KEY STORYLINES

SCOUTING FLORIDA STATE

- The Seminoles are 12-5 overall and 5-3 in conference play heading into Friday's matchup
- Most recently, Florida State hosted Virginia and No. 4 Pittsburgh, defeating Virginia 3-0 and falling to Pitt 3-1
- Along with Virginia, the Seminoles have ACC wins over Duke (3-1), North Carolina (3-0), NC State (3-1) and Notre Dame (3-1)
- Other wins for FSU include Georgia (3-2) and then-No. 14 Florida (3-1)
- The Seminoles have five players with over 100 kills, as Morgan Chacon leads the way with 164. Emma Clothier and Khorl Louis have posted 157 and 151, respectively.

Louis is also sixth in the ACC in hitting percentage with a .357

- As the setter, Lily Tessier has over 600 assists so far, averaging 9.92 assists per set. She also has 43 kills on the year
- Defensively, libero Emery Dupes has 227 digs in her 61 sets played, with 2.36 digs per set. Louis also leads the team in blocks with 70 total. Florida State is also leading the ACC with an average of 16.21 digs per set
- Florida State is leading its opponents with a .238 hitting percentage compared to a .193 recorded by opponents

SCOUTING MIAMI

- Miami takes on Wake Forest in Winston-Salem Friday evening before making the trip to Blacksburg to face the Hokies on Sunday
- The Hurricanes had their best 15-game start since 2017 and have swept four ACC opponents including Virginia, Duke, NC State and Notre Dame
- Most recently, Miami fell to Pitt 3-1 on Friday and defeated Virginia 3-0 on Sunday
- Miami is one of the better teams in the ACC defensively, posting 15.49 digs per set, sitting in second behind Florida State
- Priscilla Hernandez plays a big role in the defensive

SCOUTING MIAMI CONT.

- effort with 253 digs on the year, good for 4.148 digs per set
- Angela Grieve is the point leader for Miami, recording 245.5 points with 216 kills, both a team-high. She is also leading the team in kills per set with 3.662
- At the net, Janice Leao has 59 total blocks with .96 per set

LAST TIME AGAINST FLORIDA STATE

- The Hokies fell 3-1 to Florida State last spring, 13-25, 25-22, 16-25 and 9-25
- The Seminoles recorded 60 kills in the match compared to only 43 from Virginia Tech
- FSU also held the edge defensively, tallying 57 digs versus 46 from the Hokies
- Mara Perry had a career-high 16 assists, marking back-to-back outings that Perry earned a new career high in that category
- Anabel Zier and Cera Powell made an impact offensively, as Zier had five kills and Powell added four. Zier also had three blocks on the day
- The win over the Hokies marked the Seminoles' ninth straight win during the spring slate

LAST TIME AGAINST MIAMI

- The Hokies were defeated by the Hurricanes last March, falling in four sets 25-15, 25-18, 20-25, 25-19
- With the win, Miami improved to 10-6 on the season and 8-6 in ACC play
- The Hurricanes found their advantage on the offensive end as they had three reach double figures in kills including outside hitters Angela Grieve (19 kills), Elizaveta Lukianova (18), Janet Kalaniuvalu (15)
- Miami hit .322 on the day compared to .209 by the Hokies, recording 66 kills with 18 errors
- Marisa Cerchio recorded 10 kills on the day, marking another consecutive match in double figures
- Brie Postema had a solid day as the setter, posting 24 assists for 108 combined assists over her last four matches

ABOUT A WEEK AGO

- The Hokies hosted No. 2 Louisville and Notre Dame last weekend, falling to both teams 3-0
- Tech played Louisville tough in the second set, pushing the score to 30-28 when Louisville jumped ahead to take the win
- Marisa Cerchio paced the Tech attack with 11 kills at a .333 clip, while Talyn Jackson manufactured 34 assists, two away from her season-high
- Jackson and Angel Robinson combined for four blocks to lead the Hokies at the net
- Tech held Louisville to a .295 hitting percentage and finished with a .210 percentage

- The Hokies were swept by Notre Dame on Sunday afternoon, 25-18, 25-15 and 25-15
- Griere Hughes ended her match with a team-high eight kills and Cera Powell added seven
- Mara Perry had a solid match defensively, recording nine digs. Talyn Jackson was the primary setter with 24 assists

ACC PLAY

- The Hokies finished ACC play with a 5-11 record a season ago, sweeping Virginia as well as then-No. 14 Duke and Syracuse
- The ACC currently has three teams ranked in the top 25. Georgia Tech is currently No. 13, while Pitt is No. 4 and Louisville is No. 2
- After Georgia Tech defeated Pitt, Louisville is the only undefeated ACC team with an 18-0 overall record
- The ACC is the only league with seven teams in the top 30 of the Oct. RPI
- As a whole, the ACC was 127-33 in non-conference competition with a .794 win percentage, both the best among Power Five conferences

DID YOU KNOW...

- Heading into the Hokies first road ACC matches, Virginia Tech had played the highest number of sets so far this season in the ACC with 57 over 14 matches
- Boston College now has the most sets played with 83. Virginia Tech is second with 77 sets played
- Louisville has only played 59 sets over 18 matches
- Seven of Virginia Tech's matches have gone into five sets as the Hokies have a 4-3 record in five-set matches

DIG PINK MATCH

- Sunday's match vs. Miami is the Dig Pink Match for the Hokies who partnered with the Side-Out Foundation to help raise awareness for breast cancer
- Sophomore Mara Perry's grandmother is a breast cancer survivor and will be doing the honorary first serve to open the match
- The Hokies have been raising money to continue the efforts in finding a cure for cancer
- Funds raised for Side-Out go toward research specifically for patients with metastatic breast cancer, the most advanced form of the disease, and the least funded area of research

BLOCKSBURG

- The Hokies are currently ranked 32nd nationally in total team blocks with 181.5 and are first in the ACC
- Heading into the weekend of Oct. 8, the Hokies were ranked fifth nationally in total team blocks with 161.5 and led the ACC
- Tech recorded 19 blocks in the match over Boston College, a season-high for the

- Hokies and three blocks away from the school record of 22 set in 2001
- Angel Robinson has been a big contributor to the Hokie's block total with 80 blocks. She is currently ranked fourth in the ACC and 64th nationally
- Middle blocker Tasha Vipond has also been in on the action, recording 67 blocks, good for 14th in the ACC

CONFERENCE STATS

- The Hokies come in at seventh for opponent hitting percentage, with opposing teams averaging a .191 hitting percentage, ahead of this week's opponent Notre Dame (8th)
- Miami is currently ranked second in opposing team hitting percentage with a .170
- Virginia Tech also sits in the fifth spot for blocks per set, averaging 2.36 per set in the ACC
- The Hokies also land within the top ten spots for total team digs (second), service aces (fourth) and opponent blocks (third)

Marci Byers was named the sixth head coach of the Virginia Tech volleyball program in January, 2020. She enters her second season at the helm of the Hokies.

During her first season with Tech, the team tallied five conference wins including a sweep of Virginia and a win over then No. 14 Duke in five sets. Byers looks to build off the 2020 season with many key returners and 10 newcomers set to make an impact.

A four-time Big South Coach of the Year selection at Radford University, she is the winningest coach in Highlanders' history, leading the program to three Big South regular season titles, two Big South Tournament championships and two NCAA Tournament berths. She is one of only five head coaches in Big South history to register 200 or more career victories.

Throughout her tenure at Radford, the Chicago native consistently recruited top talent to the New River Valley from across the country, thanks to her strong relationships within the ACC footprint, as well as with elite club programs in the Midwest, Texas and California.

Byers' squads at Radford topped the 20-win mark five times over seven seasons and compiled an 81-34 (.708) overall record over four years. She led the Highlanders to a 22-7 record in 2018, including a 12-4 mark in Big South play. They reached the Big South Tournament title game for the second consecutive season and were selected to play in the National Invitational Volleyball Championship where they defeated App State in the first round. During her tenure at Radford, her student-athletes twice registered the top team GPA of any program at the school (2008 and 2013).

No stranger to defeating Power Five foes, under her direction in 2017 the Highlanders registered wins at Arizona, at South Carolina and at Virginia Tech en route to a Big South Tournament title and an NCAA Tournament berth. In 2016, Byers led Radford to a 24-6 record, including a perfect 11-0 mark at home and a Big South regular season championship. Her squads also registered wins against Wake Forest in 2016 and Washington State in 2015. Byers' 2014 squad finished with a 24-8 mark that included wins over California and Maryland as Radford claimed

the Big South regular season title. The Highlanders earned their first NCAA Tournament appearance under Byers in 2013 after winning both the Big South regular season and tournament titles, finishing the season with a 25-10 record.

Prior to beginning her tenure at Radford in 2008, she spent two seasons at NCAA Division II Chowan University in Murfreesboro, N.C. After going 4-17 in her initial season in 2006, Byers guided the Hawks to a 26-11 record as the squad averaged the most aces per game of any Division II squad. Prior to joining the collegiate ranks, she posted a 121-49 record in 10 seasons coaching in the Richmond prep ranks, spending two seasons at Mills Godwin High School and eight years at Hermitage High School.

Byers has also been a successful coach at the club level. Her 2003-04 team qualified for the Junior Olympics in Houston, while her 2004-05 team reached the Junior Olympics in Salt Lake City. She was also invited to participate in the USA Volleyball Coaches Clinic at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs.

She is a 1995 graduate of Virginia Union University where she graduated with honors with a bachelor's degree in secondary education with a concentration in mathematics. A four-year starter on the volleyball team, she captained the team as both a junior and senior. Her husband, J.D., serves as an assistant men's basketball coach at VCU. The couple are parents of a daughter, Kamryn Grey.

NOTEWORTHY

ACC LEADERS

- Logan Mosley is second in the ACC in digs with 306 and is sixth in digs per set with 3.97 on the season
- Middle Blocker Angel Robinson secures the 11th spot for hitting percentage, posting a .341, a team-high, on 261 total attempts
- Tasha Vipond grabs the number six spot for blocks per set with an average of 1.22 per set. She has 67 total blocks, with 10 solo blocks and 57 block assists
- Sophomore Cierra Huntely is ranked eighth in service aces per set, holding an average of .36 and 18 total

FRESHMAN DEBUT

- Freshman Michelle Bennett made her first appearance as a Hokie this weekend, playing in both matches against Louisville and Notre Dame
- She played in all six sets this weekend as a defensive specialist, recording two digs against Louisville and a service ace
- Against Notre Dame, Bennett had seven digs, tied for the team-high with another freshman Mary Page and senior Talyn Jackson
- Bennett was a four-year letter winner at Northwest High School in Germantown, Md. And ranked first in digs in the state of Maryland after her career

ZERO TIME TO WASTE

- Anabel Zier played a season-high four sets against Boston College, making a big impact at the net with seven total blocks, as the Hokies recorded a season-high 19 blocks
- The junior also had six kills and hit .308 over her four sets, both a season-high for her
- Zier made her first start of the season the following Sunday against Syracuse, playing in all three sets
- She had five kills and a block assist on the afternoon

GETTING IN THE GROOVE

- Graduate student Griere Hughes has been making an impact for the Hokies on the court, leading the team in several different categories
- Along with points per set, the outside hitter is also leading the team in kills per set

with 2.61

- Hughes already has 183 kills on the season, 40 more than the next highest player on the team
- She has also been big at the net for Tech, with 35 total blocks, good for .5 blocks per set

1,000 KILLS

- Senior Marisa Cerchio is 68 kills away from reaching 1,000 kills over her Virginia Tech career
- Cerchio would be the 17th player in school history to reach the milestone, with the most recent Hokie being Jaila Tolbert who recorded 1,030 from 2015-18
- She has been a mainstay in the Hokie lineup since arriving on campus in 2017, playing in 437 sets over her five-year career
- The right-side hitter had a standout junior campaign, recording 312 kills after playing in all 31 matches, a career-high. She was averaging 2.62 kills per set and hit .218 on the season

MILESTONE ACHIEVED

- Logan Mosley recorded her 1,000th career dig in the match against Louisville, becoming the 19th Hokie in school history to do so
- The Apex, N.C. native recorded her ninth and record-clinching dig late in the third set
- She is the first Tech player to reach 1,000 career digs since Carol Rafferty did so in 2018
- Mosley also holds the single-match dig record, achieving 39 digs in just her fifth match as a freshman. The junior also holds the single-season freshman digs record, tallying 507 as a rookie

HOKIE LEADERS

- Defensively, the Hokies are outperforming their opponents with only 97 reception errors compared to 109 by opponents. Tech averages only 1.3 errors per set while opponents are averaging 1.4
- Virginia Tech has also had success at the net, leading its opponents with 181.5 blocks and allowing 140.5 by opponents. The Hokies are averaging 2.4 blocks per set while opponents are averaging 1.8
- Talyn Jackson has transitioned to the primary setter position, posting 171 assists and 4.28 assists per set over 13 matches
