Kelsey Bennett has been hot for the Hokies in her last five games, hitting .500 over 18 at bats. She has posted nine hits, including a double with four RBI. She has also been steady at shortstop with zero errors in nine attempts.

Emma Ritter has been getting better and better at the plate, the only Hokie hitting over .400 this season at a .438 clip. Against ETSU, Ritter went 2-for-2 with 4 RBI, including a three-run home run in the first.

GREENSBORO, N.C. – Florida State has been voted the preseason favorite to win the 2022 ACC softball title by the league's 13 head coaches.

The Seminoles, who advanced to their 11th NCAA Women's College World Series last season and played for the national championship, received eight first-place votes and tallied 137 points.

Clemson collected two first-place votes and 128 points to finish second in the voting, while Virginia Tech earned 126 points with two first-place votes to occupy third. Duke was fourth with 119 points and the remaining first-place vote, while Notre Dame rounded out the top five with 99 points.

Virginia Tech leads the league with four representatives on the Preseason All-ACC team, while Clemson, Duke, Florida State and Georgia Tech each have two selections.

BATS ARE HOT

- After Wednesday's game against ETSU, the Hokies are now hitting .295 as a team, up from .278 after the Clemson series
- Tech's RBI count is up to 92 compared to only 25 from opponents. The Hokies also have a .438 slugging percentage after Wednesday's game
- Emma Ritter leads the team with a .708 slugging and 13 RBI. She has also posted nine multi-hit games
- Addy Greene has also been heating up at the plate in her last two starts. She has posted three hits and an RBI, including two hits in game three at Clemson as the DP

PITCHER OF THE WEEK (3/9)

- For the first time in her career, Emma Lemley was named the ACC Pitcher of the Week on March 9
- The right-hander went 1-0, shutting out then-No. 14/9 Clemson, while also earning a save in the 4-2 win over the Tigers.
- She gave up just three hits in her 7.0 innings pitched, striking out 10 Clemson batters with no walks.
- In the game three win, Lemley came on in the seventh, striking out two, giving up one run to earn the save.
- She ended her time at Clemson with a 0.88 ERA and a .138 batting average against, facing the Tigers for 8.0 innings, with 12 strikeouts and one earned run.

LEMLEY SHUTOUT

- The 4-0 shutout against then-No. 14/9 Clemson was Tech's first shutout over a top-10 ranked team since 2008
- The last time was against No. 6 Michigan in the Super Regionals on May 25. The Hokies beat the Wolverines 1-0 to force an elimination game
- Freshman Emma Lemley threw the complete game shutout against Clemson, going the distance and giving up just three hits and zero walks, striking out 10

CLUTCH LONG BALL

- The Hokies home run ball was clutch during the Clemson series, with game one and three being decided by one swing of the bat
- In game one, the game was scoreless heading in to the fourth inning. The Hokies loaded the bases with freshman Bre Peck drawing the walk to put Tech up 1-0. From there, Jayme Bailey took the first pitch to dead centerfield to give Tech the 5-0 advantage
- Game three was also scoreless heading into the sixth inning when Morgan Overaitis took an 0-2 count to center field for a three-run advantage

SERIES SWEEP

- The Hokies picked up where they left off in ACC play during the 2021 season, with the last ACC series being a series sweep against Syracuse April 30 – May 2
- Tech swept Clemson for the first time in school

- history by outscoring the Tigers 14-3 over the three games played
- To put that in perspective, Clemson was not swept at all last season in ACC play, posting a 29-5 record with six sweeps

RITTER RAKES

- Emma Ritter continued to impress at the plate for the Hokies at the Carolina Classic, playing in all three complete games and posting a .400 batting average.
- In 10 at bats, she had four hits, including her first home run of the season, with 5 RBI. Her .700 slugging percentage led the Hokie starters, as well as her two stolen bases.
- Her two-run home run against South Carolina proved to be the difference in the Hokies 5-3 win over South Carolina, as she also added an RBI in the seventh to clinch the win.

NEW YEAR, SAME KEELY

- Senior Keely Rochard ranks third in the NCAA and first in the ACC in strikeouts with 114 as of Tuesday 3/8
- She posted a new season-high with her 17 against Ohio State, just two away from her career-high of 19
- The right-hander has double-digit strikeouts in seven of the 12 games she has appeared in
- Rochard is averaging 11.7 strikeouts per seven innings and her ERA sits at 1.24.

PECK HEATING UP

- Freshman Bre Peck has been making an impact in the Hokie starting lineup, making the start at third base in 13 games, including the last nine
- She hit a home run two straight weekends, hitting a solo shot against South Carolina (2/26) and a two-run walk-off against Middle Tennessee State (2/18)
- Peck currently has nine hits with eight RBI. She hit .333 at the Carolina Classic with a .667 slugging percentage

DUAL THREAT

- Senior Keely Rochard and freshman Emma Lemley have been lethal in the circle for the Hokies, putting up impressive numbers at the Easton Bama Bash.
- Rochard ended her weekend with a 0.50 ERA and 27 strikeouts, including striking out 11 Alabama batters. She gave up only one earned run on four hits.
- Lemley has been equally as impressive, going 2-1 on the weekend with a 1.20 ERA. She threw 11.2 innings, racking up 21 strikeouts and giving up only two earned runs in her three appearances.
- She currently leads the ACC in strikeouts per seven innings with 12.8.

TOP TEN HOKIES

- Virginia Tech was ranked No. 6 by USA Today/NFCA and ESPN.com/USA Softball on Tuesday afternoon, its highest ranking in school history.
- The Hokies were previously ranked 7th in Week 2, topping the 2008 team whose highest ranking was No. 8

• For the ninth time in her career, Keely Rochard was named the ACC Pitcher of the Week on 2/14

• The senior ace went 3-0 in her weekend debut with wins over RV Northwestern, then-No. 11 Mizzou and then-No. 19 Kentucky. She also received the save in the Hokies 5-4 win over Wisconsin

- First Team All-American Keely Rochard returns for her final season in 2022, coming off a 2021 campaign in which she was named ACC Pitcher of the Year and became just the third All-American in school history
- She finished the season in the top three of NCAA Division I in strikeouts (348), shutouts (13) and wins (29) for the second straight season
- During the NCAA Tournament, Rochard went 4-2 in her six starts, holding opponents to a .196 batting average in 37.0 innings. She posted 49 strikeouts and became the first pitcher in Hokies history to go undefeated (3-0) at the NCAA Regionals

BATTLE TESTED

- The 2022 schedule features 10 NCAA Tournament teams from a season ago, including five of the 16 national seeds and National Championship Runner-Up Florida State
- "The 2022 schedule is as ambitious of a schedule as we've ever had. We'll be testing ourselves from the jump so hopefully we're in a good position to be prepared at the end of the season. Our players are working hard, we'll be ready to go in February," – Head coach Pete D'Amour

PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

- Keely Rochard was named to the 2022 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Watch List on Jan. 26
- The senior is among 50 student-athletes on the preseason watch list, making an appearance for the second straight season
- The watch list is highlighted by 21 pitchers and 29 position players with athletes representing 27 different universities from across the country
- A total of seven athletic conferences are represented, with the SEC accounting for nine schools represented, followed by the Pac-12 and ACC with five schools apiece.

PRESEASON ALL-ACC

- A conference-high four Hokies were named to the Preseason All-ACC team, the conference announced on Jan. 26
- Senior Keely Rochard, juniors Kelsey Brown and Kelsey Bennett, as well as sophomore Cameron Fagan were the Tech honorees
- This is Rochard and Bennett's third time making the preseason team, while Brown and Fagan earn the honor for the first time
- The Hokies were ranked third in the ACC Coaches Poll, behind just Clemson and Florida State
- Tech received 126 votes, including two first-place votes, while Clemson received 128 votes (two first-place votes) and FSU tallied 137 (eight first-place votes)

NATIONAL STAGE

- Rochard was invited to participate in the 2022 USA Softball Women's National Team Selection Trials, USA Softball announced in November
- Tryouts took place in Vero beach, Fla. from January 1-6. She joined a 45-member invitee list that included present and former athletes from seven athletic conferences, including four from the ACC
- "Being invited to the USA Women's National Team tryout is a tremendous honor for Keely. She's put the

work in, keeps improving and is a great ambassador for our softball program," head coach Pete D'Amour said. "I know she'll represent herself and Virginia Tech in the best light possible. We're excited for her."

ALL THE ACCOLADES

- The Hokies have been racking up the preseason recognitions heading into the 2022 season, including the conference-high Preseason All-ACC Team members
- D1 Softball named Keely Rochard the ACC Preseason Pitcher of the Year, as well as a Preseason All-American
- Emma Lemley also earned some preseason honors, receiving ACC Preseason Freshman of the Year and a spot on the Top 75 Impact Freshmen list from D1 Softball
- On the Softball America Preseason Top 100 Players list, Rochard earned the No. 5 spot and Kelsey Bennett came in at the No. 56 spot
- Rochard (No. 8), Bennett (No. 70) and Kelsey Brown (No. 78) were all named to the Extra Inning Softball Extra Elite 100 top players list

- Tech coach Pete D'Amour is 18-13 versus the NFCA/USA Today and USA Softball/ESPN.com Top 25 polls since his arrival to Tech, including four wins this season
- Last season, he was 7-5, winning two series against the two top-25 foes of then-No. 13/14 Florida State and then-No. 12/14 Duke.
- D'Amour's squad also took down No. 2/2 UCLA in game one of the Los Angeles Super Regional, the Hokies highest ranked win in school history

APPROACHING RECORDS

- Kelsey Bennett has been moving her way into the record books at the plate, currently sitting at T-8th in school history in triples with seven and 3rd in home runs with 34
- Bennett only needs one more home run to move up to the second spot and 14 to take over the top spot
- Keely Rochard currently sits at fourth in school history with a career 1.67 ERA. She is also third in strikeouts with 906. Her current .782 winning percentage is at the top in school history
- Rochard is working her way up the list in wins as well, reaching the third spot with 79. She is only Ashlee Dobbe (93) and Angela Tincher (123)
- On the base paths, Kelsey Brown is fifth in school history with 57 career stolen bases. She should move up several spots during the 2022 season



WHERE THEY LEFT OFF

- The Hokies finished the 2021 season at the LA Super Regional, their best finish to a season in recent memory
- Tech advanced to the Super Regional round for the second time in program history, first since 2008, and did so in D'Amour's second full season at the helm in Blacksburg
- Under D'Amour, Tech reached the NCAA Regionals in 2019 before the pandemic canceled the second half of the 2020 season when the Hokies sported a 21-4 record
- Rochard ended her season with 348 strikeouts, the fifth-most in a single season in school history
- "I've been fortunate enough to be around some really good teams in my career and this is the closest I've been to the World Series, certainly as a head coach, since 2011, the last time we got there at Missouri. It's my second year here. Nothing to hang our heads on, we just need to build on it." – Head Coach Pete D'Amour following the 2021 season.

GET THAT DUB

- Tech pitcher Keely Rochard was one of the best in the circle in 2021 and was especially good at getting the win as well.
- The Williamsburg, Virginia native finished third in the country in wins, owning 29 on the year.

BROWN SPOTLESS ON BASES

- Kelsey Brown was a perfect 31 for 31 on stolen bases during the 2021 season and has opened the 2022 season with five stolen bases
- No Hokie had finished a season with as many stolen bases without being thrown out.
- In her two seasons at Virginia Tech, Brown is 49-51 on stolen bases.
- She finished second in the ACC in total stolen bases, with her 31 landing her 11th nationally. She posted .60 stolen bases per game, which ranked her third in the ACC and 30th nationally

ROCHARD VERSUS THE BEST

- Keely Rochard has seen her fair share of ranked foes, with 18 to be exact.
- In those games, the senior is 13-9, defeating four ranked opponents already this season
- In the 2021 Duke series, she held the nationally-ranked and ACC Champion Blue Devils, who averaged the most runs a game (6) in the ACC coming into their series, to just one run in the first game, three in the second game and three in the fourth – all well below their average.
- She also took down No. 2 UCLA in game one of the Los Angeles Super Regional, throwing a three-hitter and allowing just two runs to the 2019 National Champions. Rochard recorded 12 strikeouts in that game, her 15th double-digit strikeout game of the season

The Virginia Tech softball team has the luxury of playing and practicing in some of the finest facilities on the East Coast. Using the Tech Softball Park, Softball Indoor Facility and a state-of-the-art weight room, the Hokies train in terrific facilities designed to help them win championships. Combined with a new locker room and one of the best scoreboard and video boards in the country, the Hokies have it all when it comes to what they need to win.

Tech Softball Park, which was completed in the fall of 1997, has dimensions of 200 feet down the lines and 220 feet to center field. In January of 2008, an additional 746 permanent seats were installed, bringing the capacity up from 336 to 1,024. The new bleachers match the ones that were already in place and now extend down to the end of both dugouts.

Thanks to an anonymous donation, TSP now has seatbacks in the section behind home plate, which was completed in fall 2017.

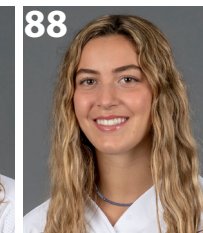
