Virginia Tech Hokies vs. Miami Hurricanes

FINAL SCORE: Virginia Tech 95, Miami 102 (3OT)

RECORDS AND NOTABLES

- Virginia Tech falls to 15-11 overall and 6-9 in ACC play.
- This triple-overtime loss marks the first time since 1983 that Tech has gone into a third overtime. Tech lost to West Virginia 90-86.
- This is the first triple-overtime game in the ACC since Wake Forest and North Carolina in 2003.
- The three-overtime thriller marked the fourth-ever in school history.
- Mike Young is now 0-3 versus Miami and 1-3 versus Jim Larrañaga.
- This is Miami's first win in Cassell Coliseum since 2018 and just its second win in Cassell in the last five years in as many games.
- Tech is now 11-5 at home this season and 3-5 at home in ACC play.
- Virginia Tech trails in the all-time series versus Miami 24-17.
- **UP NEXT:** The Hokies will travel to Durham, N.C. for an outing with Duke on Saturday at 8 p.m. inside Cameron Indoor Stadium.

TEAM NOTES

- Virginia Tech started a lineup of Wabissa Bede, Tyrece Radford, Landers Nolley, P.J. Horne, and Nahiem Alleyne, marking the 20th game this season that Tech has started these five. The starting lineup is averaging 49.2 points per game.
- Tyrece Radford and Landers Nolley's double-doubles marked the first time two Tech players have notched double-doubles in the same game since Kerry Blackshear and Chris Clarke against The Citadel in 2017.
- Virginia Tech's bench scored 30 or more points for the sixth time this season and scored over 20 points for the 16th time this year.
- **KEY FIRST HALF RUN:** With 10:21 to go in the first trailing 17-15, redshirt freshman Tyrece Radford finished off a layup and then guard Hunter Cattoor drilled a three, giving Tech 20-17 advantage for its first lead of the game. Leading 32-27 with 4:17 to go in the half, the Hurricanes went on a 9-5 run to enter the break leading 41-32.

- **KEY SECOND HALF RUN:** With 10:34 to go in the second, the Hokies were trailing 56-48 when Radford finished off an old fashioned three-point play followed by a 3-pointer from guard Jalen Cone which was a part of a 14-3 run. Trailing 74-72 with 1:09 left in the game, Nolley hit two free throws followed by a lay-in from Radford giving Tech a 76-74 lead. Miami forced overtime.
- **OVERTIME:** Tech begins overtime on a 7-3 run sparked from a turnaround jumper from Nahiem Alleyne, giving them an advantage of 84-80. Miami ended on a 4-0 to go into double-overtime.
- **DOUBLE OVERTIME:** Trailing at 88-86 with 1:20 to go Radford hit a floater over the backboard followed by a jumper from junior Wabissa Bede to give Tech a 90-88 lead. Miami hit a shot 16 seconds to force our third overtime.
- **TRIPLE OVERTIME:** Miami went on an 8-3 run in triple OT and went on to win 102-95.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Tyrece Radford

- Radford scored a career-high 26 points and registered his third double-double of the season with 10 rebounds.

Landers Nolley II

- Nolley scored 18 points with 11 rebounds, giving him his third double-double this season and second out of the last three games.

John Ojiako

- Ojiako notched a career-high five blocks and also added six boards.

Jalen Cone

- Cone posted his career high in points with 20 and hit four triples for the second straight game.
