KEY STORYLINES

TECH HOSTS ETSU

• Coming off its season-opening sweep against UNC Asheville, the Virginia Tech baseball team will chase its first midweek win of the spring on Tuesday, Feb. 22, when Tech hosts ETSU at English Field at Atlantic Union Bank Park. Tuesday's game between the Hokies and the Buccaneers will air live on ACC Network Extra with coverage beginning at 4 p.m.

HOME DOZEN

• Virginia Tech's 12-game, season-opening home stand would mark the Hokies' longest such stretch to date across program history.

OPENING WEEKEND

• Virginia Tech started its 2022 campaign by making relatively easy work of UNC Asheville, picking up three early wins by the combined, 35-8 margin.

• Offensively, the Hokies batted .393 as a team and slugged .692,

cranking out nine doubles, a triple and seven home runs while amassing the 42-16 advantage in total hits.

• Third-year catcher Cade Hunter stole the Opening Day spotlight, turning in a 4-for-4 effort that featured two doubles and two swings of the Hokies' iconic home run hammer.

• True freshman infielder Carson DeMartini homered during each of his first two Tech appearances while Nick Biddison, Tanner Schobel and Eduardo Malinowski also left the park during the first weekend of play.

• On the mound, the Hokies' trio of starting pitchers – Griffin Green, Ryan Okuda and Drue Hackenberg – united to yield 17 strikeouts across 15 shutout innings.

MIDWEEK OPPOSITION

• East Tennessee State pulls into Blacksburg with a 3-0 record

after dropping 12-plus runs on Northern Kentucky three times last weekend.

• Ashton King batted .583 (7-for-12) and crossed the plate six times to lead the Bucs, who collectively hit .355 and flexed a .482 on-base percentage.

• Similar to the Hokies, ETSU received efficient production from its pitching staff that issued 41 strikeouts against six walks and two hit batsmen.

• Under John Szefc, Tech is 5-0 against ETSU, pulling two April victories during the 2021 season – once in Johnson City (15-5) and once in Blacksburg (12-0).

• The Hokies' April 6 win was highlighted by Gavin Cross hitting for the cycle, part of his 4-for-6, seven-RBI day against his father's alma mater.

redshirt-freshman Sam Tackett sported the second highest on-base percentage among qualifying NCAA Division I players (.889).

- After swinging two hits off the bench on Opening Day, Tackett managed to draw five walks and was hit by a pitch during the series' final two games, reaching base safely during eight of his nine weekend plate appearances.

- As a unit, Tech's .485 on-base percentage ranked one position higher nationally (14th) on Monday than that of ETSU (.482, 15th).

GOLDEN PURSUIT

- Virginia Tech's third-year outfielder Gavin Cross was named to the 2022 Golden Spikes Award preseason watch list that tracks the best candidates for top amateur player in the United States.

- Cross is a five-time 2022 Preseason All-American, including three First Team mentions by *Baseball America*, *D1Baseball* and *Perfect Game/Rawlings*.

- He has also been named a top-15 college prospect for the 2022 MLB Draft by four leading publications, peaking at No. 3 by *Perfect Game*.

RECEIVING VOTES

- Virginia Tech received votes in the 2022 NCBWA preseason poll (Feb. 3), placing outside the top 35.

- Seven ACC programs were named in total - the second most behind the SEC (eight).

2021 IN REVIEW

- Virginia Tech took great strides during the 2021 season, achieving the program's best winning percentage since the Hokies' 2013 season that earned them a home NCAA Regional in Blacksburg.

- Tech rolled out to an 8-2 start that featured ACC-series victories at No. 6 Miami and against No. 25 North Carolina - the latter marking the Hokies' first-ever ACC series victory against UNC.

- In late March, the Hokies swept a three-game league series at No. 15 Pitt prior to beginning April with another ACC series victory against Boston College.

- After sweeping Wake Forest in mid-April, Tech's record stood at 19-9 (14-7 ACC). On April 12, the Hokies earned their highest ranking of the 2021

season, peaking at No. 17 in *D1Baseball's* top 25.

- Entering the second half of the season, Tech caught a perfect storm of rising ACC competition. After dropping a series against the eventual Coastal Division champion, Georgia Tech, the Hokies combined to yield a 1-5 record against two to-be College World Series teams: NC State (0-3) and Virginia (1-2).

- Arriving at its May series at Duke, Tech (27-17, 16-14 ACC) sat two games behind Georgia Tech for the division lead. However, the Hokies came up winless against the eventual postseason champions, tacking on three more defeats against No. 8 Notre Dame - a to-be Super Regional team.

- Sliding into the 12-team field at the 2021 ACC Baseball Championship, 12th-seeded Tech played to the competitive, 3-2 loss against Virginia before exiting the event with its 8-0 defeat to No. 7 Notre Dame.

- Tech finished the 2021 season ranked No. 66 in the RPI.

CROSS-ING YOUR MIND

- Gavin Cross came into his own during the 2021 season, compiling a breakthrough campaign in the ACC.

- Cross led the Hokies in batting average (.345), slugging percentage (.621), hits (70), doubles (13), triples (five), home runs (11) and stolen bases (nine).

- Listed as a freshman due to NCAA COVID-19 eligibility rules, he became Tech's first-ever freshman to be named to the All-ACC First Team as well as its first-ever ACC All-Freshman Team selection.

SPIN CYCLE

- Among Gavin Cross's most notable 2021 highlights, he it for the cycle during Tech's April 6 victory at ETSU.

- Cross went 4-for-6 with seven RBIs and two runs scored. He crushed a grand slam during his second at-bat (second inning), tripled during the fourth inning, knocked a two-RBI double during the fifth inning, overcame a seventh-inning strikeout and dialed up a first-pitch, RBI single with two outs during the top of the ninth inning.

- His cycle highlighted a monster month of April for Cross, who was batting .404 for the season on April 27.

U-S-A! U-S-A! U-S-A!

- Gavin Cross represented Virginia Tech on the 2021 USA Baseball Collegiate National Team. He competed during the multi-week Stars & Stripes summer showcase alongside the nation's premier collegiate players.

- Cross led the Stars & Stripes series in batting average (.455), slugging percentage (.879) and home runs (four) - none bigger than the grand slam he hit in his hometown of Bristol, Tennessee, on July 8.

Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock announced the hiring of Tech's 25th head baseball coach on June 9, 2017 and formally introduced John Szeffc as the head coach of the baseball program at a press conference a few days later on June 15. The 2021 season will mark his fourth as the Hokies' head coach.

In his first three seasons, Szeffc (pronounced SHEFF) has coached the Hokies to a pair of seven-game winning streaks - one that opened the 2019 season and the second was in 2020, after the team started 1-3. Also in 2020, the team won 10 games in nonconference action, which included ending the shortened season on a nine-game winning streak, the longest since the team won 18 straight nonconference games in a row back in 2012.

The team also posted an 8-0 home record, the best start at the school since 2012, which helped the Hokies extend their home winning streak in the month of February to 15 straight victories. Added to the final win of 2019, Tech has won nine straight at home, the longest since an 11-game streak from April 28, 2015 through March 4, 2016, and will enter the 2021 season tied for the 12th longest home-win streak in the NCAA.

After the shortened 2020 season, three players earned All-America distinction from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper as it recognized both pitcher Ian Seymour and catcher Carson Taylor as Third Team selections, marking the first time Tech had multiple All-Americans since 2003. Outfielder Gavin Cross was later named to the All-American Freshman Team, just the seventh ever at the school. Also, despite just a five-round MLB Draft in 2020, the draft marked the first time in school history, two Tech players are chosen in the top four rounds as Seymour (2nd) and Taylor (4th) were selected.

Szeffc, who won his 400th career game on March 10, 2018 guiding the Hokies to a 3-1 victory over Pittsburgh, accepted the head coaching position at Tech after leading Maryland to three NCAA appearances and a 180-122 (.596) overall record as the Terrapins' head coach. Before arriving in Blacksburg, Szeffc owned a 392-259-3 (.602) career record in 12 seasons as an NCAA head coach, producing 10 campaigns with 30 or more wins.

In addition to ending a 43-year NCAA tournament drought and becoming the fastest coach to 100 career wins at Maryland, Szeffc spent seven seasons (1996-2002) at the helm of the Marist College baseball program, where he led the team to four conference championships, four NCAA Regional appearances and a 212-137-3 (.607) overall mark. Szeffc earned Northeastern Conference Coach of the Year honors in 1997 and was the American Baseball Coaches

Associate Northeast Region Coach of the Year in 2001.

The first coach in Maryland history to ever take the Terrapins to an NCAA Super Regional, Szeffc accomplished the feat twice in 2014 and 2015 as he guided the program to the first two 40-win seasons in school history and claimed Maryland's first two NCAA Regional crowns. Maryland achieved a final No. 14 ranking both seasons, the highest finishes in school history.

He guided the Terrapins to the ACC Tournament final for the first time in 38 years in 2014 and then took Maryland to the Big Ten tournament final in the school's initial season in that conference, winning a program-best 42 games in 2015.

Szeffc has coached 109 players that have been drafted or signed professional contracts since 1997, including four in 2018 and five in 2019. Over the last eight drafts, 36 of his players have been selected, including the 45th pick of the 2014 draft Jake Stinnett, the highest pick of a Maryland player in almost a decade. Almost a dozen have gone on to play in the Major Leagues, including most recently, Mike Shawaryn (Red Sox) and Lamonte Wade (Twins) in 2019. He has also helped develop 26 All-Americans, including 10 of the 20 players in Maryland history to earn that distinction.

The Middletown, N.Y. native arrived at Maryland after a two-year stint as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator at Kansas State (2011-12) and a two-season stay as assistant head coach and recruiting coordinator at Kansas (2009-10). He also enjoyed a six-season tenure as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Louisiana-Lafayette (2003-08). Szeffc began his coaching career as an assistant at Sacred Heart (1995) and at Drexel (1990-93).

Szeffc managed the New York Generals in the Atlantic College Baseball League during the summers of 1995 and 1996. He led the club to a 47-28 record, earned two consecutive division titles and the ACBL title game in 1996.

Collegiately, he played two years at Connecticut before transferring in 1987 to Drexel. During his senior campaign for the Dragons, he was tabbed an All-East Coast Conference outfielder.

He graduated from Drexel University with a degree in corporate communications in 1989. He also holds a master's degree in sports administration from Temple University.

Szeffc and his wife, Barbara, have a daughter, Anna, and two sons, John Michael and Sam.
