



KEY STORYLINES

FINAL PUSH

• Virginia Tech is searching for its first result since its six-match unbeaten streak ended on Oct. 7 at Clemson.

• The Hokies enter Thursday in sole possession of 10th place in the ACC standings - four points shy of the sixth and final qualifying spot for the conference tournament.

• Virginia Tech can earn as high as the No. 4 seed in the 2021 ACC tournament. The Hokies are chasing their third ACC tourney berth within the last four seasons (2018, 2020-21).

• Including Miami, Tech's final three ACC regular season opponents have combined to yield a 2-19-0 league record during the 2021 season.

TECH KEEPS NO. 1 FSU IN CHECK

• Despite its 2-0 loss to No. 1 Florida State on Oct. 15, Virginia Tech had a handful of positive takeaways from its performance.

• Tech held the Seminoles to season shooting lows in both total attempts (nine) and attempts on target (two).

• The Hokies also held FSU to a tie for its season low in corners (two).

• Tech nearly led, 1-0, on a scoring chance by Nicole Kozlova (9') that was initiated by Tori Powell. The Hokies played within a goal of FSU until midway through the second half when Jaelin Howell struck an open-play goal from 25 yards away (70').

SERIES HISTORY

• Virginia Tech is 9-0-1 during its last 10 home series meetings against Miami (5-0-0 under head coach Chugger Adair).

LAST MEETING

• In Oct. 2020, Tech defeated the Hurricanes, 8-2, at Thompson Field. The Hokies' eight goals marked the program's second highest scoring output all-time.

• Emily Gray recorded four of Tech's record-setting nine team assists.

• Six current Hokies (five active during 2021) recorded goals that night against Miami: Taylor Bryan, Makenzie Graham, Karlie Johnson, Emmalee McCarter, Tori Powell and Emma Steigerwald.

SCOUTING MIAMI

• Miami has witnessed seven goal scorers account for the team's 10 goals during the 2021 campaign.

• The Hurricanes' lone ACC victory was earned on Oct. 2 at Boston College. Jackie Koerwitz scored the match-winning goal (90') with one second remaining in regulation.

CHASING THE MATCH

• *First 12 matches:* Prior to receiving its No. 17 national ranking on Oct. 5, Virginia Tech was 8-2-2 through its first 12 matches of the 2021 season. The Hokies led during 48.8% of their total season minutes while trailing for 10.5%. Tech had scored the match-opening goal during 10 of its 12 outings.

• *Last three matches:* Considering its three most recent defeats, Tech has not held a lead while trailing for 80.4% of its total match time. The Hokies have also conceded three goals before the 20-minute mark - something Tech had not done through its first 12 matches of the season.

• Tech returned to the top 25 for the first time since the 2019 season when the Hokies were ranked for 14 of their 19 matches, peaking at No. 18.

• Under head coach Chugger Adair, Tech has been ranked as high as No. 2 nationally during its 10-0-0 start to the 2014 season, having reached the 2013 College Cup.

POWELL RECORDS HAT TRICK AT WAKE FOREST

• Sophomore forward Tori Powell became the 11th Virginia Tech player to notch the program's 13th all-time hat trick on Oct. 10 at Wake Forest.

• Powell's three-goal performance (22', 46', 61'), helped the Hokies claw back from as large as a two-goal deficit, despite their ultimate 4-3 defeat to the Demon Deacons. Prior to Oct. 10, Tech had been 12-0-0 all-time when one of its players recorded a hat trick.

• Historically, Powell's hat trick marked Tech's first against a Power Five opponent (fifth during the program's ACC tenure).

PULLING RABBITS OUT OF HATS

• After not witnessing a hat trick since the 2009 season, Virginia Tech has celebrated two such performances during the 2021 season.

• On Sept. 2, Emily Gray delivered each of the Hokies' three goals during their 3-2 victory at James Madison.

• In similar style, Tori Powell accounted for Tech's three goals during its 4-3 loss to Wake Forest.

PELKOWSKI RACKING UP ASSISTS

• Rookie midfielder Emma Pelkowski leads Virginia Tech in assists (six) - one shy of tying for the seventh most accumulated by a Tech player during a single season.

• Pelkowski scored her first collgiate goal during her first collegiate appearance (Aug. 19) and has logged three multi-assist matches this fall.

• Tech asserted itself late during the match, staging three of its six corners inside the final 15 minutes of play. Nicole Kozlova recorded the Hokies' best equalizing attempt during the 80th minute.

GRAY'S BRACE LEADS NO. 19 TECH TO WIN AT PITT

• Absent from Virignia Tech's scoring column for more than three weeks, senior midfielder Emily Gray recorded the brace that lifted the Hokies to their 2-1 victory at Pittsburgh (Oct. 2).

• Upon netting her team leading, eighth and ninth goals of the season, Gray moved up Virginia Tech's career goals leaderboad into a tie for eighth place all-time:

VIRGINIA TECH WOMEN'S SOCCER

On December 7, 2010, former Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Jim Weaver announced the hiring of Tech's fourth head women's soccer coach Charles "Chugger" Adair, the associate head coach for the team the previous five seasons. The 2019 season marked Adair's 14th season in Blacksburg and his ninth year as the Hokies' head coach. In that time, he's become the all-time wins leader in program history, ending the 2019 campaign with a 118-53-20 overall record, and became just the second soccer coach at the school to reach the 100-win milestone with the team's victory at Miami on Sept. 23 (Jerry Cheynet, 238 wins, 28 seasons for Tech men's soccer). He's also just the 10th women's soccer head coach to reach that mark in the ACC.

Prior to Adair's arrival on campus, the women's program just once (2004) made the postseason - playing a game in both the ACC and NCAA tournaments. Since, the team has gualified for six ACC tournaments, playing for the conference title twice (2008 & 2013), and earned eight straight bids to the NCAA championship (2008-15) and 10 overall, as the Hokies made back-to-back trips in 2018 and 2019. Tech has reached the Sweet 16 four times under Adair (2009, 2011, 2014, 2018), but enjoyed its greatest success in 2013. That record-setting season included the Hokies posting a school-record 19 wins (most by any soccer team at the school), playing for the ACC title and advancing to the NCAA College Cup, where their season ended with a 3-2 loss to Florida State in a national semifinal game.

Under Adair, Tech has seen its only two draft choices selected in the NWSL draft. Jazmine Reeves was the 21st overall pick by the Boston Breakers in 2014, while Mandy McGlynn was chosen one spot higher with the No. 20 pick by Sky Blue FC in 2020. Tech has also had its only three All-Americans under Adair's tutelage - Reeves (1st, 2013), Murielle Tiernan (3rd, 2015) and Mc-Glynn (2nd, 2019) - and two of its three Academic All-Americans - Katie Yensen (3rd, 2014) and McGlynn (1st, 2019).

Along with the great strides the Hokies have made on the pitch, the Tech women's soccer program is also known for producing outstanding students who are major contributors off of it. Each year, the Hokies boast a high team grade point average and have student-athletes who compete for state, regional and national academic recognition. In fact, during the 2017-18 academic season, the team posted a program-tying best ever team GPA of 3.53 in the spring semester. In addition, both Ashley Meier (2015) and Alani Johnson (2017) have received an ACC Postgraduate Scholarship, with Meier also earning an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship as well. Lastly, in 2018, Heather Timothy became Tech's sixth women's soccer player to earn the Skelton Award for Academic Excellence in Athletics - the highest designation handed out by the Tech athletics department.

Adair has led his program to a winning record in each of his nine seasons in Blacksburg.

In 2015, the Hokies went 15-4-2 and won their opening round game in the NCAA Championship, while in the 2014 season, Adair led the Hokies to a 16-6 record and advanced to the Sweet 16 for the third time in school history. During that season, the Hokies set a school record for most goals in a season, with 62, and fewest goals allowed in a season, surrendering just 18, and reached a program-best No. 2 ranking in the country after starting the season at 10-0-0.

In their record-setting 2013 campaign, the Hokies beat three ranked teams during the regular season and then blew out then-No. 1 Virginia 4-2 in the ACC Tournament semifinals. They added two more ranked foes to their list of conquests when they downed West Virginia 1-0 and knocked off Santa Clara by advancing on penalty kicks in the NCAA Championships. The Hokies were a No. 1 seed in the tournament and hosted four games in Blacksburg. The Hokies scored a then school-record 56 goals, breaking the mark of 45 set by the 2012 team, and shut out 12 opponents, tying the mark also set by the 2012 squad. They finished the season with a school-best No. 4 ranking in the country.

In Adair's first season as the head coach (2011), Tech matched its best finish in program history (at the time), making it all the way to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Championship. Adair led the Hokies to a 14-8-1 overall record, which included 11 shutouts.

Adair came to Tech in 2006 and served as the associate head coach under previous head coach Kelly Cagle for five seasons before being promoted. In Adair's first season as an assistant to Cagle, the Hokies suffered a losing season, but have not suffered a losing season since. In 2008, the Hokies advanced to the finals of the ACC Championship for the first time, falling to North Carolina 3-0, and in 2009, the Hokies won 16 games, then a school record, and earned a final ranking of No. 12.

Adair also possesses a great deal of playing experience, having played professionally for 10 years, including stints with the Los Angeles Galaxy of Major League Soccer and the U.S. National Futsal Team. He also spent time playing for the San Diego Sockers, Wichita Wings, Portland Timbers, San Diego Flash, Minnesota Thunder, Seattle Sounders, Milwaukee Wave, Carolina Dynamo and A.A. Ghent (Belgium) from 1993-2003.

Adair played soccer at the University of San Diego after transferring from San Diego State in the early 1990s. He earned All-America honors, was a two-year captain and helped USD to the NCAA finals, where the Toreros lost to Virginia. He scored 27 goals and had 23 assists in his three years at USD. He got his bachelor's degree in business administration from USD in 1993 and he received his MBA from USD in 1996.

Adair is married to the former Shelbylynn Mc-Bride, and they have a daughter, Callie Lynn and a son, Austin Tate. He also has two other daughters Alexandra and Madeline, and a son Jack.

• Emily Gray was named the ACC Co-Offensive Player of the Week on Oct. 5 following her twogoal performance at Pittsburgh (Oct. 2). She was also chosen to the *College Soccer News* Women's National Team of the Week (Oct. 1).

STATEMENT PERFORMANCES

• Virginia Tech has earned results against both Duke and North Carolina in the same season for the first time during its ACC history.

• Considering Tech seasons, the Hokies have scored multiple results against top-five nationally ranked programs for the first time since the 2009 campaign (wins then against both No. 1 North Carolina and No. 5 Wake Forest).

SKINNER REWARDED FOR DEFENSIVE SUCCESS

• Sophomore goalkeeper Alia Skinner was named the ACC Co-Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 28 after combining to save 22 of the 25 shots she faced against No. 4 North Carolina (Sept. 23) and No. 2 Duke (Sept. 26).

• Skinner's 14 saves against UNC set a new Virginia Tech ACC-era record (since 2004), passing the 13 saves that were made by Robin Chidester in 2009 against No. 4 Stanford.

• The second-year Tech keeper conceded once off the 16 total corners she faced against the Tar Heels (1-of-7) and the Blue Devils (0-for-9).

• With Skinner in goal, the Hokies never trailed against UNC and Duke - including a 31-minute period during which Tech played with 10 women against the Blue Devils.

• Skinner was also named to the *College Soccer News* Women's National Team of the Week (Sept. 27).

STRIKING FIRST

• Virginia Tech has scored the match-opening goal during 10 of its 15 contests this season (8-0-2 record when scoring first).

• The Hokies have yet to come from behind to earn a result during the 2021 campaign (0-5-0 record).

RESUME BUILDING

• Virginia Tech was ranked No. 31 in the Oct. 17 reveal of the NCAA Women's Soccer RPI - the seventh highest position among ACC programs. The Hokies have been ranked as high as No. 18.

• Considering the Oct. 19 issue of the *United Soccer Coaches* top 25 poll, the Hokies received the seventh most points among ACC programs (32nd most points nationally).

BIG BIRD SCHEDULE

• Virginia Tech went 3-3-2 this season against its eight regular season opponents that advanced to the 2020 NCAA tournament (held during the spring of 2021).

• The Hokies defeated two defending league champions in Liberty (Aug. 19) and Elon (Aug. 26).

• On Sept. 26, the Hokies closed a six-match stretch of their schedule that featured four ranked opponents. Tech went 1-1-2 across such matches.

HOKIES AGAINST RANKED SIDES

• Virginia Tech has earned three results from five matches played against ranked competition this season (1-2-2).

• Considering their three point-earning matches against ranked sides, the Hokies have scored first on all occasions, never trailed and led for 44.1% of the combined match time (136:34).

HOME, SWEET HOME

• Virginia Tech witnessed its eight-match unbeaten stretch at Thompson Field (7-0-1) end during its Oct. 15 home defeat to No. 1 Florida State.

• From Oct. 24, 2020, to Sept. 18, 2021, the Hokies attained a seven-match home winning streak, marking the program's longest since its eight-match streak overlapped the 2008 and 2009 seasons.

• Tech extended its streak to 13 straight regular season home wins against non-conference, non-ACC opponents (20-0-2 last 22 such matches dating back to the Hokies' 2-1 loss to Ohio State on Sept. 1, 2016).

• Since the start of the 2018 season, Tech is 9-6-2 during home ACC regular season matches that have counted toward the league standings.

TALE OF TWO LOCATIONS

• *Home (5-1-1):* Virginia Tech has scored 18 goals at a +13 differential. The Hokies trailed for the first time during their Oct. 15 match against No. 1 Florida State.

• Away/Neutral (3-4-1): Tech slipped to -2 in goal differential after its Oct. 10 loss at Wake Forest – 12 for and 14 against. The Hokies have scored first during their four point-earning matches: wins at James Madison (Sept. 9), No. 12 South Carolina (Sept. 12) and Pittsburgh (Oct. 2), plus a draw at No. 4 North Carolina (Sept. 23).

TECH EARNS AWAY POINT AT UNC

• Virginia Tech's 2-2 draw at No. 4 North Carolina (Sept. 23) marked the program's first-ever away point earned during series history.

• Tech's result presented the program with its first series point since the 2011 campaign, ending its 12-match series losing streak.

• The Hokies' 2-0 lead against the Tar Heels equated to the largest deficit UNC had faced in Chapel Hill since the 2013 season (by No. 1 Virginia).

• Sophomore goalkeeper Alia Skinner registered 14 saves (career high), helping Tech survive its 32-10 deficit in total attempts (16-5 on target).

RECENT RANKED RESULTS

• Fourth-year forward Nicole Kozlova (14 career goals) co-leads the Hokies with three matchwinning goals this season - two shy of the national lead.


