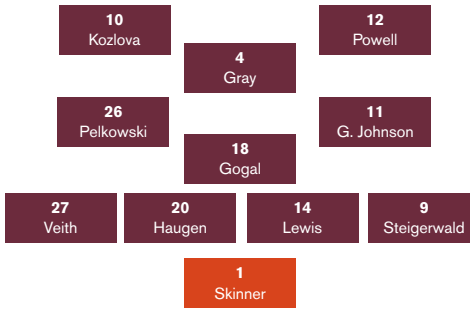

KEY STORYLINES

HOME, SWEET HOME

- After Thursday's win against Villanova, Virginia Tech has won six consecutive matches at Thompson Field.
- The Hokies have now prevailed during each of their last 13 non-conference, home regular season matches against non-ACC opponents (20-0-2 last 22 such matches dating back to Tech's 2-1 loss to Ohio State on Sept. 1, 2016).

TALE OF TWO LOCATIONS

- **Home (4-0-0):** Virginia Tech has scored 16 goals at a +14 differential. The Hokies have yet to concede a first half goal.
- **Away/Neutral (1-2-0):** Tech is -2 in goal differential: four for and six against. The Hokies have led during one of its three matches (Sept. 9 at JMU).

CHANGING THE SYSTEM

- After rolling out the same starting XI for its first five matches of the season, Virginia Tech has since made the following tweaks:
- Emma Steigerwald has made two straight starts at left and right back.
- Ava Veith returned to left back for Tech's Sept. 9 match against Villanova.
- Lauren Gogal replaced Avery Tharrington (illness) in the midfield on Sept. 9.
- South Carolina began the 2021 season ranked No. 17 in the *United Soccer Coaches* preseason poll.
- The Gamecocks have since

SCOUTING SOUTH CAROLINA

- jumped to No. 16 (Aug. 24) and up to No. 12 (Aug. 31, Sept. 7).
- South Carolina witnessed its five-match, season-opening winning streak end on Sept. 9 at Clemson (L, 1-2). The Tigers were picked No. 5 in the ACC preseason coaches' poll - two spots ahead of Virginia Tech.
- **WITH A WIN ...**
- Virginia Tech would earn its second top-15 victory during as many seasons, having defeated No. 14 Pittsburgh, 2-0, at Thompson Field in October 2020.
- The Hokies would earn their first true road victory against a ranked opponent since the opening round of the 2018 NCAA tournament (Tech defeated No. 17 Texas, 1-0, in Austin).

KNOWING WHAT IT TAKES

• Virginia Tech seniors Emily Gray, Karlie Johnson, Emmalee McCarter and Emma Steigerwald each made appearances when the Hokies won their last true road match against a ranked side.

BIG BIRD SCHEDULE

• South Carolina is the fourth of eight programs on Virginia Tech's 2021 schedule that advanced to the 2020 NCAA tournament (held during the spring of 2021).

• Tech is 2-1-0 this season against these eight programs, having defeated two defending league champions in Liberty (Aug. 19) and Elon (Aug. 26).

• Considering the Sept. 7 *United Soccer Coaches* poll, the Gamecocks are the Hokies' second of five ranked programs Tech will face between Sept. 5 and Oct. 2.

HIGH FIVE

• Virginia Tech's Sept. 9 win against Villanova featured five unique goal scorers, marking the second time this season the Hokies have had five or more players find the back of the net (Aug. 26 against Elon).

STRENGTH IN NUMBERS

• Virginia Tech's diverse attacking cast is comprised of 15 players who have recorded at least one point this fall (eight goal scorers).

• Emily Gray enters Sunday's match against South Carolina ranked in a tie for fourth among NCAA Division I players in goals scored (seven).

• Veteran strikers Nicole Kozlova and Tori Powell both returned to Tech's scoring column on Sept. 9 against Villanova. Kozlova snapped a three-match scoreless drought while Powell ended her four-match stretch.

• Emma Pelkowski leads Tech's freshman class with six points (goal, four assists) while Sophie Maltese (two goals) and Aino Vuorinen (goal, two assists) have stepped up for the Hokies as well.

BOUNCING BACK

• With Virginia Tech's 3-2 win at James Madison on Sept. 2, the Hokies improved to 4-4-0 since the beginning of the 2020-21 season when competing after a loss.

• Under head coach Chugger Adair, the Hokies have never lost consecutive matches against non-conference, non-ACC opponents during the regular season. (Tech's 2020-21 season included three consecutive non-conference losses to ACC foes Virginia [two] and Duke.)

THURSDAY KICKOFFS

• After its Sept. 9 win against Villanova, Virginia Tech has won seven consecutive Thursday matches.

GRAY NETS HISTORIC TECH HAT TRICK

• Emily Gray recorded the Hokies' first hat trick since 2009 on Sept. 2 at James Madison, powering Tech to the 3-2 victory.

• Gray became the 10th different Hokie to achieve

the program's 12th hat trick to date (fifth during its ACC tenure).

• Upon scoring her 22nd career goal on Sept. 9 against Villanova, Gray moved into the top 10 of Virginia Tech's all-time scoring list:

• Entering Sunday's match, Gray has scored or assisted on five of Tech's six set piece goals this season.

• Gray's two-assist performance against Liberty marked her third career match during which she recorded multiple assists. She previously racked up four assists during the Hokies' 8-2 win against Miami (Oct. 15, 2020) and earned two during their 2-1 win against Navy (Oct. 24, 2020).

FROM THE DOT

• Emily Gray is two-for-two on penalty kick attempts during the 2021 season (five-for-six all-time). This season, she has scored at Cincinnati (Aug. 29) and at James Madison (Sept. 2).

STRANGE, BUT TRUE

• Virginia Tech's men's and women's soccer programs faced the defending national champion in their sport, one week apart, during neutral-site matches at James Madison's Sentara Park.

• Tech's No. 15 men's team came back from 2-0 down to defeat No. 1 Marshall, 3-2, on Aug. 29 in Harrisonburg.

• The women's team lost to No. 9 Santa Clara, 2-0, on Sept. 5.

AGAINST THE COMMONWEALTH

• With victories against Liberty (Aug. 19), William & Mary (Aug. 22) and James Madison (Sept. 2), Virginia Tech has improved to 18-2-0 under Chugger Adair when competing in non-conference regular season matches against in-state opponents.

• Tech's two defeats were had against Virginia during the 2020-21 season (non-conference ACC matches inside COVID-19 scheduling).

TECH STARTS HOT

• Virginia Tech began the 2021 season with a 3-0-0 record for the seventh time under Chugger Adair (second time within the last three seasons).

• The Hokies' +10 goal differential across their first three matches of the 2021 season is tied for the program's third best mark all-time (record: +14 in 2004).

On December 7, 2010, former Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Jim Weaver announced the hiring of Tech's fourth head women's soccer coach Charles "Chugger" Adair, the associate head coach for the team the previous five seasons. The 2019 season marked Adair's 14th season in Blacksburg and his ninth year as the Hokies' head coach. In that time, he's become the all-time wins leader in program history, ending the 2019 campaign with a 118-53-20 overall record, and became just the second soccer coach at the school to reach the 100-win milestone with the team's victory at Miami on Sept. 23 (Jerry Cheynet, 238 wins, 28 seasons for Tech men's soccer). He's also just the 10th women's soccer head coach to reach that mark in the ACC.

Prior to Adair's arrival on campus, the women's program just once (2004) made the postseason - playing a game in both the ACC and NCAA tournaments. Since, the team has qualified for six ACC tournaments, playing for the conference title twice (2008 & 2013), and earned eight straight bids to the NCAA championship (2008-15) and 10 overall, as the Hokies made back-to-back trips in 2018 and 2019. Tech has reached the Sweet 16 four times under Adair (2009, 2011, 2014, 2018), but enjoyed its greatest success in 2013. That record-setting season included the Hokies posting a school-record 19 wins (most by any soccer team at the school), playing for the ACC title and advancing to the NCAA College Cup, where their season ended with a 3-2 loss to Florida State in a national semifinal game.

Under Adair, Tech has seen its only two draft choices selected in the NWSL draft. Jazmine Reeves was the 21st overall pick by the Boston Breakers in 2014, while Mandy McGlynn was chosen one spot higher with the No. 20 pick by Sky Blue FC in 2020. Tech has also had its only three All-Americans under Adair's tutelage - Reeves (1st, 2013), Murielle Tiernan (3rd, 2015) and McGlynn (2nd, 2019) - and two of its three Academic All-Americans - Katie Yensen (3rd, 2014) and McGlynn (1st, 2019).

Along with the great strides the Hokies have made on the pitch, the Tech women's soccer program is also known for producing outstanding students who are major contributors off of it. Each year, the Hokies boast a high team grade point average and have student-athletes who compete for state, regional and national academic recognition. In fact, during the 2017-18 academic season, the team posted a program-tying best ever team GPA of 3.53 in the spring semester. In addition, both Ashley Meier (2015) and Alani Johnson (2017) have received an ACC Postgraduate Scholarship, with Meier also earning an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship as well. Lastly, in 2018, Heather Timothy became Tech's sixth women's soccer player to earn the Skelton Award for Academic Excellence in Athletics - the highest designation handed out by the Tech athletics department.

Adair has led his program to a winning record in each of his nine seasons in Blacksburg.

In 2015, the Hokies went 15-4-2 and won their opening round game in the NCAA Championship, while in the 2014 season, Adair led the Hokies to a 16-6 record and advanced to the Sweet 16 for the third time in school history. During that season, the Hokies set a school record for most goals in a season, with 62, and fewest goals allowed in a season, surrendering just 18, and reached a program-best No. 2 ranking in the country after starting the season at 10-0-0.

In their record-setting 2013 campaign, the Hokies beat three ranked teams during the regular season and then blew out then-No. 1 Virginia 4-2 in the ACC Tournament semifinals. They added two more ranked foes to their list of conquests when they downed West Virginia 1-0 and knocked off Santa Clara by advancing on penalty kicks in the NCAA Championships. The Hokies were a No. 1 seed in the tournament and hosted four games in Blacksburg. The Hokies scored a then school-record 56 goals, breaking the mark of 45 set by the 2012 team, and shut out 12 opponents, tying the mark also set by the 2012 squad. They finished the season with a school-best No. 4 ranking in the country.

In Adair's first season as the head coach (2011), Tech matched its best finish in program history (at the time), making it all the way to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Championship. Adair led the Hokies to a 14-8-1 overall record, which included 11 shutouts.

Adair came to Tech in 2006 and served as the associate head coach under previous head coach Kelly Cagle for five seasons before being promoted. In Adair's first season as an assistant to Cagle, the Hokies suffered a losing season, but have not suffered a losing season since. In 2008, the Hokies advanced to the finals of the ACC Championship for the first time, falling to North Carolina 3-0, and in 2009, the Hokies won 16 games, then a school record, and earned a final ranking of No. 12.

Adair also possesses a great deal of playing experience, having played professionally for 10 years, including stints with the Los Angeles Galaxy of Major League Soccer and the U.S. National Futsal Team. He also spent time playing for the San Diego Sockers, Wichita Wings, Portland Timbers, San Diego Flash, Minnesota Thunder, Seattle Sounders, Milwaukee Wave, Carolina Dynamo and A.A. Ghent (Belgium) from 1993-2003.

Adair played soccer at the University of San Diego after transferring from San Diego State in the early 1990s. He earned All-America honors, was a two-year captain and helped USD to the NCAA finals, where the Toreros lost to Virginia. He scored 27 goals and had 23 assists in his three years at USD. He got his bachelor's degree in business administration from USD in 1993 and he received his MBA from USD in 1996.

Adair is married to the former Shelbylynn Mc-Bride, and they have a daughter, Callie Lynn and a son, Austin Tate. He also has two other daughters Alexandra and Madeline, and a son Jack.
