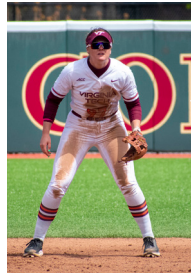


#### PLAYERS TO WATCH

#### LAST TIME OUT

• The Hokies finished out the ACC regular season with a 21-2 record with a sweep of Boston College, the highest conference winning percentage in school history. Tech also clinched the ACC Regular Season Title with the 9-0 run-rule of BC on Saturday.  
• Keely Rochard went 2-0 on the weekend, striking out 27 Eagles in her 13.0 innings pitched. Emma Lemley received the win in game three, throwing a three-hit shutout over 6.0 innings of work.  
• Morgan Overaitis and Emma Ritter led the Hokies offensively, both hitting over .500 on the weekend. Ritter posted a triple and a home run with four RBI. Overaitis also added a home run and three RBI.

**GREENSBORO, N.C.** – Florida State has been voted the preseason favorite to win the 2022 ACC softball title by the league's 13 head coaches.

The Seminoles, who advanced to their 11th NCAA Women's College World Series last season and played for the national championship, received eight first-place votes and tallied 137 points.

Clemson collected two first-place votes and 128 points to finish second in the voting, while Virginia Tech earned 126 points with two first-place votes to occupy third. Duke was fourth with 119 points and the remaining first-place vote, while Notre Dame rounded out the top five with 99 points.

Virginia Tech leads the league with four representatives on the Preseason All-ACC team, while Clemson, Duke, Florida State and Georgia Tech each have two selections.

### REGULAR SEASON CHAMPS

• The Hokies clinched their second ACC Regular Season Championship on Saturday, run-ruling Boston College 9-0 to officially clinch the championship.

• Tech last won the regular season in 2019, finishing 20-4 in the Coastal Division. The Hokies clinched the 2019 championship at Boston College as well with a sweep of the Eagles.

• The 21-2 record in ACC play is the highest winning percentage in conference play in school history.

### LEMLEY SHUTOUTS

• Emma Lemley recorded her sixth shutout of the season against Boston College in the game two win on Saturday.

• She struck out 7 Eagles and allowed just three hits in her six innings of work

• Her other five shutouts were against Miami OH (5 inn.), No. 14 Clemson, Longwood (no-hitter),

### TOP-25 FINALIST

• Keely Rochard was named a top-25 finalist for 2022 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year, released last week. This is Rochard's second straight season receiving the honor

• Emma Lemley was also named a top-25 finalist for Schutt Sports/NFCA Division I National Freshman of the Year, marking the second straight season with a Hokie on the list. (Cameron Fagan named a 2021 finalist)

### A SENIOR WEEKEND

• The Hokies celebrated six seniors the previous weekend at home against Louisville, including Keely Rochard, Mackenzie Lawter, Darby Trull, Ally Repko, Alexa Milius and Kayleigh Addington

• At the plate, Repko, Lawter and Trull all made an impact. Trull was the Hokies top hitter over the series with a .500 average on the weekend. Lawter added a double and a home run to tie up game three and Repko had two clutch pinch-hit RBI doubles and games one and three to clinch the wins

• Rochard got it done in the circle, going 2-0 with 19 total strikeouts against the Cardinals in her 13.0 innings pitched.

### LAWTER WALK-OFF

• Senior catcher Mackenzie Lawter had her second walk-off hit of the season against UVA, hitting a single up the middle to score Maddy Federico in the eighth inning to clinch the series

• This is Lawter's second walk-off this season, with the first being a walk-off hit against Ohio State on Feb. 25 to lead the Hokies to a 1-0 win over the Buckeyes in nine innings

### 1KEELY

• Senior Keely Rochard recorded her 1,000th career strikeout last in the No. 2/3 Hokies 8-1 win over Liberty.

• She becomes the second player in school history to achieve the milestone. Rochard came on in the sixth to relieve starter Emma Lemley.

• She struck out three, allowing one hit in her 2.0 innings pitched. She also received her fourth save of the season.

### 4-FOR-FAGAN

• Cameron Fagan went 4-for-4 at Liberty, including a home run, her third of the season.

• She finished her day with an RBI and scored two runs to help lead the Hokies to the 8-1 win.

• This is Fagan's second game going 4-for-4 this season, with the first being Michigan State on Feb. 12.

### SLAW STATS

• Meredith Slaw had an outstanding weekend in Tallahassee for the Hokies as the DP, going 7-for-10 against No. 2/3 Florida State.

• In game one, she hit two home runs, the first of which was a two-run shot that tied the game at 2-2 and the second took the lead at 3-2.

• In game two, Slaw also hit a home run and a double to add to the Hokies record-setting 23 runs scored against the Seminoles.

• Slaw finished her weekend with a single in game three. Over her three games played, the junior posted 7 RBI with a 1.700 slugging %. She also scored three runs over the weekend.

### CLUTCH GENE

• The Hokies battled from behind in games one and three of the Florida State series with some help from clutch hitting. Darby Trull came through big in both games, hitting a three-run home run in the top of the ninth in game one to clinch the victory for Hokies.

• In game three, Trull doubled in the top of the fourth with two outs to tie the game up at 2-2.

• Addy Greene also came up huge for Tech, hitting an inside the park grand slam in the sixth of game three to put the Hokies up 6-3.

- In the game one win, Rochard struck out 14 and allowed just one earned run on five hits against the Seminoles.
- She came on in relief in game two, receiving the win and striking out five, allowing just two hits in her 4.0 innings of work.

**PITCHER OF THE WEEK (x2)**

- Keely Rochard was named Pitcher of the Week on April 5 after striking out 14 batters en route to her first no-hitter of the season against UCF. She had a perfect game through 5.1 innings before allowing the only baserunner of the game for the Knights with a one-out walk in the sixth inning.
- The Williamsburg, Virginia, native struck out the side in the fourth and recorded at least two strikeouts in every inning but the first
- For the second time in her Hokie career, freshman Emma Lemley was named ACC Pitcher of the Week on March 29. Lemley earned Co-Pitcher of the Week after going 2-0 on the week, including the first no-hitter of her career against Longwood.
- The right-hander got the start in game one against Longwood, going the distance and striking out 13 along the way to her first career no-hitter. She walked only two batters in the 5-0 Hokie win.

**HISTORIC NO-NOS**

- The back-to-back no-hitters against Longwood were the first ever time the Hokies' no-hit both games of a doubleheader since the program's inception in 1995.
- Tech pitchers had not tossed no-hitters in consecutive games in over 20 years, dating all the way back to May 7 and May 11, 2000 in shutouts vs. St. Bonaventure and Dayton.
- Rosenberry and Lemley, who both threw their first career no-hitters, now join a group of 11 other pitchers in Hokies history that have thrown no-hitters, including teammate Keely Rochard.
- With Rochard's no-hitter against UCF, that marked the third no-hitter in five games for the Hokies, all by different pitchers

**HOT BATS**

- From March 20 - March 26, the Hokies were hitting .371 as a team, compared to .122 from opponents.
- During the 5-0 stretch, Tech had seven home runs, two triples and 10 doubles, posting 41 RBI.
- Emma Ritter and Cameron Fagan were solid at the plate, both hitting over .400
- Ritter put up seven RBI in 15 at bats, hitting two home runs
- Fagan posted a triple and a double over 13 at bats, chipping in two RBI.

**OFFENSE ROLLING**

- Virginia Tech racked up 68 runs on 90 hits in its first three ACC series. Of those 90 hits, 26 were multi-base hits, including 12 home runs.
- Jayme Bailey, Kelsey Brown and Emma Ritter have all connected on grand slams while Bre Peck recorded a multi-home run game in the Hokies' 6-1 win over Syracuse on March 13.
- Tech has seen 13 different players record at least one hit in the team's first three conference series.

**STINGY PITCHING**

- The Hokies' pitchers only gave up 11 earned runs over the team's first three ACC series, including two shutouts.
- Outside of allowing five runs in the second game of its series against North Carolina, Tech has allowed no more than one earned run in its other eight league games.
- Rochard, Lemley and Rosenberry have also combined for 25 1-2-3 innings in that span.

**BEST ACC START**

- Tech's 13-0 start in conference games is the league's best start since Florida State began league play 10-0 back in 2018.
- The Hokies' 13 straight ACC wins tied the 13 consecutive league contests the team won during a stretch of the 2014 season.
- Tech hasn't started undefeated through 13 games in conference play since joining the ACC

**DEBUT IN BLACKSBURG**

- The Hokies hit .448 over four games to open the home slate in Blacksburg, including 12 home runs over the four wins
- Tech put up a .905 slugging percentage with nine extra base hits plus the 12 home runs
- Opponents only hit .145 against Hokie pitchers with five extra base hits
- Bre Peck led the team with a .636 batting average with two home runs, two doubles and a 1.364 slugging percentage
- Mackenzie Lawter also hit two home runs over the week, now tied for the team-lead with Bre Peck, with four total

**D'AMOUR GETS 200**

- Head coach Pete D'Amour reached career-win 200 on March 11 as the Hokies run-ruled Syracuse 13-1.
- D'Amour became the fastest coach in school history to reach 100 wins at Virginia Tech a season ago, also in a win over Syracuse.

**PITCHER OF THE WEEK (3/9)**

- For the first time in her career, Emma Lemley was named the ACC Pitcher of the Week on March 9
- The right-hander went 1-0, shutting out then-No. 14/9 Clemson, while also earning a save in the 4-2 win over the Tigers.
- She gave up just three hits in her 7.0 innings pitched, striking out 10 Clemson batters with no walks.
- In the game three win, Lemley came on in the seventh, striking out two, giving up one run to earn the save.
- She ended her time at Clemson with a 0.88 ERA and a .138 batting average against, facing the Tigers for 8.0 innings, with 12 strikeouts and one earned run.

**BROWN SPOTLESS ON BASES**

- Kelsey Brown was a perfect 31 for 31 on stolen bases during the 2021 season
- No Hokie had finished a season with as many stolen bases without being thrown out.
- In her two seasons at Virginia Tech, Brown is 49-51 on stolen bases.
- She finished second in the ACC in total stolen

bases, with her 31 landing her 11th nationally. She posted .60 stolen bases per game, which ranked her third in the ACC and 30th nationally

**ROCHARD VERSUS THE BEST**

- Keely Rochard has seen her fair share of ranked foes, with 20 to be exact.

The Virginia Tech softball team has the luxury of playing and practicing in some of the finest facilities on the East Coast. Using the Tech Softball Park, Softball Indoor Facility and a state-of-the-art weight room, the Hokies train in terrific facilities designed to help them win championships. Combined with a new locker room and one of the best scoreboard and video boards in the country, the Hokies have it all when it comes to what they need to win.

Tech Softball Park, which was completed in the fall of 1997, has dimensions of 200 feet down the lines and 220 feet to center field. In January of 2008, an additional 746 permanent seats were installed, bringing the capacity up from 336 to 1,024. The new bleachers match the ones that were already in place and now extend down to the end of both dugouts.

Thanks to an anonymous donation, TSP now has seatbacks in the section behind home plate, which was completed in fall 2017.

Head coach Pete D'Amour led the Hokies to their second ever appearance in the NCAA Super Regionals during the 2021 campaign, doing so in just his second full season. Selected for the NCAA Tournament in both full seasons as head coach, D'Amour's Hokies were the No. 2 seed at the 2021 Tempe Regional with national No. 15 seed Arizona State as the group's favorite. Tech emerged from the four-team regional undefeated under D'Amour's guidance, the first time in school history that the Hokies' swept an NCAA Regional.

2021 was not just a historic year for the Hokies, but for D'Amour as well as he became the fastest head coach in program history to reach 100 wins, doing so in just 127 games. Under D'Amour's tutelage, pitcher Keely Rochard became Tech's third NFCA All-American ever and just the second to earn first-team honors. D'Amour and his wife Anna also welcomed their first son, Reaux, to the world prior to the NCAA Tournament.

In his second season leading the Hokies, Coach Pete D'Amour led the team to a 21-4 record and was in first place in the ACC when the season ended. He helped guide the team to an impressive 3-2 record at the St. Pete/Clearwater Elite Invitational against five top-25 opponents, including wins over #14 Minnesota and #17 South Carolina. D'Amour guided the progression of pitcher Keely Rochard, who was one of the nation's top pitchers in 2020, and also helped the Hokies' offense to the highest scoring in the ACC.

Guiding Virginia Tech to one of the biggest turnarounds in NCAA softball history, Pete D'Amour led the Hokies in his first year to a 24-game win improvement in 2019 after posting a 47-11 record, including a 20-4 mark in ACC play.

The 47 wins were the fourth most in school history while the 20 ACC wins were the most in program history. On Tech's way to 20 league wins, it earned an ACC regular-season title and a Coastal Division crown after being picked 10th in the ACC preseason poll. By doing so, it also earned the Hokies their first trip to the NCAA Tournament since 2015, winning two games at the Lexington Regional to pick up their first NCAA win since 2014.

No stranger to success, D'Amour, out of the new 11 Power Five head coaches in 2019, picked up the most wins of the group. The 2019 ACC Coach of the Year earned the nod to mark just Tech's second time winning it, while a school-record five Hokies made an All-ACC first team. Under D'Amour's direction, pitcher Carrie Eberle was named ACC Pitcher of the Year and third baseman Kelsey Bennett was tabbed Freshman of the Year.

He also tutored two Softball America All-Americans in outfielders Emma Strouth and Darby Trull, who both hit over .400 and tallied 60-plus putouts, as well as a school-record seven NFCA All-Region (Mid-Atlantic) selections and a school-record eight VaSID all-staters. D'Amour also was tabbed VaSID Coach of the Year.

Under his watch, Tech became ranked during the season, something that hadn't been done since 2015, and got up to as high as No. 19 in the ESPN.com/USA Softball poll and No. 22 in the USA Today/NFCA poll. The Hokies were ranked for 11 consecutive weeks in the ESPN.com/USA Softball poll, breaking the program record set in 2007 of 10 weeks, and picked up two ranked wins on the year, beating then-No. 8/8 Georgia and then-No. 20/17 JMU.

Tech took big strides at the plate in '19, resetting over 20 individual and team school records, including batting average (.334) and home runs (97), just to name a few. The Hokies led the ACC in batting average and home runs per game (1.67), while also getting it done in the circle with shutouts (22). D'Amour had the Hokies ready to play against in-state rival Virginia in the Commonwealth Clash presented by Virginia's 529, sweeping the Cavaliers 3-0 and not allowing a runner to touch third base or home plate in the series, a first in program history, for three shutout wins.

D'Amour joined the Hokies after two seasons as the head coach at Kennesaw State, where he led the Owls to a 79-37 record and two postseason appearances. Before taking over the Kennesaw State program in 2017, he earned a reputation as one of the nation's premier recruiters during his 10-year tenure as assistant coach at the University of Missouri, a perennial NCAA tournament participant.

D'Amour coached Kennesaw State to the 2018 Atlantic Sun Conference regular season and tournament championships en route to the program's first NCAA Regional appearance since transitioning to the Division I level in 2006, as the Owls finished the year with a 39-17 record. In his inaugural year as head coach at Kennesaw State in 2017, he guided the Owls to a 40-20 overall record and a berth in the National Invitational Softball Championship.

Kennesaw State went 39-17 and 14-3 in the ASUN in 2018 and earned a No. 3 seed in the Tallahassee Regional. D'Amour was named ASUN Coach of the Year and seven Owls earned ASUN all-conference accolades, including ASUN Pitcher of the Year Alley Cutting and ASUN Freshman of the Year Patricia Awald. Awald was one of 25 finalists up for NFCA National Freshman of the Year.

Prior to accepting the head coaching job at Kennesaw State, D'Amour spent a decade at Missouri as an assistant coach, serving as associate head coach for his final two seasons in 2015-16. During his tenure in Columbia, the Tigers qualified for the NCAA tournament in each of his 10 seasons on the staff, reaching five NCAA super regionals and earning three consecutive trips to the Women's College World Series from 2009-11.
