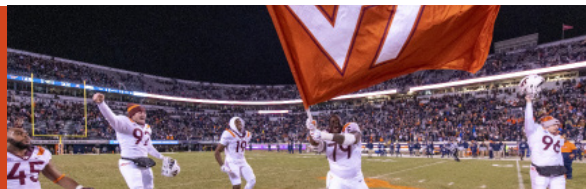

- Pry's football staff includes four individuals who played collegiately for Virginia Tech. In addition to J.C. Price and Pierson Prioleau, who were both selected in the NFL Draft, other former Hokies on staff include: Xavier Adibi (defensive analyst), Jeron Gouveia-Winslow (assistant director of player personnel) and Jarrett Ferguson (strength & conditioning assistant).
- Three of Pry's assistants (Price, Prioleau & Rudolph) own experience as NFL players, while Bowen comes to Tech after coaching TEs in 2021 for the Jacksonville Jaguars.

TECH'S FABULOUS FRESHMEN IN 2021

- Virginia Tech had two players earn spots on The Athletic's Freshman All-America team.
- P Peter Moore was named the first-team punter. Moore finished second in the ACC with a 45.1-yard gross punting avg. His 23 punts of 50+ yards tied for the ACC lead, while his 22 punts inside the 20 tied for second in the conference.
- G Kaden Moore earned second-team Freshman All-America honors from The Athletic. Moore started all 12 games at right guard in 2021, taking 658 snaps and earning an 80% grade. His 58 knockdown blocks ranked second on the squad.
- RB Malachi Thomas ranked third on the squad in rushing in 2021 and is anticipated to be Tech's leading returning rusher in 2022 after posting 93 carries for 440 yards with three TDs
- Thomas posted his first career 100-yard rushing game with a 21-carry, 151-yard, three-TD outburst vs. Syracuse (10/23/21).
- He followed that up with a 25-carry, 103-yard performance in a 26-17 win at Georgia Tech (10/30/21).

DAX & CHAMARRI ARE BACK!

- LB Dax Hollifield will return for a fifth season in 2022. The Shelby, N.C. native led Virginia Tech in total tackles (92), TFL (9.0) and sacks (4.0) in 2021.
- Hollifield has played in 47 games (35 starts), producing 267 total tackles (111 solo), 23.0 TFL, 10.0 sacks, four INTs, eight passes defensed, 14 QB hurries, one fumble recovery and a forced fumble.
- CB Chamarrri Conner ranked third on the squad in 2021 with 86 total tackles (57 solo). He tied for second on the team with 5.5 TFL. Conner has played in 50 games (37 starts) at Virginia Tech.
- Hollifield and Conner both served as team captains in 2021.

SMITH HEADLINES RETURNING WRs

- WR Kaleb Smith is Tech's top returning pass catcher for 2022. He hauled in 20 passes for 260 yards with two TDs in 2021.
- The former walk-on earned a scholarship at Tech and has played in 32 games (20 starts), owning 37 catches for 469 yards with four TDs.

TECH LANDS FOUR MID-YEAR TRANSFERS

- A quartet of veteran transfers have joined Virginia Tech for the spring semester: QBs Jason Brown (South Carolina) and Grant Wells (Marshall), as well as WRs Jadan Blue (Temple) and Stephen Gosnell (North Carolina).
- **Brown (6-2, 229)** joins the Hokies from South Carolina where he helped the Gamecocks reach bowl eligibility in 2021. He went 2-2 as a starter, leading the Gamecocks to wins over Florida and Auburn. He completed 60 of 108 passes (55.6%) for eight TDs with six INTs.
- He was a 2019 FCS All-America selection at St. Francis after leading the Northeast Conference with 3,084 passing yards, completing 251 of 403 passes (62.3%) with 28 TDs and six INTs. Brown prepped at Chancellor High School in Fredericksburg, Virginia.
- Wells (6-2, 205) comes to Blacksburg from Marshall where he served as the starting quarterback for the past two seasons. He concluded his career with the Thundering Herd after completing 460 of 715 passes (64.3%) for 5,623 yards with 34 TDs and 22 INTs. He also ran 115 times for 237 yards with nine scores.
- The Charleston, West Virginia native was named the 2020 Conference USA Freshman of the Year after leading the conference with 2,091 passing yards and 18 TD passes.
- **Blue (6-0, 190)** arrives at Tech following a productive career at Temple where he caught 169 passes for 1,672 yards with 10 touchdowns in 35 games for the Owls. He also rushed 12 times for 44 yards. Blue accumulated five games with 10 or more receptions and posted six 100-yard receiving games, including a career-high 132-yard performance at Maryland (9/14/19).
- He earned second-team All-American Athletic Conference honors following the 2019 season when he hauled in a Temple school-record 95 receptions for 1,067 yards, becoming the first Temple player to ever accumulate a 1,000-yard receiving season.
- **Gosnell (6-2, 210)** joins the Hokies from North Carolina where he played wide receiver the past two seasons. He played appeared in 15 games for the Tar Heels during that span and recorded two receptions for 11 yards.
- He prepped at East Surry High School in Pilot Mountain, North Carolina. He helped East Surry to a 15-0 record and the 1AA state championship as a senior after recording 68 receptions for 1,544 yards with 22 touchdowns.

MORE EXPERIENCED VT RETURNEES

- OL Silas Dzansi (38 Games Played/23 Games Started) will be back in 2022, along with Maryland transfer OL Johnny Jordan (39 GP/19 GS) who played in all 13 games for Tech in 2021.
- A trio of key defensive linemen return for the Hokies in 2022. DE TyJuan Garbutt (41 GP/27 GS) is back along with DTs Norell Pollard (37 GP/24 GS) and Mario Kendricks (32 GP/6 GS).
- Four other returning Tech defenders have appeared in 20+ games for the Hokies: LB Alan Tisdale (35 GP/18 GS), DB Nasir Peoples (28 GP/13 GS), DB Dorian Strong (24 GP/15 GS) and DB Keonta Jenkins (20 GP/3 GS).

TIGHT END TANDEM BACK FOR TECH

- TEs Drake Dellullis and Nick Gallo both return to Blacksburg for 2022.
- That duo combined to catch 19 passes for 206 yards with one TD.

2022 SCHEDULE NOTES

- Head coach Brent Pry's debut as Virginia Tech head coach will come at Old Dominion. Pry's counterpart on the ODU sideline will be another former Penn State assistant, Ricky Rahne, who enters his third season as the Monarchs' head coach.
- Virginia Tech and Wofford will square off for the first time on Sept. 17.
- West Virginia returns to Lane Stadium for the first time since Tech knocked off the No. 6 Mountaineers by a 19-13 margin (10/2/04) as the Hokies seek to regain the Black Diamond Trophy.
- The Hokies will play their first-ever road game at Liberty on Nov. 19. Tech's two previous meetings with the Flames both came at Lane Stadium.
- Tech will play a pair of Thursday night games in 2022, hosting West Virginia (9/22) and visiting NC State (10/27).

THE "TRIANGLE TRIFECTA"

- Three of Tech's four ACC road games in 2022 will take place in "The Triangle" aka Raleigh-Durham-Chapel Hill, N.C. marking the first time the Hokies have played road games at Duke, at North Carolina and at NC State in a single season.
- Tech posted a 2-1 record in 2020 the last time it faced a "Triangle Trifecta," winning 45-24 vs. N.C. State (9/26/20) and 38-31 at Duke (10/3/20), while suffering a 56-45 setback at UNC (10/10/20).
- Tech owns a combined 38-10 all-time record in ACC play against teams from the state of North Carolina: 15-3 vs. Duke, 14-4 vs. UNC, 5-1 vs. NC State and 4-2 vs. Wake Forest.

COACHING HIGHLIGHTS

- Brent Pry was officially named Virginia Tech head coach on November 30, 2021. He joined the Hokies after serving the past eight seasons as defensive coordinator/linebackers coach at Penn State.
- Pry returns to Blacksburg after working as a defensive graduate assistant for the Hokies from 1995-97 under head coach Frank Beamer and defensive coordinator Bud Foster.
- A 30-year coaching veteran, Pry has coached teams that have qualified for 15 bowl appearances and have finished in the FBS top 25 in total defense eight times.
- He has played an instrumental role in coaching top 10 defenses at Virginia Tech, Penn State, Vanderbilt, Georgia Southern, and Western Carolina.
- Since his promotion to defensive coordinator in 2016, the Nittany Lions have posted three seasons with 11 wins and four seasons with nine or more victories. He helped the Nittany Lions to the 2016 Big Ten Championship after defeating No. 6 Wisconsin in that conference's championship game.
- His longtime association with current Penn State head coach James Franklin dates back to 1993-94 when Franklin was the quarterback for East Stroudsburg University, where Pry coached outside linebackers and defensive backs.
- Pry was a 2021 Broyles Award nominee for the top assistant coach in the country as the Nittany Lions ranked fourth nationally in Red Zone defense (66.7%), seventh in scoring defense (16.8 ppg), eighth in defensive pass efficiency (111.98), and held their opponents to 4.7 yards per play.
- Under Pry's direction in 2020, Penn State ranked third in the Big Ten in total defense (328.8 ypg), good for 17th nationally, second in pass defense (198.6 ypg), second in TFL (6.7 per game) and fourth in rush defense (130.2 ypg).
- Pry's defense helped lead Penn State to an 11-2 record in 2019, ranking eighth nationally in scoring defense (16.0 ppg). The Nittany Lions also led the nation in fewest yards per carry (2.6) and forced fumbles (22), while ranking fifth in rushing defense (95.0 ypg) in 2019.
- The Penn State defense led the nation in sacks per game (3.62) and ranked fourth in tackles for loss (8.2) in 2018. His

- 2018 squad also ranked fifth in the county in yards per pass attempt (5.67), eighth in defensive pass efficiency (106.1) and 11th in Red Zone scoring percentage (.750).
- Penn State also registered an 11-2 record in 2017 with Pry earning his first Broyles Award nomination. The Nittany Lions finished seventh in FBS in both scoring defense (16.5 ppg) and sacks per game (3.23) during the 2017 campaign.
- After taking sole reins as Penn State's defensive coordinator post in 2016, the team posted an 11-3 mark and finished seventh in the nation, averaging 8.1 TFL per game.
- As co-defensive coordinator for Penn State in 2014, Pry helped direct a unit that finished second in FBS in total defense (278.7 ypg).
- Pry served as co-defensive coordinator at Vanderbilt from 2011-13 prior to his arrival in State College, Pennsylvania.
- While at Georgia Southern in 2010, his defensive unit helped the Eagles to a win over No. 1 Appalachian State and an appearance in the NCAA FCS semifinals.
- A member of the Memphis staff from 2007-09, Pry's defensive line corps helped the Tigers to back-to-back bowl appearances.
- He also coached at Louisiana-Lafayette (2002-06), helping the Ragin' Cajuns to their first Sun Belt Conference championship following a four-year tour of duty at Western Carolina (1998-01).
- During his stint as a graduate assistant at Tech from 1995-97, he was part of a staff that guided the Hokies to three bowl berths.
- Pry lettered as a defensive back at the University of Buffalo before suffering a career-ending injury. He began his coaching career as an undergraduate student in 1992. He graduated with a degree in history from Buffalo in 1993.
- Pry's father, Jim, played collegiately at Marshall and began his own 40-year college coaching career at his alma mater in 1973-74. The elder Pry went on to enjoy a distinguished career that included stints at Illinois, Duke, Dartmouth, Akron, East Stroudsburg University, Buffalo, VMI, and Bethune-Cookman, as well as time as a high school head coach.
- Pry and his wife, Amy, are the parents of a son, Colby and two daughters: Madeline and Catherine.
