KEY STORYLINES

HOKIES AT A GLANCE

- Virginia Tech climbed in each of the six leading college baseball polls on Monday, setting a new program record with its No. 3 ranking per *DIBaseball* while peaking at No. 2 in Perfect Game's top 25.
- Coming off a top-10 series victory against then-No. 7 Louisville – Tech's program record, eighth consecutive ACC series win – the Hokies stayed rooted inside *DIBaseball*'s top 10 for the fifth consecutive week as they continue to pad their postseason resume.
- Tech is steadily honing in the opportunity of hosting an NCAA Regional for the first time since 2013 and has its sights set even higher on claiming a top-eight national seed in the NCAA tournament for the first time during its program history.
- Entering the final week of the regular season, Tech ranks No. 5 in the NCAA Division I Baseball

RPI, having compiled 36 victories with a top-45 strength of schedule, including a 19-9 mark against the RPI top 100.

- The Hokies pull into Tuesday's tilt against Kansas State having won 26 of their last 31 regular season games, including 10 consecutive non-conference victories.
- Tech's 2022 club is also the program's winningest at English Field during its ACC era, flexing a 25-5 record in Blacksburg.

A GLIMPSE OF SIVERLING

- Tuesday has the potential to mark third-year sophomore Matthew Siverling's debut on the mound for Virginia Tech.
- Recovering from thoracic outlet syndrome, Siverling was a key contributor in Tech's 2021 bullpen, tying for the team lead in appearances (22) while toeing the second most innings (29.1) among the Hokies' relievers who did not make a start.

- Tech's southpaw came up electric during the Hokies' February 2021 series at No. 6 Miami, where he backed Peyton Alford with six strikeouts across four relief innings, holding the Hurricanes to a lone hit.
- Siverling went on to match his season high, six strikeouts again during Tech's March sweep at No. 15 Pitt, finishing his second year in Blacksburg with a 4-1 record on the mound.

- During his recovery, Siverling was named the male recipient of the 2022 Skelton Award for Academic Excellence in Athletics, having earned Dean's List and Athletic Director's Honor Roll praise during every semester for which he has been enrolled at Virginia Tech.

BLACKSBURG HOMECOMING

- Besides signifying the third all-time meeting between Virginia Tech and Kansas State, Tuesday's game will mark the return of former Tech head coach Pete Hughes to Blacksburg.

- Hughes – who has won 748 games across his 25 head coaching seasons – led the Hokies for seven seasons between 2007 and 2013 and was at the helm when the program made its two most recent trips to the NCAA tournament (2010, 2013).

- In the present hands of fifth-year head coach John Szefc, Virginia Tech's 2022 squad is pursuing – and in some ways, has already surpassed – many of the accomplishments set by Hughes' 2013 club.

- Entering Tuesday, the Hokies' 36 wins this season are the most the program has earned since 2013 when Tech finished 40-22.

- As a team, the 2022 Hokies are slugging more than 100 points higher than the 2013 squad (.557 to .440), having already mashed 33 more home runs than their 2013 counterparts.

- On the mound, Tech's 2022 staff holds the comparative edge in ERA (4.09), strikeouts (445) and opposing batting average (.256) – all with a week remaining in the regular season.

- The 2022 Hokies are also actively chasing their best ACC regular season finish since Hughes' 2013 team placed sixth in the year-end standings.

INSIDE THE ACC RACE

- With one week remaining in the regular season, Virginia Tech (16-9 ACC) sits in sole possession of second place in the ACC Coastal Division.

- Tech can clinch the ACC Coastal Division (and potentially be in line for an overall ACC regular season title) if it outperforms Miami in results this weekend without surrendering ground to Notre Dame.

- Since joining the ACC, the Hokies' best Coastal Division finishes are third-place results in 2013 and 2015 while their best conference-wide regular season finishes are sixth-place results in 2010 and 2013.

- Virginia Tech's 2022 berth in the ACC Baseball Championship marks the program's sixth all-time and its first during consecutive seasons.

PARTY LIKE ITS 2013

- Virginia Tech's 2013 team (as coached by current Kansas State head coach Pete Hughes) and its 2022 team have shared interesting parallels:

- Both teams started the season with 10-1 records.

- Both teams lost their first ACC series against a top-20 Georgia Tech program (the 2022 Hokies have won eight consecutive ACC series since dropping their set to the Yellow Jackets).

- Both teams won multiple top-10 series - in 2013, Tech defeated No. 4 Florida State and No. 5 Virginia (as ranked per ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll). In 2022, the Hokies defeated No. 2 Miami and No. 7 Louisville (as ranked per *D1Baseball*).

- Both teams eclipsed 35 regular season victories (only three Tech teams have done so during its ACC era: 2010, 2013, 2022).

Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock announced the hiring of Tech's 25th head baseball coach on June 9, 2017 and formally introduced John Szeffc as the head coach of the baseball program at a press conference a few days later on June 15. The 2021 season will mark his fourth as the Hokies' head coach.

In his first three seasons, Szeffc (pronounced SHEFF) has coached the Hokies to a pair of seven-game winning streaks - one that opened the 2019 season and the second was in 2020, after the team started 1-3. Also in 2020, the team won 10 games in nonconference action, which included ending the shortened season on a nine-game winning streak, the longest since the team won 18 straight nonconference games in a row back in 2012.

The team also posted an 8-0 home record, the best start at the school since 2012, which helped the Hokies extend their home winning streak in the month of February to 15 straight victories. Added to the final win of 2019, Tech has won nine straight at home, the longest since an 11-game streak from April 28, 2015 through March 4, 2016, and will enter the 2021 season tied for the 12th longest home-win streak in the NCAA.

After the shortened 2020 season, three players earned All-America distinction from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper as it recognized both pitcher Ian Seymour and catcher Carson Taylor as Third Team selections, marking the first time Tech had multiple All-Americans since 2003. Outfielder Gavin Cross was later named to the All-American Freshman Team, just the seventh ever at the school. Also, despite just a five-round MLB Draft in 2020, the draft marked the first time in school history, two Tech players are chosen in the top four rounds as Seymour (2nd) and Taylor (4th) were selected.

Szeffc, who won his 400th career game on March 10, 2018 guiding the Hokies to a 3-1 victory over Pittsburgh, accepted the head coaching position at Tech after leading Maryland to three NCAA appearances and a 180-122 (.596) overall record as the Terrapins' head coach. Before arriving in Blacksburg, Szeffc owned a 392-259-3 (.602) career record in 12 seasons as an NCAA head coach, producing 10 campaigns with 30 or more wins.

In addition to ending a 43-year NCAA tournament drought and becoming the fastest coach to 100 career wins at Maryland, Szeffc spent seven seasons (1996-2002) at the helm of the Marist College baseball program, where he led the team to four conference championships, four NCAA Regional appearances and a 212-137-3 (.607) overall mark. Szeffc earned Northeastern Conference Coach of the Year honors in 1997 and was the American Baseball Coaches

Associate Northeast Region Coach of the Year in 2001.

The first coach in Maryland history to ever take the Terrapins to an NCAA Super Regional, Szeffc accomplished the feat twice in 2014 and 2015 as he guided the program to the first two 40-win seasons in school history and claimed Maryland's first two NCAA Regional crowns. Maryland achieved a final No. 14 ranking both seasons, the highest finishes in school history.

He guided the Terrapins to the ACC Tournament final for the first time in 38 years in 2014 and then took Maryland to the Big Ten tournament final in the school's initial season in that conference, winning a program-best 42 games in 2015.

Szeffc has coached 109 players that have been drafted or signed professional contracts since 1997, including four in 2018 and five in 2019. Over the last eight drafts, 36 of his players have been selected, including the 45th pick of the 2014 draft Jake Stinnett, the highest pick of a Maryland player in almost a decade. Almost a dozen have gone on to play in the Major Leagues, including most recently, Mike Shawaryn (Red Sox) and Lamonte Wade (Twins) in 2019. He has also helped develop 26 All-Americans, including 10 of the 20 players in Maryland history to earn that distinction.

The Middletown, N.Y. native arrived at Maryland after a two-year stint as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator at Kansas State (2011-12) and a two-season stay as assistant head coach and recruiting coordinator at Kansas (2009-10). He also enjoyed a six-season tenure as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Louisiana-Lafayette (2003-08). Szeffc began his coaching career as an assistant at Sacred Heart (1995) and at Drexel (1990-93).

Szeffc managed the New York Generals in the Atlantic College Baseball League during the summers of 1995 and 1996. He led the club to a 47-28 record, earned two consecutive division titles and the ACBL title game in 1996.

Collegiately, he played two years at Connecticut before transferring in 1987 to Drexel. During his senior campaign for the Dragons, he was tabbed an All-East Coast Conference outfielder.

He graduated from Drexel University with a degree in corporate communications in 1989. He also holds a master's degree in sports administration from Temple University.

Szeffc and his wife, Barbara, have a daughter, Anna, and two sons, John Michael and Sam.
