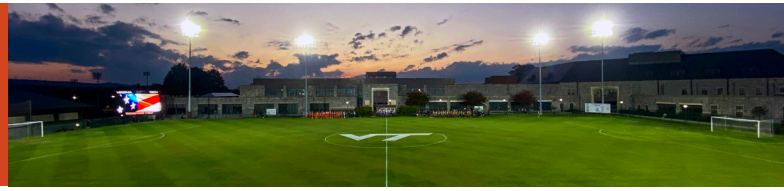

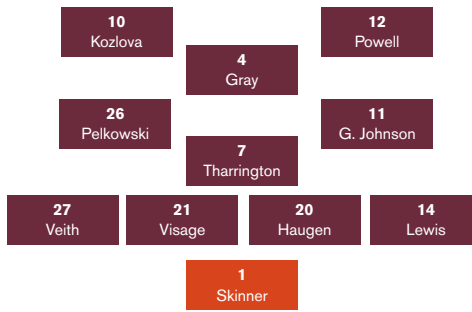

KEY STORYLINES

BOUNCING BACK

• Virginia Tech posted a 3-4-0 record during the 2020-21 regular season when competing after a loss.

• Under head coach Chugger Adair, the Hokies have never lost consecutive matches against non-conference, non-ACC opponents during the regular season. (Tech's 2020-21 season included three consecutive non-conference losses to ACC foes Virginia [two] and Duke.)

THREE'S COMPANY

• Emily Gray and Nicole Kozlova co-lead the Hokies with three goals apiece this season. The duo is tied for fifth place on the ACC goals list, led by Boston College's Linda Boama (five).

• Gray converted Tech's first penalty kick goal of the season

at Cincinnati (Aug. 29). She is four-for-five all-time from the penalty dot.

SCOUTING JAMES MADISON

• Virginia Tech has won five straight series meetings against James Madison, dating back to the 2010 season (last series loss in 2008).

• JMU scored three goals against ACC-member Louisville on Aug. 27 - its most recent outing. The Dukes dug out of their 3-0 deficit with three straight goals (44', 55', 61') to test the Cardinals. Louisville was picked to finish immediately behind Virginia Tech in the ACC preseason coaches' poll.

• James Madison is seeking its first winning season since 2018, when the Dukes advanced to the CAA championship match.

• Tech is 2-0-0 this season against CAA opponents, earning wins against William & Mary (Aug. 22) and Elon (Aug. 26) by the combined 8-1 goal margin.

AGAINST THE COMMONWEALTH

• With season-opening victories against Liberty (Aug. 19) and William & Mary (Aug. 22), Virginia Tech improved to 17-2-0 under Chugger Adair when competing in non-conference regular season matches against in-state opponents.

• Tech's two defeats were had against Virginia during the 2020-21 season (non-conference ACC matches inside COVID-19 scheduling).

• Virginia Tech's men's and women's soccer programs will face the defending national champion in their sport, one week apart, during neutral-site matches at James Madison's Sentara Park.

• Tech's No. 15 men's team came back from 2-0 down to defeat No. 1 Marshall, 3-2, on Aug. 29 in Harrisonburg.

• The women's team will take on No. 9 Santa Clara on Sept. 5 at the same facility.

TECH STARTS HOT

• Virginia Tech began the 2021 season with a 3-0-0 record for the seventh time under Chugger Adair (second time within the last three seasons).

• The Hokies' +10 goal differential across their first three matches of the 2021 season is tied for the program's third best mark all-time (record: +14 in 2004).

SEVENTH HEAVEN

• Virginia Tech's seven goals against Elon on Aug. 26 (7-1 victory) tied its third highest goal count across program history:

• Nicole Kozlova factored into three of Tech's four goals scored within the opening 20 minutes of play. She became the Hokies' third player to record five or more points within the last five seasons (Allyson Brown, Tori Powell).

• On Tech's fifth goal of the match, Aino Vuorinen connected with Ava Veith, yielding both players their first collegiate assist and goal, respectively.

• The Hokies tied a program record with their eight assists (Aug. 27, 2006, vs. Radford).

VEITH MAKES #SCTOP10

• Ava Veith's first collegiate goal - extending Virginia Tech's lead to 5-0 on Aug. 26 against Elon - received the No. 2 spot on SportsCenter's Top 10 Plays.

• Veith unloaded a 35-yard, curling strike to the top-right shelf, precluding Holly Weber's 30-yard strike that took place on the other side of a 55-minute lightning delay.

KEEP IT CLEAN

• Virginia Tech posted consecutive season-opening clean sheets for the fourth time during its program history (all instances under Chugger Adair: 2012, 2014, 2019, 2021).

CORNER POCKET

• On Aug. 19 and Aug. 22, Virginia Tech accumulated 10 or more corners during consecutive matches for the first time since August 2017.

GRAY MOVES UP TECH ALL-TIME ASSISTS LIST

• Emily Gray assisted twice during Virginia Tech's season-opening victory against Liberty (Aug. 19) - both off set pieces she initiated.

POWELL PACKS A PUNCH

• After her seven-goal rookie season during the 2020-21 campaign, sophomore Tori Powell factored into the scoring for three of Tech's first four season-opening goals.

• Powell headed in Tech's third goal against Liberty (Aug. 19). Three of her nine career goals have been scored against the Flames (102 minutes of series match time).

• After heading in Ava Veith's corner against William & Mary (Aug. 22), Powell recorded her third career match-winning goal.

TRAINING PAYS OFF

• Set pieces - both attacking and defending - were a point of emphasis for Virginia Tech during its preseason training.

• Three of the Hokies' first four goals scored of the 2021 season came off set pieces (two off corners).

IN PURSUIT OF PERFECTION

• Virginia Tech kept its 2021 opponents scoreless through the first 269 minutes of the season,

marking the third longest season-opening stretch the Hokies have mastered to date:

On December 7, 2010, former Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Jim Weaver announced the hiring of Tech's fourth head women's soccer coach Charles "Chugger" Adair, the associate head coach for the team the previous five seasons. The 2019 season marked Adair's 14th season in Blacksburg and his ninth year as the Hokies' head coach. In that time, he's become the all-time wins leader in program history, ending the 2019 campaign with a 118-53-20 overall record, and became just the second soccer coach at the school to reach the 100-win milestone with the team's victory at Miami on Sept. 23 (Jerry Cheynet, 238 wins, 28 seasons for Tech men's soccer). He's also just the 10th women's soccer head coach to reach that mark in the ACC.

Prior to Adair's arrival on campus, the women's program just once (2004) made the postseason - playing a game in both the ACC and NCAA tournaments. Since, the team has qualified for six ACC tournaments, playing for the conference title twice (2008 & 2013), and earned eight straight bids to the NCAA championship (2008-15) and 10 overall, as the Hokies made back-to-back trips in 2018 and 2019. Tech has reached the Sweet 16 four times under Adair (2009, 2011, 2014, 2018), but enjoyed its greatest success in 2013. That record-setting season included the Hokies posting a school-record 19 wins (most by any soccer team at the school), playing for the ACC title and advancing to the NCAA College Cup, where their season ended with a 3-2 loss to Florida State in a national semifinal game.

Under Adair, Tech has seen its only two draft choices selected in the NWSL draft. Jazmine Reeves was the 21st overall pick by the Boston Breakers in 2014, while Mandy McGlynn was chosen one spot higher with the No. 20 pick by Sky Blue FC in 2020. Tech has also had its only three All-Americans under Adair's tutelage - Reeves (1st, 2013), Murielle Tiernan (3rd, 2015) and McGlynn (2nd, 2019) - and two of its three Academic All-Americans - Katie Yensen (3rd, 2014) and McGlynn (1st, 2019).

Along with the great strides the Hokies have made on the pitch, the Tech women's soccer program is also known for producing outstanding students who are major contributors off of it. Each year, the Hokies boast a high team grade point average and have student-athletes who compete for state, regional and national academic recognition. In fact, during the 2017-18 academic season, the team posted a program-tying best ever team GPA of 3.53 in the spring semester. In addition, both Ashley Meier (2015) and Alani Johnson (2017) have received an ACC Postgraduate Scholarship, with Meier also earning an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship as well. Lastly, in 2018, Heather Timothy became Tech's sixth women's soccer player to earn the Skelton Award for Academic Excellence in Athletics - the highest designation handed out by the Tech athletics department.

Adair has led his program to a winning record in each of his nine seasons in Blacksburg.

In 2015, the Hokies went 15-4-2 and won their opening round game in the NCAA Championship, while in the 2014 season, Adair led the Hokies to a 16-6 record and advanced to the Sweet 16 for the third time in school history. During that season, the Hokies set a school record for most goals in a season, with 62, and fewest goals allowed in a season, surrendering just 18, and reached a program-best No. 2 ranking in the country after starting the season at 10-0-0.

In their record-setting 2013 campaign, the Hokies beat three ranked teams during the regular season and then blew out then-No. 1 Virginia 4-2 in the ACC Tournament semifinals. They added two more ranked foes to their list of conquests when they downed West Virginia 1-0 and knocked off Santa Clara by advancing on penalty kicks in the NCAA Championships. The Hokies were a No. 1 seed in the tournament and hosted four games in Blacksburg. The Hokies scored a then school-record 56 goals, breaking the mark of 45 set by the 2012 team, and shut out 12 opponents, tying the mark also set by the 2012 squad. They finished the season with a school-best No. 4 ranking in the country.

In Adair's first season as the head coach (2011), Tech matched its best finish in program history (at the time), making it all the way to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Championship. Adair led the Hokies to a 14-8-1 overall record, which included 11 shutouts.

Adair came to Tech in 2006 and served as the associate head coach under previous head coach Kelly Cagle for five seasons before being promoted. In Adair's first season as an assistant to Cagle, the Hokies suffered a losing season, but have not suffered a losing season since. In 2008, the Hokies advanced to the finals of the ACC Championship for the first time, falling to North Carolina 3-0, and in 2009, the Hokies won 16 games, then a school record, and earned a final ranking of No. 12.

Adair also possesses a great deal of playing experience, having played professionally for 10 years, including stints with the Los Angeles Galaxy of Major League Soccer and the U.S. National Futsal Team. He also spent time playing for the San Diego Sockers, Wichita Wings, Portland Timbers, San Diego Flash, Minnesota Thunder, Seattle Sounders, Milwaukee Wave, Carolina Dynamo and A.A. Ghent (Belgium) from 1993-2003.

Adair played soccer at the University of San Diego after transferring from San Diego State in the early 1990s. He earned All-America honors, was a two-year captain and helped USD to the NCAA finals, where the Toreros lost to Virginia. He scored 27 goals and had 23 assists in his three years at USD. He got his bachelor's degree in business administration from USD in 1993 and he received his MBA from USD in 1996.

Adair is married to the former Shelbylynn Mc-Bride, and they have a daughter, Callie Lynn and a son, Austin Tate. He also has two other daughters Alexandra and Madeline, and a son Jack.

BIG-TIME MINUTES

- Virginia Tech backs Victoria Haugen and Allie Lewis played the duration of Tech's two season-opening matches against Liberty (Aug. 19) and William & Mary (Aug. 22).
- Entering Thursday, Lewis (346 minutes) and fellow rookie Avery Tharrington (271) rank first and fourth, respectively, on Tech's list of players to have seen the most match time this season.

A SENIOR NIGHT TO REMEMBER

- Nicole Kozlova dramatically scored Tech's first goal of the 2021 season on her Senior Night (Aug. 19 vs. Liberty) - the first of six matches this season devoted to honoring one member of the Hokies' 2021 senior class.
- Kozlova broke the ice during the 19th minute, directing a 12-yard, right-to-left rolling shot through the left post (assisted by Victoria Haugen and Tori Powell). Tech went on to win, 3-0.
- Kozlova's strike against Liberty made her eighth career goal and her fourth career match-winner.
- During the 2020-21 season, Kozlova appeared in five of Tech's 17 matches due to her commitment to the Ukrainian women's national team. She is expected to split time again this fall between Tech and the national team.

HEY THERE, ROOKIE

- Emma Pelkowski netted her first collegiate goal on Aug. 19 against Liberty during her first career appearance and start.
- Pelkowski headed in the rebound from Emily Gray's 25-yard free kick during the 50th minute to deliver Tech the 2-0 lead against the Flames.
- From Tech's starting XI, Pelkowski was substituted for during the 25th minute before beginning the second half on the pitch. She scored during her 30th minute of play.

FIRST OUTINGS

- Six Tech newcomers (including five true freshmen) made their collegiate debuts during the Hokies' regular season opener against Liberty (Aug. 19).
- Allie Lewis, Avery Tharrington and Emma Pelkowski debuted from the Hokies' starting XI. Lewis played the duration of the contest on Tech's back line while Tharrington played more than an hour in the midfield.
- Sophie Maltese, Lauren Gogal and Allie George each came in as reserves for the Hokies.

TECH OPENS 2021 IN VICTORY

- Virginia Tech downed Liberty, 3-0, on Aug. 19 to start the 2021 season.
- The Hokies improved to 10-1-0 all-time against the Flames.
- Tech is now 22-3-4 all-time during home openers (9-1-1 under Chugger Adair).

FINE ATTACKING DISPLAYS

- Virginia Tech has averaged 16.25 shot attempts per match this season, peaking at 20 shots during its Aug. 26 victory against Elon.
- Tech averaged 11.35 attempts per match during the 2020-21 season. The Hokies also averaged 14.15 attempts per their 13-match schedule excluding contests against Florida State, North Carolina and Duke.

BIG BIRD SCHEDULE

- Liberty was the first of eight programs on Virginia Tech's 2021 schedule that advanced to the 2020 NCAA tournament (held during the spring of 2021).
- Tech's 2021 non-conference schedule features two defending league champions in Liberty and Elon.
- The Hokies will face the defending national champion, Santa Clara, during their second match at the Fairfield by Marriott Invitational in Harrisonburg, Virginia (hosted by James Madison).

PRESEASON RECAP

- Virginia Tech combined for two clean sheets and a +4 goal differential during its two exhibition matches.
- Holly Weber scored two of Tech's four preseason goals to lead the Hokies in scoring.
- Emily Gray and Tori Powell connected on each other's preseason goals. Powell's header goal against Richmond (Aug. 12) came off the boot of Gray's corner from the left flag.
- Tech blitzed Loyola (Aug. 8) for two quick goals after the hour mark (61', 63'), capitalizing on a turnover in the Greyhounds' defensive third to lead, 2-0.
- The Hokies scored twice inside the first 40 minutes against Richmond en route to victory.
