out of a total of 19 teams. He also coached the team in the 2009 Federation of International Lacrosse in the Czech Republic.

Sung's ascent as an NCAA coach began at Division III Adrian College in Michigan, where he started the program from the ground up and compiled a 46-19 overall record. His 2011 squad started the season 1-4 before registering 15 consecutive victories to earn a berth in the NCAA Division III Tournament. After posting a 6-7 overall record in its first season in 2008, the program went 10-4 in 2009, 14-3 in 2010 and 16-5 in 2011.

Before beginning the program at Adrian College, Sung spent five years as the assistant women's club lacrosse coach at the University of Michigan, setting the groundwork for that program to eventually become a varsity sport in the Big Ten. The Wolverines accumulated a 93-22 record during this tenure.

A longtime trainer of goalies, Sung has held various coaching positions with Birmingham Seaholm High School and the Detroit Lacrosse Club. He has been the assistant director of the Great Lakes Women's Lacrosse Camp since 1997. In addition to his work at various levels in the lacrosse community, Sung has a wealth of sales and management experience in the private sector.

Sung was the starting goalkeeper of the Oakland University lacrosse team in 1997 and 1998 and was also a two-year captain. He was also member of two International Cup U16 championship teams in 1993 and 1994. He completed his degree in Bachelor of Arts degree in communications from Oakland in 2007.

Sung, who resides in Blacksburg with his wife Tina, has three stepsons; Darek, Devin and Zachary, and a daughter, Abby.

25 YEARS OF LACROSSE AT VIRGINIA TECH

- The 2019 season represents the 25th Anniversary of the first season of varsity lacrosse at Virginia Tech. The inaugural year, 1995, the Hokies went 2-7 with wins over Hollis and Monmouth.
- The program is celebrating with a 25th Anniversary event on Saturday, Feb. 9 by inviting alums of the program to campus to cheer on the team in their season opener and then having a dinner that evening.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

- The Hokies graduated the program's most successful class in 2018, including most of the starters on the defensive side of the field and All-ACC goalie Meagh Graham.
- The 2019 roster features 12 freshmen in the class of '22.

THEY COME FROM ALL OVER

- Since Coach Sung assumed head coaching duties in 2016, the Hokies have widened their recruiting footprint. While most Hokies hail from Virginia, and Maryland, some like Carly Goetz (Minnesota), Lauren Hayes (New Hampshire) and Morgan Berman (Georgia) have traveled further to be a part of Hokie Nation.

A FAMILY AFFAIR

- This season's roster features two sets of sisters, the Byrnes and the Beaches.
- Captain MC Byrne has been a staple of the program over the past few years in the midfield. She is joined for her final year by younger sister Julia, a transfer from the University of Cincinnati. Julia is a senior attacker majoring in marketing.
- The Beach sisters are junior Payton and freshman Gabby from Grasonville, Maryland. Payton has played in five career games, scoring one goal, in a win over Radford in 2017.

WHERE HAVE WE HEARD THAT NAME BEFORE?

- Another unique aspect about the Hokies is the number of players with similar names.
- The 2019 squad features two 'MC's', Mary Claire Byrne and Mary Clare McCarthy.
- The Hokies have four players named Emma; Harden (number 20), Crooks (31), Day (39) and Hodges (41).
- Tech has two Julia's; Bolte (3) and Byrne (10).
- There is also the trio Sarah Lubnow (13), Sarah Vanadia (35) and Sara Goodwin (23).

MC BYRNE CLIMBING THE CHARTS

- Byrne is climbing the charts in terms of career caused turnovers. Her 69 is good for fifth all-time in Tech history. Her 2017 and 2018 season and third and fourth respectively for an individual season with 37 and 32 caused turnovers.

HOKIES LOOK TO END DROUGHTS

- Tech will host two perennial powers James Madison and North Carolina this season with whom the Hokies have long losing streaks against. Against JMU, the defending national champs Tech is 0-16 all-time. North Carolina has won each of the programs' 26 meetings, including all three matchups in 2018.
