#### SEASON OPENERS

- The Hokies have won four consecutive season openers, dating back to a win over RV Witchita State in 2019.
- Since the 2009 season, the Hokies are on a 13-1 streak in home openers, falling only to No. 14 Ole Miss 5-1 to open the 2018 season
- Tech hasn't lost consecutive season openers since 2001-02.
- Although Tech didn't open the season with a ranked opponent, they defeated two ranked opponents throughout opening weekend, one of the toughest opening weekends since 2016.

**GREENSBORO, N.C.** – Florida State has been voted the preseason favorite to win the 2022 ACC softball title by the league's 13 head coaches.

The Seminoles, who advanced to their 11th NCAA Women's College World Series last season and played for the national championship, received eight first-place votes and tallied 137 points.

Clemson collected two first-place votes and 128 points to finish second in the voting, while Virginia Tech earned 126 points with two first-place votes to occupy third. Duke was fourth with 119 points and the remaining first-place vote, while Notre Dame rounded out the top five with 99 points.

Virginia Tech leads the league with four representatives on the Preseason All-ACC team, while Clemson, Duke, Florida State and Georgia Tech each have two selections.

### ACC PITCHER OF THE WEEK

- For the ninth time in her career, Keely Rochard was named the ACC Pitcher of the Week on Tuesday
- The senior ace went 3-0 in her weekend debut with wins over RV Northwestern, then-No. 11 Mizzou and then-No. 19 Kentucky. She also received the save in the Hokies 5-4 win over Wisconsin
- Racking up 34 strikeouts on the weekend, Rochard finished with a 1.38 ERA, giving up only four walks in 20.1 innings pitched. In four appearances, the right-hander posted a .181 batting average against
- In the 3-2 win over Northwestern, Rochard went the distance, giving up only one earned run on three hits, striking out 15.
- She followed that up with another double-digit strikeout performance against Mizzou, tallying 11 with only two earned runs. Against Kentucky, Rochard threw five innings of scoreless softball, giving up only one run in the sixth off four hits, striking out eight

### BENNETT DOING BENNETT THINGS

- Kelsey Bennett picked up where she left off in 2021, hitting .615 in her opening weekend in 13 at bats
- The junior posted eight hits, including two doubles, with two RBI and two runs scored
- She finished her weekend with a .769 slugging percentage as well as a .688 on base percentage

### LEMLEY DEBUT

- Freshman Emma Lemley impressed in her freshman debut, getting the 5-4 win over Wisconsin in the season opener
- Against the Badgers, the right-hander threw 6.2 innings, striking out 16 and giving up only one earned run on one hit
- She also received the win in the 5-1 victory over Michigan State, throwing four scoreless innings, giving up two hits and striking out seven
- Lemley finished her weekend debut with a 0.66 ERA with a 0.79 batting average against. She gave up three hits and four runs over her 10.2 innings pitched

### CONSISTENT CAM

- Cameron Fagan recorded at least one hit in every game at the Northern Lights/Southern Nights Tournament last weekend
- Against Michigan State, the sophomore went 4-for-4 with an RBI
- She also had a multi-hit game against Mizzou with two and scored a crucial run in the Hokies 4-3 victory
- Fagan ended her weekend with a .474 batting average, good for second on the team, as well as a .474 on base percentage

### RACKING UP THE Ks

- The Virginia Tech pitchers combined for 62 total strikeouts last weekend, compared to only 17 by

opponents

- Rochard led the way with 34 total over 20.1 innings. Lemley also added 23 in 10.2 innings.
- Mackenzie Osborne came on in relief against Michigan State and had five strikeouts over three innings
- As a whole, the Hokie pitching staff currently has a 1.24 ERA and a .149 batting average against

### REPKO RAKES

- Ally Repko joins the Hokies as a graduate transfer for the 2022 season after a four-year career at Elon.
- In her weekend debut with the Hokies, she started four games at designated player, tallying three hits including two doubles
- Repko had a double and an RBI in the Hokies win over Northwestern as well as a double in the win over Kentucky
- As a senior with the Phoenix, Repko started in all 39 games, recording a .340 batting average and leading the team in home runs (nine), RBIs (34) and slugging percentage (.670)
- During the 2019 season, Repko was a starter in all 54 games was tied for the team lead in runs scored (32) and doubles (14)
- She was named to the CAA All-Rookie Team in 2018 after leading Elon with six home runs, along with seven doubles and 23 RBIs

### RETURNING THE CORE

- All of the Hokies Super Regional lineup returns for the 2022 season including All-American Keely Rochard, as well as All-ACC members Jayme Bailey, Kelsey Bennett, Kelsey Brown and Cameron Fagan
- Seniors Mackenzie Lawter and Darby Trull, as well as junior Meredith Slaw and sophomores Addy Greene and Emma Ritter had solid falls for the Hokies and will see time in the starting lineup
- The Hokie freshmen class will also see playing time this year as pitcher Emma Lemley will look to provide Rochard relief in the circle. Bre Peck, Ariana Wright and Rachel Castine will also see time in the lineup for the Hokies
- Sophomores Mackenzie Osborne and Ivy Rosenberry also return in the circle for Virginia Tech and will see time on the rubber

### IMPACT FRESHMAN

- Emma Lemley was named a Top 75 Impact Freshman by D1 Softball heading into the 2022 season
- The pitcher was also named the preseason ACC Pitcher of the Year by D1 Softball
- The Forest, Va. native was a USSSA All-American, three-time USA Softball State Champion and a two-time member of the All-Seminole District Team.
- She has a 20-strikeout game and a perfect game on her resume, as well as a 0.80 ERA in high school, averaging two strikeouts per inning. The freshman held a 0.90 in travel ball, playing for Starz Gold.
- Lemley was ranked the No. 30 overall recruit in the class of 2021 by Extra Inning Softball

**NEWCOMERS**

- Along with Lemley, the Hokies welcome eight newcomers to the roster, including six freshman and a transfer
- Ally Repko, a graduate transfer from Elon, was a four-year starter for the Phoenix, earning First Team All-CAA honors as a senior. She batted .340 in her final season and led the team in home runs with nine and RBIs with 34
- Ariana Wright is a freshman utility player out of Georgia and was a three-time First Team All-State member as well as a three-time First Team All-Region honoree. During the 2020 fall season, Wright hit .519 with 15 home runs and 11 doubles
- The No. 22 overall recruit in the class of 2021 also has a spot on the Hokie roster in Bre Peck. The Pennsylvania native was a two-time 6A First Team All-State member as well as the Gatorade Pennsylvania Softball Player of the Year
- Rachel Castine had a solid fall for the Hokies to open her rookie season. She was a four-year letterwinner at Greenbrier Christian Academy in Chesapeake, Va., hitting .500 during the fall of 2019 with 11 RBIs. During the summer of 2020, Castine tallied seven home runs, with seven doubles and 26 RBIs in 25 games played

**ROCHARD RETURNS**

- First Team All-American Keely Rochard returns for her final season in 2022, coming off a 2021 campaign in which she was named ACC Pitcher of the Year and became just the third All-American in school history
- She finished the season in the top three of NCAA Division I in strikeouts (348), shutouts (13) and wins (29) for the second straight season
- During the NCAA Tournament, Rochard went 4-2 in her six starts, holding opponents to a .196 batting average in 37.0 innings. She posted 49 strikeouts and became the first pitcher in Hokies history to go undefeated (3-0) at the NCAA Regionals

**BATTLE TESTED**

- The 2022 schedule features 10 NCAA Tournament teams from a season ago, including five of the 16 national seeds and National Championship Runner-Up Florida State
- "The 2022 schedule is as ambitious of a schedule as we've ever had. We'll be testing ourselves from the jump so hopefully we're in a good position to be prepared at the end of the season. Our players are working hard, we'll be ready to go in February," – Head coach Pete D'Amour

**PRESEASON RANKINGS**

- The Hokies were ranked No. 10 by ESPN.com/USA Softball heading into the 2022 season, the highest preseason ranking in school history
- Tech moved up three spots from the final rankings of the 2021 season, which had them at No. 13
- This is the highest ranking for the Hokies from ESPN.com/USA Softball since 2008 when Tech was ranked No. 15
- The highest overall ranking in school history came at the conclusion of the 2008 season when the Hokies earned a No. 8 ranking by the NFCA
- The 2022 schedule pits the Hokies against eight

Top 25 teams, including three to open the season with No. 12 Missouri, No. 20 Kentucky and No. 24 Northwestern

- Virginia Tech will also take on No. 2 Alabama and No. 16 Tennessee in non-conference play, as well as No. 6 Florida State and No. 14 Clemson in ACC play. Liberty is ranked No. 24 in the USA Today/NFCA poll, who the Hokies will take on twice this season in midweek matchups.

**PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST**

- Keely Rochard was named to the 2022 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Watch List on Jan. 26
- The senior is among 50 student-athletes on the preseason watch list, making an appearance for the second straight season
- The watch list is highlighted by 21 pitchers and 29 position players with athletes representing 27 different universities from across the country
- A total of seven athletic conferences are represented, with the SEC accounting for nine schools represented, followed by the Pac-12 and ACC with five schools apiece.

**PRESEASON ALL-ACC**

- A conference-high four Hokies were named to the Preseason All-ACC team, the conference announced on Jan. 26
- Senior Keely Rochard, juniors Kelsey Brown and Kelsey Bennett, as well as sophomore Cameron Fagan were the Tech honorees
- This is Rochard and Bennett's third time making the preseason team, while Brown and Fagan earn the honor for the first time

- Tryouts took place in Vero beach, Fla. from January 1-6. She joined a 45-member invitee list that included present and former athletes from seven athletic conferences, including four from the ACC
- "Being invited to the USA Women's National Team tryout is a tremendous honor for Keely. She's put the work in, keeps improving and is a great ambassador for our softball program," head coach Pete D'Amour said. "I know she'll represent herself and Virginia Tech in the best light possible. We're excited for her."

- Last season, he was 7-5, winning two series against the two top-25 foes of then-No. 13/14 Florida State and then-No. 12/14 Duke.
- D'Amour's squad also took down No. 2/2 UCLA in game one of the Los Angeles Super Regional, the Hokies highest ranked win in school history

**APPROACHING RECORDS**

- Kelsey Bennett has been moving her way in to the record books at the plate, currently sitting at T-8th in school history in triples with seven and 3rd in home runs with 34
- Bennett only needs one more home run to move up to the second spot and 14 to take over the top spot

- In those games, the senior is 11-7, defeating three ranked opponents already this season
- In the 2021 Duke series, she held the nationally-ranked and ACC Champion Blue Devils, who averaged the most runs a game (6) in the ACC coming into their series, to just one run in the first game, three in the second game and three in the fourth – all well below their average.
- She also took down No. 2 UCLA in game one of the



Los Angeles Super Regional, throwing a three-hitter and allowing just two runs to the 2019 National Champions. Rochard recorded 12 strikeouts in that game, her 15th double-digit strikeout game of the season

**CONFERENCE RESPECT**

- Four ACC softball teams are ranked among the top 15 of the D1Softball Preseason Poll, tied for the most of any conference
- Florida State leads the group at No. 6, followed by No. 11 Virginia Tech, No. 13 Duke and No. 14 Clemson
- In the ESPN.com / USA Softball poll, FSU comes in at No. 6, while the Hokies hold steady at the No. 10 spot, followed by No. 14 Clemson and No. 18 Duke. Notre Dame is also receiving votes in the preseason poll

**D'AMOUR HITS 100**

- In the Hokies' 8-1 win in the series finale at Syracuse on May 2, 2021, Tech head coach Pete D'Amour earned his 100th win at Virginia Tech.

- Ivy Rosenberry saw action in 12 games a season ago, throwing 48 innings with nine starts for the Hokies. She gave up only four walks and ended 2021 with a 3.06 ERA and 27 strikeouts
- Rosenberry also has postseason experience, making her debut in game 3 of the LA Super Regional, throwing two innings and holding No. 2 UCLA to just one hit

**FAGAN FIREPOWER**

- Fagan made a splash as a freshman, earning NFCA First Team All-Mid-Atlantic honors, as well as being named to the Schutt/Sports NFCA Division I Freshman of the Year Top 30
- During the 2021 season, she recorded a hit in 29 of 34 games, including 14 multi-hit games. Fagan was also another Hokie player that had a standout game in the win over UCLA, going 3-for-5 with two RBIs and a run scored.
- The infielder tied for the team-lead with two home runs at the Tempe Regional, while also batting .417 with three RBIs and three runs scored.
- Fagan led the team with a .409 batting average, ending the season with 22 RBIs and five home runs. She was named to the 2021 ACC All-Freshman Team and to the VaSID All-State First Team.

The Virginia Tech softball team has the luxury of playing and practicing in some of the finest facilities on the East Coast. Using the Tech Softball Park, Softball Indoor Facility and a state-of-the-art weight room, the Hokies train in terrific facilities designed to help them win championships. Combined with a new locker room and one of the best scoreboard and video boards in the country, the Hokies have it all when it comes to what they need to win.

Tech Softball Park, which was completed in the fall of 1997, has dimensions of 200 feet down the lines and 220 feet to center field. In January of 2008, an additional 746 permanent seats were installed, bringing the capacity up from 336 to 1,024. The new bleachers match the ones that were already in place and now extend down to the end of both dugouts.

Thanks to an anonymous donation, TSP now has seatbacks in the section behind home plate, which was completed in fall 2017.



## 2022 RESULTS

**What's a Hokie?**



The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which is still used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

The official university school colors - Chicago Maroon and Burnt Orange - also were introduced in 1896. The colors were chosen by a committee because they made a 'unique combination' not worn elsewhere at the time. The official definition of "Hokie" is "a loyal Virginia Tech Fan".

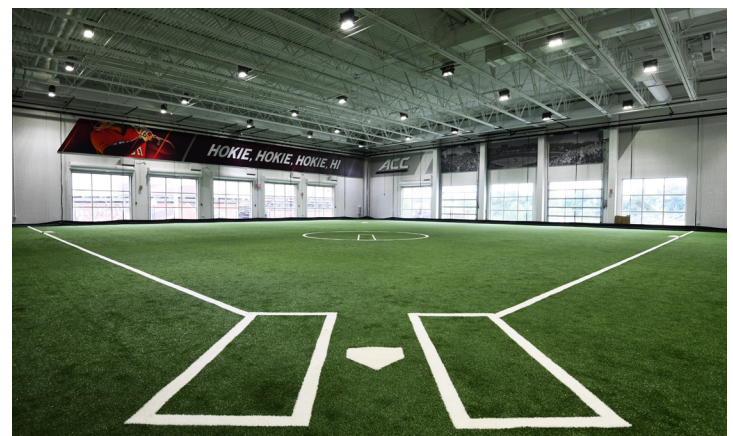
**'19 CLASS OF ACC COACHES**

**SOFTBALL INDOOR FACILITY**

- The facility, which is attached to Rector Field House (track & field) and immediately adjacent to Tech Softball Park, opened the fall 2018 and provides the Hokies with an indoor infield for practice during inclement weather, along with four cages for hitting and pitching practice.
- The one-story building also features two coaches rooms, an equipment room, a team room, a film room, a mudroom and team facilities. The facility will be available to the program year-round and will have uses for practice, team events and gameday necessities. The new facility will encompass more than 16,000 square feet.
- The facility was designed by Cannon Designs and was built by Branch Associates of Salem, Virginia. This project was a part of a larger plan that vastly improved Rector Field House (track & field) and all of the adjacent athletics facilities. Total cost was roughly \$18 million.

Head coach Pete D'Amour led the Hokies to their second ever appearance in the NCAA Super Regionals during the 2021 campaign, doing so in just his second full season. Selected for the NCAA Tournament in both full seasons as head coach, D'Amour's Hokies were the No. 2 seed at the 2021 Tempe Regional with national No. 15 seed Arizona State as the group's favorite. Tech emerged from the four-team regional undefeated under D'Amour's guidance, the first time in school history that the Hokies' swept an NCAA Regional.

2021 was not just a historic year for the Hokies, but for D'Amour as well as he became the fastest head coach in program history to reach 100 wins, doing so in just 127 games. Under D'Amour's tutelage, pitcher Keely Rochard became Tech's third NFCA All-American ever and just the second to earn first-team honors. D'Amour and his wife Anna also welcomed their first son, Reaux, to the world prior to the NCAA Tournament.

In his second season leading the Hokies, Coach Pete D'Amour led the team to a 21-4 record and was in first place in the ACC when the season ended. He helped guide the team to an impressive 3-2 record at the St. Pete/Clearwater Elite Invitational against five top-25 opponents, including wins over #14 Minnesota and #17 South Carolina. D'Amour guided the progression of pitcher Keely Rochard, who was one of the nation's top pitchers in 2020, and also helped the Hokies' offense to the highest scoring in the ACC.

Guiding Virginia Tech to one of the biggest turnarounds in NCAA softball history, Pete D'Amour led the Hokies in his first year to a 24-game win improvement in 2019 after posting a 47-11 record, including a 20-4 mark in ACC play.

The 47 wins were the fourth most in school history while the 20 ACC wins were the most in program history. On Tech's way to 20 league wins, it earned an ACC regular-season title and a Coastal Division crown after being picked 10th in the ACC preseason poll. By doing so, it also earned the Hokies their first trip to the NCAA Tournament since 2015, winning two games at the Lexington Regional to pick up their first NCAA win since 2014.

No stranger to success, D'Amour, out of the new 11 Power Five head coaches in 2019, picked up the most wins of the group. The 2019 ACC Coach of the Year earned the nod to mark just Tech's second time winning it, while a school-record five Hokies made an All-ACC first team. Under D'Amour's direction, pitcher Carrie Eberle was named ACC Pitcher of the Year and third baseman Kelsey Bennett was tabbed Freshman of the Year.

He also tutored two Softball America All-Americans in outfielders Emma Strouth and Darby Trull, who both hit over .400 and tallied 60-plus putouts, as well as a school-record seven NFCA All-Region (Mid-Atlantic) selections and a school-record eight VaSID all-staters. D'Amour also was tabbed VaSID Coach of the Year.

Under his watch, Tech became ranked during the season, something that hadn't been done since 2015, and got up to as high as No. 19 in the ESPN.com/USA Softball poll and No. 22 in the USA Today/NFCA poll. The Hokies were ranked for 11 consecutive weeks in the ESPN.com/USA Softball poll, breaking the program record set in 2007 of 10 weeks, and picked up two ranked wins on the year, beating then-No. 8/8 Georgia and then-No. 20/17 JMU.

Tech took big strides at the plate in '19, resetting over 20 individual and team school records, including batting average (.334) and home runs (97), just to name a few. The Hokies led the ACC in batting average and home runs per game (1.67), while also getting it done in the circle with shutouts (22). D'Amour had the Hokies ready to play against in-state rival Virginia in the Commonwealth Clash presented by Virginia529, sweeping the Cavaliers 3-0 and not allowing a runner to touch third base or home plate in the series, a first in program history, for three shutout wins.

D'Amour joined the Hokies after two seasons as the head coach at Kennesaw State, where he led the Owls to a 79-37 record and two postseason appearances. Before taking over the Kennesaw State program in 2017, he earned a reputation as one of the nation's premier recruiters during his 10-year tenure as assistant coach at the University of Missouri, a perennial NCAA tournament participant.

D'Amour coached Kennesaw State to the 2018 Atlantic Sun Conference regular season and tournament championships en route to the program's first NCAA Regional appearance since transitioning to the Division I level in 2006, as the Owls finished the year with a 39-17 record. In his inaugural year as head coach at Kennesaw State in 2017, he guided the Owls to a 40-20 overall record and a berth in the National Invitational Softball Championship.

Kennesaw State went 39-17 and 14-3 in the ASUN in 2018 and earned a No. 3 seed in the Tallahassee Regional. D'Amour was named ASUN Coach of the Year and seven Owls earned ASUN all-conference accolades, including ASUN Pitcher of the Year Alley Cutting and ASUN Freshman of the Year Patricia Awald. Awald was one of 25 finalists up for NFCA National Freshman of the Year.

Prior to accepting the head coaching job at Kennesaw State, D'Amour spent a decade at Missouri as an assistant coach, serving as associate head coach for his final two seasons in 2015-16. During his tenure in Columbia, the Tigers qualified for the NCAA tournament in each of his 10 seasons on the staff, reaching five NCAA super regionals and earning three consecutive trips to the Women's College World Series from 2009-11.

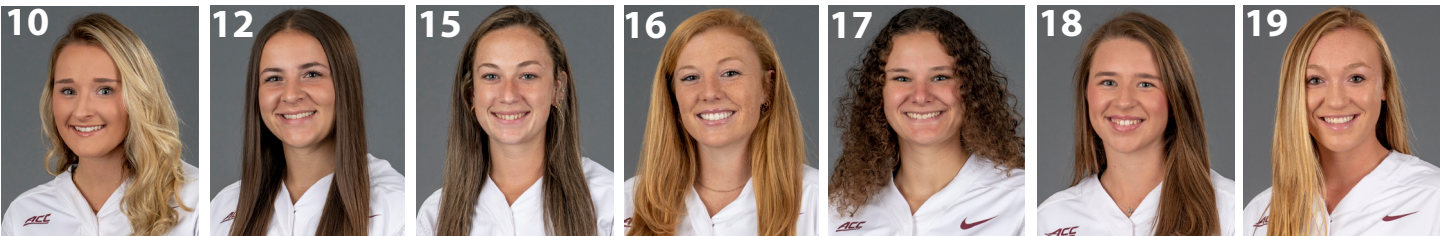

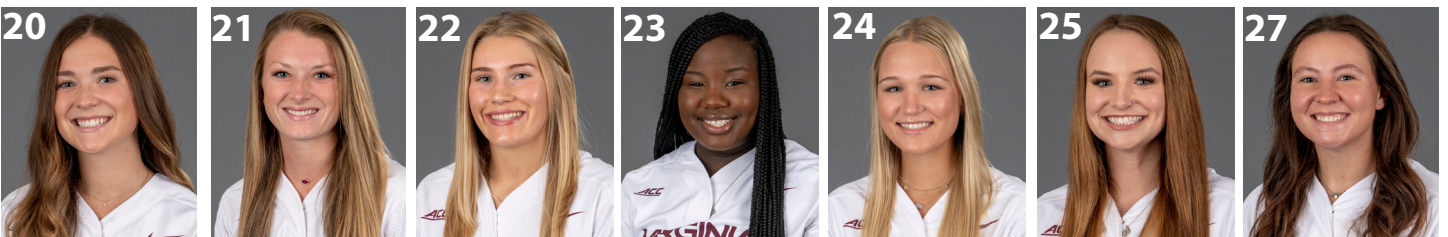




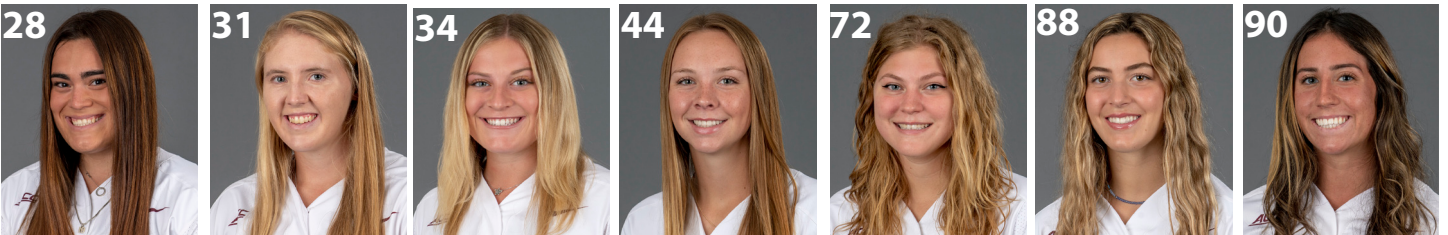
