## TECH OPENS FIFTH SEASON UNDER FUENTE

- Virginia Tech opens its fifth season under head coach Justin Fuente in 2020 as NC State visits Lane Stadium.
- The Hokies will open the season with an ACC opponent for the third consecutive year after two straight road openers at BC (8/31/19) and at FSU (9/3/18).
- Tech owns a four-game winning streak vs. NC State, but this contest will mark the first clash against the Wolfpack under Fuente. The two teams haven't met since 2015 and NC State hasn't won in Blacksburg since 2004.
- NC State finished the 2019 campaign with a 4-8 mark and is seeking to snap a five-game ACC losing streak.
- Fuente's 33 wins are the most accumulated by any Tech head coach in his initial four seasons with the Hokies.
- Clemson's Dabo Swinney is the only active ACC head coach who can top Fuente's 33 wins in his first four full seasons at an ACC school.
- Tech is ranked No. 20 in the AP Top 25 and is No. 24 in the Amway/USA Today Coaches Poll.
- The Hokies haven't played their opening game this late in 70 seasons since opening 1950 vs. Quantico (9/30/50).
- NC State opened its season with a 45-42 home win vs. Wake Forest (9/19).

## HOME SWEET HOME - LANE STADIUM

- Virginia Tech is 4-0 in home openers under Fuente and has won its last three ACC contests at Lane Stadium.
  - Tech went 6-1 at home in 2019, marking the third time in four seasons under Fuente that VT has suffered only one home loss.
- ## KEY SCORING STATS ON HOKIES, WOLFPACK
- VT is 23-5 when scoring 30+ points under Fuente.
  - NC State is 7-23 in ACC play when allowing 30+ points under Doeren, including an 0-6 mark in 2019.
  - VT owns a 28-2 mark under Fuente when leading at half.
  - VT is 31-2 when holding foes to 21 points or fewer dating back to the start of the 2015 season (6-1 in 2019).
  - NC State is 2-25 under in ACC games under Doeren when scoring 21 points or fewer (0-6 mark in 2019).
  - VT has won 25 straight games when limiting foes to 17 points or fewer (6-0 in 2019).
  - NC State is 3-20 under Doeren when scoring 17 points or fewer.

## BUSINESS IS BOOMING FOR BRADBURN

- P Oscar Bradburn set a Tech single-season record with a 46.5-yard average, breaking the previous mark of 45.1 (Jimmy Kibble, 1997). Bradburn currently holds Tech's record for career punting average at 43.7.
- The Ray Guy Award semifinalist ranked eighth among FBS punters with that 46.5-yard gross avg. in 2019.

## LB RAYSHARD ASHBY = TACKLING MACHINE

- LB Rayshard Ashby led the ACC with 120 tackles (61 solo), making him the only active player in the league with back-to-back 100-tackle seasons. He enters 2020 as the ACC's top returning tackler for the second year in a row.
- Ashby's 120 tackles were the most by a VT player since Vince Hall had 128 in 2006. He's accumulated 225 tackles the past two years, the most in back-to-back seasons since Hall's 228 (2005-06).
- Ashby earned ACC Linebacker of the Week honors five times in 2019, the most POW accolades of any defensive player in the league in 2019.
- Ashby led Tech and ranked third in the ACC with 17.0 tackles for loss in 2019, a total that ranked eighth among FBS linebackers. Those 17.0 TFL ranked third by a Tech player since 1999, trailing Tremaine Edmunds (18.5 in 2016) and Taylor (18 in 2001).

## HAMILTON TAKES OVER TECH'S DEFENSE

- Tech alum and former NFL player Justin Hamilton enters his initial season as defensive coordinator in 2020. New additions to the Hokies' defensive staff also include former Minnesota head coach Tracy Claeys (linebackers), longtime NFL coach Bill Teerlinck (defensive line), Tech All-American and 12-year NFL playing veteran Daryll Tapp (co-defensive line) and Virginia native Ryan Smith (cornerbacks).
- Tech's defense returns six players who started all 13 games in 2019: LB Rayshard Ashby, LB Dax Hollifield, DE Emmanuel Belmar, S Divine Deablo, DT Jarrod Hewitt and CB Chamarri Conner.
- Those six players accounted for 59.2% (22.5 of 38.0) of Tech's sacks and 57.8% (48.0 of 83.0) TFL in 2019.
- Tech racked up 38.0 sacks in 2019 after registering 24.0 during the entire 2018 campaign.
- Five players with 50 total tackles or more in 2019 are back: Ashby (120), Deablo (84), Conner (68), Hollifield (67) and LB Alan Tisdale (52).
- Tech led the ACC in Red Zone defense (78.8 scoring pct.) and ranked sixth among Power Five squads. Tech allowed 23 TDs on 42 opponent Red Zone possessions, good for a 54.8 Red Zone touchdown percentage allowed.

## TECH BOASTS A TRIO OF TALENTED QUARTERBACKS

- Tech boasts a trio of QBs who have all walked off the field after guiding their team to victory against a Power Five opponent - Hendon Hooker, Quincy Patterson & Braxton Burmeister.
- In his six wins as Tech's starter in 2019, QB Hendon Hooker completed 68 of 108 passes (63.0%) for 1,126 yards with 10 TDs and no INTs (181.1 rating) in those contests. He also rushed 83 times for 266 yards with four TDs in those six victories.
- Hooker started eight contests for Tech in 2019 and did not throw an INT in seven of those contests. He threw for a career-high 311 yards at UVA (11/29/19) and had a season-high 76 rushing yards at Miami (10/5/19).
- QB Braxton Burmeister sat out the 2019 campaign after transferring from Oregon. He completed nine of 12 passes with one TD in a 41-20 win vs. Utah (10/28/17). Head coach Justin Fuente has indicated he anticipates Burmeister playing in 2020.
- QB Quincy Patterson relieved an injured Hooker and led Tech to a 43-41 six-OT win vs. UNC (10/19/19), rushing for a career-high 122 yards, including a 53-yard TD scamper. He started the following week at Notre Dame (11/2/19).

### TECH'S RECEIVING TALENT

- WR Tre Turner led Tech with 34 catches and 553 yards in 2019 to go along with four TDs catches.
- WR Tayvion Robinson tied for second on the squad in 2019 with 31 receptions, adding 404 yards with one score.
- TE James Mitchell scored four rushing TDs on five carries in 2019. He tied for fourth on the squad a year ago with 21 catches for 361 yards with a pair of TD catches.
- Villanova transfer WR Changa Hodge caught 65 passes for 1,118 yards and 13 TDs. He posted five career 100-yard receiving games at Villanova, including an eight-catch, 236-yard outburst with four TDs vs. Delaware (11/23/19).
- Kansas transfer WR Evan Fairs posted 28 receptions for 392 yards with one TD during his tenure with the Jayhawks.

### DEVIN TAYLOR JOINS TECH'S DBS

- Illinois State transfer CB Devin Taylor played in 35 career contests for the Redbirds, registering 80 tackles, nine INTs, 31 passes defended and one sack.
- Taylor led the Missouri Valley Football Conference with 24 passes defended in 2019, including a league-high 19 breakups. He ranked sixth in the FCS in passes defended with 1.6 per game.

### VT'S DYNAMIC RB ADDITIONS

- Kansas transfer RB Khalil Herbert played in 35 games for the Jayhawks, producing 320 carries for 1,735 yards (5.4 avg.) with 14 TDs. He racked up a career-high 291-yard rushing performance at WVU (9/23/17).
- Versatile Rutgers transfer RB Raheem Blackshear can also line up in the slot and is a dangerous return man. In 27 games (14 starts) at Rutgers, he rushed 211 times for 912 yards with six TDs and three 100-yard games. He also caught 80 passes for 810 yards with six TDs with three 100-yard games. Blackshear returned 30 kickoffs for 518 yards (17.3 avg.).
- Blackshear totaled 2,239 all-purpose yards during his career at Rutgers.

**FIRST FOUR SEASONS AT VT FOR JUSTIN FUENTE**

- Head coach Justin Fuente produced a 33-20 (.623) record in his first four seasons with the Hokies.
  - Fuente is the only coach in Tech history to register three seasons with eight or more wins in his initial four campaigns in Blacksburg.

**YOUTH IS SERVED ON TECH'S O-LINE**

- Out of a total of 65 possible starts on Tech's offensive line in 2019, exactly ZERO were made by seniors.
- In fact, 90.8% of Tech's O-line starts (59 of 65) were made by underclassmen in 2019. Redshirt Juniors had the other five starts - Austin Cannon (3), Zachariah Hoyt (2) and T.J. Jackson (1).
- Only 28 true freshman FBS offensive linemen played more than 500 snaps in 2019. Tech boasted two of them in Doug Nester and Bryan Hudson.
- Tech's starting lineup on the offensive line over the last four games of the 2019 regular season consisted of the following: LT Christian Darrisaw (Soph.), LG Lecitus Smith (R-Soph.), C Bryan Hudson (Fresh.), RG Doug Nester (Fresh.) and RT Luke Tenuta (R-Fresh.).

**HOOKER TAKES CARE OF THE FOOTBALL**

- QB Hendon Hooker threw 13 TDs and only two INTs in 2019, good for a 6.50 TD/INT ratio, a mark that led all ACC players with 150 or more pass attempts.
- Only five Power Five quarterbacks with 300 or more pass attempts registered a TD/INT ratio of 6.50 or better in 2019 - Ohio State's Justin Fields (13.67), Alabama's Tua Tagovailoa (11.00), LSU's Joe Burrow (10.0), Oregon State's Jake Luton (9.33) and Arizona State's Jayden Daniels (8.50).
- Hooker threw two INTs on 162 attempts in 2019, good for a 1.2 INT percentage, a figure that led all ACC passers with 150 or more pass attempts.
- Only six Power Five quarterbacks with 250 or more pass attempts registered an INT percentage of 1.2 or lower in 2019 - Arizona State's Daniels (0.6), Oregon State's Luton (0.8), Ohio State's Fields (0.8), LSU's Burrow (1.1) Alabama's Tagovailoa (1.2) and South Carolina's Tryan Hilinski (1.2).

**PREP QBS EXCEL IN NEW POSITIONS FOR VT**

- Virginia Tech has a long tradition of converting talented high school QBs to new positions and having them excel for the Hokies, including these three key players for Tech in 2020.

**TE JAMES MITCHELL - BIG STONE GAP, VA**

- Versatile performer who posted four TDs on five rushing attempts in 2019.
- Also caught 21 receptions for 361 yards with two TDs.

**WR TAYVION ROBINSON - VIRGINIA BEACH, VA**

- Speedy receiver & return man tied for second on VT with 31 catches, adding 404 receiving yards with one TD in 2019.
- Had a team-high 13 punt returns for 185 yards (14.1 avg.), as well as 11 rushes for 132 yards in 2019.
- Robinson earned PFF College All-Freshman First Team honors as a punt returner in 2019.

**S DIVINE DEABLO - WINSTON-SALEM, N.C.**

- Began his Tech career as a wide receiver before switching to defensive back.
- Owns 24 career starts at defensive back for Tech.
- Finished second on the squad with 84 total tackles (42 solo). Also posted 4.5 TFL, an INT and returned a fumble for a 98-yard TD at Notre Dame (11/2/19).

# LAST MEETING

BLACKSBURG, VA – Virginia Tech quarterback Brenden Motley threw three touchdown passes to Isaiah Ford, and the Hokies rushed for 200 yards, as they notched a much-needed 28-13 victory over ACC foe NC State on Friday night.

The win moved Tech to 3-3 overall, 1-1 in ACC play. The Hokies avoided starting 0-2 in conference play for the first time since joining the league. NC State fell to 4-2 overall, 0-2 in the ACC.

The Hokies also beat the Wolfpack for the fourth straight time.

"It's super big," Tech coach Frank Beamer said of the win. "To get back in the conference race ... and I think we're in it, but we had to get a conference win to stay in it. We'll see what happens. We'll see what happens with Pittsburgh and so forth. Yeah, this was critical. We as a football team – players and coaches – talked about it. Some games are just bigger than others, and this one was absolutely big and critical."

For the second straight game, Tech found itself behind 10-0 in the first half. NC State got on the board on its opening drive, getting a 33-yard field goal by Kyle Bambarid and an 8-yard scoring pass from quarterback Jacoby Brissett to Jumichael Ramos.

But Tech's defense responded after that, holding the Wolfpack to just a field goal the rest of the game. In fact, the Wolfpack amassed just 125 yards in the final three quarters and finished with just 270 yards for the game. The Hokies' defense also held NC State quarterback Jacoby Brissett in check. Brissett threw for just 113 yards and his streak of passes without an interception ended at 241 when Adonis Alexander intercepted him in the fourth quarter.

"To make in-game adjustments right now is tough, but our kids hung in there and stepped up big when we needed to," Tech defensive coordinator Bud Foster said. "I can't say enough about how hard our kids competed. But at the same time, they worked the game. It wasn't easy for some young kids and for us [the coaches]. But at the same time, they stepped up when we needed them to, and I'm really proud of them."

Tech's offense exploded in the second quarter, scoring on three straight possessions – all ending on touchdown passes from Motley to Ford. Motley's 27-yard touchdown pass to Ford with 10:41 left in the first half cut the NC State lead to 10-7 and then his 5-yard touchdown pass to Ford with 5:54 left in the first half gave Tech a lead it would not relinquish.

A 2-yard touchdown pass to Ford with 18 seconds left gave the Hokies a 21-10 lead at halftime. Ford became the first Tech receiver since Ernest Wilford in 2002 (Syracuse) to catch at least three touchdown passes in a game. Wilford caught four in the Hokies' triple overtime loss to the Orangemen.

"It was like I couldn't not get open, and Motley wasn't finding me," Ford said. "Tonight was special."

NC State added a field goal in the third quarter, but the Hokies put the game way midway through the fourth quarter. Leading 21-13 and taking over at their own 12, they drove to their own 41 before Motley handed the ball off to Traven McMillian on a second-down play. McMillian broke down the left sideline, hurdled a tackler and went 59 yards for a touchdown that gave Tech a 28-13 lead with 6:54 left in the game.

NC State tried to respond, driving to the Tech 32. But on fourth down, quarterback Jacoby Brissett's pass in the end zone was broke up by the Hokies' Brandon Facyson, and Tech took over on downs, essentially sealing the game.

Tech finished with 358 yards of offense. Motley completed 14 of 28 for 158 yards, with the three touchdown passes to Ford and no interceptions. McMillian set career highs in yards (96) and carries (11).

"My mindset was just to run the ball hard," McMillian said. "Read my blocks, and if a guy is there, just run over him. Just play physical."

"I think he's a guy that can make a difference in a ball game," Beamer said of McMillian. "He's dangerous. He's got speed. He's got power. Our fans are going to like that guy a lot before he leaves here. He's got it."

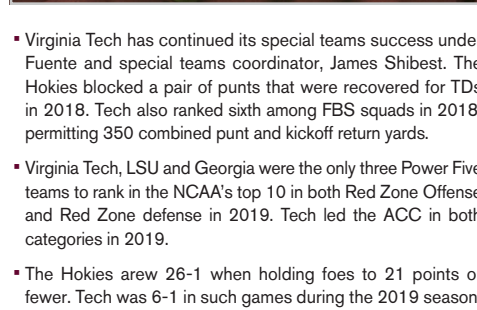

## 2016 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR

- The consensus 2016 ACC Coach of the Year, Fuente was also named the top first-year FBS head coach in the nation by the Football Writers Association of America, sharing that honor with USC's Clay Helton.
- Tech finished the 2016 season ranked No. 16 in both the AP Poll and the Coaches Poll, marking the highest final mark for the Hokies since 2010 (No. 16 AP, No. 15 Coaches).
- Virginia Tech, Penn State, Colorado, West Virginia and Western Michigan all finished in the AP Top 25 after getting zero votes in the AP Preseason Poll.
- Tech's 10 wins were the team's most since 2011 and the most ever by a first-year Virginia Tech head coach, surpassing the previous mark of nine wins by C.P. Miles in 1905.

- Fuente was named Virginia Tech's head coach on Nov. 29, 2015 after orchestrating a dramatic resurrection of the football fortunes at the University of Memphis.
- The Hokies enter their fifth season under Fuente, who has compiled a 33-20 record in Blacksburg.
- The only other active ACC head coach that can top Fuente's 33 wins in his first three seasons at an ACC school is Clemson's Dabo Swinney (36).
- Since Fuente arrived in Blacksburg in 2016, the only ACC schools with more wins are Clemson (55)
- Tech extended its streak of consecutive bowl appearances to 27 straight seasons in 2019 under Fuente, the longest active streak in the nation and third-longest streak all-time in NCAA history.
- The Hokies have finished in the Top 25 twice in Fuente's four seasons at the helm in Blacksburg.
- Tech finished the 2016 season ranked No. 16 in both the AP Poll and the Coaches Poll and concluded the 2017 season at No. 24 in the AP Top 25 and No. 25 in the Coaches Poll.
- The Hokies own a 23-5 mark under Fuente when scoring 30+ points and are 28-2 when leading at halftime.
- Fuente's reputation for exemplary work with the offense and quarterbacks was once again on display in 2019. Despite utilizing a fourth different primary quarterback for a fourth straight year, QB Hendon Hooker helped jumpstart Tech's season by winning his first six collegiate starts for the Hokies..
- The Hokies have produced the top three passing seasons in school history since Fuente and offensive coordinator Brad Cornelsen arrived at Tech - 2016 (261.4 ypg), 2018 (253.8 ypg) and 2017 (239.5 ypg).
- Despite not entering the starting lineup until the season's third contest in 2018, QB Ryan Willis threw 24 TDs, a mark that tied as the second-best in school history.
- The Hokies finished the 2017 season fourth in the FBS in scoring defense (14.8 ppg) and posted an FBS-best three shutouts, while only Michigan (26.1%) held foes to a lower third-down conversion rate than VT (25.2).
- Virginia Tech has continued its special teams success under Fuente and special teams coordinator, James Shibest. The Hokies blocked a pair of punts that were recovered for TDs in 2018. Tech also ranked sixth among FBS squads in 2018, permitting 350 combined punt and kickoff return yards.
- Virginia Tech, LSU and Georgia were the only three Power Five teams to rank in the NCAA's top 10 in both Red Zone Offense and Red Zone defense in 2019. Tech led the ACC in both categories in 2019.
- The Hokies are 26-1 when holding foes to 21 points or fewer. Tech was 6-1 in such games during the 2019 season.

**2020 TEAM CAPTAINS**

• A quartet of upperclassmen, DT Jarrod Hewitt, S Divine Deablo, OL Tyrell Smith and LB Rayshard Ashby have been selected by their teammates to lead the program onto the field during the 2020 season.

**MORE ON THE QUARTERBACK ROOM**

• Hendon Hooker assumed starting QB duties after four games in 2019 and won the first six starts of his career, jumostarting the offense with his decision making and athletic ability when the play breaks down. In his first career start at Miami, he led the underdog Hokies to a 42-35 victory with four total scores (three through the air) and 260 yards.

• Quincy Patterson, the game-winner in the thrilling 6-OT victory over North Carolina has seen action in 10 games in his career with the one start at Notre Dame. The 6-foot-4 QB has accounted for a total of 532 yards - 266 through the air and 266 on the ground.

• Burmesiter, who Coach Fuente indicated will see time, has not played competitively since 2018 when he played in reserve duty at the University of Oregon behind NFL First Round Draft pick Justin Herbert. The California native is known as a dual threat QB described by his teammates as ‘a playmaker.’

• Tech also has redshirt freshman Knox Kadum and true freshman Peyton Kemmerlin on the roster.

**FUENTE, CORNELSEN MAKE VIRGINIA TECH HISTORY WITH QB PLAY**

• For the first time since 1998, the Hokies utilized three different starting QBs in 2019 (Ryan Willis, Hooker and Patterson). Fuente has indicated that the 2020 season could produce a similar situation with all three signal callers vying for their opportunity.

• In the 6-OT victory over North Carolina, three QBs threw for a TD, marking the first time since at least 1987 that feat had been accomplished.

**MORE HISTORY FOR PATTERSON, FUENTE, CORNELSEN**

• When Patterson ran for a career-high 122 yards and a TD against North Carolina, he became the third Virginia Tech QB to reach the 100-yard plateau on the ground under offensive coordinator Brad Cornelsen.

• Other QBs to run for 100 yards - Jerod Evans and Josh Jackson.

**TE JAMES MITCHELL EMERGES AS TOP PLAYMAKER**

• A part of a dynamic TE duo in 2019 that included NFL Draft pick Dalton Keene, junior TE James Mitchell accounted for six total scores and was one of the Hokies’ most dynamic offensive threats.

• The Big Stone Gap, Virginia native ran the ball in the red zone five times and scored four TDs and also caught 21 passes for 361 yards - an average of 17.2 per play.

• He had a career day at Georgia Tech (11/16/19) with four receptions for 90 yards.

**THE GENESIS OF “BIG PLAY TRE”**

• WR Tre Turner hauled in six catches for a career-best 106 yards including a career-long 55-yard reception vs. North Carolina (10/19/19). It was the first 100-yard game of his career. He topped that mark with a 134-yard effort at rival Virginia (11/29/19).

• He produced a career-long 57-yard run and racked up a career-high 73 rushing yards vs. Wake Forest (11/9/19).

▪ Hudson has started 10 straight games at center and was named to the Freshman All-America Squad of The Athletic. He also earned a spot on the PFF College Freshman second-team squad.

▪ G Doug Nester was an honorable mention pick for the PFF College Freshman Team.
