RECORDS AND NOTABLES

- Virginia Tech falls to 14-8 overall and 5-6 in ACC play.
- The Hokies are now 1-1 against top-five opponents this season, with Tech being victorious over then-No. 3/3 Michigan State in the Maui Jim Maui Invitational.
- Florida State has defeated Tech six straight times, including their two overtime victories last season.
- Mike Young is 0-1 against the Seminoles and Leonard Hamilton.
- The Hokies last defeated the Seminoles in 2016 in Washington, D.C. and last took down FSU in Blacksburg in 2016.
- Florida State leads the all-time series 36-22.
- **UP NEXT:** The Hokies will travel to Atlanta for a matchup with Georgia Tech on Tuesday, Feb. 4, at 7 p.m. ET inside McCamish Pavilion.

TEAM NOTES

- Virginia Tech started a lineup of Wabissa Bede, Tyrece Radford, Landers Nolley, P.J. Horne, and Nahiem Alleyne, marking the 16th game this season that Tech has gone with these five out of the gate.
- The Seminoles hit 10 3s, which is the most a team has made against Tech since Duke drilled 13 on Dec. 6. It's just the fourth time this season an opponent has hit double digit 3s versus the Hokies.
- FSU outrebounded Tech 32-29, but the Hokies outscored the Seminoles 32-28 in paint points.
- The Seminoles bench outscored Tech's bench 25-17. The Hokies bench scored below 20 points for just the 10th time this year.
- **KEY FIRST HALF RUN:** Trailing by four with just over seven minutes to go in the first, freshman Hunter Cattoor drilled consecutive 3-pointers to cut into the deficit and make the score 20-19 with the Seminoles on top. The Hokies and Seminoles traded baskets late in the first and FSU entered the break leading 34-29.

• **KEY SECOND HALF RUN:** With just under 18 minutes to go in the second, the Seminoles went on an 8-2 run, giving them a 46-36 advantage. The Seminoles nailed a triple with just over a minute to go in action to make the score 70-55 with FSU leading. Florida State would go on to win 70-60.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Tyrece Radford

• Radford scored a team-high 18 points and led Tech in scoring for the second time this season. This is Radford's eighth game scoring in double figures and second straight game doing so.

Landers Nolley

• Nolley's 14 points marks his 20th game scoring in double figures and 10th consecutive outing reaching double digits in points.

Hunter Cattoor

• Cattoor scored 10 points, marking his highest-scoring performance since he recorded 17 against Maryland Eastern Shore on Dec. 21. This is Cattoor's seventh double-digit points performance.

Wabissa Bede

• Bede dished out six assists against Florida State, giving Bede 30 assists over the last five games for 6.0 assists per game average during that stretch.
