



VIRGINIA TECH SOCCER '72



THE OUTLOOK

As part of the university's centennial, soccer has been added to Virginia Tech's official intercollegiate sports.

Played as a club sport for the last several years on the Tech campus, soccer has been developing under the tutelage of physical education instructors, the latest George (Chip) Snead, who took over in September, 1970, and will serve as head coach during the 1972 season with assistance from Mark Alley, a member of the agronomy faculty.

Defence, the best of what the Tech club had to offer last season, again figures to be the team's best suit, with much reliance on junior goalie Jack Barnold, an aggressive, daring player.

Strong contenders for fullback jobs are senior Bo Heller, juniors, John Maynard and Charlie Keedy. John Wright ('72 co-captain with Barnold), a starting fullback last year, has moved to center halfback where he's expected to help pick up Tech's scoring potential from the halfback line. Wright, one of the few seniors on the Team, has a strong shot and probably is Tech's most adept ball handler.

Scoring, Tech's weakest department last year, should take a sharp turn for the better. Except for senior Jim Gates, Tech's strongest frontline potential in juniors: John Harves, Tony Bardo, Dave Stocker and Gary Vicinus, a newcomer who possesses an exceptionally strong shot with either foot.

Again competing against some of the best established teams in the area and playing only four contest at home, the Hokies will be hard pressed to produce a winner in '72.

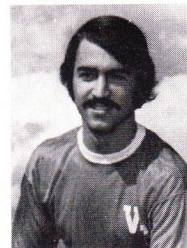
