INSIDE THE SERIES: VIRGINIA TECH VS. DAVIDSON

- Virginia Tech and Davidson have met 20 times in their history with the Hokies winning on 16 occasions, including each of the last 10.
- In last season's meeting the Hokies won 17-10 in Backsburg behind five goals from Paige Petty and 11 saves from Angie Benson in goal.

NEWCOMERS ADDING ATTACKING PUNCH

- Attackers Caroline Allen and Whitney Liebler have each contributed eight points this season with six goals and two assists apiece.
- Allen, a transfer from Cornell scored her 100th carer goal in the victory at Liberty, the first game of the season. She has scored twice in each game that she has played in.
- Liebler, a freshman from Williamsburg, Virginia, saw her first action against Duke and has been been a starter ever since. She led the Hokies with five goals and six points in the rout of Longwood at Thompson Field earlier this season.

CAPTAIN PAIGE PETTY

- Already the most decorated player in program history, Petty was elected as a team captain this season for the first time in her career.
- She leads the team with 10 goals this season and has also coralled the most draws 11 thus far in 2021.

PAIGE PETTY, ANGIE BENSON NAMED ALL-AMERICANS

- Petty, a preseason Third Team member is a senior midfielder for the Hokies finished the 2020 season with 38 goals, the third-best total in the nation. She was also inside the top 10 in points, registering 43 in a 10-game shortened season due to COVID. She was named an Inside Lacrosse All-American at the conclusion of the season and was a Tewaaraton Award Watch List member as well as the VaSID Player of the Year.
- For her career, Petty ranks third in Virginia Tech history with 162 goals, fourth with 182 points and is fifth with 185 draw controls.
- Already a two-time First Team All-ACC performer, Petty is the program's most decorated athlete.
- Benson, in her second season with the Hokies, will look to build on a tremendous 2020 season where she posted a 7-3 record and was second in the nation with a 7.38 goals against average. She made 83 saves on the season and had four contests with 10 or more. In a win at Louisville, she made 16 saves and owned a 53% save percentage in 2020.

CROOKS CHASING 100

- Midfielder Emma Crooks sits at 99 career points (87 goals, 12 assists) and with join the century club with her next point.
- The senior from Great Falls, Virginia has seven points in the first five games this season but has shown the propensity to fill it up, scoring 12 career hat tricks
- Her freshman season, she scored eight goals in a single contest, the second-most in a game by a Hokie in program history.

Freshman midfielder Kayla Frank scored the game's first three goals, part of a 5-0 run and the Virginia Tech lacrosse team got off to a winning start to the 2020 season Saturday afternoon inside the Beamer-Lawson Indoor Practice Facility defeating Davidson 17-10.

Tech begins the season with a victory for the third time in the last four years ahead of an in-state showdown at James Madison Wednesday in Harrisonburg

"Eight points in her first college game is a great starting point for the year," head coach John Sung said of the Moorestown, New Jersey native who scored three times and provided a game-high five assists.

Frank was a part of the starting midfield with juniors Paige Petty and Emma Crooks that combined to score 16 of the squad's 27 points in the game. All three recorded hat tricks and freshman Jacelyn Lazore also added two goals from the

In the attack, senior Julia Bolte provided four points (two goals, two assists) and captain Taylor Caskey added three points (one goal, two assists).

In goal for Tech was Angie Benson making her first appearance on a competitive lacrosse field in two year. The Palm City, Florida native recorded 11 saves and two ground balls in 48 minutes of work. She faced 25 shots from the Wildcats.

Down the stretch, the Hokies held a 16-5 lead before Davidson scored five of the game's final six goals.

Davidson was led by three points apiece from Oliva Carey and Sam Rippley. Starting goalie Delaney Guhman made 12

Tech held an edge on the draw circle 16-13. Emma Crooks led the team with six.

Both teams were efficient on the clear, with Tech converting 20-22 opportunities and Davidson 18-21.

The Wildcats out shot the Hokies 30-28, but Tech placed more on frame 23-21.

Eight Hokies saw their first action, seven freshmen and goalie Angie Benson.

All three of Tech's active goalies saw time in the game.

With her two assists, Taylor Caskey moved into a tie for 10th place all-time in that category with 42. The senior has 111 total points.

HOKIES' TURNAROUND IN ACC

- Prior to 2017, Virginia Tech was 3-62 all-time in ACC play and had never won a game at the conference tournament.
- Since John Sung has taken the helm, Tech is 9-14 in league contests including winning five games during the historic 2018 season that also saw the Hokies win at the ACC Tournament for the first time.

- Hired on May 27, 2016, Sung joined Virginia Tech after building the Winthrop University program from scratch beginning in May of 2011. He oversaw the program's rapid ascent as a regional powerhouse after beginning competition in 2013. In the program's third season, Sung led Winthrop to a 17-4 record, as the Eagles qualified for the NCAA Tournament after winning both the Big South regular-season and tournament titles. In 2016, Winthrop went 20-3, winning the Big South Tournament championship and advancing to another NCAA Tournament. The 2016 season marked the team's second consecutive Big South regular-season and tournament titles.
- In just three seasons in Blacksburg, John Sung has guided the Virginia Tech lacrosse program to new heights, including its first appearance in the NCAA tournament in 2018 as the Hokies advanced into the Round of 16
- Sung's Hokies have reset records for wins in a season, ACC wins, goals against average, point scored and goals scored in a single season and Sung, a former goalie, helped Meagh Graham set the program record for lowest goals against average in a season at 9.64 during the 2017 campaign.
- In his first season in Blacksburg, Sung engineered the best turnaround in program history winning six more games than the previous season. In 2017, the Hokies won 11 games, equaling the tally of the 1999 squad and reaching double figure wins for the first time since 2012. The team set program records in several categories including ACC wins in a season, goals scored, and points scored.
- The 2015 and 2016 Big South Coach of the Year, Sung formerly was the chair of the NCAA Division I Lacrosse Committee and also serves on the U.S. Lacrosse Convention Education Committee. His 2015 squad set Big South single-season records for points, goals (314), free-position goals (67), shots (633), shots on goal (459), ground balls (384), draw controls (312), and caused turnovers (213). In 2016, Winthrop scored 301 goals, including 58 free-position goals. The Eagles set Big South single-season marks for shots (662), ground balls (434), and caused turnovers (266)
- In addition to compiling a 54-26 overall record at Winthrop, Sung led the Haudenosaunee Nation to the quarterfinals of the 2013 Federation of International Lacrosse World Cup held in Canada. The team finished in seventh place out of a total of 19 teams. He also coached the team in the 2009 Federation of International Lacrosse in the Czech Republic.
- Sung's ascent as an NCAA coach began at Division III Adrian College in Michigan, where he started the program from the ground up and compiled a 46-19 overall record. His 2011 squad started the season 1-4 before registering 15 consecutive victories to earn a berth in the NCAA Division III Tournament. After posting a 6-7 overall record in its first season in 2008, the program went 10-4 in 2009, 14-3 in 2010 and 16-5 in 2011.



- Before beginning the program at Adrian College, Sung spent five years as the assistant women's club lacrosse coach at the University of Michigan, setting the groundwork for that program to eventually become a varsity sport in the Big Ten. The Wolverines accumulated a 93-22 record during this tenure.
- A longtime trainer of goalies, Sung has held various coaching positions with Birmingham Seaholm High School and the Detroit Lacrosse Club. He has been the assistant director of the Great Lakes Women's Lacrosse Camp since 1997. In addition to his work at various levels in the lacrosse community, Sung has a wealth of sales and management experience in the private sector.
- Sung was the starting goalkeeper of the Oakland University lacrosse team in 1997 and 1998 and was also a two-year captain. He was also member of two International Cup U16 championship teams in 1993 and 1994. He completed his degree in Bachelor of Arts degree in communications from Oakland in 2007.
- Sung, who resides in Blacksburg with his wife Tina, has three stepsons; Darek, Devin and Zachary, and a daughter Abby.
