GREENSBORO, N.C. – Florida State leads all ACC teams with four selections to the 2021 Preseason All-ACC Softball Team and has been selected as the 2021 ACC preseason favorite in a vote of the league's 13 head coaches.

The Seminoles, who have won the last six ACC Softball Championships, received nine first-place votes. Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own teams.

Virginia Tech finished second in the poll with 136 points and four first-place votes, while Notre Dame was picked third with 114 points. Duke (99 points), North Carolina (96 points) and Clemson (88 points) were slated fourth, fifth and sixth, respectively. Louisville was picked seventh with 81 points, followed by NC State (78 points), Georgia Tech (61 points) and Syracuse in 10th with 39 points. Pitt finished with 31 points for 11th, and Virginia (28 points) and Boston College (22 points) rounded out the voting.

A FIRST, BUT NOT THE BEST

• As said on the first page, the Hokies were held to zero home runs over the weekend.

• So kudos to Pitt's pitching on accomplishing the feat, and quite the feat it is.

• Since D'Amour took over (first season was '19), Tech hadn't been held to a zero-homerun outing in a series before, marking this past weekend the first time doing so.

• D'Amour and Co. played in 13 series leading up to the Pitt series. And, remember, the Pitt series was four games, while majority of the other 13 were three-game series, making it that much more impressive for the Panthers.

• So, expect Tech to get back to its ways with the long ball soon. Besides, they've hit a staggering 156 dingers over the last three years out of 102 contests (1.5 HRs a game).

ON ANOTHER LEVEL

• Over her last five games, sophomore Jayme Bailey is really hitting her stride.

• The utility player is batting .600, with going 6 for 10 at the plate, with a team-high six RBIs over that span, as well as two extra-base hits (1 2B, 1 HR).

Bailey's slugging percentage is a whopping

1.000% and she has two walks and two sac flies, as well.

SHUTOUT QUEEN

• Queen Keelz is tough to get a run on, ranking as one of the better pitchers in the country for most shutouts so far this season.

• Rochard is tied for second nationally for shutouts with five this year.

• Last season, the righty racked up seven and has 23 so far in her storied career.

WHAT DO THEY DO WELL?

• Tech ranks highly in the nation in a few categories that has led to its success.

• The Hokies rank 11th overall in shutouts (8), 21st in both home runs per game (1.42) and slugging percentage (.559) and 23rd in batting average (.324).

• How do those stack up amongst its ACC peers? It is first in batting average, shutouts and slugging percentage, while being second in home runs per game.

GOING BACK TO BACK

In the doubleheader vs. Radford on March 17, the Hokies went back-to-back multiple times.
In Game 1, Cana Davis and Alexa Milius hit back-to-back solo homers, each players' second homer of the year.

• In Game 2, Jayme Bailey, Kelsey Bennett and Morgan Overaitis went back-to-back-to-back, marking the first time Tech had accomplished the feat since Feb. 21, 2015.

WALK IT OFF

• Up 8-1 in the bottom of the fifth inning in Game 2 vs. Radford, Grace Chavez entered the game as a pinch hitter with two outs and belted one over the left field wall to end the game 9-1.

• It was the Hokies' first walk-off home run of the season and first since April 12, 2019 when Mackenzie Lawter walked off Virginia after five innings.

• The homer was Chavez's fifth of the year and first since Game 3 vs. No. 13/13 Florida State.

BENNETT BOMBS

• Since March 13, Kelsey Bennett has hit six home runs, including her school record three homers in Sunday's win at NC State.

• The sophomore is leading the team with seven homers on the season, tying her total from last season in 25 games.

• Since March 13, Bennett has knocked in 14 runs off nine hits.

BAILEY ON ST. PATRICK'S DAY

 After beating NC State 3-1 in their series, the Hokies have won five straight ACC series dating back to the April 2019 series at Boston College.

• Tech holds the longest active streak in the conference after beating NC State, who had won five straight prior to losing to the Hokies.

ROCHARD EARNS NATIONAL HONOR

• After going 3-1 in the Clemson and Florida State series, beating the Seminoles twice including a one-hit shutout, Keely Rochard was named the Wilson NFCA Pitcher of the Week on Feb. 23.

This is the fourth time in her career that Rochard was named the national pitcher of the week after accomplishing the feat once in 2020 and twice in 2019.
Rochard is currently 5-1 with a 0.57 ERA in 37.0 innings pitched, holding opponents to a .142 batting average.

FOUR BASES, FOUR TIMES

• Sophomore Grace Chavez has hit a home run in four straight games played, starting with the last game of the Clemson series and every game of the Florida State series.

• The Las Vegas native is second on the team with four home runs after ending last season with a team high seven home runs in 25 games.

• Entering the day without turning a double play on the season, the Hokies infield turned five in the Clemson doubleheader (2/19), helping lead the team to back-to-back wins.

TALK ABOUT A TURNAROUND

• Under Tech coach Pete D'Amour's guidance, Tech cracked the NCAA record book for biggest turnarounds.

• The minimum is 20 more wins than the previous season. Tech's 21 1/2-win differential is tied for the 18th-most in NCAA history and most since 2011, when Indiana had a 21 1/2-game turnaround.

ACC REGULAR-SEASON CHAMPS

• For the first time since 2007 and only the second time in school history, the Hokies came away with the best record in the ACC during the regular season.

• Tech's 20-4 record in ACC play topped Florida State's clip of 19-5, giving them a one-game advantage and the crown. It also won the Coastal Division for the first time in program history.

• But the Seminoles would get it done in the ACC Championship, winning the 10-team tournament on their home field.

THE BEST IN THE ACC

• In 2019, Tech led the ACC in a few categories

when it came to the plate and the circle. • The Hokies boasted three team categories that

sat atop the league's stats.

• As a team, Tech had the best batting average (.334), fewest hits allowed (293) and shutouts (22).

US & OU

- Tech, made up of an elite pitching staff and a bunch of sound batters, was one of only two teams in the nationin 2019 to be in the top six nationally in shutouts (22) and batting average (.334).
- The other school was Oklahoma, the Big 12 champion and the WCWS runner-up.

• Tech went 45-3 when it scored first last year and an underwhelming 2-8 when its opponent scored first.

• Pitcher Keely Rochard had a knack for not allowing an opponent to sniff the plate in 2019.

• She was one of only 19 players to have 10 or more shutouts and finished tied for eighth in the land with 11 on the season.

• The Hokies have a chance of seeing a player who was also one of the top 19 players in Northwestern's Danielle Williams (13 shutouts) on Sunday.

A SENSE OF URGENCY

• The Hokies batted a sizzling .598 (79 of 132) with a runner on third base and there are less than two outs in 2019. Having a sense of urgency, Tech typically knocked that runner in - and then some.

• The righty finished with 60 pitches in five innings of work, getting her 15 outs by nine pop ups, two grounders and four Ks.

• It marked the seventh perfect game in program history and first since Jasmine Harrell's on May 1, 2012, in a 9-0 win over Liberty in five innings.

The Virginia Tech softball team has the luxury of playing and practicing in some of the finest facilities on the East Coast. Using the Tech Softball Park, Softball Indoor Facility and a state-of-the-art weight room, the Hokies train in terrific facilities designed to help them win championships. Combined with a new locker room and one of the best scoreboard and video boards in the country, the Hokies have it all when it comes to what they need to win.

Tech Softball Park, which was completed in the fall of 1997, has dimensions of 200 feet down the lines and 220 feet to center field. In January of 2008, an additional 746 permanent seats were installed, bringing the capacity up from 336 to 1,024. The new bleachers match the ones that were already in place and now extend down to the end of both dugouts.

Thanks to an anonymous donation, TSP now has seatbacks in the section behind home plate, which was completed in fall 2017.

After finishing second in the regular season, the Hokies rolled through the ACC Tournament for the second time in a row, guaranteeing them their fourth straight NCAA Regional appearance.

Pitcher Angela Tincher led the way in the circle, winning All-America honors and National Player of the Year. She became only the third person at the time in NCAA softball history to rack up over 2,000 career strikeouts.

The Hokies made their first trip ever to the WCWS and finished the season with a school-record 50 wins, program-best 16 ACC wins and highest-ever finish in the NFCA poll with a No. 8 ranking in the final poll.

Tech also had a historic upset of the U.S. National Team, breaking the Red, White & Blue's 185-game, pre-Olympic exhibition tour winning streak with a 1-0 win on March 26.

What's a Hokie?



The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which is still used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

The official university school colors - Chicago Maroon and Burnt Orange - also were introduced in 1896. The colors were chosen by a committee because they made a 'unique combination' not worn elsewhere at the time. The official definition of "Hokie" is "a loyal Virginia Tech Fan".

SOFTBALL INDOOR FACILITY

• The facility, which is attached to Rector Field House (track & field) and immediately adjacent to Tech Softball Park, opened the fall 2018 and provides the Hokies with an indoor infield for practice during inclement weather, along with four cages for hitting and pitching practice.

• The one-story building also features two coaches rooms, an equipment room, a team room, a film room, a mudroom and team facilities. The facility will be available to the program year-round and will have uses for practice, team events and gameday necessities. The new facility will encompass more than 16,000 square feet.

• The facility was designed by Cannon Designs and was built by Branch Associates of Salem, Virginia. This project was a part of a larger plan that vastly improved Rector Field House (track & field) and all of the adjacent athletics facilities. Total cost was roughly \$18 million.

In his second season leading the Hokies, Coach Pete D'Amour led the team to a 21-4 record and was in first place in the ACC when the season ended. He helped guide the team to an impressive 3-2 record at the St. Pete/ Clearwater Elite Invitational against five top-25 opponents, including wins over #14 Minnesota and #17 South Carolina. D'Amour guided the progression of pitcher Keely Rochard, who was one of the nation's top pitchers in 2020, and also helped the Hokies' offense to the highest scoring in the ACC.

Guiding Virginia Tech to one of the biggest turnarounds in NCAA softball history, Pete D'Amour led the Hokies in his first year to a 24-game win improvement in 2019 after posting a 47-11 record, including a 20-4 mark in ACC play.

The 47 wins were the fourth most in school history while the 20 ACC wins were the most in program history. On Tech's way to 20 league wins, it earned an ACC regular-season title and a Coastal Division crown after being picked 10th in the ACC preseason poll. By doing so, it also earned the Hokies their first trip to the NCAA Tournament since 2015, winning two games at the Lexington Regional to pick up their first NCAA win since 2014.

No stranger to success, D'Amour, out of the new 11 Power Five head coaches in 2019, picked up the most wins of the group. The 2019 ACC Coach of the Year earned the nod to mark just Tech's second time winning it, while a school-record five Hokies made an All-ACC first team. Under D'Amour's direction, pitcher Carrie Eberle was named ACC Pitcher of the Year and third baseman Kelsey Bennett was tabbed Freshman of the Year.

He also tutored two Softball America All-Americans in outfielders Emma Strouth and Darby Trull, who both hit over .400 and tallied 60-plus putouts, as well as a school-record seven NFCA All-Region (Mid-Atlantic) selections and a school-record eight VaSID all-staters. D'Amour also was tabbed VaSID Coach of the Year.

Under his watch, Tech became ranked during the season, something that hadn't been done since 2015, and got up to as high as No. 19 in the ESPN.com/USA Softball poll and No. 22 in the USA Today/NFCA poll. The Hokies were ranked for 11 consecutive weeks in the ESPN.com/USA Softball poll, breaking the program record set in 2007 of 10 weeks, and picked up two ranked wins on the year, beating then-No. 8/8 Georgia and then-No. 20/17 JMU.

Tech took big strides at the plate in '19, resetting over 20 individual and team school records, including batting average (.334) and home runs (97), just to name a few. The Hokies led the ACC in batting average and home runs per game (1.67), while also getting it done in the circle with shutouts (22). D'Amour had the Hokies ready to play against in-state rival Virginia in the Commonwealth Clash presented by Virginia529, sweeping the Cavaliers 3-0 and not allowing a runner to touch third base or home plate in the series, a first in program history, for three shutout wins.

D'Amour joined the Hokies after two seasons as the head coach at Kennesaw State, where he led the Owls to a 79-37 record and two postseason appearances. Before taking over the Kennesaw State program in 2017, he earned a reputation as one of the nation's premier recruiters during his 10-year tenure as assistant coach at the University of Missouri, a perennial NCAA tournament participant.

D'Amour coached Kennesaw State to the 2018 Atlantic Sun Conference regular season and tournament championships en route to the program's first NCAA Regional appearance since transitioning to the Division I level in 2006, as the Owls finished the year with a 39-17 record. In his inaugural year as head coach at Kennesaw State in 2017, he guided the Owls to a 40-20 overall record and a berth in the National Invitational Softball Championship.

Kennesaw State went 39-17 and 14-3 in the ASUN in 2018 and earned a No. 3 seed in the Tallahassee Regional. D'Amour was named ASUN Coach of the Year and seven Owls earned ASUN all-conference accolades, including ASUN Pitcher of the Year Alley Cutting and ASUN Freshman of the Year Patricia Awald. Awald was one of 25 finalists up for NFCA National Freshman of the Year.




