RECORDS AND NOTABLES

- Virginia Tech goes to 14-9 overall and 5-7 in ACC play.
- The Hokies have now dropped four straight games for the first time this season and are 3-4 on the road overall.
- Mike Young is now 1-3 against both Georgia Tech and Josh Pastner.
- This marks the Yellow Jackets' first win over Virginia Tech Tech since 2014, snapping a six-game losing streak
- Virginia Tech leads the all-time series 20-7.
- **UP NEXT:** The Hokies will return to Blacksburg for a three-game home slate beginning with Boston College on Saturday at noon at Cassell Coliseum.

TEAM NOTES

- Virginia Tech started a lineup of Wabissa Bede, Tyrece Radford, Landers Nolley, P.J. Horne, and Nahiem Alleyne, marking the 17th game this season that Tech has gone with these five out of the gate.
- The Yellow Jackets shot over 50 percent from the field, as well as hitting eight 3-pointers.
- Georgia Tech outrebounded the Hokies 37-30 and recorded more points in the paint with a margin of 34-22.
- Virginia Tech's bench did outscore the Yellow Jackets bench 22-16. This marks the 14th game this season the Hokies' bench has scored 20 or more points.
- **KEY FIRST HALF RUN:** Georgia Tech went on a 15-2 run over a nine-minute stretch beginning early in the first half. This run would prove to be too much for the Hokies as the Yellow Jackets entered the break leading 38-18.
- **KEY SECOND HALF RUN:** With just over 15 minutes to go in the game, Georgia Tech went on a 10-3 run giving the Yellow Jackets a 57-28 advantage. Georgia Tech led the rest of the way and would go on to win 76-57.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Tyrece Radford

• Radford scored a team-high 12 points and led Tech in scoring for the third time this season. This is Radford's ninth game scoring in double figures and third straight game doing so.

Landers Nolley

• Nolley's 10 points marks his 21st game scoring in double figures and 11th consecutive outing reaching double digits in points.

Wabissa Bede

• Bede tied his career high in blocks with two at Georgia Tech.

Branden Johnson

• Johnson scored the first points of his Tech career with four on the night and had a career-high five rebounds.
