KEY STORYLINES

SIX-STRAIGHT

Virginia Tech expanded on its program record of consecutive tournament appearances with its berth into the 2021 NCAA Tournament. The Hokies are 8-4-1 in this run. By achieving this feat. Tech joins four other programs (Indiana, Maryland, Wake Forest and Washington) as the only teams to make the last six tournaments.

The Hokies are the only team from Virginia to make this year's field. This is the first time that Tech has been the only Commonwealth school to make the field. The last time such a thing occurred was 2009 (Virginia).

NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

This is Virginia Tech's tenth appearance in the NCAA Tournament. The Hokies' most successful run came in 2007 when they reached the College Cup.

Fifth-year senior Camron Lennon has appeared in eight career NCAA Tournament matches. dating back to Nov. 19, 2017 vs. Michigan St. Sivert Haugli, Kahlil Dover, Andrew Weber, Connor Jordan-Hvde, and Chris Little have been with Tech for four postseason appearances.

MORE THAN 90

Seven of Tech's games have gone to overtime in the 2021 season. The Hokies are 3-1-3 in those matches, with all three wins coming at home. Four of Tech's last five postseason games have gone to extra time and VT is 2-1-1 in thos matches.

LAST TIME OUT

Virginia Tech earned a win in the tournament for the sixth consecutive season on Thursday against Campbell. Kyle McDowell, Kahlil Dover and Pol Monells combined

on both goals, with McDowell scoring the first, Dover the second, and Monells assisting both.

NICOLA STEPS UP

After battling back from multiple knee injuries in his career, junior Chris Nicola stepped into a starting spot for missing defender Sivert Haugli against Boston College.

IT'S A TEAM EFFORT

Eleven players (Labovitz, Pugh, Ameres, Lennon, Monells, Flores, Blacklock, Dover, Haugli, McDowell, and Taber) have recorded a goal and an assist this season. Pugh (ETSU), Monells (Louisville), Dover (Louisville) and McDowell (Campbell) have done it in the same game.

Taking over the reins of a program that faced strict recruiting restrictions, head coach Mike Brizendine has rebuilt the men's soccer team and has seen the most success in program history. Brizendine has made it his mission to lead the Virginia Tech program to new heights and make the Hokies into one of the top programs in the Atlantic Coastal Conference.

Professional development has been an important component in the Virginia Tech men's soccer program under Brizendine's watch and that mission came full circle in the MLS SuperDraft 2021. Daniel Pereira was selected No. 1 by Austin FC after two years with the Hokies, while former walk-on Kristo Strickler was selected No. 30 overall by Houston Dynamo.

From 2016-19 the Hokies had the greatest stretch in program history as they made the NCAA Tournament for a program record fourth consecutive time, earned the highest national seeding in program history (10th), won the most ACC games in a four-year time (46) and made six tournament appearances.

In 2019 the Hokies once again made the NCAA Tournament as they claimed the 10th seed and a first-round bye. Tech would face and defeat No. 16 New Hampshire 4-1 in the round of 32 before falling late to Stanford 2-1 in their second-straight Sweet Sixteen appearance.

James Kasak became the seventh Hokie to train under Brizendine and be drafted as he was taken with the sixth pick of the fourth round.

The 2018 campaign was another stellar year for the Hokies as they once again surpassed 10 wins and made their second trip to the round of 16 in the past three seasons.

The 2017 season saw Tech make their second consecutive NCAA appearance season as they defeated Air Force 2-0 in the First Round. On the way to their tournament appearance, the Hokies had historic victories over Creighton, handing the Blue Jays their first home loss on opening night since 1995 and beating No. 1 Notre Dame thanks to two goals from forward Marcelo Acuna.

Following the 2017 season, Ben Lundgaard was taken with the 22nd overall selection by the Columbus Crew Major League Soccer SuperDraft.

The 2016 season was one of the best seasons in recent history and marked a resurgence of the Tech soccer program. The Hokies earned an atlarge bid to the NCAA tournament, the program's first in a decade, opening with a 1-0 victory over East Tennessee State. The Hokies then went on to defeat Charlotte and Indiana, advancing to the Elite Eight. The program ended the season ranked eighth nationally.

Brizendine was named the 2016 VaSID Coach of the Year with junior Marcelo Acuna earning third-team All-America honors. Senior Juan Pablo Saavedra joined an elite group of former Hokies when he was drafted by FC Toronto in the 2016 MLS Draft.

Brizendine has coached over 25 players that have gone on to play professional soccer, as well as eight MLS draftees. After taking over a program facing significant recruiting restrictions and coming off a four-win season, his leadership has returned Virginia Tech to one of the most competitive programs in the nation.

After serving 10 years as a collegiate assistant coach, including five at Virginia Tech, Brizendine finally got his opportunity lead his own program when former AD Jim Weaver promoted him to the head coach on June 11, 2009.

During the 2015 season, Brizendine's team won five games, including an upset against then-No. 10 Xavier. Sophomore Merlin Baus led the team, tallying 15 points. At the conclusion of the season, Ricardo John signed with the professional team Central F.C. in his native country of Trinidad and Tobago.

In 2014, Brizendine's young squad produced seven wins, including victories over Wake Forest, NC State, SIUE and UNCG. Freshman Ricardo John, who tallied 11 points, was named all-conference and all-region. Underclassmen scored all 19 goals and freshman keeper Ben Lundgaard recorded six shutouts in seeing nearly 75 percent of the minutes in goal.

The 2013 season saw a school-record three players either drafted into the MLS or sign professional contracts following the season. The Hokies also earned eight points in ACC play, the most since 2007, behind five ties and an upset victory over No. 17 Syracuse. Under Brizendine's direction, the Hokie defense only allowed 23 goals all season, the lowest total allowed since 2005, as well as the second first-team All-ACC selection in school history.

Brizendine's 2012 team earned the most wins in a season (seven) for the program since 2007. On Nov. 5, 2012, in College Park, Md., the Hokies scored three unanswered goals to top NC State in the first round of the Atlantic Coast Conference tournament, capturing only the second victory for the team in the tournament since the school joined the conference in 2004.

The 2011 side played five top-25 opponents during the season, and the year was highlighted by a 1-O double-overtime win over 2011 NCAA champion North Carolina. The victory was the program's first over a No. 1 ranked opponent since 2004.

Under Brizendine's guidance, the Hokies have also had a great deal of success in the classroom. His teams earned the NSCAA Team Academic Award six times (2010-14, 2016-17). The award honors teams with a cumulative grade-point average of 3.0 or higher.

As an assistant under former coach Oliver Weiss, Brizendine played an integral role in helping the Hokies make it to the College Cup for the first time in the program's history. For his contributions, he was recognized as the NSCAA's Atlantic Region Assistant Coach of the Year in 2007.

Brizendine joined the Hokie staff after a successful stint with Bridgewater (Va.) College, a Division III program that participates in the Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC). After assisting both the men's and women's programs at Bridgewater in 2000, he became the head men's coach from 2001 to 2003, guiding the team from non-competitive status to a full-fledged Division III program. Brizendine led Bridgewater to its two best single-season records – 12-6 in 2003 and 11-7 in 2002 – for a 23-13 mark over two seasons and a .639 winning percentage. For this significant turnaround, his peers named him ODAC Coach of the Year in 2003.

NEWS, NOTES, AND TRENDS

HOKIE HONORS

- Jacob Labovitz was named first-team All ACC, Mayola Kinyua received third team All-ACC honors, while Danny Flores was named to the All-Freshman team.
- Sivert Haugli was named to the ACC Preseason Watch List. The Virginia Tech captain was also named United Soccer Coaches Player of the Week for his two-goal performance against No. 1 Marshall.
- Jacob Labovitz was named ACC Offensive Player of the Week after scoring two goals, including the overtime game winner, against Virginia.
- Danny Flores earned ACC Offensive Player of the Week honors following his wonder goal in OT against Notre Dame, which also features on SportsCenter's Top 10 plays at No. 4.

BY THE ACC NUMBERS

- Jacob Labovitz is tied for fifth in the ACC in goals scored with eight.
- Kyle McDowell is tied for first in the ACC with eight assists.
- Labovitz is tied for sixth in the ACC with 20 points.
- Ben Martino is third in the ACC in total saves with 61, averaging 3.59 saves per game which is good for third in the league.

WELL-BEHAVED HOKIES

• The Hokies finished the regular season averaging the least amount of fouls per game with 10.19. Tech was also the last team to receive a red card.

CLUTCH GENE

• Labovitz has now scored three game-winners in overtime for the Hokies. The first occurrence came against Louisville in 2020, then again in the second round of the 2020 NCAA Tournament against No. 15 Oregon State. In each of the three matches, Labovitz scored two goals.

DRAFT DAY

- History was made on January 21, 2021, as two Virginia Tech players were selected in the MLS SuperDraft: Daniel Pereira and Kristo Strickler.
- Pereira, a native of Roanoke, Va., was selected first overall by Austin FC, and Kristo Strickler, a native of Hilliard, Oh., was selected No. 30 overall by Houston Dynamo.
- Pereira's selection made him the first Virginia Tech men's soccer player selected first overall, along with the first South American player picked first.
- The midfielder was immediately placed into the Austin FC starting lineup, ahead of its inaugural season in the MLS.
- Strickler now plays with Tormenta FC.

BEST CLASS YET

- The Hokies brought in the 12th ranked recruiting class in the 2021 cycle, per Top-DrawerSoccer.com.
- The freshman class includes players with experience playing in the USL Championship (Martino, Flores), internationally (Taber), and the 2021 North Carolina Gatorade Player of the Year (Hensley).

JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE

- While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."
- Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its named to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.
- Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.
- The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.
- Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."
- Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.

WHAT IS A HOKIE?

- That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics.
 The answer leads back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical
 College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.
- With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body. Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today.
- Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention.
- Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.
- Following is the "Old Hokie" yell in its original form:

Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy! Tech! Tech! V.P.I.! Sola-Rex Sola-Rah

THOMPSON FIELD, THE HOME OF THE HOKIES



Thompson Field serves as the home of the Virginia Tech men's and women's soccer teams as well as the lacrosse team. Located in the center of the Virginia Tech athletics complex, the facility ranks as one of the finest for both soccer and lacrosse in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Located across from Lane Stadium, the Hokies' football home, and adjacent to Tech Softball Park, Thompson Field was completed in the fall of 2003 and dedicated in 2008 in the name of Sandra D. Thompson, a longtime supporter of women's athletics at Virginia Tech.

The field is a bluegrass playing surface and measures approximately 75 by 120 yards. It is equipped with an underground irrigation system and a drainage system that allows for it to be ready for play quickly following rainstorms. The complex also features a wireless scoreboard, and a permanent Hubbell lighting system allows for night games.

The athletics department has made improvements gradually since the venue opened in 2003. In 2005, workers completed a new restroom facility for the field, and during the summer of 2008, a new game operations center was erected atop the stadium above the fans. The approximately 900-square foot facility includes two broadcast booths for both home team and visiting team radio broadcasts. The center also has two covered areas devoted to broadcasting and/or videographers' cameras, and there is a large working area for media members covering the Hokies.

The climate-controlled facility also contains a state-of-the-art sound system and Ethernet capability. The Internet-ready facility allows Tech's official athletics website, hokiesports.com, to originate live audio broadcasts and live stats of the Hokies' matches from the press box. Above the grandstand is a wired camera deck.

Between each team's bench area is the Sandy D. Thompson Press Box. Formerly the press operations center for the field, the facility is now used as a halftime room for game officials and as an auxiliary area for press and game operations.
