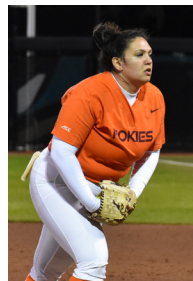

BASE TO BASE

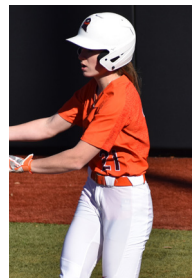
- Taking on five ranked teams in a row during the regular season for the first time in school history, Virginia Tech softball will play five games in four days at the St. Pete/Clearwater Elite Invitational on ESPN's family of networks.
- Tech enters the tourney with a 4-1 record after it nearly left South Carolina perfect last weekend at the Kickin' Chicken Classic, falling to Iowa in extras on the final day.
- The Hokies once again had the bats going early, scoring 10-plus runs twice in their opening weekend for the second straight year.
- Tech coach Pete D'Amour, who is 2-4 versus ranked foes at Tech, and his Hokies will have their toughest test yet in the Sunshine State.

WHO TO WATCH



- Preseason All-ACC selection Keely Rochard was steady opening weekend at the Kickin' Chicken Classic in the circle.
- The pitcher turned in at least nine strikeouts in all three outings and less than one walk a contest.

- Transferring from JMU and making an immediate contribution, outfielder Kelsey Brown is off to pretty stellar start as a Hokie.
- Brown leads the team in batting average, hits, runs scored and stolen bases.



LAST TIME OUT

- Playing in its first extra-inning game since its battle in Athens with then-No. 8/8 Georgia last season, Tech came up short versus Iowa 4-3 in the eighth to close opening weekend.
- The Hawkeyes jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the second inning, but the Hokies got a leadoff home run by Grayson Cruce to spark a rally to take a 3-2 lead. But Iowa answered with two unanswered.
- Pitcher Keely Rochard dazzled with 15 Ks.

GREENSBORO, N.C. – Six-time Atlantic Coast Conference Champion Florida State leads all ACC teams with five selections to 2020 Preseason All-ACC Softball Team and has been chosen as the 2020 ACC softball preseason favorite in a vote of the league's 13 head coaches.

The Seminoles have won six straight ACC Softball Championships and received 10 first-place votes. Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own teams.

Virginia Tech has the second-most selections of any team with four representatives, while North Carolina and Notre Dame have two selections each. Georgia Tech and Louisville each had one representative on the team.

HOKIE CLEARWATER STORYLINES

- There are some pretty interesting story lines for the Hokies when they take on three teams in particular in Clearwater.
- First one would have to be their first game taking on Oklahoma State, a team that has their ACC Pitcher of the Year a season ago in Carrie Eberle.
- Second storyline is that Tech will take on Missouri, a team that coach Pete D'Amour was a part of for roughly a decade, getting the Tigers to the Women's College World Series three times.
- Lastly, outfielder Al Velazquez will go up against her former team in Minnesota. She was a part of their Big Ten title in 2018 before transferring to the Hokies last year.

SOMETHING ABOUT THE OPENER

- For the second straight season under Pete D'Amour's direction, the Hokies broke the school record for stolen bases in the season-opening weekend.
- Tech put together eight steals at Coastal Carolina last Friday night, topping the previous high of seven set versus Purdue last year.
- The Hokies, as stated on the first page, rank 10th in the country in steals per game (3.0).

RACK 'EM UP

- When pitcher Keely Rochard threw 15 chairs against Iowa, it marked the first time a Hokie had 15 Ks since Feb. 27, 2016, when Maggie Tyler had 15 of her own versus USC Upstate.

SHE CAN WRITE, TOO

- Junior catcher Mackenzie Lawter writes a blog on Justin's World of Softball's website, sharing her thoughts on the season and what she is up to off the diamond as well.
- A multimedia journalism major, Lawter jokingly says she's one of the better writers on the team.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

- Tech's twin sisters - Ashley and Ansley Whitley - are one of 21 twins in Division I softball. The power duo are identical as well, so good luck telling them apart.
- When the two got here this past fall, Tech coach Pete D'Amour joked he couldn't tell them apart when they weren't together - but he's good now.

LITTLE CRAY TO SAY THE LEAST

- The improvement in numbers from 2018 to 2019 are pretty drastic to say the least thanks to a new coaching staff and players playing up to their potential.

A WEEKEND FOR FIRSTS

- The long ball was a common theme for the Hokies in Conway to open up the season, seeing seven players hit a home run. Of the seven, three did it for the first time at the college level.
- For the first-timers, freshman Ashley Whitley went yard first with a three-run bomb to right center versus Campbell, sophomore Kelsey Brown followed in the next game against East Carolina with solo shot to left center and freshman Grayson Cruce capped off the newbies with a solo homer to left center versus Iowa on Sunday.

A HISTORY LESSON

- Tech has been to nine regionals in its storied history, including five of the last nine years, and owns an overall record of 14-17 in regionals.
- The kicker is that it hasn't made it out of one since 2008, when it went onto the Ann Arbor Super Regional and eventually the WCWS.
- Of the nine NCAA regional trips, eight of the nine have been on SEC campuses.

TALK ABOUT A TURNAROUND

- Under Tech coach Pete D'Amour's guidance, Tech cracked the NCAA record book for biggest turnarounds.
- The minimum is 20 more wins than the previous season. Tech's 21 1/2-win differential is tied for the 18th-most in NCAA history and most since 2011, when Indiana had a 21 1/2-game turnaround.

ACC REGULAR-SEASON CHAMPS

- For the first time since 2007 and only the second time in school history, the Hokies came away with the best record in the ACC during the regular season.
- Tech's 20-4 record in ACC play topped Florida State's clip of 19-5, giving them a one-game advantage and the crown. It also won the Coastal Division for the first time in program history.
- But the Seminoles would get it done in the ACC Championship, winning the 10-team tournament on their home field.

THE BEST IN THE ACC

- Last season, Tech led the ACC in a few categories when it came to the plate and the circle.
- The Hokies boasted three team categories that sat atop the league's stats.
- As a team, Tech had the best batting average (.334), fewest hits allowed (293) and shutouts (22).

OUT AHEAD

- The Hokies last year typically got off to a fast start, outscoring their opponents 235-32 in the first three innings of games in Year 1 of the Pete D'Amour era.
- They outscored their opponents 90-10 in the first inning, 62-11 in the second and 83-11 in the third.
- Tech went 45-3 when it scored first last year and an underwhelming 2-8 when its opponent scored first.
- So far this season, the Hokies are outscoring their opponent 12-6 the first three innings and are 3-0 when they score first and 1-1 when the opponent scores first.

BACK FOR MORE

- Outfielder Al Velazquez is back after tying a school-record 50 runs scored last season with then-senior Emma Strouth.

SHUT 'EM DOWN

- Pitcher Keely Rochard had a knack for not allowing an opponent to sniff the plate in 2019.
- She was one of only 19 players to have 10 or more shutouts and finished tied for eighth in the land with 11 on the season.
- The Hokies have a chance of seeing a player who was also one of the top 19 players in Northwestern's Danielle Williams (13 shutouts) on Sunday.

A SENSE OF URGENCY

- The Hokies batted a sizzling .598 (79 of 132) with a runner on third base and there are less than two outs in 2019. Having a sense of urgency, Tech typically knocked that runner in - and then some.

THEY DIG THE LONG BALL

- Tech set a school record for the most home runs hit in a season in 2019, boasting 97 for the fifth most in the nation.
- What puts it in perspective is that they only hit 35 last season, including the team high for a player being just eight. Last season, the Hokies had four players with eight or more homers.

DIAPER DANDIES

- Kelsey Bennett and Jayme Bailey were named to the Schutt Sports/NFCA National Freshman of the Year Top 25 list on April 18, 2019, becoming the first-ever Hokies to make the list.
- With them making the list, they were one of only two schools to boast two players (UCLA).
- Bennett would make the top 10 list, as announced on May 9, 2019, the only freshie out of the ACC.

REJECTED

- Tech blanked in-state rival Virginia in all three games of the series last year, clinching a point in the Commonwealth Clash, as well as holding the Wahoos to never reaching third base or home plate.
- It marked the second straight year that the Hokies swept the Cavaliers and the first time ever holding an opponent scoreless in a three-game series.

ROCHARD SPINS PERFECT GAME

- After taking a loss to then-No. 8/8 Georgia in March, pitcher Keely Rochard got another chance in the circle versus a ranked team and did not disappoint.
- Rochard, who was quoted after the game saying she wanted another shot versus a top opponent, put together her best game yet against then-No. 20/17 JMU in Blacksburg, throwing a perfect game.
- The righty finished with 60 pitches in five innings of work, getting her 15 outs by nine pop ups, two grounders and four Ks.
- It marked the seventh perfect game in program history and first since Jasmine Harrell's on May 1, 2012, in a 9-0 win over Liberty in five innings.

JOINING ELITE COMPANY

- Pitcher Keely Rochard became just the fifth Hokie to pitch a perfect game, joining Angela Tincher (2), Ashlee Dobbe (2), Katie Maynard (1) and Jasmine Harrell (1).
- It also marked Rochard's third no-hit game of the season, as she threw two no-nos in February of 2019.
- Her three no-nos made her one of only five players in school history to have three or more no-hitters, joining Angela Tincher (14), Ashlee Dobbe (8), Clarisa Crowell (4) and Kelly Heinz (3).

RUN-RULIN' THE BEST

- Before Tech's 12-0 [5] victory over then-No. 20/17 JMU, the last time Tech run-ruled a ranked team takes you all the way back to April 1, 2007, when it defeated No. 24 NC State 8-0 [5].
- But that was the only time previously in history that's happened, making the JMU accomplishment just the second time in school history.

NOT IN OUR HOUSE

- The win over nationally ranked JMU on April 10 marked the first time Tech had won at home versus a top-25 team since April 6, 2016, which was ironically versus JMU.
- The last time Tech played in a game when both teams were ranked and won at home was on April 26, 2008, against No. 14 North Carolina. It also marked Coach D'Amour's first ranked win at TSP.
- It was Tech's 18th win at home against a ranked team.

AFTER SIX A LOCK

- After losing to then-No. 20/17 JMU on April 10 in the first game of a doubleheader 3-1, it marked the first time Tech had blown a lead late in a game all year.
- Coming into the contest, the Hokies were a perfect 20-0 when leading after six innings of action.
- Even more impressive is Pete D'Amour's head coaching record when leading after six. He's 87-3, making that only his third game to slip away like that, losing two in that fashion at Kennesaw State.

GOOD THINGS COME TO AN END

- Outfielder Al Velazquez put quite a streak together, 23 games in a row reaching base, but it was snapped on April 7, 2019 at Duke.
- The streak, which dated all the way back to Feb. 27 against Radford, was the longest by a Hokie that season and set a career high for the sophomore.
- Her hitting streak during that time span got up to 10 games.

SAY IT AIN'T SO

- The school record at Tech for consecutive games played without an error was six, which was set Feb. 28-March 8, 2007.
- After their series at Duke in 2019, the record fell with the Hokies playing nine straight errorless games before making one in the series finale. Tech went 8-1 during that stretch.

TECH IN THE POLLS

- After finishing the 2019 season ranked No. 23 in the NFCA poll and No. 21 in the USA Softball poll, Virginia Tech looks to build off a stellar first year in the Pete D'Amour era.
- The Hokies, who are receiving votes in both major preseason polls, bring back four NFCA all-region selections in 2020 and look to defend their ACC regular-season title.
- No. 19 was the highest Tech got to in 2019 in USA Softball's poll. The last time Tech was as high as No. 19 in the poll was on March 20, 2013.

CLOSE ONES

- Coach Pete D'Amour has a knack for winning close games and has put that on display since his arrival to Blacksburg.
- D'Amour owns a 26-16 record in one-run games and went 5-1 in 2019.
- However, he's 0-1 this year with a 4-3 loss to Iowa.

WHEN THE BIG DOGS SHOW UP

- Tech has had its fair share of ranked opponents come through Tech Softball Park (49 games).
- The Hokies are 18-33 (.353) in those games and are 5-7 (.417) when Tech is ranked, too.
- Before April 10, 2019, the last time Tech was ranked and beat a ranked team at home was on April 26, 2008, when it took down No. 14 North Carolina 5-2 [10] when the Hokies were ranked No. 18.

- The Hokies dealt a pretty good hand to the Cards in late March of 2019, winning the series over Louisville, 2-1, and outscoring the Cards 28-13 in Blacksburg.
- The two wins for Tech were run-rules, marking only the second time in school history the Hokies have run-ruled an ACC team in back-to-back games.
- The last time that happened was against Boston College on April 11, 2009, in a doubleheader. Tech won the first game 14-6 in six innings and the second game 9-1 in six innings.

HOT CORNER

- Though she's a sophomore now starting at short-stop, Kelsey Bennett was one of a select few to start at third base in every game as freshmen in the Power Five in 2019.
- The few are three players, including Baylor's Kassidy Krupit, Oregon's Rachel Cid and Virginia Tech's Kelsey Bennett.

- The ACC selected two Hokies on March 12 - Kelsey Bennett (Player) and Carrie Eberle (Pitcher).
- On April 2, Bennett earned her second ACC Co-Player of the Week.
- Tech swept the ACC weekly awards again, this time doing it on April 16 when Keely Rochard won Pitcher of the Week and Emma Strouth was Co-Player of the Week.

IT'S BEEN A MINUTE

- When the Hokies beat then-eighth-ranked Georgia on March 1, 2019, it marked their first win over a top 10-opponent since 2016 vs. No. 6 JMU.
- It also marked Tech's first road win over a ranked opponent since May 19, 2013, when Tech beat No. 17 Kentucky in an NCAA Regional.
- Darby Trull hit the would be game-winning RBI in the top of the eighth to win it versus the Bulldogs, knocking in Maddi Banks.

ROCHARD MAKES HISTORY

- Sophomore Keely Rochard was on her A-game in the circle the week of Feb. 15-17, 2019, facing 38 batters and not surrendering a hit and only allowing three walks to Detroit Mercy and Charleston Southern.
- Her two no-hitters made her the third player in school history to have consecutive no-nos, joining Clarissa Crowell (1999) and Ashlee Dobbe (2000).
- She also became the first player since 2000 to accomplish the feat and only the sixth Hokie to post two or more no-hitters, as well as the first no-hitter since Feb. 24, 2017, when Aysha Richardson did it against Seton Hall in five innings.
- Rochard later threw a perfect game on April 10 against No. 20/17 JMU, bringing her no-hitter total to three games.

NFCA TIDBITS

- Tech's Pete D'Amour became only the second coach in school history and he brought in a new staff with him.
- His first hire came on June 27, 2018, when he tabbed Kirin Kumar as an assistant coach. Kumar, who has ties to the ACC, comes most recently from NC State and played at Georgia Tech.
- Coming with him from the Peach State, Doug Gillis was hired on August 10, 2018, after being the pitching coach at Kennesaw State. He holds the same role in Blacksburg.
- He added volunteer assistant Andrew Stover this past fall, a former high school coach in Roanoke, which is roughly 45 minutes north of Blacksburg.
- Former All-American at Missouri Sami Fagan joined the staff in the winter of 2018 after playing professionally in Japan and the United States. She holds the title of coordinator of player development.
- Caitlyn Nolan, a senior last year who broke the single-season home run record, is now a student assistant.

The Virginia Tech softball team has the luxury of playing and practicing in some of the finest facilities on the East Coast. Using the Tech Softball Park, Softball Indoor Facility and a state-of-the-art weight room, the Hokies train in terrific facilities designed to help them win championships. Combined with a new locker room and one of the best scoreboard and video boards in the country, the Hokies have it all when it comes to what they need to win.

Tech Softball Park, which was completed in the fall of 1997, has dimensions of 200 feet down the lines and 220 feet to center field. In January of 2008, an additional 746 permanent seats were installed, bringing the capacity up from 336 to 1,024. The new bleachers match the ones that were already in place and now extend down to the end of both dugouts.

Thanks to an anonymous donation, TSP now has seatbacks in the section behind home plate, which was completed in fall 2017.

In 2008, the Hokies reached new levels, culminating with a trip to Oklahoma City for the Women's College World Series. After finishing second in the regular season, the Hokies rolled through the ACC Tournament for the second time in a row, guaranteeing them their fourth straight NCAA Regional appearance.

Pitcher Angela Tincher led the way in the circle, winning All-America honors and National Player of the Year. She became only the third person at the time in NCAA softball history to rack up over 2,000 career strikeouts.

The Hokies made their first trip ever to the WCWS and finished the season with a school-record 50 wins, program-best 16 ACC wins and highest-ever finish in the NFCA poll with a No. 8 ranking in the final poll.

Tech also had a historic upset of the U.S. National Team, breaking the Red, White & Blue's 185-game, pre-Olympic exhibition tour winning streak with a 1-0 win on March 26.

What's a Hokie?



The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which is still used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

The official university school colors - Chicago Maroon and Burnt Orange - also were introduced in 1896. The colors were chosen by a committee because they made a 'unique combination' not worn elsewhere at the time. The official definition of "Hokie" is "a loyal Virginia Tech Fan".

SOFTBALL INDOOR FACILITY

- The facility, which is attached to Rector Field House (track & field) and immediately adjacent to Tech Softball Park, opened the fall 2018 and provides the Hokies with an indoor infield for practice during inclement weather, along with four cages for hitting and pitching practice.
- The one-story building also features two coaches rooms, an equipment room, a team room, a film room, a mudroom and team facilities. The facility will be available to the program year-round and will have uses for practice, team events and gameday necessities. The new facility will encompass more than 16,000 square feet.
- The facility was designed by Cannon Designs and was built by Branch Associates of Salem, Virginia. This project was a part of a larger plan that vastly improved Rector Field House (track & field) and all of the adjacent athletics facilities. Total cost was roughly \$18 million.

Guiding Virginia Tech to one of the biggest turnarounds in NCAA softball history, Pete D'Amour led the Hokies in his first year to a 24-game win improvement in 2019 after posting a 47-11 record, including a 20-4 mark in ACC play.

The 47 wins were the fourth most in school history while the 20 ACC wins were the most in program history. On Tech's way to 20 league wins, it earned an ACC regular-season title and a Coastal Division crown after being picked 10th in the ACC preseason poll. By doing so, it also earned the Hokies their first trip to the NCAA Tournament since 2015, winning two games at the Lexington Regional to pick up their first NCAA win since 2014.

No stranger to success, D'Amour, out of the new 11 Power Five head coaches in 2019, picked up the most wins of the group. The 2019 ACC Coach of the Year earned the nod to mark just Tech's second time winning it, while a school-record five Hokies made an All-ACC first team. Under D'Amour's direction, pitcher Carrie Eberle was named ACC Pitcher of the Year and third baseman Kelsey Bennett was tabbed Freshman of the Year.

He also tutored two Softball America All-Americans in outfielders Emma Strouth and Darby Trull, who both hit over .400 and tallied 60-plus putouts, as well as a school-record seven NFCA All-Region (Mid-Atlantic) selections and a school-record eight VaSID all-stars. D'Amour also was tabbed VaSID Coach of the Year.

Under his watch, Tech became ranked during the season, something that hadn't been done since 2015, and got up to as high as No. 19 in the ESPN.com/USA Softball poll and No. 22 in the USA Today/NFCA poll. The Hokies were ranked for 11 consecutive weeks in the ESPN.com/USA Softball poll, breaking the program record set in 2007 of 10 weeks, and picked up two ranked wins on the year, beating then-No. 8/8 Georgia and then-No. 20/17 JMU.

Tech took big strides at the plate in '19, resetting over 20 individual and team school records, including batting average (.334) and home runs (97), just to name a few. The Hokies led the ACC in batting average and home runs per game (1.67), while also getting it done in the circle with shutouts (22). D'Amour had the Hokies ready to play against in-state rival Virginia in the Commonwealth Clash presented by Virginia529, sweeping the Cavaliers 3-0 and not allowing a runner to touch third base or home plate in the series, a first in program history, for three shutout wins.

D'Amour joined the Hokies after two seasons as the head coach at Kennesaw State, where he led the Owls to a 79-37 record and two postseason appearances. Before taking over the Kennesaw State program in 2017, he earned a reputation as one of the nation's premier recruiters during his 10-year tenure as assistant coach at the University of Missouri, a perennial NCAA tournament participant.

D'Amour coached Kennesaw State to the 2018 Atlantic Sun Conference regular season and tournament championships en route to the program's first NCAA Regional appearance since transitioning to the Division I level in 2006, as the Owls finished the year with a 39-17 record. In his inaugural year as head coach at Kennesaw State in 2017, he guided the Owls to a 40-20 overall record and a berth in the National Invitational Softball Championship.

Kennesaw State went 39-17 and 14-3 in the ASUN in 2018 and earned a No. 3 seed in the Tallahassee Regional. D'Amour was named ASUN Coach of the Year and seven Owls earned ASUN all-conference accolades, including ASUN Pitcher of the Year Alley Cutting and ASUN Freshman of the Year Patricia Awald. Awald was one of 25 finalists up for NFCA National Freshman of the Year.

Prior to accepting the head coaching job at Kennesaw State, D'Amour spent a decade at Missouri as an assistant coach, serving as associate head coach for his final two seasons in 2015-16. During his tenure in Columbia, the Tigers qualified for the NCAA tournament in each of his 10 seasons on the staff, reaching five NCAA super regionals and earning three consecutive trips to the Women's College World Series from 2009-11.

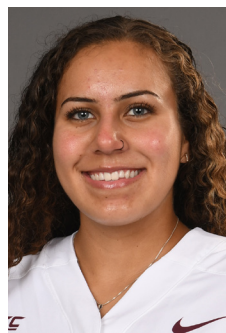
