ACC FOOTBALL NOTES

FOUR ACC TEAMS IN THE TOP 10 FOR FIRST TIME IN LEAGUE HISTORY

• For the first time in league history, four ACC teams are ranked in the AP Top 10 - No. 1 Clemson, No. 5 Notre Dame, No. 7 Miami and No. 8 North Carolina. The ACC has previously had three teams in the AP Top 10 on 15 different occasions, including last week's poll.

• Five ACC teams are ranked in the AP Top 25 and USA Today/Amway Coaches Top 25 polls. In both polls, Clemson is No. 1, Notre Dame is No. 5 and Miami is No. 7. North Carolina is No. 8 in the AP poll and No. 9 in the Coaches' poll, while Virginia Tech is No. 19 in the AP and No. 18 in the Coaches. NC State, Pitt and Virginia are receiving votes in both polls and Boston College is receiving votes in the Coaches poll.

• Clemson is atop the AP poll for the 21st time in school history.

• At No. 8 in the AP poll, North Carolina is ranked in the top 10 for the first time since 2015.

WINNING IN THE ACC

• Clemson has won an ACC record 32 consecutive regular-season games. The Tigers' last regular-season loss was at Syracuse in 2017. According to ESPN Stats & Info, Clemson's 32 regular-season wins are second only to Boise State's 35 from 2008-10 since 2005.

• Clemson has the most consecutive Saturday wins in FBS history with 46, one more than the previous record of 45 by Oklahoma from 1953-57.

• Notre Dame, which won its 20th straight home game vs. USF, has the nation's second-longest current winning streak with eight consecutive victories dating back to last season. North Carolina has won five straight, and Clemson and Miami have won three in a row.

• Notre Dame is fifth all-time with 910 wins. In the ACC, the Irish are followed by Clemson (14th, 761), Virginia Tech (16th, 753), Georgia Tech (19th, 739), Pitt (20th, 735), Syracuse (22nd, 725) and North Carolina (29th, 700).

MIAMI AT CLEMSON IS 17TH MATCHUP OF TWO ACC TEAMS IN TOP 10

• This week's matchup between No. 1 Clemson and No. 7 Miami is the 17th all-time matchup of two ACC teams ranked in the AP Top 10. These two teams were also involved in the last ACC meeting of top 10 teams in the 2017 ACC Championship Game when No. 1 Clemson defeated No. 7 Miami, 38-3.

• This matches the highest combined ranking (8) - Clemson (1), Miami (7) - in a game matching two ranked ACC teams.

• Of the 16 previous games between ACC teams ranked in the top 10, Florida State has appeared nine times, followed by Clemson (7) and Miami (5).

• Including Saturday night's game, Clemson has appeared in four of the last five such games.

• The higher ranked team has won nine of the 16 games, and on seven occasions the game has been decided by one score.

THE WEEK AHEAD - OCT. 9-10

• No. 1 Clemson and No. 7 Miami meet Saturday night at 7:30 p.m. on ABC. This is the fourth time the ACC has been featured on the Saturday night ABC national game of the week. Clemson is looking to win its 33rd consecutive regular-season game, while Miami is seeking its first 4-0 start since winning 10 straight to open the 2017 season. Miami has won its two previous games in Clemson.

• Two of the four games nationally between ranked teams feature the ACC. In addition to No. 1 Clemson and No. 7 Miami, No. 8 North Carolina plays host to No. 19 Virginia Tech at noon on ABC. Last year's game between the two teams in Blacksburg, Virginia, went six overtimes, an ACC record. Virginia Tech is 13-3 against UNC in ACC play. Virginia Tech running back Khalil Herbert leads the nation in rushing and is this week's ACC Running Back and Specialist of the Week.

• Long-time ACC opponents NC State and Virginia meet for the 59th time on the gridiron, but for the first time in Charlottesville since 2011 Saturday at noon on ACC Network. NC State has won three of the last four meetings versus the Cavaliers, including a 35-21 decision in the most recent game between the teams at Raleigh in 2018. Wolfpack QB Devin Leary is completing 66.7 percent of his passes and has a pass efficiency mark of 164.3, which ranks second in the ACC.

• Florida State will be making its second road trip to face a top 10 opponent when the Seminoles travel to No. 5 Notre Dame Saturday night at 7:30 p.m. on NBC. The Seminoles secured their first win under head coach Mike Norvell last week over Jacksonville State. Notre Dame is looking to extend its 20-game home win streak.

• Duke makes its third trip to Syracuse and its first since 2014 Saturday at 12:30 p.m. on RSN. The Orange seeks its second consecutive series victory versus the Blue Devils after winning big by a 49-6 score in Durham last season.

• Pitt and Boston College meet for the 32nd time Saturday afternoon at 4 p.m. on ACC Network. It's only the third meeting as ACC members.

• Louisville faces Georgia Tech at 7 p.m. on ESPN in a matchup of two teams coming off an open week. This is just the second meeting between the two teams.

CLEMSON'S SPECTOR NAMED WALTER CAMP NATIONAL DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Clemson linebacker Baylon Spector recorded a career-best 13 tackles (4 solo), including 1.5 for losses, and added half a sack in the Tigers' 41-23 win over Virginia to earn the Walter Camp Football Foundation National Defensive Player of the Week. Spector is the 11th Clemson player to earn Walter Camp National Player of the Week honors since 2004, and the first since former Tiger LB Isaiah Simmons (Dec. 1, 2019).

NC STATE'S LEARY NAMED MANNING AWARD STAR AND O'BRIEN AWARD GREAT 8

• NC State's Devin Leary has been named one of the Manning Award "Stars of the Week" and one of the Davey O'Brien Award's "Great 8" for his performance the Wolfpack's 30-29 victory over Pitt. Leary, the ACC Quarterback of the Week, tallied career-highs in nearly every category and connected on a pair of fourth-quarter touchdown passes, including the go-ahead score with 23 seconds to go. • ESPN's College GameDay Built by Home Depot will broadcast from an ACC school for the fourth time this year when the show airs Saturday from Clemson in advance of the ranked matchup between the No. 1 Tigers and No. 7 Miami. GameDay began the year in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, for Wake Forest's game vs. Clemson (Sept. 12), was in Louisville for the Cardinals' matchup with Miami (Sept. 19) and was in Miami for the FSU game (Sept. 26). Saturday's broadcast will be Clemson's 25th overall appearance – and sixth home appearance – on College GameDay.

• The 11-time Emmy Award-winning show is hosted by Rece Davis, who is joined on-site by Kirk Herbstreit, Desmond Howard, David Pollack and Chris 'The Bear' Fallica, with Lee Corso from his home in Orlando. Chris Fowler (play-by-play), Herbstreit (analyst) and Allison Williams (sideline) will call the Clemson-Miami game at 7:30 p.m. on ABC.

CHASING RECORDS

• Clemson's Travis Etienne ranks fifth all-time in ACC career rushing yards. He is 394 yards shy of the career record held since 1978 by NC State's Ted Brown. Etienne already holds the ACC career record for rushing touchdowns (57) and total touchdowns (63).

• Etienne is also fourth in ACC history with 5,581 career all-purpose yards. He is chasing former Tiger C.J. Spiller, who had 7,588 yards from 2006-09. North Carolina's Leon Johnson is second with 5,828 yards and Duke's Chris Douglas is third with 5,748.

• Clemson's Trevor Lawrence has thrown for 73 touchdowns, which ranks sixth in ACC history. NC State's Russell Wilson is fifth with 76. The top three in the ACC are Tajh Boyd of Clemson with 107, Philip Rivers of NC State with 95 and Deshaun Watson of Clemson with 90.

Virginia Tech's Brian Johnson (16), Virginia's Brian Delaney (15) and NC State's Christopher Dunn (14) have a current streak of at least 10 consecutive field goals. Only UTSA's Hunter Duplessis is the only other active player with a longer streak (18). Wake Forest's Nick Sciba holds the NCAA record of 34 set last season.

CLEMSON'S ETIENNE HAS ACC TD RECORD

• Clemson running back Travis Etienne holds ACC records in overall touchdowns (65) and rushing touchdowns (58). In 2019, he moved past Pitt's James Conner (2013-16), who previously held the ACC career rushing TD record with 52. In addition to his 58 rushing touchdowns, Etienne has seven scores at a receiver.

• Etienne has scored a touchdown in 38 games, which ties the FBS record for most career games with a touchdown (by any means), held jointly by Florida's Tim Tebow (38 games from 2006-09) and Louisiana Tech's Kenneth Dixon (38 from 2012-15).

THREE FROM ACC ON AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

• Three ACC players – Clemson QB Trevor Lawrence, Duke OG Rakavius Chambers and NC State P Trenton Gill – have been named to the 11-man FBS Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, which recognizes extra efforts by players and student support staff off the field. The ACC is tied for the most players on the team from any conference. The Allstate AFCA Good Works Team was established in 1992 by the College Football Association. Fans can vote for the 2020 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team captain once a day now through Nov. 22 at ESPN.com/Allstate.

ETIENNE AIMS FOR THIRD PDY AWARD

• Clemson running back Travis Etienne returned for his senior season and has an opportunity to become the first player in ACC history to win player of the year honors three times. Last season, he became the seventh player in league history to be voted ACC Player of the Year twice and the second in a four-year span (Louisville quarterback Lamar Jackson in 2016-17). He is also the first running back since North Carolina's Mike Voight (1975-76) to win the honor in multiple years.

ACC COMMITTEE FOR RACIAL & SOCIAL JUSTICE

The ACC's Committee for Racial and Social Justice (CORE - Champions of Racial Equity) announced three initiatives in conjunction with its member institutions on Sept. 3.

- Mandatory diversity and inclusion training for student-athletes, athletic department and conference staff
- Creation of ACC Unity Symbol as a visual representation of solidarity among the ACC's 15 institutions
- ACC Unity Statement to be read prior to every league contest

"I applaud the work of ACC CORE and the initiatives collaborated on and adopted by our schools," said ACC Commissioner John Swofford. "It is critically important for our country to unite as one. The ACC is committed to creating meaningful change, eradicating racism, and upholding the values of equality, diversity and non-discrimination."

"In a time of great challenges where society seems more divided than ever before, we the student-athletes of the ACC want to take a stand against racism, discrimination and any other form of injustice," said Leon Krapf from the NC State Men's Soccer Team and the ACC's representative to NCAA SAAC. "As athletes, we know that sport has the power to unite people from all backgrounds. However, we are more than just athletes. Therefore, we want to use our platforms to advocate for a more tolerant, understanding and inclusive environment on our campuses and beyond. We will overcome our current challenges if we act together and united. #UNITE!"

Student-athletes, athletic department and conference office staff will be required to attend annual diversity and inclusion training. The initiative was unanimously approved by the conference athletic directors. The focus of this year's training will be anti-racism.

The ACC's unity symbol – "UNITE" – will be displayed in venues and on video boards throughout the league, as well as at ACC Championship events and on social media.

CORE also has introduced a Unity Statement, which will be read at all ACC events: **"We, the ACC, are committed to seeing each other as equals, supporting each other, and treating each other with respect and dignity at all times, recognizing that our differences don't divide us, but they make us stronger."**

CORE's work is ongoing and guided by its mission statement, which is "to promote and encourage racial equity and social justice through education, partnerships, engagement and advocacy."

Among CORE's actions to date: the ACC Office's recognition of Juneteenth as a holiday; working with its institutions to increase voter education and vote, with some ACC schools serving as polling places; engaging in conversations and education throughout the conference with staff and student-athletes and initiating partnerships with local organizations and community groups; empowering students and student-athletes to engage with fans around the topic of social justice to minimize misunderstandings.

- Have representation at all levels that is reflective of the make-up of the student-athlete population
- Inclusion and empowerment of diverse individuals
- Accountability for hiring practices

- The six players to win the award twice are NC State's Roman Gabriel (QB) in 1960 & 1961, North Carolina's Don McCauley (RB) in 1969 & 1970, North Carolina's Mike Voight (RB) in 1975 & 1976, Clemson's Steve Fuller (QB) in 1977 & 1978, Florida State's Charlie Ward (QB) in 1992 & 1993, and Louisville's Lamar Jackson (QB) in 2016 & 2017.

- The only player in a Power 5 conference to win three league Player of the Year awards was Georgia's Herschel Walker (1980, 1981 & 1982).

NINE ACC QBS MAKE NFL START

- The ACC leads the country with nine starting quarterbacks in the NFL – Boston College's Matt Ryan (Falcons), Clemson's Deshaun Watson (Texans), Duke's Daniel Jones (NY Giants), Louisville's Lamar Jackson (Ravens) and Teddy Bridgewater (Panthers), North Carolina's Mitch Trubisky (Bears), NC State's Philip Rivers (Colts) and Russell Wilson (Seahawks) and Virginia Tech's Tyrod Taylor (Chargers).

RETURN TO COMPETITION

- The ACC Board of Directors announced July 29 that if public health guidance allows, ACC sponsored fall sports would begin competition during the week of Sept. 7-12. The announcement followed several months of discussion and scenario planning among the league membership and Medical Advisory Group. The Medical Advisory Group continues to meet and update its [report](#).

2020 ACC Football:

- The season's first games took place Sept. 10-12
- The 2020 scheduling model includes 11 games (10 plus one: 10 conference and one non-conference)
- All non-conference game opponents, selected by the respective school, must be played in the home state of the ACC institution, and all non-conference opponents must meet the medical protocol requirements as agreed upon by the ACC
- The 11 games will be played over at least 13 weeks with each team having two open dates
- There will be one division
- Notre Dame will also play a 10-game conference schedule and be eligible to compete in the 2020 ACC Football Championship Game
- All television revenue for the 2020 season, including Notre Dame's home games broadcast by NBC, will be shared equally by all 15 institutions
- The ACC Football Championship Game will be played on either December 12 or 19 at Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte, North Carolina, and will feature the top two teams based upon highest conference-game winning percentage
- All 15 teams will continue to be part of the ACC's bowl selection process; should Notre Dame win the ACC Football Championship Game it would be eligible for the Orange Bowl, if not selected as a College Football Playoff semifinal team

RETURNING STANDOUTS

- For the first time in ACC history, the league returned two quarterbacks (North Carolina's Sam Howell and Clemson's Trevor Lawrence) who threw 35 or more touchdown passes the previous season. Add in Miami's D'Eriq King, who threw 36 TDs in 2018 at Houston, and the ACC has the only three QBs in the country playing this fall who have thrown 35 or more touchdowns in a single season. The only other returning quarterback who threw 35-plus touchdowns last year was Ohio State's Justin Fields.

- The ACC is the only FBS conference with two returning 1,500-yard rushers in Clemson's Travis Etienne (1,604 yards) and Louisville's Javian Hawkins (1,525 yards). The only other time the ACC returned two 1,500-yard backs was 2016 with Florida State's Dalvin Cook and Clemson's Wayne Gallman. North Carolina's Michael Carter (1,003

yards in 2019) gives the ACC three returning 1,000-yard rushers.

- Clemson is the first ACC team since Florida State in 1995 to return the first-team all-conference quarterback (Trevor Lawrence) and a first-team running back (Travis Etienne). The 1995 FSU team returned QB Danny Kanell and RB Warrick Dunn.

2020 PRESEASON ALL-ACC PICKS

- Clemson was selected by the media as the clear favorite in the league's preseason football poll. The nationally top-ranked Tigers are predicted to finish first in the ACC by 132 of the media panel's 134 voters and are also picked to win the ACC Football Championship Game. In addition, Clemson junior quarterback Trevor Lawrence was selected as the ACC Preseason Player of the Year, and the Tigers led all schools with five players voted to the 27-member 2020 Preseason All-ACC Team. Notre Dame, which will compete as an ACC football member this season, received the remaining two first-place votes. North Carolina placed third in the preseason balloting, followed by Louisville, Virginia Tech and Miami.

2020 ACC FOOTBALL TIEBREAKER POLICY

The ACC Champion will be decided by a game between the two postseason eligible teams with the highest percentage of wins during all regular season conference competition.

However, for any team to be eligible for the ACC Football Championship Game, or to be considered in a tiebreaker, such team must have played within one (1) total conference game of the average number of conference games played by all conference teams (rounding up/down at .5) during the 2020 season. For example, if the average number of conference games played in the 2020 season is 9.25 (value of nine (9) when rounded down), a team would be eligible to participate in the ACC Football Championship Game, or be considered in a tiebreaker, if that team played eight (8) or more conference games. Furthermore, in the event there is an unequal total number of conference games played among teams tied in the loss column, head-to-head results will take precedence over win-percentage.

If teams remain tied, existing procedures will be applied to determine the ACC Football Championship Game representative(s). Overall conference standings will be calculated on a percentage basis, using the ten conference games which are part of the schedule. If teams are tied for the best win percentage or second best win percentage in its conference games then, in order to determine the Championship Game representative, the procedures listed below will be followed.

Two-Team Tie

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Head-to-head competition versus the team with the best overall win percentage and proceeding through the conference. Multiple ties within the conference will be broken from first to last using the league's tiebreaker policies.
3. Overall win percentage versus all common conference opponents.
4. Win percentage versus common conference opponents based upon their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common conference opponents based upon their conference order of finish.
5. The tied team with the higher ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
6. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or Commissioner's designee.

Three-Team (or More) Tie

- (Three-team (or more) tiebreaker procedure will be used to break all ties to identify the Championship game representative. Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tiebreaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three-team (or more) tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied).
1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
 2. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the conference with the best overall conference win percentage and proceeding through the conference. Multiple ties within the conference will be broken first to last, using the league's tiebreaker policies.
 3. Combined win percentage versus all common conference opponents.
 4. Win percentage versus common conference opponents based upon their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common conference opponents based upon their conference order of finish.
 5. The tied team with the higher ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
 6. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or Commissioner's designee.
- Note: Conference games against otherwise postseason ineligible teams will always be counted in the league standings and in application of the tie breaker policies.

■ Two new coaches have joined the ACC in 2020, Boston College's Jeff Hafley and Florida State's Mike Norvell. Hafley comes to Chestnut Hill after a successful stint as Ohio State's co-defensive coordinator. He was a finalist for the 2019 Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach. Norvell takes over in Tallahassee after spending four seasons as the head coach at Memphis where he won the 2019 AAC championship. His .717 winning percentage was the highest in Memphis history.

■ Twelve head coaches in the ACC have won at least 50 career games, including five with more than 100 victories. North Carolina's Mack Brown is tops among active coaches with 253 wins, and Notre Dame's Brian Kelly (coaching in the ACC for the first year) has 244. The other 100-win coaches in the ACC are Clemson's Dabo Swinney (133), Wake Forest's Dave Clawson (127), Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall (125) and Duke's David Cutcliffe (116). No other conference has as many coaches with 100 career wins.

■ Among active coaches, Clemson's Dabo Swinney, Notre Dame's Brian Kelly, Louisville's Scott Satterfield and North Carolina's Mack Brown and rank among the top 25 in the nation in career winning percentage. Swinney's .811 winning percentage leads the nation. The ACC has more coaches in the top 25 in winning percentage than any other conference.

■ Two of the five active coaches to win a national title reside in the ACC. Dabo Swinney led Clemson to national titles in 2016 and 2018. North Carolina's Mack Brown won a national title at Texas in 2005.

■ Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney is one win shy of FSU's Bobby Bowden's ACC mark for bowl victories, which includes CFP National Championship Games. Bowden leads with 11 Bowl/CFP wins during his tenure in the ACC. Swinney ranks second with 10. Louisville's Scott Satterfield is 4-0 with three bowl victories at Appalachian State and last year's win over Mississippi State in the Music City Bowl.

■ Mack Brown's 14 bowl victories at Texas (10) and North Carolina (4) ranks fourth all-time and second among active coaches. Dabo Swinney's 10 bowl wins are fifth among active coaches, while Duke's David Cutcliffe and Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall are tied for 10th with seven bowl victories.

■ Five current league coaches have won ACC Coach of the Year honors - North Carolina's Mack Brown in 1996, Duke's David Cutcliffe in 2012 & 2013, Clemson's Dabo Swinney in 2015 & 2018, Virginia Tech's Justin Fuente in 2016 and Louisville's Scott Satterfield in 2019.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

- The ACC has won seven national championships in football, men's basketball, women's basketball and baseball since 2015. That is the most of any conference. The ACC is the only conference to win each of those four titles over that stretch.
- The ACC has won three of the last seven football national titles (ties for most of any conference) and three of the last five men's basketball national championships (most of any conference) since 2015.
- The ACC has had a team in either the College Football Playoff or the BCS National Championship Game in each of the past seven years.
- Clemson (15-0) won the league's eighth football national championship in 2018 with a 44-16 win over previously unbeaten Alabama. The 28-point margin of victory was the largest over a No. 1 ranked team in ACC history.

ACC FCG IN CHARLOTTE

- In April 2018, the ACC and the Charlotte Sports Foundation announced a 10-year agreement that will keep the ACC Football Championship Game in Charlotte through the 2030 season. The game will be played annually at Bank of America Stadium on the first Saturday in December.
- The ACC Football Championship Game has sold out four times in Charlotte (2010, 2011, 2015, 2017).
- The economic impact of the 2019 game was close to \$30 million, with more than \$185 million of economic impact over the last six games played in Charlotte.

BOWL SUCCESS

- A nation's best 10 ACC teams played a postseason bowl game following the 2019 season – Boston College (TicketSmarter Bowl), Clemson (CFP), Florida State (Tony the Tiger Sun Bowl), Louisville (Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl), Miami (Walk-On's Independence Bowl), North Carolina (Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman), Pitt (Quick Lane Bowl), Virginia (Capital One Orange Bowl), Virginia Tech (Belk Bowl) and Wake Forest (New Era Pinstripe Bowl).
- The ACC is the only conference to send every team to at least one bowl game over the previous four seasons (2016-19).
- The ACC is tied for the most bowl teams (42) among all conferences over the last four years (11 in 2016, 10 in 2017, 11 in 2018, 10 in 2019).
- Since 2013, the ACC has the second-best record of any Power 5 conference in the BCS, New Year's Six and CFP games, and is tied for the most national championships (Florida State in 2013, Clemson in 2016 & 2018).

BOWL PARTNERSHIPS

- The ACC is in its sixth year of a 12-year agreement with the Capital One Orange Bowl, which will host an ACC team—either its champion or next available team—in all years when the Orange Bowl is not a semifinal site for the College Football Playoff. The opponent will be the highest ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten or Notre Dame. The ACC has won five of the last seven Orange Bowls that featured an ACC team, including five in a row from 2012-16.
- A new six-year bowl lineup begins in 2020, and includes the addition of the San Diego County Credit Union Holiday Bowl and the newly created Fenway Bowl in Boston. In addition to those two bowls, the ACC has agreements through 2025 with the *Cheez-It* World Bowl, Duke's Mayo Bowl, Military Bowl, New Era Pinstripe Bowl, TaxSlayer Gator Bowl and Tony the Tiger Sun Bowl. The league will also send a team to either the Gasparilla Bowl, Birmingham Bowl or SERVPRO First Responder Bowl on an annual basis. In addition, the ACC will send a team to the Outback Bowl if the league's opponent in a non-semifinal Capital One Orange Bowl is from the Big Ten.

ACC & THE NFL DRAFT

- Since the 2005 season, the ACC has had 570 players chosen in the NFL Draft, including 89 first-round picks, the second highest totals of any conference.
- The ACC has had 289 players selected since 2013 - the second-highest total among all conferences - and has had 40 or more players picked in four of the last seven drafts. The ACC's 45 draftees in 2018 was its third-highest ever.
- Current ACC teams have had a total of nine players chosen as the first overall selection in the NFL Draft. The most recent was Florida State's Jameis Winston, who was tabbed first in 2015 by the Tampa Bay Bucs. Miami (Vinny Testaverde, 1987, Tampa Bay; and Russell Maryland, 1991, Dallas) and Virginia Tech (Bruce Smith, 1985, Buffalo; and Michael Vick, 2001, Atlanta) each had two top selections while Florida State (Jameis Winston, 2015, Bucs), NC State (Mario Williams, 2006, Texans), Virginia (Bill Dudley, 1942, Steelers) and Syracuse (Ernie Davis, 1962, Redskins) each had one. Also, NC State's Roman Gabriel, the No. 2 overall selection in the 1962 draft, was chosen No. 1 in the AFL Draft by the Oakland Raiders.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- Virginia linebacker Jordan Mack was a finalist for the 2019 William V. Campbell Trophy® presented by Mazda, announced by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF). Celebrating its 30th year in 2019, the award recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership. An ACC player has won three of the last six Campbell Trophies, including Duke's David Helton in 2014, Virginia's Micah Kiser in 2017 and Clemson's Christian Wilkins in 2018.
- Ten ACC football teams have an APR above the Division I average of 968, which ranks second among peer conferences. In all sports, the ACC is second among Power 5 conferences with 83 teams from member schools recognized in the most recent NCAA APR Public Recognition Awards.
- Ten of 14 ACC Football teams earned a graduation success rate (GSR) at or above the FBS average. That was second-most among Power 5 conferences, both in terms of percentage and in total number.
- The ACC remains the only Power 5 conference to have multiple teams score 90 or higher in GSR each year since 2005. Duke (96), Louisville (91) and Boston College (90) reached that plateau this year.
