KEY STORYLINES

DOMINATING THE SHOTS

- Virginia Tech out shot Indiana 19-5 in the home opener on Sunday but had trouble making it past the Hoosiers goalkeeper.
- Tech had 24 shots in the season opener against William & Mary, keeping the Tribe down to 7.
- The Hokies continue to put the pressure on in the second half with over half their shots taken in the last 45 minutes.

SCOUTING BLUE HENS

- Delaware is comes off a 1-1 tie on the road vs. Villanova. The Wildcats had a slight edge over the Blue Hens 12-10 in shots and 8-2 in corner kicks. Tech defeated Villanova in 2021 (5-1).
- In their first game of the season, Delaware kept a

cleansheet against Delaware State winning 3-0. The Blue Hens took 26 shots (11 on goal).

- Last season, the Blue Hens went 5-11-2 winning only 2 of their 8 away games.
- The Blue Hens lost lead goalkeeper, Lauren Krinsky, who graduated last year. 2019-21 Blue Hens leading goal scorer, Sara D'Appolonia returns for her 5th year.

THE HISTORY

• Virginia Tech trails the series vs Delaware (0-1). Hokies last met the Blue Hens in 1994 on Thompson Field. Delaware defeated Tech 3-1.

CAA EXPERIENCE

• Virginia Tech started the 2022 campaign playing William & Mary on the road. Tech won the

match 4-3.

- Tech has not lost to a current Colonial Athletic Association school since 2004.
- Against current CAA schools, the Hokies are 15-8.

POSTSEASON 2021

- Virginia Tech made its 12th NCAA tournament appearance all-time and its third within the last five seasons (2018, 2019, 2021).
- The Hokies have qualified for the NCAA tournament during eight of Chugger Adair's 12 seasons as head coach.
- Tech is 13-12-1 all-time during the NCAA tournament (11-8-1 under Chugger Adair).

• Virginia Tech has averaged 21.5 shot attempts per match this season, keeping opponents down to six shots.

HOKIES AT HOME

- Virginia Tech was unable to make it past the Hooisers goalkeeper in the 0-0 home opener.
- Virginia Tech compiled a 8-1-1 record at home during the 2021 season, scoring 27 goals at a +21 goal differential.
- After defeating Ohio State on Nov. 12, the Hokies improved to 6-2-1 all-time during NCAA tournament matches staged at Thompson Field.

BUILT DIFFERENT

- Hokies military practices proved benefical in the second half of the season opener as the team scored two goals in the last 10 minutes of play.
- Hokies made 11 shots in the last 30 minutes of the Indiana match, and kept Indiana away from making any attempts.
- · Tech has the stamina to stay strong in the final minutes of the match, allowing zero goals in the second half.

POWELL

- Tori Powell leads the team with 13 shots and two goals after the first two games of the season.
- Powell became the 11th Virginia Tech player to notch the program's 13th all-time hat trick on Oct. 10 at Wake Forest (2021).
- Powell's hat trick marked Tech's first against a Power Five opponent (fifth during the program's ACC tenure).

PELKOWSKI

- Pelkowski scored her first goal of the season bouncing the ball off the crossbar against William and Mary.
- Midfielder Emma Pelkowski tied for the fifth best single-season assists marks across program history in 2021 with eight.

VEITH ON #SCTOP10

- Ava Veith's first collegiate goal extending Virginia Tech's lead to 5-0 on Aug. 26, 2021 against Elon - received the No. 2 spot on SportsCenter's Top 10 Plays.
- Veith unloaded a 35-yard, curling strike to the top-right shelf, preluding Holly Weber's 30-yard strike that took place on the other side of a 55-minute lightning delay.

FRESHMEN TO WATCH

• Freshman Taylor Price netted her first regular-

season goal vs William and Mary in her first collegiate game. Price is quickly making her presence known on the team as she led the Hokies in preseason goals (2).

• Midfielder Courtney Andersen was named to the 2022 TopDrawerSoccer.com Freshman Best XI list! Andersen made one assist in the preseason match against Loyola.

HARGROVE SUCCESS

- Sophmore goalkeeper Lauren Hargrove made her first career start at the Indiana match on Sunday. She has allowed zero goals, playing 144 minutes this season.
- Starting the season, Hargrove stepped into the goal with 10 minutes left in the first and kept the Tribe scoreless throughout the rest of the match. She blocked two shots. She also saved shots against Indiana.

SEASON OUTLOOK

• Virginia Tech has aspirations of making the program's 13th NCAA tournament appearance to date this fall, having earned all berths since 2004.

PRESEASON POLLS

- Virginia Tech was voted to finish ninth in the preseason ACC standings this season by the league's head coaches.
- The Hokies will be chasing one of six spots in the 2022 ACC Women's Soccer Championship.
- · Of the eight programs picked to finish ahead of Tech, four were ranked among the top 10 national preseason positions per *United Soccer Coaches*:

- Advanced to the NCAA third round: 2018 after defeating Arkansas, 1-0 (20T), in Cary, North Carolina.

BEST PERFORMANCES 2021

- Sept. 12: Virginia Tech defeats No. 12 South Carolina, 1-0, in a true road environment. The Hokies held SC to season lows in attempts (seven total, three on target).
- Sept. 23: Tech earns its first-ever away series point at No. 4 North Carolina (2-2 draw). The Hokies' 2-0 lead marked the largest deficit UNC

had faced at home since 2013.

- Sept. 26: Virginia Tech collects a result against its second consecutive top-five opponent, drawing with No. 2 Duke (1-1). The Hokies never trailed against UNC or Duke during the same
- Oct. 15: Tech holds No. 1 Florida State to season lows in attempts (nine total, two on target).
- Nov. 12: Tech takes down Ohio State (3-1) in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

AGAINST THE COMMONWEALTH

- With the victory against W&M, Virginia Tech improved to 19-2-0 under Chugger Adair when competing in non-conference regular season matches against in-state opponents.
- Tech's two defeats were had against Virginia during the 2020-21 season (non-conference ACC matches inside COVID-19 scheduling).

On December 7, 2010, former Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Jim Weaver announced the hiring of Tech's fourth head women's soccer coach Charles "Chugger" Adair, the associate head coach for the team the previous five seasons. The 2019 season marked Adair's 14th season in Blacksburg and his ninth year as the Hokies' head coach. In that time, he's become the all-time wins leader in program history, ending the 2019 campaign with a 118-53-20 overall record, and became just the second soccer coach at the school to reach the 100-win milestone with the team's victory at Miami on Sept. 23 (Jerry Cheynet, 238 wins, 28 seasons for Tech men's soccer). He's also just the 10th women's soccer head coach to reach that mark in the ACC.

Prior to Adair's arrival on campus, the women's program just once (2004) made the postseason - playing a game in both the ACC and NCAA tournaments. Since, the team has qualified for six ACC tournaments, playing for the conference title twice (2008 & 2013), and earned eight straight bids to the NCAA championship (2008-15) and 10 overall, as the Hokies made back-to-back trips in 2018 and 2019. Tech has reached the Sweet 16 four times under Adair (2009, 2011, 2014, 2018), but enjoyed its greatest success in 2013. That record-setting season included the Hokies posting a school-record 19 wins (most by any soccer team at the school), playing for the ACC title and advancing to the NCAA College Cup, where their season ended with a 3-2 loss to Florida State in a national semifinal game.

Under Adair, Tech has seen the program's three draft choices selected in the NWSL draft. Jazmine Reeves was the 21st overall pick by the Boston Breakers in 2014, while Mandy McGlynn was chosen one spot higher with the No. 20 pick by Sky Blue FC in 2020. Emily Gray made history in 2021 becoming the highest drafted pick at number three by North Carolina Courage. Tech has also had its only three All-Americans under Adair's tutelage - Reeves (1st, 2013), Murielle Tiernan (3rd, 2015) and McGlynn (2nd, 2019) - and two of its three Academic All-Americans - Katie Yensen (3rd, 2014) and McGlynn (1st, 2019).

Along with the great strides the Hokies have made on the pitch, the Tech women's soccer program is also known for producing outstanding students who are major contributors off of it. Each year, the Hokies boast a high team grade point average and have student-athletes who compete for state, regional and national academic recognition. In fact, during the 2017-18 academic season, the team posted a program-tying best ever team GPA of 3.53 in the spring semester. In addition, both Ashley Meier (2015) and Alani Johnson (2017) have received an ACC Postgraduate Scholarship, with Meier also earning an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship as well. Lastly, in 2018, Heather Timothy became Tech's sixth women's soccer player to earn the Skelton Award for Academic Excellence in Athletics - the highest designation handed out by the Tech athletics department.

In 2015, the Hokies went 15-4-2 and won their opening round game in the NCAA Championship, while in the 2014 season, Adair led the Hokies to a 16-6 record and advanced to the Sweet 16 for the third time in school history. During that season, the Hokies set a school record for most goals in a season, with 62, and fewest goals allowed in a season, surrendering just 18, and reached a program-best No. 2 ranking in the country after starting the season at 10-0-0.

In their record-setting 2013 campaign, the Hokies beat three ranked teams during the regular season and then blew out then-No. 1 Virginia 4-2 in the ACC Tournament semifinals. They added two more ranked foes to their list of conquests when they downed West Virginia 1-0 and knocked off Santa Clara by advancing on penalty kicks in the NCAA Championships. The Hokies were a No. 1 seed in the tournament and hosted four games in Blacksburg. The Hokies scored a then school-record 56 goals, breaking the mark of 45 set by the 2012 team, and shut out 12 opponents, tying the mark also set by the 2012 squad. They finished the season with a school-best No. 4 ranking in the country.

In Adair's first season as the head coach (2011), Tech matched its best finish in program history (at the time), making it all the way to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Championship. Adair led the Hokies to a 14-8-1 overall record, which included 11 shutouts.

Adair came to Tech in 2006 and served as the associate head coach under previous head coach Kelly Cagle for five seasons before being promoted. In Adair's first season as an assistant to Cagle, the Hokies suffered a losing season, but have not suffered a losing season since. In 2008, the Hokies advanced to the finals of the ACC Championship for the first time, falling to North Carolina 3-0, and in 2009, the Hokies won 16 games, then a school record, and earned a final ranking of No. 12.

Adair also possesses a great deal of playing experience, having played professionally for 10 years, including stints with the Los Angeles Galaxy of Major League Soccer and the U.S. National Futsal Team. He also spent time playing for the San Diego Sockers, Wichita Wings, Portland Timbers, San Diego Flash, Minnesota Thunder, Seattle Sounders, Milwaukee Wave, Carolina Dynamo and A.A. Ghent (Belgium) from 1993-2003.

Adair played soccer at the University of San Diego after transferring from San Diego State in the early 1990s. He earned All-America honors, was a two-year captain and helped USD to the NCAA finals, where the Toreros lost to Virginia. He scored 27 goals and had 23 assists in his three years at USD. He got his bachelor's degree in business administration from USD in 1993 and he received his MBA from USD in 1996.

Adair is married to the former Shelbylynn Mc-Bride, and they have a daughter, Callie Lynn and a son, Austin Tate. He also has two other daughters Alexandra and Madeline, and a son Jack.
