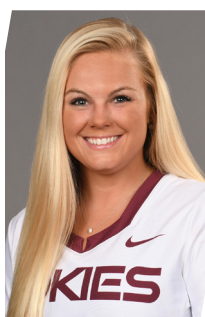

In a top twelve battle Wednesday afternoon, the defending national champion James Madison Dukes went on four-goal run to take control and ended the contest scoring the last three goals to earn a 14-8 victory over No. 12 Virginia Tech Wednesday afternoon from the Beamer-Lawson Indoor Practice Facility.

JMU, whom the Hokies have never beaten in 17 tries, move to 1-1 on the season, as does Tech heading into Saturday's clash against Colorado.

"I think we got off to a good start obviously when we had the lead, and from there we kind of lost a bit of focus and against good teams like JMU we can't do that," head coach John Sung said. "Those little mistakes we have to learn from and move on because we play another top team here this weekend."

The Hokies turned the ball over 17 times Wednesday.

A bright spot was All-American Paige Petty who scored three goals and dished out an assist for a team high four points. She also won six draws in the midfield and scooped up two ground balls.

Mary Claire Byrne, Taylor Caskey, Emma Crooks, Grace Nelson and Julia Bolte each also scored points, with Tech finding a better rhythm and assisting of four of the team's eight goals.

James Madison was paced by five goals from Logan Brennan, a junior attacker who capitalized on her free position opportunities, converting both of her attempts. As a team, JMU was 4 of 8 from the 8-meter line while Virginia Tech was just 2 of 9.

The contest was a physical one with both teams accumulating over 35 fouls and each side had at least one payer carded out of the game.

Molly Dougherty anchored the Dukes' defense, coming up with 10 saves and three ground balls.

Petty's hat trick was her first of the young season and the 11th of her career

Taylor Caskey and Julia Bolte each recorded their first goals of the season

Tech held an advantage in draw controls again this afternoon 14-10, with Emma Crooks and Paige Petty each securing six.

Game Notes

After six Hokies made their first collegiate start in the season opener this past weekend, Lizzie Lohrer a freshman earned her first start against the Dukes. She secured two draw controls and had one ground ball in the game.

IN THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY

- Sung's career record in the month of February is 28-15 (.65)
- In his 11 completed seasons of head coaching, his teams have gone unbeaten in the month of February once, a 5-0 mark with Winthrop in 2016. His best February as a Hokie was his first campaign in 2017 where he was 6-1.

HOKIES' TURNAROUND IN ACC

- Prior to 2017, Virginia Tech was 3-62 all-time in ACC play and had never won a game at the conference tournament.
- Since John Sung has taken the helm, Tech is 8-14 in league contests including winning five games during the historic 2018 season that also saw the Hokies win at the ACC

• Hired on May 27, 2016, Sung joined Virginia Tech after building the Winthrop University program from scratch beginning in May of 2011. He oversaw the program's rapid ascent as a regional powerhouse after beginning competition in 2013. In the program's third season, Sung led Winthrop to a 17-4 record, as the Eagles qualified for the NCAA Tournament after winning both the Big South regular-season and tournament titles. In 2016, Winthrop went 20-3, winning the Big South Tournament championship and advancing to another NCAA Tournament. The 2016 season marked the team's second consecutive Big South regular-season and tournament titles.

• In just three seasons in Blacksburg, John Sung has guided the Virginia Tech lacrosse program to new heights, including its first appearance in the NCAA tournament in 2018 as the Hokies advanced into the Round of 16.

• Sung's Hokies have reset records for wins in a season, ACC wins, goals against average, point scored and goals scored in a single season and Sung, a former goalie, helped Meagh Graham set the program record for lowest goals against average in a season at 9.64 during the 2017 campaign.

• In his first season in Blacksburg, Sung engineered the best turnaround in program history winning six more games than the previous season. In 2017, the Hokies won 11 games, equaling the tally of the 1999 squad and reaching double figure wins for the first time since 2012. The team set program records in several categories including ACC wins in a season, goals scored, and points scored.

• The 2015 and 2016 Big South Coach of the Year, Sung formerly was the chair of the NCAA Division I Lacrosse Committee and also serves on the U.S. Lacrosse Convention Education Committee. His 2015 squad set Big South single-season records for points, goals (314), free-position goals (67), shots (633), shots on goal (459), ground balls (384), draw controls (312), and caused turnovers (213). In 2016, Winthrop scored 301 goals, including 58 free-position goals. The Eagles set Big South single-season marks for shots (662), ground balls (434), and caused turnovers (266).

• In addition to compiling a 54-26 overall record at Winthrop, Sung led the Haudenosaunee Nation to the quarterfinals of the 2013 Federation of International Lacrosse World Cup held in Canada. The team finished in seventh place out of a total of 19 teams. He also coached the team in the 2009 Federation of International Lacrosse in the Czech Republic.

• Sung's ascent as an NCAA coach began at Division III Adrian College in Michigan, where he started the program from the ground up and compiled a 46-19 overall record. His 2011 squad started the season 1-4 before registering 15 consecutive victories to earn a berth in the NCAA Division III Tournament. After posting a 6-7 overall record in its first season in 2008, the program went 10-4 in 2009, 14-3 in 2010 and 16-5 in 2011.

• Before beginning the program at Adrian College, Sung spent five years as the assistant women's club lacrosse coach at the University of Michigan, setting the groundwork for that program to eventually become a varsity sport in the Big Ten. The Wolverines accumulated a 93-22 record during this tenure.

• A longtime trainer of goalies, Sung has held various coaching positions with Birmingham Seaholm High School and the Detroit Lacrosse Club. He has been the assistant director of the Great Lakes Women's Lacrosse Camp since 1997. In addition to his work at various levels in the lacrosse community, Sung has a wealth of sales and management experience in the private sector.

• Sung was the starting goalkeeper of the Oakland University lacrosse team in 1997 and 1998 and was also a two-year captain. He was also member of two International Cup U16 championship teams in 1993 and 1994. He completed his degree in Bachelor of Arts degree in communications from Oakland in 2007.

• Sung, who resides in Blacksburg with his wife Tina, has three stepsons; Darek, Devin and Zachary, and a daughter Abby.

On Feb. 23, 2019 Virginia Tech played the first half of a game at Duke in orange uniforms playing to a 5-5 tie. At halftime, the squad changed into black uniforms due to weather and Coach Sung wanting the players' equipment to be dry. Tech ultimately lost 11-10 in overtime to the Blue Devils. With the game tied in orange, the result is listed as a game in black.

ALL-ACC TALENTS RETURN

- Tech placed three student-athletes on the ACC's All-Conference Team in 2019, midfielder Paige Petty, midfielder Emma Crooks and defender Elena Ricci.
- Crooks, Tech's primary draw taker, led the team with 74 last season and was also the second leading scorer with 42 tallies and 48 total points. The junior from Great Falls, Virginia earned second-team accolades.
- Junior defender Elena Ricci joined Crooks on the second team, following a season where she coralled 66 draws and also had 39 ground ball pickups. She caused 18 turnovers in 2019.

PETTY ALREADY TECH'S MOST DECORATED PLAYER

- After just two seasons, midfielder Paige Petty has already placed herself amongst some of the best to ever play at Tech.
- Petty is the only Hokie to ever earn multiple first team All-ACC awards, multiple IWLCA All-Region selections and an All-American nod in 2018.
- She begins the 2020 season ranking 10th in career points, sixth in goals, and seventh in draw conrols in Virginia Tech history.

BERMAN ON THE SHELF FOR 2020

- Junior goalie Morgan Berman who started all 18 games a season ago, will sit out the 2020 campaign as she recovers from an ACL tear suffered during the fall.
- She has registered a 12.07 goals against average in 24 appearances. In 2019 she recorded 46 ground balls and caused six turnovers, winning eight games. She made 142 saves.

SO WHO WILL BE IN THE CAGE THIS SEASON

- Tech has three other goalies on the roster, senior Sydney Gagnon, freshman Maggie Lyons and senior Angie Bensomn who joined the Hokies in January.
- Gagnon has played in 11 games in her career coming up with 11 saves and owning a 6.00 goals against average. She has registered one win.
- Lyons hails from Great Falls, Virginia and spent the last four years prepping at Georgetown Visitation. She has been named; DC Metro Schoolgirls Team One in 2017 and 2018, US Lacrosse Schoolgirls Player of the Year Runner-Up in 2018, All-ISL Team One in 2018 & 2019 and a US Lacrosse All-American in 2019. She plans to major in criminology and aspires to be a criminal analyst or a psychologist.
- Benson played for the Towson Tigers in 2016 and 2017 before taking time off from the game. With the Tigers she tallied a 26-9 record and owned a 8.06 goals against average. She registered 224 saves (.463 save percentage) and corralled 46 ground balls and caused seven turnovers.

LOOKING FOR TECH'S INITIAL VICTORY

- The 2020 schedule features two programs that the Hokies have never defeated with multiple opportunities, James Madison (0-17) and North Carolina (0-29).
- Tech will face JMU February 12 in Harrisonburg and will see the Tar Heels on April 4 in Chapel Hill.

Freshman midfielder Kayla Frank scored the game's first three goals, part of a 5-0 run and the Virginia Tech lacrosse team got off to a winning start to the 2020 season Saturday afternoon inside the Beamer-Lawson Indoor Practice Facility defeating Davidson 17-10.

Tech begins the season with a victory for the third time in the last four years ahead of an in-state showdown at James Madison Wednesday in Harrisonburg.

"Eight points in her first college game is a great starting point for the year," head coach John Sung said of the Moorestown, New Jersey native who scored three times and provided a game-high five assists.

Frank was a part of the starting midfield with juniors Paige Petty and Emma Crooks that combined to score 16 of the squad's 27 points in the game. All three recorded hat tricks and freshman Jacelyn Lazore also added two goals from the midfield.

In the attack, senior Julia Bolte provided four points (two goals, two assists) and captain Taylor Caskey added three points (one goal, two assists).

In goal for Tech was Angie Benson making her first appearance on a competitive lacrosse field in two year. The Palm City, Florida native recorded 11 saves and two ground balls in 48 minutes of work. She faced 25 shots from the Wildcats.

Down the stretch, the Hokies held a 16-5 lead before Davidson scored five of the game's final six goals.

Davidson was led by three points apiece from Oliva Carey and Sam Rippley. Starting goalie Delaney Guhman made 12 saves.

INSIDE THE BOX SCORE

Tech held an edge on the draw circle 16-13. Emma Crooks led the team with six. Both teams were efficient on the clear, with Tech converting 20-22 opportunities and Davidson 18-21.

The Wildcats out shot the Hokies 30-28, but Tech placed more on frame 23-21.

GAME NOTES

Eight Hokies saw their first action, seven freshmen and goalie Angie Benson.

All three of Tech's active goalies saw time in the game.

With her two assists, Taylor Caskey moved into a tie for 10th place all-time in that category with 42. The senior has 111 total points.
