KEY STORYLINES

INSIDE THE ACC RACE

- Virginia Tech pulls into its final regular season series on the verge of history, still in contention to win the program's first ACC Coastal Division title.
- Entering Thursday, the second-place Hokies (16-9) trail first-place Miami (18-9 ACC) by one game, needing to outperform the Hurricanes by one result this weekend to clinch the division crown (assuming all games are played to completion).
- Tech is in an interesting predicament as the respective ACC Atlantic and Coastal Division leaders - No. 14 Notre Dame and No. 9 Miami - will meet this weekend for their season-closing series in Coral Gables.
- Should the Hokies win at least two games against Duke, Tech would need assistance yet be in prime position to win the

outright ACC regular season championship - a feat the program has yet to accomplish within the league.

WINNER, WINNER

- Winner of a program record, eight consecutive ACC series, Virginia Tech is eager to etch the final chapter of its unprecedented regular season success.
- The Hokies head into their series against Duke already lying 37 regular season victories - the most the program has achieved during its ACC tenure - needing one win against the Blue Devils to set a new program record for ACC regular season victories.
- Overall, Tech has won 27 of its last 32 games, vaulting to No. 5 in the NCAA Division I RPI with its 17-9 record against the RPI top 100.

HAMMER TIME

- Virginia Tech has mashed 91 home runs this season as the 2022 Hokies seek to become the program's fifth team to eclipse triple digits in homers since 1960.
- Tech is equipped with six double-digit home run hitters, led by team co-leaders Tanner Schobel (14) and Cade Hunter (14).
- Schobel is coming off a 2-for-4 night during Tuesday's 8-2 victory against Kansas State, during which he recorded his 17th multi-RBI game of the season, elevating his season total to 63.
- Gavin Cross enters this week's series against Duke having powered four home runs during his last eight games, having racked up 10 of his 13 home runs against ACC competition.
- Among the Hokies' other double-digit home run hitters,

CLINCHING SCENARIO

• Virginia Tech can clinch the ACC Coastal Division and the outright ACC regular season title should it collect three victories this week against Duke in addition to having Miami drop one of its three games against Notre Dame.

• Scenarios exist where Tech can still clinch the outright ACC regular season title with two victories and a loss while receiving help from Louisville, Miami and Notre Dame.

• The 2022 Hokies are poised to set the program record for best ACC regular finish - both leaguewide and within the division. Tech's best leaguewide finish is sixth place (2010, 2013) and its best divisional finish is third place (2013, 2015).

ACC PITCHER OF THE WEEK

• Fifth-year graduate student Jordan Geber was named the ACC Pitcher of the Week on Monday.

• Geber made two shorts during one of Tech's most difficult weeks against two 30-win programs, Liberty and then-No. 7 Louisville.

• Against the Flames, Geber was perfect, retiring nine-of-nine batters faced. Four days later, he kept the Cardinals to one hit across four innings of work, registering five strikeouts.

• Considering both outings, Geber combined to throw seven shutout innings while allowing one hit and one walk, striking out nine batters.

SWIPER, NO SWIPING

• Virginia Tech enters its series against Duke with 66 stolen bases - the second most among ACC programs.

• The Hokies' 66 steals are the most the program has achieved since the 2010 season (68) and continue to trail its ACC-era record, set during 2007 (82).

Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock announced the hiring of Tech's 25th head baseball coach on June 9, 2017 and formally introduced John Szeffc as the head coach of the baseball program at a press conference a few days later on June 15. The 2021 season will mark his fourth as the Hokies' head coach.

In his first three seasons, Szeffc (pronounced SHEFF) has coached the Hokies to a pair of seven-game winning streaks - one that opened the 2019 season and the second was in 2020, after the team started 1-3. Also in 2020, the team won 10 games in nonconference action, which included ending the shortened season on a nine-game winning streak, the longest since the team won 18 straight nonconference games in a row back in 2012.

The team also posted an 8-0 home record, the best start at the school since 2012, which helped the Hokies extend their home winning streak in the month of February to 15 straight victories. Added to the final win of 2019, Tech has won nine straight at home, the longest since an 11-game streak from April 28, 2015 through March 4, 2016, and will enter the 2021 season tied for the 12th longest home-win streak in the NCAA.

After the shortened 2020 season, three players earned All-America distinction from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper as it recognized both pitcher Ian Seymour and catcher Carson Taylor as Third Team selections, marking the first time Tech had multiple All-Americans since 2003. Outfielder Gavin Cross was later named to the All-American Freshman Team, just the seventh ever at the school. Also, despite just a five-round MLB Draft in 2020, the draft marked the first time in school history, two Tech players are chosen in the top four rounds as Seymour (2nd) and Taylor (4th) were selected.

Szeffc, who won his 400th career game on March 10, 2018 guiding the Hokies to a 3-1 victory over Pittsburgh, accepted the head coaching position at Tech after leading Maryland to three NCAA appearances and a 180-122 (.596) overall record as the Terrapins' head coach. Before arriving in Blacksburg, Szeffc owned a 392-259-3 (.602) career record in 12 seasons as an NCAA head coach, producing 10 campaigns with 30 or more wins.

In addition to ending a 43-year NCAA tournament drought and becoming the fastest coach to 100 career wins at Maryland, Szeffc spent seven seasons (1996-2002) at the helm of the Marist College baseball program, where he led the team to four conference championships, four NCAA Regional appearances and a 212-137-3 (.607) overall mark. Szeffc earned Northeastern Conference Coach of the Year honors in 1997 and was the American Baseball Coaches

Associate Northeast Region Coach of the Year in 2001.

The first coach in Maryland history to ever take the Terrapins to an NCAA Super Regional, Szeffc accomplished the feat twice in 2014 and 2015 as he guided the program to the first two 40-win seasons in school history and claimed Maryland's first two NCAA Regional crowns. Maryland achieved a final No. 14 ranking both seasons, the highest finishes in school history.

He guided the Terrapins to the ACC Tournament final for the first time in 38 years in 2014 and then took Maryland to the Big Ten tournament final in the school's initial season in that conference, winning a program-best 42 games in 2015.

Szeffc has coached 109 players that have been drafted or signed professional contracts since 1997, including four in 2018 and five in 2019. Over the last eight drafts, 36 of his players have been selected, including the 45th pick of the 2014 draft Jake Stinnett, the highest pick of a Maryland player in almost a decade. Almost a dozen have gone on to play in the Major Leagues, including most recently, Mike Shawaryn (Red Sox) and Lamonte Wade (Twins) in 2019. He has also helped develop 26 All-Americans, including 10 of the 20 players in Maryland history to earn that distinction.

The Middletown, N.Y. native arrived at Maryland after a two-year stint as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator at Kansas State (2011-12) and a two-season stay as assistant head coach and recruiting coordinator at Kansas (2009-10). He also enjoyed a six-season tenure as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Louisiana-Lafayette (2003-08). Szeffc began his coaching career as an assistant at Sacred Heart (1995) and at Drexel (1990-93).

Szeffc managed the New York Generals in the Atlantic College Baseball League during the summers of 1995 and 1996. He led the club to a 47-28 record, earned two consecutive division titles and the ACBL title game in 1996.

Collegiately, he played two years at Connecticut before transferring in 1987 to Drexel. During his senior campaign for the Dragons, he was tabbed an All-East Coast Conference outfielder.

He graduated from Drexel University with a degree in corporate communications in 1989. He also holds a master's degree in sports administration from Temple University.

Szeffc and his wife, Barbara, have a daughter, Anna, and two sons, John Michael and Sam.
