AT THE RIM

- Playing at home for the second game in a row, the No. 20/20 Virginia Tech men's basketball team will play host to No. 19/23 Duke on Tuesday at 7 p.m. ET on ACCN.
- The Hokies and Blue Devils played each other twice last season, with Duke winning both times, including the last time out on Feb. 22 in Durham, 88-64. (More on page 5)
- Duke leads the all-time series 49-11, but Tech has won three of the last of seven games.
- The Hokies are 9-12 at home versus the Blue Devils and have won three of the last four games inside Cassell Coliseum.
- Tech coach Mike Young is 0-3 all-time versus Duke's Mike Krzyzewski, falling twice last year and in 2014 when he was at Wofford.

WHO TO WATCH



- Turning in his second double-double of the season, Keve Aluma racked up 15 points and 12 rebounds vs. the Irish.
- The big man also owned two assists and a block in 34 minutes of action, and had a plus-eight plus-minus.

- Jalen Cone has been feeling it from downtown as of late, making 23 triples his last five games, including four against Notre Dame.
- He would go on to have a team-high 18 points and also had a steal in 24 minutes off the bench.



LAST TIME OUT

- Trailing by seven points at half, the Hokies came out firing in the second half, opening with a 12-2 run to take the lead and ended up winning comfortably, 77-63.
- Tech got it done in the paint, outscoring the Fighting Irish 34-20.

A WIN WOULD

- Make the Hokies 4-1 in league play for just the fifth time since 2004-05 when it joined the ACC, joining the other years of 2018-19, 2015-16, 2008-09 and 2006-07.
- Extend Tech's home winning streak to six games and then snap its three-game skid to Duke.
- Mean that the Hokies have defeated the Blue Devils four of the last five outings in Cassell.
- Be Tech's third ranked win of the season, joining its victories over No. 3/3 Villanova and then-No. 24/ RV Clemson.

PUTTIN' ON THE CLAMPS

- Tech accomplished something for the first time since it joined the prestigious ACC (2004-05), with holding an opponent to two made field goals in a half this past Sunday versus the Fighting Irish.
- The feat topped the previous best of holding its foe of three made shots in a half, which came against NC State in 2019, Arkansas Pine Bluff in 2015 and Eastern Michigan in 2011.

ONE OF THE BEST DOW LOW

- Keve Aluma certainly has made his presence felt since joining the Hokies, and has does so especially down low.
- The Wofford transfer leads the ACC in free throws made at 45 and free throws attempted at 68.
- Aluma is shooting 66.2 percent from the charity stripe this season, which is up from 48.3 percent clip his final season in Spartanburg.

STRONGER TOGETHER

- Last Wednesday, the Hokies had four players score in double figures, showcasing a balanced attack, and still ended up losing.
- That marked just the second time in the Mike Young era in which that happened, with the other instance being Tech's setback to BYU (90-77) in the fifth-place game at the Maui Jim Maui Invitational last season.
- The Hokies are 10-2 under Young when having at least four players score in double digits, and it was only just the second time that Tech had four or more players do so in an ACC game (Wake Forest, Jan. 14, 2020; an 80-70 win).

NOT SO FAST, MY FRIEND

- After scoring 10 or more fastbreak points in four straight games for the first time in the Mike Young era, Tech was held to a season-low two fastbreak points at Louisville on Wednesday.
- During that four-game stretch, Tech had 12 fastbreak points against Clemson, 15 versus Coppin State, 13 against Longwood and 15 versus Miami (Fla.) for an average of 13.8.
- Tech, which averaged 9.5 fastbreak points per game last year against nonconference foes and just 8.1 versus ACC opponents for a season average of 8.5, is averaging 10.2 so far this season.
- According to KenPom, the Hokies' tempo is on a little more of an uptick compared to last year, with them averaging 67.4 (adjusted tempo rating) this year to 65.5 last season.

SWIPIN' AT A HIGH CLIP

- Over the last four games, Tech has racked up 33 steals, which is its best four-game stretch under Young.
- During that span, the Hokies are averaging 8.3 steals per game, which was way above their season average before that stretch (2.5 steals per game).
- The Hokies had seven steals at Louisville, marking just their eighth time of owning seven or more steals against an ACC team in the Young era out of 24 contests.

CLOSE, BUT NO CIGAR

- Tech lost a close one at Louisville on Wednesday, 73-71, and it was just the eighth time Young at Tech has been in a contest that was decided by four points or less. He is 3-5 in those games.
- Last year, the Hokies had four contests in league play that were decided by four points or less, with winning at Syracuse by four (67-63), beating UNC in double overtime at home (79-77), losing to Boston College in overtime at home (77-73) and falling to in-state rival Virginia at home (56-53) for a 2-2 clip.

JACK OF ALL TRADES

- Displaying his versatility to close 2020, Keve Aluma put together one of the better games this season by any player nationally.
- Aluma against Miami (Fla.) put together a 26-point, six-rebound, four-assist, three-block outing, making him the lone high-major player to have at least that stat line in a game and just one of four players in all of DI.

CHECKING IN ON NET

- The first NET rankings came out on Monday, Jan. 4 and the Hokies came in at No. 34, the fourth best in the ACC.
- In the first NET rankings of the 2019-20 season, the Hokies were at No. 62. Tech went 3-7 against quadrant I teams last year and went 4-9 the year before that.
- Tech's best win of the season came against then-No. 3/3 Michigan St, which finished seventh in NET.
- Tech finished the 2019-20 season ranked No. 92.
- In 2018-19, the Hokies, after making a run to the Sweet 16, finished in the final NET rankings at 12th.
- Ironically, Wofford, which was coached by Mike Young at the time, came in two spots below (14).

DOUBLE TROUBLE

- Forwards Keve Aluma and Justyn Mutts sure came to play against Miami (Fla.), carrying Tech to a victory with not its best play out of its guards in some time.
- The two combined for quite the stat line: 41 points, 15 rebounds, six assists, four steals and three blocks.
- In doing so, the two set some career and season highs, including Aluma's career high in points (26), assists (4, tied) and blocks (3, tied) and Mutts' career best in 3s made (3) and season highs for points (15), rebounds (9, tied) and steals (3).

What's a Hokie?



The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which is still used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

The official university school colors - Chicago Maroon and Burnt Orange - also were introduced in 1896. The colors were chosen by a committee because they made a 'unique combination' not worn elsewhere at the time. The official definition of "hokie" is "a loyal Virginia Tech Fan".

WHERE THEY AT

- Tech has 15 players on the squad who represent 10 states and two international countries (Netherlands, Nigeria), making it tied for eighth in the country for most states and countries represented on a roster this season.
- Virginia leads the way with three players – Joseph "Joe" Bamisile, Gill Williamson, Grant Yates – while Maryland has two players – Keve Aluma and Darius Maddox.
- New Mexico, Penn and UT Martin are No. 1 nationally with 15 players from different states and countries, while in the ACC, Boston College (13) is first and Florida State is tied with the Hokies for the second most in the league with 12.
- Of the 23 schools that have 12 or more players from different spots, nine are from high-major conferences, including BC, Kentucky, Butler, FSU, Iowa State, Nebraska, Tennessee, Tulane and the Hokies.

'19 CLASS OF HIGH-MAJOR COACHES

- Out of the seven high-major conferences (ACC, American, BIG EAST, B1G, Big 12, Pac-12 and SEC), there were 14 head coaches hired for the 2019-20 season.
- Virginia Tech coach Mike Young was just one of six coaches that were a mid-major coach to jump up to the big leagues, joining Alabama's Nate Oats (Buffalo), Arkansas' Eric Musselman (Nevada), Tulane's Ron Hunter (Georgia State) and Washington State's Kyle Smith (San Francisco).
- Of the 14 new coaches, Young was the longest-tenured coach to leave, following his 17-year stint as the head guy at Wofford.
- The NBA saw three of its coaches jump into the college ranks, with Michigan's Juwon Howard (Miami Heat), Nebraska's Fred Hoiberg (Chicago Bulls) and Vanderbilt's Jerry Stackhouse (Memphis Grizzlies).
- In this cycle, only one assistant coach was promoted from within and that was Temple's Aaron McKie, who served as an assistant under Fran Dunphy for five seasons in Philadelphia.
- Former Hokie coach Buzz Williams, who is at Texas A&M, was one of just two coaches to jump ship and go high-major for high-major, with UCLA's Mick Cronin (Cincinnati) being the other.
- A full breakdown of the 14 coaches in the cycle is below, with the SEC welcoming the most among the seven leagues with four. The Big 12 was the lone conference not make coaching change heading into the 2019-20 season.

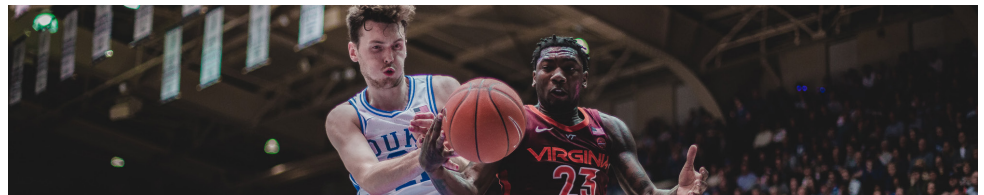

LAST TIME vs. DUKE

- Getting punched in the mouth early, the Hokies let up 51 points at halftime in Durham and trailed by 26, which was the second-biggest halftime deficit for the Hokies since they joined the ACC in 2004-05.
- They did outscore the Blue Devils in the second half, 38-37, but it was to no avail as they fell by 24 points despite having three players in double figures scoring.
- Tech didn't shoot it particularly great, connecting on 37.3 percent of its shots, and got out-rebounded by 18 (49-31), including giving up 14 offensive rebounds.
- Two of the Hokies that scored in double digits are back, including Tyrece Radford (16 points, nine rebounds) and Hunter Cattoor (10 points, one steal).

SCOUTING DUKE

- Duke is coming off an 11-point victory over Wake Forest (3-3, 0-3) at home, getting two players to turn in 20-point games in Matthew Hurt (26 points) and D.J. Steward (21 points) in its 79-68 win.
- Krzyzewski enters his 41st season in Durham, following his five-year stint as the head coach at Army West Point from 1975-80. A five-time national champion and 12-time Final Four participant, Coach K has the most wins in the history of college basketball on the men's side in Division I with 1,162.
- The Blue Devils are paced by Hurt, who is averaging a team-high 19.6 points per game that ranks first in the ACC, and Jalen Johnson, who is averaging 11.5 points and a team-best 8.3 rebounds in just four games. He is a gametime decision tomorrow and has missed the last three contests.
- Some of the strengths the Blue Devils possess are causing havoc on the defensive end, owning the ninth-most steals per game (9.6) in the country and second in the ACC, and owning the glass, posting 12.9 offensive rebounds per game, which is good for third in the conference.



BOOTS FLIRTIN' W/ DOUBLE-DOUBLES

- Tyrece "Boots" Radford has come oh so close to getting his first double-double of the season, and really, has come close twice two of his last three games.
- Boots had nine points and eight rebounds against Longwood on Dec. 21 to wrap up noncon, then came back with a 13-point, nine-rebound outing versus Miami (Fla.) to close 2020.
- He averaged 11 points and 8.5 rebounds per game during that two-game span.
- The Louisiana native had three double-doubles last year, including two of those coming in ACC play (Wake, Miami).

NA STAYIN' STEADY

- Sophomore Nahiem Alleyne, who is in the top three for best shooters on the team (Cone, Cattoor), has been pretty steady this season from downtown.
- The guard has made at least one triple in all but two games this year, with those coming against VMI and Louisville.
- If you remember last season, the Georgia native made a 3 in 13 consecutive games, which tied for the fifth-longest of any ACC player last year. And of that group, only him and Syracuse's Buddy Boeheim returned this season.
- This season, he ranks ninth in the ACC in 3-point field-goal percentage (39.1%) among players that have hit at least 15 triples.

CAUSING HAVOC DEFENSIVELY

- Tech forced Miami (Fla.) into committing 19 turnovers on Dec. 29, which was a season high for the 'Canes, as well as a season high forced by Tech.
- Over the last seven seasons, Tech has only done that (forced 19 or more TOs against an ACC team) five times, making it a first in the Mike Young era and for the first time since 2017.

FINDING A WAY TO GET IT DONE

- Tech, as most teams, doesn't do well in the win column when it allows its opponent to shoot better than 50 percent from the field.
- Since coach Mike Young has gotten here, the Hokies are 1-4 in games when its opponents shoot better than 50 percent.
- Before its game against Miami (Fla.) to close 2020, Tech was 0-4 in those situations, until it pulled out the win, which shot 53.6 percent from the field.
- The only other team this season that the Hokies allowed their foe to shoot more than 50 percent was against Penn State (50.0%), its lone home loss.

80 THE SWEET SPOT

- The Hokies, who are averaging 71.8 points per game over the last two seasons, are 8-1 when scoring 80 or more points in the Mike Young era.
- Tech dropped 80 on Miami, marking only the third time its scored 80 or more against an ACC team the last two seasons, and just the second in a regulation game (80 vs. WF, 95 vs. Miami in 3OT).
- Therefore, Tech tied its ACC high in the Young era for a regulation game.

WAS A FUN RIDE

- Tech played all of its December games in the friendly confines of Cassell Coliseum, taking on six foes in total.
- December treated the Hokies well, winning five of those six contests, with its lone loss coming to Penn State in the ACC/B1G Challenge.

DUNK CITY

- The rim was rocking quite a bit in Tech's last game, with the Hokies tallying seven dunks against Longwood on Dec. 21.
- The seven dunks marked the most in the Mike Young era, topping the previous high of five set against Maryland Eastern Shore last year (Dec. 29).
- Keve Aluma had multiple dunks (2x) and then Nahiem Alleyne, David N'Guessan, Hunter Cattoor, Tyrece Radford and Justyn Mutts all had one and joined in on the 'dunk party' as well.
- To put it in perspective of how rare that instance was, Tech had three games this early this season (Coppin St, Villanova, USF) that it didn't get a single dunk.
- Last year, Tech had five games of three dunks, six games of two dunks and 11 games of just one.

DON'T MAKE 'EM LIKE ME ANYMORE

- Keve Aluma has been arguably Tech's best player so far this season, with being the team's leading scorer (14.8) and rebounder (6.8), and put it all together in Tech's most recent outing.
- Against Longwood, the redshirt junior put together quite the stat line, registering 14 points, four rebounds, three blocks, two steals and an assist in just 24 minutes of action.
- Because of that outing, he is just one of five ACC players and only 13 high-major guys, including Iowa's Luka Garza, to do that stat line or better this season.

SOMETHING 'BOUT THOSE TWO

- When you look at the shortest players on the rosters for Virginia Tech and Miami (Fla.), it's not your typical 6-foot walk-on, as Tech's Jalen Cone (5'10") and Miami's Chris Lykes (5'7") are pretty short considering DI averages.
- But, despite their challenges of that, the two have formed a bond with one another and consider each other friends off the court.
- The two text regularly and Lykes has given Cone tips on best practices of overcoming his lack of height in the ACC, with Lykes being a couple of years older than Cone and sharing words of wisdom of what has worked for him over the years.

SMALL BUT MIGHTY

- Among high-major conference teams, there are only 35 players that are less than six feet tall, including Tech's Jalen Cone, standing at 5-foot-10.
- Of those 35, 19 of them are walk-ons, while the other 16 are on scholarship.
- In the ACC, Cone is one of eight players shorter than six feet, and is just one of five scholarship players in the league.
- Cone will go against two of the more famous shorter guys in the league, including Miami (Fla.)'s Chris Lykes and UVA's Kihei Clark.

UPTICK IN SHARING THE ROCK

- Sophomore guard Hunter Cattoor has improved his ball handling and decision making from last year, and it really has showed here the last couple of games for the Hokies.
- With Cartier Diarra opting out of the season (since Dec. 15), Cattoor has filled in as the secondary point guard, spelling Wabissa Bede, and has done a nice job, as he turned in eight assists in the two games immediately following Diarra's departure.
- That two-game stretch of eight dimes is his best two-game stretch yet as a Hokie, topping his previous high of seven assists last season versus Delaware State on Nov. 20 and then-No. 3 Michigan State on Nov. 25.
- Versus Coppin State on Dec. 19, he dished out a career-high five assists – not bad for a guy who is known as a catch-and-shoot specialist.

UNDER A HANDFUL CAN SAY SO

- Tech is one of just four high-major schools this season to have two players drill five or more 3s together in the same game.
- The Hokies are one of two ACC schools ('Cuse) to do so this year, while the other two teams are two top-10 teams in No. 4 Iowa (vs. UNC), which actually had three players accomplish the feat, and No. 5 Villanova (vs. Georgetown).

20-ASSIST PLATEAU

- Tech has had six games of 20 or more assists in the Young era and is 5-1 in those games, with the lone loss coming to Syracuse at home last year in a close one, 80-78.
- The Hokies had 20 assists against Coppin State for a season high, with three players owning at least four, including Wabissa Bede (5 ast.), Hunter Cattoor (5) and Jalen Cone (4).

TOP ITEMS IN YOUNG ERA

- To give perspective on how well the Hokies were clicking on all cylinders against Coppin State on Dec. 19, here are how some key items that stand out in the Mike Young era.
- Tech's bench exploded for 51 points, which is the most in the Young era, topping the previous high of 49, which was set twice - Delaware State (Nov. 20) and Maryland Eastern Shore (Dec. 29).
- Tech's 20 3s were the second most in school history, as well as the Young era (21 vs. Delaware St).
- The 97 points were the second most in the Young era, topping the triple OT game against Miami (Fla.) last year of 95 points, but being a triple short of the Delaware State game's 100-point outing.
- Also, Tech had eight players make a 3 versus Coppin State, which hasn't happened at Tech since Nov. 21, 2017 against Houston Baptist (8 as well).

NOT GREAT, BOB - OH WAIT

- Tech had not been shooting the ball well from downtown early in the season, making just five 3s versus then-No. 24/RV Clemson, six 3s against Penn State, four triples versus VMI and only five the one before that (USF) for a combined 20-of-81 clip (24.7%).
- In the Mike Young era, that was the fewest 3s made in a four-game stretch.
- So, after hitting just 20 3s its last four games heading into Coppin State, Tech ripped off the exact amount in just one game.

FALLING BUT WINNING THE GLASS

- Tech coach Mike Young is 12-2 at Tech when his Hokie team out-rebounds the opponent, with another instance of it happening versus Penn State (39-33).
- It marked just the second loss when his group has outrebounded its opponent, with the only other loss coming last season against Boston College on Feb. 8, 2019, with a +1 differential.
- In fact, out of Tech's 20 ACC games last year, it only out-rebounded its league opponent three times, with two of those being versus Clemson.

BOOTS EXPANDING HIS VERSATILITY

- Guard Tyrece Radford, otherwise known as "Boots", tied his career high in assists against Radford, racking up five assists.
- Radford has done so three times now, with the other two coming last year against Syracuse (Jan. 18) and Maryland Eastern Shore (Dec. 29).
- Last year, the Louisiana native had seven games of four or more assists. So, after working on his passing ability this offseason, expect Boots to share the rock on an uptick this season instead of having his head down traditionally on his way to the rim.
- Since the season opener versus the Highlanders, Radford has found his groove with sharing the rock, leading the team in assists in three games so far, including Tech's game vs. Penn State (3 ast.).

RARE, LIKE MR. CLEAN WITH HAIR

- Justyn Mutts, who doesn't have a bad hairdo himself, became just the fifth Hokie in the last decade to have a 10-point, nine-rebound, six-assist or better stat line and the first since 2019 (Nickeil Alexander-Walker) when he did so vs. VMI.
- Mutts is just one of two in the ACC players in the ACC to do so this year (Louisville's Carlík Jones).

PUTTIN' ON THE CLAMPS

- Tech gave up less than 59 points in back-to-back games against USF and VMI, marking just the third time in the Mike Young era.
- The previous two times were a four-game stretch (Chattanooga, Gardner-Webb, VMI and Maryland Eastern Shore; Dec. 11-29) and a three-game stretch (Coppin State, USC Upstate and Lehigh; Nov. 8-16).

'ROUND THE BLOCK

- With more of an intentionality of scoring inside this season with the added presence down low compared to last year, Tech showcased that vs. USF with 42 points in the paint, which was most in the Mike Young era, spanning over 35 games.
- The previous high was 40 points against then-No. 10/8 Duke on Dec. 6 in Cassell, a 77-63 lost.

GETTIN' TO THE CHARITY STRIPE

- Coach Young was not happy with how little the Hokies got to the free-throw line last year, with an average of 13.4 per game, which ranked second-to-last in the ACC and was in the bottom 25 nationally.
- So now, with not being as dependent on the 3-ball and having more players that can get to the rim, Tech has increased that average to 21.5 this season, including a three-game stretch of 20-plus three-throw attempts versus Villanova, USF and VMI.
- Last year, the Hokies only had eight games (out of 32) of having 20 or more free throw attempts. When doing so, they were 7-1, with the lone loss being against Miami (Fla.) in triple overtime.
- Tech accomplished consecutive contests with 20-plus free throws only twice (Jan. 7-14) last year.

STARTIN' OUT HOT

- The Hokies have started the season out on a strong note, with defeating their opponent by 10 or more points twice through five games.
- In Young's final season at Wofford (2018-19), that was a norm, with his Terriers having 22 games of winning by double digits.
- Last season, though, Tech only won by 10 or more 10 times, including just four times against a high-major conference opponent.
- The Hokies already have one double-digit win against a high-major team (USF) this year.

MORE ON THE DECK

- Sophomore Hunter Cattoor was a more balanced player in high school he shared recently, with doing a little bit of everything (3s, mid-range, floaters) at all three levels.
- Since his arrival to Blacksburg, he's been more of a catch-and-shoot player and is looking to buck that trend.
- So, against USF, the guard set a career-high eight free throw attempts and cashed in six of those. Cattoor last year, out of 31 games, only got to the line in eight games for a total of 22 free throw attempts. So expect more times than not he will put it on the deck and attack the rim.

LEVELIN' UP

- The grad transfer from Iowa, Cordell Pemsli, stepped up in a big way against USF, subbing in for Keve Aluma when he picked up his second foul early in the first half.
- Pemsli came in and made some big plays, playing 12 minutes and recording eight points and four rebounds alone in the first half.
- He would go on to finish with 10 points and six rebounds - not bad for a role player who had 13 minutes, one point and two rebounds combined the first two games.

BENCH MOB HEATIN' UP

- In the USF win, the Hokies had five players score in double figures, which was a first this year and only the third time in the Mike Young era (UMES, Michigan St.; both with five players).
- Of those five players Sunday, two did so coming off the bench, respectively, in Cartier Diarra and Cordell Pemsli. Last season, that happened just eight times, with half of those in ACC play.

NBA & G-LEAGUE

NAW IN YEAR 2

- Nickeil Alexander-Walker has left his mark on Virginia Tech and is working on making a name for himself at the next level with the New Orleans Pelicans.
- A first-round draft pick in 2019, the Toronto native played in 47 games for the Pels in the 2019-20 NBA season. On Feb. 26, he was moved down to the Erie Bayhawks, then came back up when the bubble in Orlando started.
- He scored a career-high 27 points against the Miami Heat on Saturday, Nov. 16. He followed it up the next game on Sunday, Nov. 17 with 19 points, five rebounds and four assists versus the Warriors, for his best two-game stretch of the season.
- This season, NAW has played in seven games for the Pelicans and is averaing 14.8 minutes off the bench and 7.9 points.

- It was a little bit of a whirlwind for Tech alums Nickeil Alexander-Walker, Justin Robinson and Ahmed Hill last year, with all three going up and down and all around on their quest to solidifying a roster spot in the NBA.
- Robinson, who signed as an undrafted free agent after the NBA Draft concluded with the Washington Wizards, was waived on Jan. 4.
- Hill signed with the Hornets this summer on a two-way deal, but was released in early November. However, he landed nicely on his feet, with now playing on the NAZ Suns, the G-League affiliate of the Phoenix Suns.
- Justin Bibbs, who plays for the Boston Celtics' affiliate (Maine Red Claws), hit a game-winner on Jan. 19, 2019, finishing with 15 points and six assists.

THAT'S A FIRST

- Tech basketball under the direction of Coach Young is known for being a quality 3-point shooting team, with the Hokies finishing with the most 3s made last year in the ACC with 315.
- So when they are having an off shooting night from downtown, it's tough to overcome it and get a win.
- Last year, Tech had three instances when it made five or less 3s and went 0-3 in those games.
- This year, with not being as reliant on the deep ball, Tech made only five triples versus USF, but still earned a blowout win, a first in the Mike Young era.

DOWNTOWN, A STAPLE

- As you know, 3-point shooting is a staple of the Coach Young offense.
- And to back up his prowess, Young is one of only two coaches whose teams have ranked in the top 80 nationally in 3P% each of the last six years (since 2014-15).
- The only others are Saint Mary's Randy Bennet, Duke's Coach K, Michigan State's Tom Izzo and Gonzaga's Mark Few each with five a piece.

TOP-THREE WINS

- There are only two teams since '10 that have won a game against a top-3 team in their first six games of the season in consecutive years, with it being Tech and Duke ('17, '18).

THE FEW, THE PROUD

- Only eight players this season have racked up 13 rebounds and dished out five assists in a game, with Tyrece Radford accomplishing the feat against then-No. 3 Villanova.
- Three of those players reside in the ACC, with Radford, Duke's Jalen Johnson and Pitt's Justin Champagnie.

WITH THE BEST OF THEM

- Over the last five seasons, only Tech, Duke, UNC and Kansas have the most wins against AP top-five teams, with all four squads owning six games apiece since 2016.

UPSET TIDBITS

- Coach Young earned his second ranked win at Tech, following his upset of then-No. 3 Michigan State last November in Maui, and makes him 2-0 at Tech versus the AP's third-ranked team.
- For the third time in Coach Young's last four seasons he's earned a top-five win (No. 5 North Carolina, 2017, when he was at Wofford).
- Tech now has three straight seasons of winning a nonconference tournament game against a ranked opponent (No. 23/22 Purdue, 2018, Charleston Classic).

- When comparing the two averages in wins and losses for the Hokies this season, the biggest things that are glaring are points per game (-15.1) and 3P% margin (-8.8%).
- So, if Tech is doing badly in those categories, or when it's opponent raining from 3 (46.2% in Ls), it could be a long day for the Hokies.

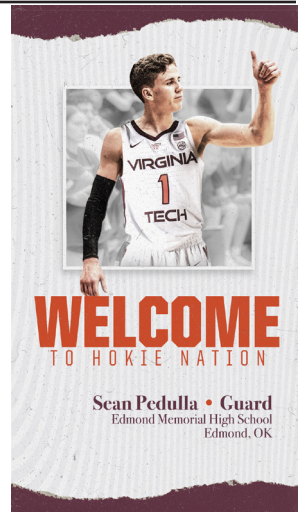

Having just three players returning who saw minutes the previous year in 2018-19 on the team, Young had to act quickly when hired on April 7, 2019 and build a roster to compete in the best conference in the nation. Adding a staff and six scholarship players in a hurry, Young's first season in Blacksburg started off with a bang, as the Hokies went down to South Carolina and defeated Clemson in style to give Young his first Hokie and ACC win, as well as his 300th career victory.

Another big-time W came at the prestigious Maui Jim Maui Invitational against then-No. 3 Michigan State. On ESPN2 with Dan Shulman and Jay Bilas on the call, the young Hokies (7 of the 9 rotation players were underclassmen) pulled off one of the bigger upsets of the season with a 71-66 win. With the upset of Sparty, it marked the first time since 1964 that Tech beat a top-five team in nonconference play.

Despite being the shortest and second-youngest squad among high-major conference teams, Young and Co. tallied 16 wins to make it the most victories by a first-year head coach at Tech since 1999-00 and tied for the fifth-most wins ever by a first-year Hokie coach. He also became the first coach to win two of his first three road ACC games in school history.

Leaning on a mix of young and old in his first season, Young developed junior Wabissa Bede into one of the finer point guards in the country, as Bede would go on to finish with the sixth-best assist-to-turnover ratio nationally (3.34) and first in the ACC. And under Young's tutelage, redshirt freshman Tyrece Radford blossomed into one of the better all-around players in the league, with being one of only two players in the ACC to average 10 points, six rebounds and shoot over 60 percent from the field.

Under the direction of Young, the Hokies put together some new records during the 2019-20 season. On Nov. 20 versus Delaware State, Tech racked up 21 3-pointers, marking the most in school history and the most ever by an ACC team. Speaking of 3s, the 315 hit last season were the second-most in school history.

Four freshmen hit 49 or more 3-pointers, which was the most by any program in over the last 25 years. Behind the young bucks, Tech finished 13th nationally in 3-pointers made per game with 9.9 triples a contest, which was the most in school history.

Utilizing its freshmen on the offensive end last year, Tech finished with its freshmen averaging 50.7 points per game, which is the fourth-most in ACC history behind Duke's 2018-19, 2017-18, 1982-83 teams.

Making sure his team played the game the right way by limiting miscues, Young's prowess showed on Dec. 29 when Tech committed only two turnovers against Maryland Eastern Shore to tie a school record. The Hokies would go on to finish fourth in the nation in fewest turnovers committed per game (9.9).

The Radford, Virginia native joined the Hokies after a record-setting 17-year tenure as the head coach at Wofford. The Terriers posted a 30-5 overall record in 2018-19, including a perfect 18-0 mark in Southern Conference play, and registered a convincing 84-68 win over Seton Hall in the first round of the 2019 NCAA Tournament.

The 2019 Sporting News Coach of the Year, Young built the Terriers into one of the Southern Conference's preeminent programs and a perennial NCAA Tournament participant. He guided Wofford to five NCAA Tournament berths over the past 10 seasons and five Southern Conference championships.
