#### BASE TO BASE

- The No. 14/15 Hokies (3-0, 0-0 ACC) moved up one spot in each of the two major polls Tuesday after holding Kennesaw State scoreless in a season-opening series sweep last weekend.
- Tech will face two ACC opponents in Clemson (2-0, 0-0 ACC), who received votes in both polls, and No. 13/14 Florida State (3-1, 0-0 ACC) to open the conference season.
- The No. 14 ranking in the USA Today/NFCA Coaches Poll is the highest the program has achieved since 2007.

#### WHO TO WATCH



- Keely Rochard threw complete game shutouts in back-to-back starts at Kennesaw State.
- She struck out 18 batters and allowed just five hits in the 14.0 innings pitched.

- Freshman Cameron Fagan leads the team with five hits through the team's first three games.
- She holds a .455 batting average and is tied for the team-lead in runs, with three, and stolen bases, with two.



#### LAST TIME OUT

- The Hokies swept Kennesaw State in their three-game series to open the season last weekend.
- Tech won 6-0, 6-0 and 4-0, shutting out the Owls in all three games. Last time the Hokies shut out a team over an entire series was March 6-8, 2020 at Virginia.
- Jayne Bailey leads the team with four RBIs after the opening weekend, recording all four in the second game of the series.

**GREENSBORO, N.C.** – Florida State leads all ACC teams with four selections to the 2021 Preseason All-ACC Softball Team and has been selected as the 2021 ACC preseason favorite in a vote of the league's 13 head coaches.

The Seminoles, who have won the last six ACC Softball Championships, received nine first-place votes. Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own teams.

Virginia Tech finished second in the poll with 136 points and four first-place votes, while Notre Dame was picked third with 114 points. Duke (99 points), North Carolina (96 points) and Clemson (88 points) were slated fourth, fifth and sixth, respectively. Louisville was picked seventh with 81 points, followed by NC State (78 points), Georgia Tech (61 points) and Syracuse in 10th with 39 points. Pitt finished with 31 points for 11th, and Virginia (28 points) and Boston College (22 points) rounded out the voting.

**HOKIE STORYLINES AT CLEMSON**

- This is the first ever meeting between the Hokies and Tigers on the softball field after Clemson started its program last season.
- Tech hasn't lost an ACC series since April 21, 2019 after sweeping Virginia in 2020 in the only ACC series before the pandemic ended the season.
- Through three games in 2021, the Hokies have yet to allow a run to their opponents, shutting out Kennesaw State in the season-opening series.

**HOKIE STORYLINES VS. FSU**

- Saturday and Sunday's three-game set will pit the No. 1 and No. 2 teams in the ACC according to the 2021 ACC Preseason Coaches Poll against each other.
- Tech was picked second in the conference behind Florida State for the second straight year. The Hokies and Seminoles were the only teams to receive first-place votes in 2021.
- Tech has not beaten FSU since March 11, 2014, losing 12 straight to the Seminoles.

**PARTY LIKE ITS 2007**

- The Hokies are ranked No. 14 in this week's USA Today/NFCA Coaches Poll it's highest ranking since 2007 and second-highest ranking ever.
- Tech was ranked No. 13 in the poll for one week in 2007, marking its highest rank in program history.
- The Hokies check in at No. 15 in this week's ESPN.com/USA Softball Poll.

**LOCKDOWN PITCHING**

- Keely Rochard and Ivy Rosenberry did not allow a run to Kennesaw State in the three-game series to open the season.
- The Owls were seventh in the nation in 2020 in batting average, batting .350 as a team for the season.
- Rochard and Rosenberry held KSU to a .108 batting average, allowing just eight hits combined.

**EXTRA EXTRA**

- The Hokies hit eight extra-base hits at Kennesaw State, averaging over two per game, with five doubles, two home runs and one triple.
- Jayme Bailey and Emma Ritter lead the team with two a piece, a double and triple for Bailey and a double and home run for Ritter.

**NEW YEAR, SAME KEELY**

- Starting two out of the three games at Kennesaw State, pitcher Keely Rochard threw two complete game shutouts and struck out 18 batter while doing so.
- Rochard led the country in 2020 in strikeouts (183), wins (15) and shutouts (7).
- In the 14.0 innings pitched this year, Rochard has allowed only five hits and walked ust two batters.

**SECOND TIMES THE CHARM**

- Freshmen Addy Greene and Emma Ritter both homered in their second career at-bats in Game 1 of the series at Kennesaw State.
- Ritter launched a lead-off solo shot in the fourth inning to increase Tech's lead to 3-0 and two batters later Greene hit a two-run bomb that gave the Hokies a 5-0 lead.
- Both Greene and Ritter started all three games of the series at second base and left field, respectively.

**QUITE THE DEBUT**

- Freshman Ivy Rosenberry made her first start Saturday in Game 2 at Kennesaw State, throwing a complete game shutout.
- The Virginia native allowed just three hits, no walks and struck out two.
- Rosenberry retired 21 of the 24 batters she faced.

**HOT START**

- Freshman Cameron Fagan leads the Hokies in batting average at .455 with five hits on the season after making her collegiate debut at Kennesaw State.
- Fagan started all three games at shortstop and was the only Hokie to record a hit in all three games.
- The Florida native is also tied for the team lead with two stolen bases and three runs scored.

**THEY'RE BACK**

- The Hokies bring back eight starters from last season's 21-4 team, including Keely Rochard, Kelsey Bennett, Jayme Bailey and Darby Trull.
- Kelsey Brown is also back after leading the team in stolen bases last season with 18 in 25 games.
- Catcher Mackenzie Lawter, Designated Player Grace Chavez and First Base Meredith Slaw are also back.

**IT'S BEEN A WHILE**

- Virginia Tech is ranked No. 15 to start the season the USA Today/NFCA Coaches Poll, its highest preseason ranking since 2008.
- The only higher ranking Tech has ever held at any time was No. 13 for one week in 2007.

**NEED A BIGGER SHELF**

- Junior pitcher Keely Rochard racked in preseason awards before the 2021 season earning Preseason All-ACC Team, D1 Softball & Justin's World of Softball Preseason All-American and named to the USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year watchlist, to name a few.
- Rochard led the country in strikeouts (183), wins (15) and shutouts (7) in 2020.

**CLOSING THE GAP**

- Virginia Tech was picked to finish second in the conference behind Florida State in the 2021 ACC Preseason Coaches Poll.
- Tech received 136 points in the poll, just five behind Florida State's 141.
- The two teams were picked to finish first and second, respectively in the 2020 poll, but the Seminoles led the Hokies by a 18-point margin.
- The Hokies and Seminoles were the only teams in the conference to garner first-place votes with FSU receiving nine and VT four.

**HITTING EXPLOSION**

- The Hokies have three of their four all-time leaders in batting average on the current roster.
- Jayme Bailey (.382), Kelsey Bennett (.368) and Darby Trull (.362) are Nos. 2-4 on the all-time list, respectively.
- The same three are also in the top-four of all-time on-base percentage in school history.
- Four out of the top-nine in highest slugging percentage in school history are also currently on the roster. Bennett and Bailey are Nos. 1-2 at .746 and .636, respectively, while Trull and Mackenzie Lawter are tied for eighth at .525.

**ROCHARD MOVING UP**

- At 444 career strikeouts, Keely Rochard is ninth all-time on the VT strikeout list.
- She is just 23 strikeouts away from passing Kelly Heinz for eighth on the list.
- Rochard is second on the all-time strikeouts per seven innings list, registering 8.8 Ks/7 IP.
- She needs just five more wins to pass Carrie Eberle for the ninth-most winningest pitcher in Hokies history.
- Currently fifth on the all-time VT shutouts leaders, Rochard needs two more to pass Maggie Tyler for sole possession of fourth.

**HOKIES STAY HOT IN FLORIDA**

- Tech went 4-1 in Jacksonville at the JU/UNF Spring Break Challenge.
- The Spring Break Challenge was the second time this season the Hokies made the trip to Florida. Tech went 3-2 at the St. Pete/Clearwater Elite Invitational.

**ROCHARD NEARLY PERFECT**

- Keely Rochard threw her fourth-career no-hitter at Jacksonville, throwing seven innings and striking out 13 batters.
- A first-inning walk was the difference in the no-hitter and a perfect game, which would have been the second of her career.
- Rochard nearly threw back-to-back no-hitters against Stony Brook. The Seawolves got a hit with two outs in the bottom of the seventh to break up almost 14-straight innings of no-hit ball.

**TECH SWEEPS IN CHARLESTON**

- The Hokies went 5-0 at the Charleston Invitational last week, winning all five by at least five runs and two by run-rule.
- Tech beat Dartmouth 12-2 [5], Army 8-3, Bradley 9-1, North Carolina A&T 16-0 [5] and College of Charleston 5-0.
- Meredith Slaw led the team in RBIs for the weekend with eight in just seven at-bats. She set career-highs in RBIs (4), hits (2) and runs scored (2) vs. North Carolina A&T.
- Kaylee Hewitt threw her first career no-hitter.

**HEWITT THROWS NO-NO**

- Freshman Kaylee Hewitt threw her first career no-hitter against North Carolina A&T.
- She accomplished the feat with only 59 pitched through five innings.
- Hewitt was one walk from a perfect game after she allowed a base on balls in the first inning and retired every batter after.

- The Hokies took down #18/17 South Carolina, #14/13 Minnesota and #21/23 Northwestern in Florida.
- Minnesota was the highest ranked opponent that Tech beat at a neutral site since No. 8 Georgia on March 1, 2019.
- The Hokies were ranked No. 24/25 following the weekend.
- the Hokies last year.

**SOMETHING ABOUT THE OPENER**

- For the second straight season under Pete D'Amour's direction, the Hokies broke the school record for stolen bases in the season-opening weekend in 2020.
- Tech put together eight steals at Coastal Carolina last Friday night, topping the previous high of seven set versus Purdue last year.
- The Hokies, as stated on the first page, rank 10th in the country in steals per game (3.0).

**RACK 'EM UP**

**A HISTORY LESSON**

- Tech has been to nine regionals in its storied history, including five of the last nine years, and owns an overall record of 14-17 in regionals.
- The kicker is that it hasn't made it out of one since 2008, when it went onto the Ann Arbor Super Regional and eventually the WCWS.
- Of the nine NCAA regional trips, eight of the nine have been on SEC campuses.

**TALK ABOUT A TURNAROUND**

- Under Tech coach Pete D'Amour's guidance, Tech cracked the NCAA record book for biggest turnarounds.
- The minimum is 20 more wins than the previous season. Tech's 21 1/2-win differential is tied for the 18th-most in NCAA history and most since 2011, when Indiana had a 21 1/2-game turnaround.

**ACC REGULAR-SEASON CHAMPS**

- For the first time since 2007 and only the second time in school history, the Hokies came away with the best record in the ACC during the regular season.
- Tech's 20-4 record in ACC play topped Florida State's clip of 19-5, giving them a one-game advantage and the crown. It also won the Coastal Division for the first time in program history.
- But the Seminoles would get it done in the ACC Championship, winning the 10-team tournament on their home field.

**THE BEST IN THE ACC**

- In 2019, Tech led the ACC in a few categories when it came to the plate and the circle.
- The Hokies boasted three team categories that sat atop the league's stats.
- As a team, Tech had the best batting average (.334), fewest hits allowed (293) and shutouts (22).

**US & OU**

- Tech, made up of an elite pitching staff and a bunch of sound batters, was one of only two teams in the nation in 2019 to be in the top six nationally in shutouts (22) and batting average (.334).
- The other school was Oklahoma, the Big 12 champion and the WCWS runner-up.

**OUT AHEAD**

- The Hokies in 2019 typically got off to a fast start, outscoring their opponents 235-32 in the first three innings of games in Year 1 of the Pete D'Amour era.
- They outscored their opponents 90-10 in the first inning, 62-11 in the second and 83-11 in the third.
- Tech went 45-3 when it scored first last year and an underwhelming 2-8 when its opponent scored first.

**THE MOUNTAINTOP**

- After winning all three of its games at Boston College for their final ACC series, the Hokies finished with the most ACC wins in school history, boasting 20 in 2019.
- Of those 20, 12 came on the road with Tech owning a perfect 12-0 record in ACC road games.

- With getting a W vs. the Tar Heels, Tech eclipsed the 40-win plateau for the first time since 2012.

**SHUT 'EM DOWN**

- Pitcher Keely Rochard had a knack for not allowing an opponent to sniff the plate in 2019.
- She was one of only 19 players to have 10 or more shutouts and finished tied for eighth in the land with 11 on the season.
- The Hokies have a chance of seeing a player who was also one of the top 19 players in Northwestern's Danielle Williams (13 shutouts) on Sunday.



### A SENSE OF URGENCY

- The Hokies batted a sizzling .598 (79 of 132) with a runner on third base and there are less than two outs in 2019. Having a sense of urgency, Tech typically knocked that runner in - and then some.

### THEY DIG THE LONG BALL

- Tech set a school record for the most home runs hit in a season in 2019, boasting 97 for the fifth most in the nation.
- What puts it in perspective is that they only hit 35 last season, including the team high for a player being just eight. Last season, the Hokies had four players with eight or more homers.

### DIAPER DANDIES

- Kelsey Bennett and Jayme Bailey were named to the Schutt Sports/NFCA National Freshman of the Year Top 25 list on April 18, 2019, becoming the first-ever Hokies to make the list.
- With them making the list, they were one of only two schools to boast two players (UCLA).
- Bennett would make the top 10 list, as announced on May 9, 2019, the only freshman out of the ACC.

### REJECTED

- Tech blanked in-state rival Virginia in all three games of the series in 2019, clinching a point in the Commonwealth Clash, as well as holding the Wa-hoos to never reaching third base or home plate.
- It marked the second straight year that the Hokies swept the Cavaliers and the first time ever holding an opponent scoreless in a three-game series.

### ROCHARD SPINS PERFECT GAME

- After taking a loss to then-No. 8/8 Georgia in March, pitcher Keely Rochard got another chance in the circle versus a ranked team and did not disappoint.
- Rochard, who was quoted after the game saying she wanted another shot versus a top opponent, put together her best game yet against then-No. 20/17 JMU in Blacksburg, throwing a perfect game.
- The righty finished with 60 pitches in five innings of work, getting her 15 outs by nine pop ups, two grounders and four Ks.
- It marked the seventh perfect game in program history and first since Jasmine Harrell's on May 1, 2012, in a 9-0 win over Liberty in five innings.

### JOINING ELITE COMPANY

- Pitcher Keely Rochard became just the fifth Hokie to pitch a perfect game, joining Angela Tincher (2), Ashlee Dobbe (2), Katie Maynard (1) and Jasmine Harrell (1).
- It also marked Rochard's third no-hit game of the season, as she threw two no-nos in February of 2019.
- Her three no-nos made her one of only five players in school history to have three or more no-hitters, joining Angela Tincher (14), Ashlee Dobbe (8), Clarisa Crowell (4) and Kelly Heinz (3).

### RUN-RULIN' THE BEST

- Before Tech's 12-0 [5] victory over then-No. 20/17 JMU, the last time Tech run-ruled a ranked team takes you all the way back to April 1, 2007, when it defeated No. 24 NC State 8-0 [5].
- But that was the only time previously in history that's happened, making the JMU accomplishment just the second time in school history.

### NOT IN OUR HOUSE

- The win over nationally ranked JMU on April 10 marked the first time Tech had won at home versus a top-25 team since April 6, 2016, which was ironically versus JMU.
- The last time Tech played in a game when both teams were ranked and won at home was on April 26, 2008, against No. 14 North Carolina. It also marked Coach D'Amour's first ranked win at TSP.
- It was Tech's 18th win at home against a ranked team.

### SAY IT AIN'T SO

- The school record at Tech for consecutive games played without an error was six, which was set Feb. 28-March 8, 2007.
- After their series at Duke in 2019, the record fell with the Hokies playing nine straight errorless games before making one in the series finale. Tech went 8-1 during that stretch.

### WHEN THE BIG DOGS SHOW UP

- Tech has had its fair share of ranked opponents come through Tech Softball Park (49 games).
- The Hokies are 18-33 (.353) in those games and are 5-7 (.417) when Tech is ranked, too.
- Before April 10, 2019, the last time Tech was ranked and beat a ranked team at home was on April 26, 2008, when it took down No. 14 North Carolina 5-2 [10] when the Hokies were ranked No. 18.

- Sophomore Keely Rochard was on her A-game in the circle the week of Feb. 15-17, 2019, facing 38 batters and not surrendering a hit and only allowing three walks to Detroit Mercy and Charleston Southern.
- Her two no-hitters made her the third player in school history to have consecutive no-nos, joining Clarisa Crowell (1999) and Ashlee Dobbe (2000).
- She also became the first player since 2000 to accomplish the feat and only the sixth Hokie to post two or more no-hitters, as well as the first no-hitter since Feb. 24, 2017, when Aysha Richardson did it against Seton Hall in five innings.

The Virginia Tech softball team has the luxury of playing and practicing in some of the finest facilities on the East Coast. Using the Tech Softball Park, Softball Indoor Facility and a state-of-the-art weight room, the Hokies train in terrific facilities designed to help them win championships. Combined with a new locker room and one of the best scoreboard and video boards in the country, the Hokies have it all when it comes to what they need to win.

Tech Softball Park, which was completed in the fall of 1997, has dimensions of 200 feet down the lines and 220 feet to center field. In January of 2008, an additional 746 permanent seats were installed, bringing the capacity up from 336 to 1,024. The new bleachers match the ones that were already in place and now extend down to the end of both dugouts.

Thanks to an anonymous donation, TSP now has seatbacks in the section behind home plate, which was completed in fall 2017.

In 2008, the Hokies reached new levels, culminating with a trip to Oklahoma City for the Women's College World Series. After finishing second in the regular season, the Hokies rolled through the ACC Tournament for the second time in a row, guaranteeing them their fourth straight NCAA Regional appearance.

Pitcher Angela Tincher led the way in the circle, winning All-America honors and National Player of the Year. She became only the third person at the time in NCAA softball history to rack up over 2,000 career strikeouts.

The Hokies made their first trip ever to the WCWS and finished the season with a school-record 50 wins, program-best 16 ACC wins and highest-ever finish in the NFCA poll with a No. 8 ranking in the final poll.

Tech also had a historic upset of the U.S. National Team, breaking the Red, White & Blue's 185-game, pre-Olympic exhibition tour winning streak with a 1-0 win on March 26.

**What's a Hokie?**



The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which is still used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

The official university school colors - Chicago Maroon and Burnt Orange - also were introduced in 1896. The colors were chosen by a committee because they made a 'unique combination' not worn elsewhere at the time. The official definition of "Hokie" is "a loyal Virginia Tech Fan".

**SOFTBALL INDOOR FACILITY**

- The facility, which is attached to Rector Field House (track & field) and immediately adjacent to Tech Softball Park, opened the fall 2018 and provides the Hokies with an indoor infield for practice during inclement weather, along with four cages for hitting and pitching practice.
- The one-story building also features two coaches rooms, an equipment room, a team room, a film room, a mudroom and team facilities. The facility will be available to the program year-round and will have uses for practice, team events and gameday necessities. The new facility will encompass more than 16,000 square feet.
- The facility was designed by Cannon Designs and was built by Branch Associates of Salem, Virginia. This project was a part of a larger plan that vastly improved Rector Field House (track & field) and all of the adjacent athletics facilities. Total cost was roughly \$18 million.

In his second season leading the Hokies, Coach Pete D'Amour led the team to a 21-4 record and was in first place in the ACC when the season ended. He helped guide the team to an impressive 3-2 record at the St. Pete/Clearwater Elite Invitational against five top-25 opponents, including wins over #14 Minnesota and #17 South Carolina. D'Amour guided the progression of pitcher Keely Rochard, who was one of the nation's top pitchers in 2020, and also helped the Hokies' offense to the highest scoring in the ACC.

Guiding Virginia Tech to one of the biggest turnarounds in NCAA softball history, Pete D'Amour led the Hokies in his first year to a 24-game win improvement in 2019 after posting a 47-11 record, including a 20-4 mark in ACC play.

The 47 wins were the fourth most in school history while the 20 ACC wins were the most in program history. On Tech's way to 20 league wins, it earned an ACC regular-season title and a Coastal Division crown after being picked 10th in the ACC preseason poll. By doing so, it also earned the Hokies their first trip to the NCAA Tournament since 2015, winning two games at the Lexington Regional to pick up their first NCAA win since 2014.

No stranger to success, D'Amour, out of the new 11 Power Five head coaches in 2019, picked up the most wins of the group. The 2019 ACC Coach of the Year earned the nod to mark just Tech's second time winning it, while a school-record five Hokies made an All-ACC first team. Under D'Amour's direction, pitcher Carrie Eberle was named ACC Pitcher of the Year and third baseman Kelsey Bennett was tabbed Freshman of the Year.

He also tutored two Softball America All-Americans in outfielders Emma Strouth and Darby Trull, who both hit over .400 and tallied 60-plus putouts, as well as a school-record seven NFCA All-Region (Mid-Atlantic) selections and a school-record eight VaSID all-staters. D'Amour also was tabbed VaSID Coach of the Year.

Under his watch, Tech became ranked during the season, something that hadn't been done since 2015, and got up to as high as No. 19 in the ESPN.com/USA Softball poll and No. 22 in the USA Today/NFCA poll. The Hokies were ranked for 11 consecutive weeks in the ESPN.com/USA Softball poll, breaking the program record set in 2007 of 10 weeks, and picked up two ranked wins on the year, beating then-No. 8/8 Georgia and then-No. 20/17 JMU.

Tech took big strides at the plate in '19, resetting over 20 individual and team school records, including batting average (.334) and home runs (97), just to name a few. The Hokies led the ACC in batting average and home runs per game (1.67), while also getting it done in the circle with shutouts (22). D'Amour had the Hokies ready to play against in-state rival Virginia in the Commonwealth Clash presented by Virginia529, sweeping the Cavaliers 3-0 and not allowing a runner to touch third base or home plate in the series, a first in program history, for three shutout wins.

D'Amour joined the Hokies after two seasons as the head coach at Kennesaw State, where he led the Owls to a 79-37 record and two postseason appearances. Before taking over the Kennesaw State program in 2017, he earned a reputation as one of the nation's premier recruiters during his 10-year tenure as assistant coach at the University of Missouri, a perennial NCAA tournament participant.

D'Amour coached Kennesaw State to the 2018 Atlantic Sun Conference regular season and tournament championships en route to the program's first NCAA Regional appearance since transitioning to the Division I level in 2006, as the Owls finished the year with a 39-17 record. In his inaugural year as head coach at Kennesaw State in 2017, he guided the Owls to a 40-20 overall record and a berth in the National Invitational Softball Championship.

Kennesaw State went 39-17 and 14-3 in the ASUN in 2018 and earned a No. 3 seed in the Tallahassee Regional. D'Amour was named ASUN Coach of the Year and seven Owls earned ASUN all-conference accolades, including ASUN Pitcher of the Year Alley Cutting and ASUN Freshman of the Year Patricia Awald. Awald was one of 25 finalists up for NFCA National Freshman of the Year.

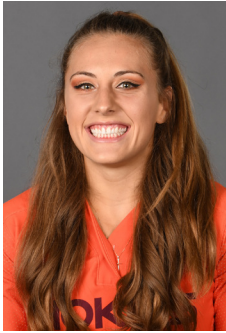
