Tech is ranked No. 15, moving up from one spot in last week's AP poll. Trailing No. 10 Duke, the Hokies are the second-highest ranked ACC team for the first time in school history.

AT THE RIM

- Playing at home for the second game in a row, Virginia Tech men's basketball will play host to Penn State on Tuesday at 9 p.m. ET on ESPN2 in the ACC/B1G Challenge.
- The Hokies will go up against the Nittany Lions for the second straight time in the challenge, with Tech seeking to avenge its one-point loss in 2018. (More on page 5)
- Tech, which is 6-3 in the all-time series with Penn State, has won all of its games in Blacksburg at 2-0 (2010, '79).
- The two schools have faced each other three times in the challenge and Tech has never won once out of the tries in 2018, '14 and '07.
- Tech head coach Mike Young has never faced Penn State or interim head coach Jim Ferry.

WHO TO WATCH



- Posting his first double-double since Jan. 24, 2019, and just the second of his career, Keve Aluma tallied a team-high 17 points and 12 rebounds vs. VMI.
- Aluma had career-high 13 free-throw attempts and made a career-best seven FTs.



- Filling up the stat sheet, Justyn Mutts turned in an almost double-double with 10 points and nine rebounds.
- He also dished out a career-high six assists, topping his previous high of five set twice during the 2019-20 season at Delaware.

LAST TIME OUT

- Down by four points with eight minutes left, the Hokies picked it up a notch and would go on to win by eight points over VMI Thursday.
- Similar to last season when the two schools faced off, both teams didn't shoot it particularly well, with each under 36 FG%.

A WIN WOULD

- Keep Tech's undefeated season intact and be Young's first-ever win over Penn State, as well as his third win over a Big Ten program (Michigan State in 2019, Purdue in 2007).
- Extend Tech's nonconference home winning streak to 35 games.
- Snap its two-game losing streak to Penn State, dating back to 2014.

RARE, LIKE MR. CLEAN WITH HAIR

- Justyn Mutts, who doesn't have a bad hairdo himself, became just the fifth Hokie in the last decade to have a 10-point, nine-rebound, six-assist or better stat line and the first since 2019 (Nickeil Alexander-Walker) when he did so vs. VMI.
- Mutts is just one of six high-major players this season to accomplish the feat, including just one of two in the ACC (Louisville's Carlik Jones).

NOT GREAT, BOB

- Tech has not been shooting the ball well from downtown as of late, making just four triples in its last game (VMI) and only five the one before that (USF) for a 9-of-43 clip (20.9%).
- In the Mike Young era, that is the fewest 3s made in a two-game stretch, topping the previous low of 11, which was set twice last year.
- However, after being 0-3 when making five or less 3s last year, the Hokies have been able to make shots inside and are 2-0 this year when doing so.

PUTTIN' ON THE CLAMPS

- Tech has given up less than 59 points in back-to-back games, marking just the third time in the Mike Young era.
- The previous two times were a four-game stretch (Chattanooga, Gardner-Webb, VMI and Maryland Eastern Shore; Dec. 11-29) and a three-game stretch (Coppin State, USC Upstate and Lehigh; Nov. 8-16).

GETTIN' TO THE CHARITY STRIPE

- Coach Young was not happy with how little the Hokies got to the free-throw line last year, with an average of 13.4 per game, which ranked second-to-last in the ACC and was in the bottom 25 nationally.
- So now, with not being as dependent on the 3-ball and having more players that can get to the rim, Tech has increased that average to 20.5 this season, including back to back to back 20-plus FTs its last three games.
- Last year, the Hokies only had eight games (out of 32) of having 20 or more free throw attempts. When doing so, they were 7-1, with the lone loss being against Miami (Fla.) in triple overtime.
- Tech accomplished consecutive contests with 20-plus free throws only twice (Jan. 7-14) last year.

STARTIN' OUT HOT

- The Hokies have started the season out on a strong note, with defeating their opponent by 10 or more points twice through three games for an average margin of victory of 12.0.
- In Young's final season at Wofford (2018-19), that was a norm, with his Terriers having 22 games of winning by double digits.
- Last season, though, Tech only won by 10 or more 10 times, including just four times against a high-major conference opponent.
- The Hokies already have one double-digit win against a high-major team (USF) this year.

MORE ON THE DECK

- Sophomore Hunter Cattoor was a more balanced player in high school he shared recently, with doing a little bit of everything (3s, mid-range, floaters) at all three levels.
- Since his arrival to Blacksburg, he's been more of a catch-and-shoot player and is looking to buck that trend.
- So, against USF, the guard set a career-high eight free throw attempts and cashed in six of those. Cattoor last year, out of 31 games, only got to the line in eight games for a total of 22 free throw attempts. So expect more times than not he will put it on the deck and attack the rim.

LEVELIN' UP

- The grad transfer from Iowa, Cordell PemsI, stepped up in a big way against USF, subbing in for Keve Aluma when he picked up his second foul early in the first half.
- PemsI came in and made some big plays, playing 12 minutes and recording eight points and four rebounds alone in the first half.
- He would go on to finish with 10 points and six rebounds - not bad for a role player who had 13 minutes, one point and two rebounds combined the first two games.

BENCH MOB HEATIN' UP

- In the USF win, the Hokies had five players score in double figures, which was a first this year and only the third time in the Mike Young era (UMES, Michigan St.; both with five players).
- Of those five players Sunday, two did so coming off the bench, respectively, in Cartier Diarra and Cordell PemsI. Last season, that happened just eight times, with half of those in ACC play.

THAT'S A FIRST

- Tech basketball under the direction of Coach Young is known for being a quality 3-point shooting team, with the Hokies finishing with the most 3s made last year in the ACC with 315.
- So when they are having an off shooting night from downtown, it's tough to overcome it and get a win.
- Last year, Tech had three instances when it made five or less 3s and went 0-3 in those games.
- This year, with not being as reliant on the deep ball, Tech made only five triples versus USF, but still earned a blowout win, a first in the Mike Young era.

What's a Hokie?



The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which is still used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

The official university school colors - Chicago Maroon and Burnt Orange - also were introduced in 1896. The colors were chosen by a committee because they made a 'unique combination' not worn elsewhere at the time. The official definition of "hokie" is "a loyal Virginia Tech Fan".

WHERE THEY AT

- Tech has 15 players on the squad who represent 10 states and two international countries (Netherlands, Nigeria), making it tied for eighth in the country for most states and countries represented on a roster this season.
- Virginia leads the way with three players – Joseph "Joe" Bamisile, Gill Williamson, Grant Yates – while Maryland has two players – Keve Aluma and Darius Maddox.
- New Mexico, Penn and UT Martin are No. 1 nationally with 15 players from different states and countries, while in the ACC, Boston College (13) is first and Florida State is tied with the Hokies for the second most in the league with 12.
- Of the 23 schools that have 12 or more players from different spots, nine are from high-major conferences, including BC, Kentucky, Butler, FSU, Iowa State, Nebraska, Tennessee, Tulane and the Hokies.

'19 CLASS OF HIGH-MAJOR COACHES

- Out of the seven high-major conferences (ACC, American, BIG EAST, B1G, Big 12, Pac-12 and SEC), there were 14 head coaches hired for the 2019-20 season.
- Virginia Tech coach Mike Young was just one of six coaches that were a mid-major coach to jump up to the big leagues, joining Alabama's Nate Oats (Buffalo), Arkansas' Eric Musselman (Nevada), Tulane's Ron Hunter (Georgia State) and Washington State's Kyle Smith (San Francisco).
- Of the 14 new coaches, Young was the longest-tenured coach to leave, following his 17-year stint as the head guy at Wofford.
- The NBA saw three of its coaches jump into the college ranks, with Michigan's Juwon Howard (Miami Heat), Nebraska's Fred Hoiberg (Chicago Bulls) and Vanderbilt's Jerry Stackhouse (Memphis Grizzlies).
- In this cycle, only one assistant coach was promoted from within and that was Temple's Aaron McKie, who served as an assistant under Fran Dunphy for five seasons in Philadelphia.
- Former Hokie coach Buzz Williams, who is at Texas A&M, was one of just two coaches to jump ship and go high-major for high-major, with UCLA's Mick Cronin (Cincinnati) being the other.
- A full breakdown of the 14 coaches in the cycle is below, with the SEC welcoming the most among the seven leagues with four. The Big 12 was the lone conference not make coaching change heading into the 2019-20 season.

LAST TIME vs. PENN STATE

- Tied at 58-all with four minutes remaining, the Nittany Lions made some clutch plays down the stretch while the Hokies were cold from the field and had some costly turnovers, as Penn State pulled off the upset of then-No. 13 Virginia Tech in the 2018 ACC/B1G Challenge.
- There were a few things why Tech didn't win in comfortable fashion, with it only having nine assists, which turned out to be the second-fewest assists for the team that season, a season that would end in the Sweet 16, and then 15 turnovers proved to be too much, with a rough assist-turnover ratio for the game.
- Playing only seven players on the night, the Hokies had four players scoring in double figures, including an almost double-double by Kerry Blackshear Jr.
- The lone player to play in the game and still be on Tech's roster, guard Wabissa Bede tallied 11 minutes in his start, recording three assists, one rebound and a steal.

SCOUTING PENN STATE

- Penn State is coming off an overtime loss at home to Seton Hall (2-3) this past Sunday, falling by a score of 98-92. The Pirates relied heavily on working it inside, outscoring the Nittany Lions 54-30 in points in the paint, and had to put together quite the comeback to earn the win, trailing by as many as 19 points (1H, 10:59).
- Jim Ferry enters his fourth season in University Park, but just the first as the interim head coach, following his three-year stint as an assistant. A well-versed traveler, Ferry has been a head coach at all three divisions, including Plymouth State (DIII), Adelphi (DII), LIU (DI) and Duquesne (DI). He's racked up 316 wins.
- Penn State is led by a freshman who is scoring 22.3 points per game in Seth Lundy, a three-start forward who was ranked No. 221 in the 247Sports rankings. At 6-foot-6 and 219 pounds, Lundy is averaging 4.3 rebounds per game and can do a little bit of everything (nine 3-pointers, team-high 14 free-throw attempts).
- The Nittany Lions rank 14th in steals (10.7) and 18th in 3-pointers made per game (11.0).



DOWNTOWN, A STAPLE

- As you know, 3-point shooting is a staple of the Coach Young offense.
- And to back up his prowess, Young is one of only two coaches whose teams have ranked in the top 80 nationally in 3P% each of the last six years (since 2014-15).
- The only others are Saint Mary's Randy Bennet, Duke's Coach K, Michigan State's Tom Izzo and Gonzaga's Mark Few each with five a piece.

'ROUND THE BLOCK

- With more of an intentionality of scoring inside this season with the added presence down low compared to last year, Tech showcased that vs. USF with 42 points in the paint, which was most in the Mike Young era, spanning over 35 games.
- The previous high was 40 points against then-No. 10/8 Duke on Dec. 6 in Cassell, a 77-63 lost.

TOP-THREE WINS

- There are only two teams since '10 that have won a game against a top-3 team in their first six games of the season in consecutive years, with it being Tech and Duke ('17, '18).

THE FEW, THE PROUD

- Only three players this season have racked up 13 rebounds and dished out five assists in a game, with Tyrece Radford accomplishing the feat against then-No. 3 Villanova.

WITH THE BEST OF THEM

- Over the last five seasons, only Tech, Duke, UNC and Kansas have the most wins against AP top-five teams, with all four squads owning six games apiece since 2016.

UPSET TIDBITS

- Coach Young earned his second ranked win at Tech, following his upset of then-No. 3 Michigan State last November in Maui, and makes him 2-0 at Tech versus the AP's third-ranked team.
- For the third time in Coach Young's last four seasons he's earned a top-five win (No. 5 North Carolina, 2017, when he was at Wofford).
- Tech now has three straight seasons of winning a nonconference tournament game against a ranked opponent (No. 23/22 Purdue, 2018, Charleston Classic).

THE GLASS

- Tech didn't control the glass too much last year in games against ACC teams, with only out-rebounding its ACC opponent three times out of 21 games.
- But what was a weakness, with a good amount of that coming down to size, last year is arguably now a strength, as the Hokies out-rebounding third-ranked Villanova by nine.
- Tyrece Radford tied his career high with 13 boards to lead the charge on the glass for Tech.
- Keve Aluma (8) and Justyn Mutts (6) combined for 14 boards, including three of those being offensive.

BEEN A MINUTE

- Tech scored 81 against then-No. 3/3 Villanova, marking the first time the Hokies have scored 80 or more points since Feb. 19, 2020 against Miami (Fla.) in a triple overtime thriller.
- A total of seven games came in between the Miami and 'Nova games.
- The Hokies are 5-1 when they score 80-plus points under Coach Young. The lone loss was the Miami (Fla.) triple OT contest, a 102-95 setback.

EFFICIENT AS THEY COME

- Forward Keve Aluma had quite the debut vs. Radford, netting seven of his 10 shots for a career-high 19 points.
- The redshirt junior likely won't keep a 70 percent field-goal percentage going all season, but it is something to keep an eye on the rest of the way.
- In his final season at Wofford (2018-19), Aluma shot 67 percent from the floor, which ranked 17th among all Division I players (minimum 140 FGA).
- So, expect a high clip from the Maryland native this season.

COMEBACK KIDS

- Tech put together a 12-point comeback against the third-ranked 'Cats in the win.
- The last time the Hokies were down double digits and came back to win was vs. UNC on Jan. 22, 2020, which was also a game that went into overtime.

SOMETHING ABOUT 4

- Tech, which didn't necessarily have a handful of high-end scorers in Mike Young's first season, looks like it does now, as six players made at least four shots against Radford.
- So there must be something about the No. 4, as Tech also had four steals, with four players getting one swiipe apiece.
- Last year, Tech didn't have a single game of six players making four or more field goals (closest was five players twice), marking the Radford game a first in the Mike Young era – a promising sign for the Hokies of a more well-balanced attack offensively.

- The Hokies had 18 or more assists in seven games last year and went 6-1 on those contests, losing to Syracuse 71-69 at home in the lone setback.

BOOTS EXPANDING HIS VERSATILITY

- Guard Tyrece Radford, otherwise known as "Boots", tied his career high in assists against Radford, racking up five assists.
- Radford has done so three times now, with the other two coming last year against Syracuse (Jan. 18) and Maryland Eastern Shore (Dec. 29).
- Last year, the Louisiana native had seven games of four or more assists. So, after working on his passing ability this offseason, expect Boots to share the rock on an uptick this season instead of having his head down traditionally on his way to the rim.

BETTER LATE THAN NEVER

- Tech has three (!) players that just started playing basketball recently, with Keve Aluma, Cartier Diarra and John Ojiako all first playing basketball in high school.
- Each began that late for various reasons. Aluma was in love with soccer up until then, Diarra was a dancer and Ojiako had someone run into him on the street and told him he should give it a try.

MY TURN

- Coach Young this fall created a non-profit called MY TURN, which is an anti-bullying organization.
- Through this organization, Coach Young hopes to bring attention and awareness to bullying in schools, as well as prevention tactics to the community at Tech and the surrounding areas.
- Growing up in Southwest Virginia, Coach Young spent a lot of time in Cassell Coliseum with his late father, Bob Young, whose service and dedication as an educator and coach impacted many young lives in the new river valley community.
- Following in his father's footsteps, Coach Young's passion for coaching and teaching makes him a great advocate for promoting change and equality.

THAT NEW, NEW

- Tech is tied for the 12th-most newcomers in the nation, bringing in nine players this past offseason.
- Two of those guys were already on campus in Keve Aluma and Grant Yates, but had to sit out last year due to NCAA transfer rules.
- Speaking of transfers, Tech welcomed three this past summer in Cartier Diarra (Kansas State), Justyn Mutts (Delaware) and Cordell Pems (Iowa). Mutts has two years of eligibility, while Diarra and Pems each have one season left. However, the NCAA waived the players' eligibility that compete in winter sports, therefore all three could return an additional year.
- Then the other four players are freshmen, with three being on scholarship and one is a walk-on.
- The Hokies have the most newcomers of any team in the ACC.
- Here is how Tech ranks among high-major conferences with bringing in new players:

NOT TOO SHABBY

- Tech ranked highly in a few categories nationally last season and hopes to do the same this season, with those including being fifth in turnovers per game (9.9), fifth in assist-turnover ratio (1.48), 13th in 3-point field goals per game (9.8) and 17th in personal fouls per game (14.8).

OLDER AND WISER

- Last season, Tech was one of the youngest teams in the country (second among high-majors, trailing Utah), playing seven underclassmen in its nine-player rotation.
- This season, it got a little older and wiser with the addition of three grad transfers, as well as its core of now-sophomores having a year of experience, which should equate to a more poised Hokie bunch.
- The three grad transfers combined for 252 games under their belts coming into this season, giving the Hokies some much-needed experience.

WHAT'S NOT TO LIKE?

- KenPom had the Hokies at No. 35 out of 351 teams in its preseason rankings, which are based off of adjusted efficiency margin.
- Out of the ACC, it has Tech tabbed as the eighth best team in the league.

SMALL BUT MIGHTY

- Among high-major conference teams, there are only 35 players that are less than six feet tall, including Tech's Jalen Cone, standing at 5-foot-10.
- Of those 35, 19 of them are walk-ons, while the other 16 are on scholarship.
- In the ACC, Cone is one of eight players shorter than six feet, and is just one of five scholarship players in the league.
- Where does Cone rank among the group in points per game? He ranks sixth, averaging 8.0 last year.
- The other two in the league above him you likely have heard of - Miami (Fla.)'s Chris Lykes (15.4 ppg in '19-20, 5'7") and UVA's Kihei Clark (10.8 ppg in '19-20, 5'9").

FIRST-YEAR WINS

- Tech coach Mike Young tallied 16 wins his first year in Blacksburg, making him tied for the fifth-most wins by a first-year Tech coach in school history.
- The 16 wins were the most by a first-year Tech coach since 1999-00 when Ricky Stokes had 16 as well.

HOME SWEET HOME

- The Hokies extended their home nonconference winning streak to 33 games against Radford last Wednesday, which is a school record.
- Tech is in elite company among high-major schools, sitting with tied for the fourth-best win streak.

LET'S KEEP IT GOING

- Tech hasn't lost a home nonconference game since Dec. 30, 2015 against West Virginia (88-63), owning a 34-game streak.
- The previous best was 23, which was set twice from 1980-84 and 2005-09. The current streak began on Nov. 11, 2016, against Maine.

BOOTS ON THE BOARDS

- For just the third time in school history since joining the ACC in 2004, Tech had a freshman lead the team in rebounding last season when Tyrece Radford brought down 199 boards.
- The other two instances were done by household names as well, with Dorian Finney-Smith (232) in 2011-12 and Jeff Allen (251) in 2007-08 doing so.

GET 'EM FROM DEEP

- Hunter Cattoor started to get into a rhythm from the perimeter closing the season last year.
- The guard, who was averaging 1.4 3-point makes per game before Feb. 15, finished another level since that game versus Pitt Feb. 15 with a 2.9 mark on a 47.4 percent clip over his last eight outings.
- So, though his attempts were about the same with one more a pop, he made more at a higher rate, making him a reliable threat off the bench, and is someone to watch heading into this year for another jump in shooting percentages coming most likely.
- In his last game, with maybe a glimpse of what's to come, he hit four 3s against North Carolina.

TEAM ON THEIR BACK

- The ACC has had its fair share of teams that are carried by freshmen, especially in recent memory.
- Tech, similar to Duke the last couple of years, had its freshmen score more than 50 points per game last year, which ranked it fourth all-time on the ACC freshman season team superlatives record book.
- Of the 51.7 points from last season, the Hokies return 36.2 points from that (70.0 percent) bunch.

THE LONE SWEEP

- Last season, Tech swept Clemson with defeating the Tigers once on the road (Nov. 5) and once at home (March 4) for its lone sweep of a team on the year.
- It marked just the second-ever over the Tigers (2017).
- The Hokies had six players hit a 3-pointer, including four players hitting at least two.

MAKE IT RAIN

- Tech let it rip with six guys hitting a 3-pointer against Clemson in its final home game of the 2019-20 season, which is a trend it accomplished a few times that season.
- In their 32 games last season, the Hokies had nine games with six or more guys hitting a triple and went 6-3 in those games.
- Tech had six guys hit a 3 against Coppin State (11/8) and USC Upstate (11/13), marking the first time that has happened in consecutive games since December 2018 vs. Central Connecticut State (1st) and VMI (5th).
- Since 2010, the Hokies have had 31 games in which they have had at least six players make a 3. In those games, they are 26-5 (.839).
- The most they've had hit a 3 is eight players in a game, which has happened just once since 2010 (Houston Baptist on Nov. 21, 2017).

A SELECT CREW

- There were only two players in the ACC that averaged more than 10 points, six rebounds and shot over 60 percent last year.
- The two players were NC State's DJ Funderburk and the Hokies' Tyrece Radford.
- The funny thing is, one is a guard and the other is a forward, with an eight-inch differential in height, as Radford stands 6'2" and Funderburk 6'10".
- Both players are back this year.

LEADIN' OFF THE BENCH

- Last season, Tech had two players come off the bench and score in double figures seven times in the Mike Young era.
- Interestingly enough, it did not happen at all in 2018-19 and just once the year before in 2017-18 (vs. Iowa in ACC/B1G Challenge).
- So, expect more of the same with a deeper bench in Young's second season in Blacksburg.

STEPPING UP DOWN THE STRETCH

- Guard Tyrece Radford put together his best stretch towards the end of the season, leading the Hokies in scoring five of their last 12 games since Jan. 28, 2019 at Miami (Fla.).
- Radford played well above his averages over the last 12 games, especially in scoring, with being more aggressive (hence the uptick in attempts).

- However, it did not accumulate to the most made 3s in school history, though, with it being the second most ever made with 315, which led the ACC.

BENCH MOB

- The Hokies' bench scored 30 points in three straight ACC games (Miami, Duke, UVA), which is something that had happened only twice in the ACC era ('04). They had an ACC-high 36 points vs. UVA on Feb. 26, 2019.
- The other occasion took place in 2015 during a four-game stretch (UVA, Pitt, WF, 'Cuse).
- Some of that bench will be expected to take on a larger this season, with potentially starting.

GOOD THINGS COME TO AN END

- After guard Nahiem Alleyne did not knock down one from 3-point land versus Virginia Feb. 26, 2019, it snapped his 13-game streak of making at least one.
- Before the matchup with the Cavaliers, that was the longest active streak in the ACC. It would go on to finish tied for the fifth-longest in the league.
- Of those streaky shooters last year, only two return in Alleyne and Syracuse's Boeheim.

LET IT GO

- Tech went 14-2 last year when holding a lead with five minutes to go. The two losses came at Boston College on Jan. 25 and Feb. 19 vs. Miami.
- The Hokies are 3-0 this season when owning one.

DISHIN' THE ROCK

- The Hokies went 4-1 last year when racking up more than 20 assists as a team in a game.
- Of the five, two of those came against Syracuse, which, likely, was due to the Orange's 2-3 zone.
- The Highlanders are expected to play a little bit of 2-3 zone on Wednesday, so look for Tech to potentially hit its stride when Radford does so.

OVERTIME HISTORY LESSON

- When the Hokies played in their first overtime game in 2019-20, it had been a while since they last played some 'free basketball'
- The extra session vs. UNC on Jan. 22 marked the first time Tech played OT since the 2019 ACC Tournament against Florida State, a 65-63 heartbreaking loss.
- When the Tar Heels and Hokies went into double overtime, it marked the first time since 2017 versus Virginia, an 80-78 win, that it went into two OTs.
- Tech two weeks later played in overtime with Boston College and fell at home.
- Then against Miami (Fla.), the Hokies went into triple overtime for the first time since 1983, a four-point loss at West Virginia, 90-86.
- It was Tech's fourth triple overtime (it has never been to four or more), tying its longest game ever. In real time, the game went 2 hours & 41 minutes.
- The contest was the longest game in Cassell, as the other three 3OT games were not at home.

ON THE GLASS

- The Hokies went a solid 8-1 when out-rebounding their opponents on the glass last season.
- With more added depth down low, expect those nine instances last year to increase, with the addition of Keve Aluma (6-9, Wofford), Justyn Mutts (6-7, Delaware) and Cordell PemsI (6-9, Iowa) making their presence felt on the boards.

PRETTY RARE

- Tech, which averaged 68.8 points per game last year, went 11-3 when it scored 70 or more.
- The Hokies scored 70-plus versus Boston College and lost on Feb. 8, marking their first time doing so since Nov. 27 when they took on BYU at the Maui Jim Maui Invitational in a 90-77 setback.
- Then when they scored 95 against Miami (Fla.) in a triple-overtime thriller, it marked their third loss in that fashion.

CHECKING IN ON NET LAST YEAR

- The NET rankings came out on Monday, Dec. 16, 2019, and the Hokies were at No. 62. Tech went 3-7 against quadrant I teams last year and went 4-9 the year before that.
- Tech's best win of the season came against then-No. 3/3 Michigan State, which finished seventh in NET.
- Tech finished the season ranked No. 92.
- In 2018-19, the Hokies, after making a run to the Sweet 16, finished in the final NET rankings at 12th.
- Ironically, Wofford, which was coached by Mike Young at the time, came in two spots below (14).

WELL DONE, NAW

- Former Hokie and New Orleans Pelican Nickeil Alexander-Walker was named to TeamWorld in the 2020 NBA Rising Stars Game last year, which he played on Valentine's Day in Chicago.
- Alexander-Walker tallied six points, two rebounds, four assists one block and a steal in 20 minutes off the bench.
- Team USA won 151-131 in front of over 20,000.

GET IT GOING FROM DOWNTOWN

- Tech was one of the better shooting teams from beyond the arc in the country last season and a big reason why is because it had multiple guys that can stroke it.
- Tech ranked 13th nationally in 3-point field goals made per game with 9.8 and was one of only four schools in a high-major conference to average 9.8 or more makes a game.

- He scored a career-high 27 points against the Miami Heat on Saturday, Nov. 16. He followed it up the next game on Sunday, Nov. 17 with 19 points, five rebounds and four assists versus the Warriors.
- The guard had a big summer with the team, starring on its NBA Summer League squad with having numerous 20-point performances in Las Vegas.

- Robinson, who signed as an undrafted free agent after the NBA Draft concluded with the Washington Wizards, was waived on Jan. 4.
- Hill signed with the Hornets this summer on a two-way deal, but was released in early November. However, he landed nicely on his feet, with now playing on the NAZ Suns, the G-League affiliate of the Phoenix Suns.
- Justin Bibbs, who plays for the Boston Celtics' affiliate (Maine Red Claws), hit a game-winner on Jan. 19, 2019, finishing with 15 points and six assists.

- After Tech's bench was essentially non-existent vs. Chattanooga on Dec. 11 (season-low 5 points), it woke up and ripped off three straight games of scoring 30 or more points on Dec. 15, 21 & 29.
- During that stretch, the Hokies' reserves averaged 40.3 points per game after scoring a combined 121 points, including tying a season-high 49 vs. UMES.
- Tech's bench was made up of four players, with three of the four being freshmen.
- In ACC play, the Hokies' bench averaged 21.7 points per game during the 20-game stretch, with an ACC-high of 36 points at versus [RV/RV] Virginia on Feb. 26.
- With much added depth and potentially rotating 10 players a game, watch out for Tech's bench to be a strong suit once again in 2020-21.

- Tech's Wabissa Bede showed his flashes of being one of the better point guards in the land last year, racking up seven games of owning eight or more assists.



Having just three players returning who saw minutes the previous year in 2018-19 on the team, Young had to act quickly when hired on April 7, 2019 and build a roster to compete in the best conference in the nation. Adding a staff and six scholarship players in a hurry, Young's first season in Blacksburg started off with a bang, as the Hokies went down to South Carolina and defeated Clemson in style to give Young his first Hokie and ACC win, as well as his 300th career victory.

Another big-time W came at the prestigious Maui Jim Maui Invitational against then-No. 3 Michigan State. On ESPN2 with Dan Shulman and Jay Bilas on the call, the young Hokies (7 of the 9 rotation players were underclassmen) pulled off one of the bigger upsets of the season with a 71-66 win. With the upset of Sparty, it marked the first time since 1964 that Tech beat a top-five team in nonconference play.

Despite being the shortest and second-youngest squad among high-major conference teams, Young and Co. tallied 16 wins to make it the most victories by a first-year head coach at Tech since 1999-00 and tied for the fifth-most wins ever by a first-year Hokie coach. He also became the first coach to win two of his first three road ACC games in school history.

Leaning on a mix of young and old in his first season, Young developed junior Wabissa Bede into one of the finer point guards in the country, as Bede would go on to finish with the sixth-best assist-to-turnover ratio nationally (3.34) and first in the ACC. And under Young's tutelage, redshirt freshman Tyrece Radford blossomed into one of the better all-around players in the league, with being one of only two players in the ACC to average 10 points, six rebounds and shoot over 60 percent from the field.

Under the direction of Young, the Hokies put together some new records during the 2019-20 season. On Nov. 20 versus Delaware State, Tech racked up 21 3-pointers, marking the most in school history and the most ever by an ACC team. Speaking of 3s, the 315 hit last season were the second-most in school history.

Four freshmen hit 49 or more 3-pointers, which was the most by any program in over the last 25 years. Behind the young bucks, Tech finished 13th nationally in 3-pointers made per game with 9.9 triples a contest, which was the most in school history.

Utilizing its freshmen on the offensive end last year, Tech finished with its freshmen averaging 50.7 points per game, which is the fourth-most in ACC history behind Duke's 2018-19, 2017-18, 1982-83 teams.


Making sure his team played the game the right way by limiting miscues, Young's prowess showed on Dec. 29 when Tech committed only two turnovers against Maryland Eastern Shore to tie a school record. The Hokies would go on to finish fourth in the nation in fewest turnovers committed per game (9.9).

The Radford, Virginia native joined the Hokies after a record-setting 17-year tenure as the head coach at Wofford. The Terriers posted a 30-5 overall record in 2018-19, including a perfect 18-0 mark in Southern Conference play, and registered a convincing 84-68 win over Seton Hall in the first round of the 2019 NCAA Tournament.

The 2019 Sporting News Coach of the Year, Young built the Terriers into one of the Southern Conference's preeminent programs and a perennial NCAA Tournament participant. He guided Wofford to five NCAA Tournament berths over the past 10 seasons and five Southern Conference championships.

- Mike Young brings a polished resume from his time at Wofford and you can see that in the numbers he carries regarding finishing a lead when his teams have had one over his years of coaching.
- Over the last seven years when Young has had a lead with five minutes to go, he usually holds on to it to preserve the win, boasting a .913 winning percentage to his name.
- Since his arrival to Tech, the Hokies have carried the trend also, owning a 17-2 record.
