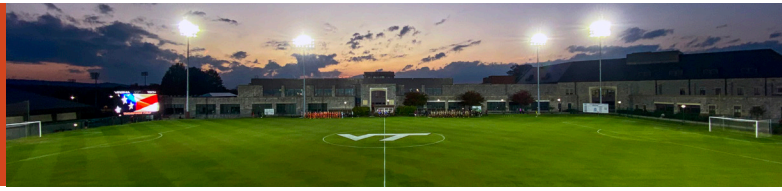

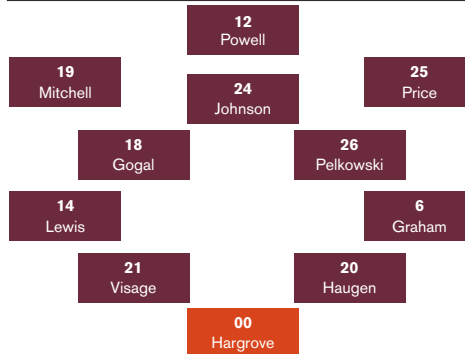

KEY STORYLINES

ROAD TO THE NCAA

- The Hokies started the season unbeaten after the first five games against non-conference teams.
- Tech led in the first half against #4 South Carolina before allowing two goals in the second falling 2-1, their first loss of the season.
- The Hokies went on to win four on the next five matches including two shutout victories over ACC opponents, #22 NC State (1-0), and Wake Forest (2-0).
- The Hokies' win against the Wolfpack marked the team's first win over a nationally ranked team this season.
- Tech held #22 NC State down to 1 shot on goal, with a shot

advantage of 21-7. Tech won the match 1-0 with a goal from Taylor Price in the 63rd minute.

- Tech defeated #3 North Carolina 2-1 with both Tech goals in the final 17 minutes. Tori Powell scored the game winning goal in the 85th minute, her 5th game-winning goal in her career.
- Powell's chip in goal over North Carolina earned her ACC Co-Offensive Player of the Week honors.
- The Hokies tied Virginia in the Commonwealth Clash 3-3, with 2 goals from Taylor Bryan in the final 10 minutes. Taylor Price scored the first goal of the match at 30:27, her 8th goal of the season.
- Earlier this season, Victoria

"Dori" Haugen was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week, and College Soccer News Women's National Team of the Week. She was vital in the Hokies win against both NC State and Wake Forest playing a full 180 minutes.

- Taylor Price scored the only goal of the game vs. NC State, her sixth goal of the season. Price ended the season ranked second in the ACC among freshmen with 8 goals and 3 assists.
- Taylor Price and Natalie Mitchell were named to the midseason TopDrawerSoccer Freshmen Top 100 list. Price ranked fifth, Mitchell 11th.

HOW WE ADD UP

- Tech has continued to show reliance on dominating in the second half of the game, scoring over half their goals in the last 45 minutes (24 of 37).

- The Hokies have scored 37 goals in 18 games averaging 2.06 per game.

- Tech's scoring offense is ranked tied for 39th in the NCAA with a scoring average of 2.06. Tech ended the regular season fifth in the ACC with 279 shots, and ranked 6th in Goals.

- Tech's goalkeeper Lauren Hargrove recorded her sixth clean sheet of the season with the win over Syracuse. Hargrove is tied for fourth in the ACC for shutouts, and seventh in saves (51).

- Virginia Tech ended the non-conference portion of their schedule 6-1-1.

SCOUTING THE MOUNTAINEERS

- West Virginia returns to the pitch as the Big 12 Champions after claiming two shutout victories over #16 Texas (1-0) and #17 TCU (1-0).

- The Mountaineers ended the regular season 7-4-7 winning three of their last five games before heading into the conference championships.

- Earlier in the season, Clemson defeated West Virginia 1-0 with a goal in the 10th minute of the match. The Mountaineers held a 10-5 shot advantage.

- Lauren Segalla leads her team with five goals and one assists this season. Segalla scored the game winning goal against Texas advancing her team to the final round of the Big 12 conference championships.

- Dilary Heredia-Beltran is tied with Segalla in points (11) with 2 goals and 7 assists. AJ Rodriguez has also scored five goals, being one of the three athletes on the team score three or more goals.

- The Mountaineers have been low in scoring with 28 goals throughout their 21 matches, however, they have kept opponents down to 17 goals.

- Last season, West Virginia made it to the second round of the Big 12 Championships, falling to Texas 3-4 Pks. The team did not advance to the NCAA Tournament in 2021. Season record 10-5-5.

- West Virginia was picked to finish 3rd in the Big 12 preseason poll.

THE HISTORY

- Virginia Tech is tied in the series against West Virginia, with an overall series record of 3-3. Tech last defeated the Mountaineers in 2015 (2-1).

- Hokies last played the Mountaineers in 2015 at the Hoosier Classic. Tech claim victory 2-1, and third straight win against West Virginia since 2011.

ACC RECORD

- The Hokies have an overall ACC conference record of 76-86-26. In 2021, the Hokies finished with a 5-3-2 conference record.

ATTACK

- Virginia Tech has averaged 15.7 shot attempts per match this season, keeping opponents down to an average of 9.6 shots. The Hokies are ranked fifth in the ACC in total shots (251), fifth in points (102), and sixth in goals (34).

HOKIES AT HOME

- Virginia Tech is 5-3-2 at home this season. Hokies tied with Indiana 0-0 in the home opener, and then went on to beat Delaware 2-0 later in the week. Tech then went on to take down Charlotte 3-0, before falling to #4 South Carolina 1-2.

- In perhaps the biggest win of the season so far, Virginia Tech defeated #3 North Carolina 2-1. Tori Powell scored the game winning goal in the 85th minute.

- Hokies have scored 17 goals in eight games at home this season. The Hokies have won 8 games this season when scoring first, having lost only to South Carolina.

- Virginia Tech compiled a 8-1-1 record at home during the 2021 season, scoring 27 goals at a +21 goal differential.

THE SECOND

- The Hokies continue put the pressure on teams in the second half scoring 22 of their 34 goals in the last 45 minutes.

- Tech tied Virginia in the final 10 minutes of the game with two goals.

- Hokies defeated North Carolina in the final 18 minutes of the match with two goals.

- Tori Powell scored her second goal of the game in the 86th minute of the match versus Charlotte.

- In their toughest non-conference match, the Hokies held off the #4 Gamecocks for 56 minutes before allowing a goal. After South Carolina's second goal, the Hokies continued to stop the

Gamecocks from scoring in the final 30 minutes.

- The team has the drive to stay strong in the final minutes of the match, allowing only 85 shots in the second half compared to the Hokies 139 shots.

PRICE

- Four times this season, freshman Taylor Price has scored the first goal of the game for the Hokies leading them to a victory.

- Price leads the team with eight goals and ended the season with 19 points. Price was named to the ACC All-Freshman Team and All-ACC Third Team.

- As a freshman, Price has already made a huge impact on the team with 40 shots, 8 goals, 3 assists, and 19 points.

- Price was named to the College Soccer News National Women's Team of the Week on Oct. 3 for her game winning shot against NC State.


POWELL

- Tori Powell scored her 21st career goal vs. North Carolina, her sixth goal of the season.

- Powell scored the game winning goal against North Carolina in the 85th minute of the match (2-1).

- Powell scored the third and final goal at the Charlotte match with less than 4 minutes remaining in the game. She scored 2 of 3 shots on goal.

On December 7, 2010, former Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Jim Weaver announced the hiring of Tech's fourth head women's soccer coach Charles "Chugger" Adair, the associate head coach for the team the previous five seasons. The 2019 season marked Adair's 14th season in Blacksburg and his ninth year as the Hokies' head coach. In that time, he's become the all-time wins leader in program history, ending the 2019 campaign with a 118-53-20 overall record, and became just the second soccer coach at the school to reach the 100-win milestone with the team's victory at Miami on Sept. 23 (Jerry Cheynet, 238 wins, 28 seasons for Tech men's soccer). He's also just the 10th women's soccer head coach to reach that mark in the ACC.

Prior to Adair's arrival on campus, the women's program just once (2004) made the postseason - playing a game in both the ACC and NCAA tournaments. Since, the team has qualified for six ACC tournaments, playing for the conference title twice (2008 & 2013), and earned eight straight bids to the NCAA championship (2008-15) and 10 overall, as the Hokies made back-to-back trips in 2018 and 2019. Tech has reached the Sweet 16 four times under Adair (2009, 2011, 2014, 2018), but enjoyed its greatest success in 2013. That record-setting season included the Hokies posting a school-record 19 wins (most by any soccer team at the school), playing for the ACC title and advancing to the NCAA College Cup, where their season ended with a 3-2 loss to Florida State in a national semifinal game.

Under Adair, Tech has seen the program's three draft choices selected in the NWSL draft. Jazmine Reeves was the 21st overall pick by the Boston Breakers in 2014, while Mandy McGlynn was chosen one spot higher with the No. 20 pick by Sky Blue FC in 2020. Emily Gray made history in 2021 becoming the highest drafted pick at number three by North Carolina Courage. Tech has also had its only three All-Americans under Adair's tutelage - Reeves (1st, 2013), Murielle Tiernan (3rd, 2015) and McGlynn (2nd, 2019) - and two of its three Academic All-Americans - Katie Yensen (3rd, 2014) and McGlynn (1st, 2019).

Along with the great strides the Hokies have made on the pitch, the Tech women's soccer program is also known for producing outstanding students who are major contributors off of it. Each year, the Hokies boast a high team grade point average and have student-athletes who compete for state, regional and national academic recognition. In fact, during the 2017-18 academic season, the team posted a program-tying best ever team GPA of 3.53 in the spring semester. In addition, both Ashley Meier (2015) and Alani Johnson (2017) have received an ACC Postgraduate Scholarship, with Meier also earning an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship as well. Lastly, in 2018, Heather Timothy became Tech's sixth women's soccer player to earn the Skelton Award for Academic Excellence in Athletics - the highest designation handed out by the Tech athletics department.

In 2015, the Hokies went 15-4-2 and won their opening round game in the NCAA Championship, while in the 2014 season, Adair led the Hokies to a 16-6 record and advanced to the Sweet 16 for the third time in school history. During that season, the Hokies set a school record for most goals in a season, with 62, and fewest goals allowed in a season, surrendering just 18, and reached a program-best No. 2 ranking in the country after starting the season at 10-0-0.

In their record-setting 2013 campaign, the Hokies beat three ranked teams during the regular season and then blew out then-No. 1 Virginia 4-2 in the ACC Tournament semifinals. They added two more ranked foes to their list of conquests when they downed West Virginia 1-0 and knocked off Santa Clara by advancing on penalty kicks in the NCAA Championships. The Hokies were a No. 1 seed in the tournament and hosted four games in Blacksburg. The Hokies scored a then school-record 56 goals, breaking the mark of 45 set by the 2012 team, and shut out 12 opponents, tying the mark also set by the 2012 squad. They finished the season with a school-best No. 4 ranking in the country.

In Adair's first season as the head coach (2011), Tech matched its best finish in program history (at the time), making it all the way to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Championship. Adair led the Hokies to a 14-8-1 overall record, which included 11 shutouts.

Adair came to Tech in 2006 and served as the associate head coach under previous head coach Kelly Cagle for five seasons before being promoted. In Adair's first season as an assistant to Cagle, the Hokies suffered a losing season, but have not suffered a losing season since. In 2008, the Hokies advanced to the finals of the ACC Championship for the first time, falling to North Carolina 3-0, and in 2009, the Hokies won 16 games, then a school record, and earned a final ranking of No. 12.

Adair also possesses a great deal of playing experience, having played professionally for 10 years, including stints with the Los Angeles Galaxy of Major League Soccer and the U.S. National Futsal Team. He also spent time playing for the San Diego Sockers, Wichita Wings, Portland Timbers, San Diego Flash, Minnesota Thunder, Seattle Sounders, Milwaukee Wave, Carolina Dynamo and A.A. Ghent (Belgium) from 1993-2003.

Adair played soccer at the University of San Diego after transferring from San Diego State in the early 1990s. He earned All-America honors, was a two-year captain and helped USD to the NCAA finals, where the Toreros lost to Virginia. He scored 27 goals and had 23 assists in his three years at USD. He got his bachelor's degree in business administration from USD in 1993 and he received his MBA from USD in 1996.

Adair is married to the former Shelbylynn McBride, and they have a daughter, Callie Lynn and a son, Austin Tate. He also has two other daughters Alexandra and Madeline, and a son Jack.

• Powell became the 11th Virginia Tech player to notch the program's 13th all-time hat trick on Oct. 10 at Wake Forest (2021).

• Powell's hat trick marked Tech's first against a Power Five opponent (fifth during the program's ACC tenure).

• Natalie Mitchell has taken 50 shots this season, making 3 goal and 8 assists, ranked tied for fourth in the ACC for assist.

• Mitchell has gone two-for-two on penalty kicks this season, scoring the first goal of the match vs. South Carolina.

• Taylor Bryan was recently named ACC Offensive Player of the Week after recording a brace against Virginia in the final minute. Bryan has scored the equalizer twice this season, first against North Carolina. Her goal changed the tide, and helped the Hokies comeback for a 2-1 victory.

• Sophomore goalkeeper Lauren Hargrove made her first career start at the Indiana match allowing zero goals in her first full 90 minutes of play against the Hoosiers. Hargrove went on to play 300 minutes this season before allowing one goal.

• Hargrove has gone on to record 6 shutouts this season including 3 in the ACC.

• Midfielder Courtney Andersen was named to the 2022 TopDrawerSoccer.com Freshman Best XI list! Andersen made one assist in the preseason match against Loyola.

VEITH ON #SCTOP10

• Ava Veith's first collegiate goal - extending Virginia Tech's lead to 5-0 on Aug. 26, 2021 against Elon - received the No. 2 spot on SportsCenter's Top 10 Plays.

• Veith unloaded a 35-yard, curling strike to the top-right shelf, precluding Holly Weber's 30-yard strike that took place on the other side of a 55-minute lightning delay.
