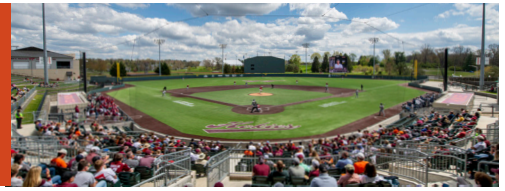

KEY STORYLINES

RIDING THE WAVES

• Virginia Tech doubled down on its No. 8 ranking last week, turning in a 5-0 record against VMI, Radford and Boston College (three-game sweep) to eclipse 28 victories for the first time since the 2013 campaign.

• Tech's five-game winning streak was paired with slight adversity as the Hokies came from behind to win three contests, erasing a five-run deficit against the Keydets at English Field.

• Despite sweeping the Eagles during ACC play, Tech witnessed one of its quieter offensive performances, yielding three-game series lows in runs scored (14), hits (22) and home runs (three).

• Although scoring dipped, the Hokies emerged as a team capable of winning close ballgames.

• Prior to its series at BC, Tech had been 1-8 this season when scoring six runs or fewer – a trend the Hokies overcame during each of their victories against the Eagles.

• After combining to use 13 arms during its midweek wins against VMI and Radford, Tech received two quality starts from right-handers Griffin Green and Drue Hackenberg that helped the Hokies burn only six pitchers against BC.

• Fifth-year righty Ryan Metz is projected to lead Tech's well-rested pitching staff into Wednesday's action against James Madison.

• Metz has thrown three-plus innings during each of his last three midweek appearances, toying a 1.93 ERA during those outings while recording nine strikeouts against one walk.

• Overall, Metz's 2.30 season ERA stands as the second lowest on the Hokies' staff among pitchers who have

thrown 15 or more innings this season.

NEW BALLCLUB

• Since meeting six weeks ago in Harrisonburg – the program's first series meeting since 2014 – Virginia Tech is a different baseball club.

• On Monday, the Hokies broke their program record for highest all-time *DJBaseball* poll placement (set a week ago), ascending to No. 7.

• Tech is considered a top-10 team in five of the six leading college baseball polls, peaking at No. 5 in this week's reveal of *Perfect Game's* top 25 rankings.

• Upon visiting the Dukes in March, the Hokies were three games into what became a five-game losing streak, burdened by their 14-inning loss at then-No. 13 Georgia Tech that had concluded their nine-hour doubleheader in Atlanta.

• Tech offered JMU little resistance, settling for two runs

on six hits – season lows that were revisited on April 22 at Boston College.

- Though the Hokies went on to outwit the Dukes, 6-4, Tech's staff conceded 12 free bases to JMU, accounting for seven walks, three hit batsmen and two wild pitches.

- Shaking off its 5-2 defeat that night to James Madison, Virginia Tech has since posted an 18-4 record, flexing an offense that continues to rank top-five nationally in batting average (.320), slugging percentage (.595), doubles (100) and home runs (80).

- The Hokies have also climbed inside the top 50 NCAA Division I pitching staffs in ERA (4.18) – the fifth best mark in among ACC programs – while placing 10th in fielding percentage (.981).

HAMMERIN' DUO

- Pulling into Wednesday's midweek contest with 80 home runs, Virginia Tech is four home runs away from tying the program's ACC-era record, as set during the 2017 season (84).

- The Hokies' 80 home runs are tied with Georgia Tech for the third most hit by an NCAA Division I program this spring, trailing the pace of No. 1 Tennessee (93) and Old Dominion (88).

- Shortstop Tanner Schobel and catcher Cade Hunter co-lead Tech with 13 home runs apiece while pacing the squad with 53 and 51 RBIs, respectively.

- On Tuesday, Hunter and Schobel were both named to *D1Baseball's* list of the top six Draft Risers for the 2022 MLB Draft.

Tech trails series, 33-26 (Last 10: Tech leads, 6-4)

- After their 0-4 start to league play, the Hokies have since won six consecutive ACC series with their 12-3 conference mark, chalking 18 victories during their last 21 games overall.

- Tech's No. 7 ranking marks the program's highest *D1Baseball* poll placement all-time, coming in four positions behind the current ACC leader, No. 3 Miami.

- Two weeks ago in Blacksburg, the Hokies' lineup shelled the division-leading Hurricanes for 25 runs while taking the opening two games of the teams' three-game series in Blacksburg. Tech averaged 14.0 hits per nine innings against Miami, rallying for three-plus runs on five occasions.

- The Hokies' recent swell of ACC success can also be attributed to starting right-handers Griffin Green and Drue Hackenberg.

- Since March 18, Tech is 10-1 when playing behind Green and Hackenberg – Green has toed a 4-0 record with a 3.18 ERA, 30 strikeouts and 11 walks during the stretch while Hackenberg has boasted a 5-0 record with a 2.19 ERA, 34 strikeouts and seven walks.

HOME RUN STRETCHES

- **Eduardo Malinowski:** Seven home runs across first 10 games at Tech between Feb. 18 (Opening Day) and March 6.

- **Gavin Cross:** Six home runs across nine-game stretch between April 1 and April 12, featuring five home runs hit against No. 18 North Carolina and No. 21 NC State.

- **Tanner Schobel:** Seven home runs across eight-game stretch leading into Boston College series.

POSTSEASON RESUME

- As of April 26, Virginia Tech ranks No. 23 in the NCAA Division I Baseball RPI. The Hokies are 10-7 against top-50 RPI programs, including a 3-1 mark against the top 25 spots (results against Notre Dame and Miami).

- Tech is 7-6 against opponents ranked in *D1Baseball's* top 25.

Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock announced the hiring of Tech's 25th head baseball coach on June 9, 2017 and formally introduced John Szeffc as the head coach of the baseball program at a press conference a few days later on June 15. The 2021 season will mark his fourth as the Hokies' head coach.

In his first three seasons, Szeffc (pronounced SHEFF) has coached the Hokies to a pair of seven-game winning streaks - one that opened the 2019 season and the second was in 2020, after the team started 1-3. Also in 2020, the team won 10 games in nonconference action, which included ending the shortened season on a nine-game winning streak, the longest since the team won 18 straight nonconference games in a row back in 2012.

The team also posted an 8-0 home record, the best start at the school since 2012, which helped the Hokies extend their home winning streak in the month of February to 15 straight victories. Added to the final win of 2019, Tech has won nine straight at home, the longest since an 11-game streak from April 28, 2015 through March 4, 2016, and will enter the 2021 season tied for the 12th longest home-win streak in the NCAA.

After the shortened 2020 season, three players earned All-America distinction from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper as it recognized both pitcher Ian Seymour and catcher Carson Taylor as Third Team selections, marking the first time Tech had multiple All-Americans since 2003. Outfielder Gavin Cross was later named to the All-American Freshman Team, just the seventh ever at the school. Also, despite just a five-round MLB Draft in 2020, the draft marked the first time in school history, two Tech players are chosen in the top four rounds as Seymour (2nd) and Taylor (4th) were selected.

Szeffc, who won his 400th career game on March 10, 2018 guiding the Hokies to a 3-1 victory over Pittsburgh, accepted the head coaching position at Tech after leading Maryland to three NCAA appearances and a 180-122 (.596) overall record as the Terrapins' head coach. Before arriving in Blacksburg, Szeffc owned a 392-259-3 (.602) career record in 12 seasons as an NCAA head coach, producing 10 campaigns with 30 or more wins.

In addition to ending a 43-year NCAA tournament drought and becoming the fastest coach to 100 career wins at Maryland, Szeffc spent seven seasons (1996-2002) at the helm of the Marist College baseball program, where he led the team to four conference championships, four NCAA Regional appearances and a 212-137-3 (.607) overall mark. Szeffc earned Northeastern Conference Coach of the Year honors in 1997 and was the American Baseball Coaches

Associate Northeast Region Coach of the Year in 2001.

The first coach in Maryland history to ever take the Terrapins to an NCAA Super Regional, Szeffc accomplished the feat twice in 2014 and 2015 as he guided the program to the first two 40-win seasons in school history and claimed Maryland's first two NCAA Regional crowns. Maryland achieved a final No. 14 ranking both seasons, the highest finishes in school history.

He guided the Terrapins to the ACC Tournament final for the first time in 38 years in 2014 and then took Maryland to the Big Ten tournament final in the school's initial season in that conference, winning a program-best 42 games in 2015.

Szeffc has coached 109 players that have been drafted or signed professional contracts since 1997, including four in 2018 and five in 2019. Over the last eight drafts, 36 of his players have been selected, including the 45th pick of the 2014 draft Jake Stinnett, the highest pick of a Maryland player in almost a decade. Almost a dozen have gone on to play in the Major Leagues, including most recently, Mike Shawaryn (Red Sox) and Lamonte Wade (Twins) in 2019. He has also helped develop 26 All-Americans, including 10 of the 20 players in Maryland history to earn that distinction.

The Middletown, N.Y. native arrived at Maryland after a two-year stint as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator at Kansas State (2011-12) and a two-season stay as assistant head coach and recruiting coordinator at Kansas (2009-10). He also enjoyed a six-season tenure as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Louisiana-Lafayette (2003-08). Szeffc began his coaching career as an assistant at Sacred Heart (1995) and at Drexel (1990-93).

Szeffc managed the New York Generals in the Atlantic College Baseball League during the summers of 1995 and 1996. He led the club to a 47-28 record, earned two consecutive division titles and the ACBL title game in 1996.

Collegiately, he played two years at Connecticut before transferring in 1987 to Drexel. During his senior campaign for the Dragons, he was tabbed an All-East Coast Conference outfielder.

He graduated from Drexel University with a degree in corporate communications in 1989. He also holds a master's degree in sports administration from Temple University.

Szeffc and his wife, Barbara, have a daughter, Anna, and two sons, John Michael and Sam.
