KEY STORYLINES

LOOKING FOR SEVEN

- Virginia Tech faced their first loss of the season on Thursday versus #4 South Carolina 1-2. Tech was unbeaten after five games this season before falling to the Gamecocks.
- Although the No. 4 Gamecocks won, Tech fought an even match as both teams had six shots on goal. The Hokies held the shot advantage 12-11.
- Tech has relied on dominating in the second half of the game, scoring over half their goals in the last 45 minutes.

- Tori Powell leads the team in goals with five goals. Powell is ranked tied for 13th in the NCAA, for goals this season.
- Taylor Price is second on the team with four goals, and is ranked tied for 9th in the ACC.
- Tech's goalkeeper Lauren Hargrove has recorded three clean sheets so far this season, having let three all get past her in her last six games. Hargrove is ranked sixth in the ACC with a saving percentage of .850.

SCOUTING BEARS

- The Bears return to the pitch after a 1-2 loss to James Madison on Thursday. Northern Colorado had a 13-6 shot deficit to the Dukes.
- The Bears have the endurance

to play to the very end, as Melina Faris scored against the Dukes with less than 30 seconds left in the match. Faris also scored the team's first goal in their game versus North Dakota State.

- Northern Colorado leads the Big Sky Conference at 4-1-2, and leads the conference with a saving percentage of .897 (35 saves)
- Goalkeeper Kaya Lindberg has allowed 4 goals in 599 minutes of play this season, saving 35 shots. Lindberg is currently ranked first in the Big Sky in goals against average of .601.

• Northern Colorado shows strength throughout the entire match with 7 goals in the first period and 8 in the second. The Bears have shown more determination in the second half

- Northern Colorado was picked to finish first in the Big Sky conference preseason poll.
- Forward Lauren Woodhull leads her team in points with 4 goals.

- Virginia Tech has not played against Northern Colorado.

BIG SKY EXPERIENCE

- Sunday's match versus Northern Colorado will be the first time Virginia Tech has gone head-to-head with a current Big Sky school.

ATTACK

- Virginia Tech has averaged 17.7 shot attempts per match this season, keeping opponents down to an average of 7.1 shots.

HOKIES AT HOME

- Virginia Tech is 2-1-1 at home this season. Hokies tied with Indiana 0-0 in the home opener, and beat Delaware 2-0 later in the week. Tech then went on to take down Charlotte 3-0, before falling to South Carolina 1-2 on Thursday.
- Hokies have scored six goals in four games at home this season.
- Virginia Tech compiled a 8-1-1 record at home during the 2021 season, scoring 27 goals at a +21 goal differential.

THE SECOND

- The Hokies continue to put the pressure on teams in the second half scoring 12 of their 18 goals in the last 45 minutes.
- Hokies made 9 shots in the last 42 minutes of the Charlotte match. Tori Powell scored her second goal of the game in the 86th minute of the match.
- In their toughest non-conference match, the Hokies held off the #4 Gamecocks for 56 minutes before allowing a goal. After their second goal, the Hokies continued to stop the Gamecocks from scoring in the final 30 minutes.
- The team has the drive to stay strong in the final minutes of the match, allowing only three goals in the second half.

POWELL

- Tori Powell scored her 20th career goal vs. Charlotte, her fifth goal of the season. Powell is ranked tied for thirteenth in the NCAA for goals, and tied third in the ACC.
- Powell scored the third and final goal at the Charlotte match with less than 4 minutes remaining in the game. She scored 2 of 3 shots on goal.
- Powell became the 11th Virginia Tech player to notch the program's 13th all-time hat trick on Oct. 10 at Wake Forest (2021).
- Powell's hat trick marked Tech's first against a Power Five opponent (fifth during the program's ACC tenure).

PRICE

- Three times this season, freshman Taylor Price has scored the first goal of the game for the Hokies leading them to victory.
- Price is second on the team with four goals this season and remains the top ranked freshman in the ACC for goals and points.
- As a freshman, Price has already made a huge impact on the team with 21 shots, 4 goals, 1 assist, and 9 points.

MITCHELL

- Natalie Mitchell has taken 27 shots this season, the 4th most of any player in the ACC and is first among freshmen. She has made 2 goal and 4 assists, ranking second in the ACC for assists.
- Mitchell has gone 2-2 on penalty kicks this season, scoring the first goal of the match vs. South Carolina.

HARGROVE

- Sophomore goalkeeper Lauren Hargrove made her first career start at the Indiana match. She allowed zero goals in 90 minutes of play. Hargrove went on to play 300 minutes this season before allowing one goal.
- Starting the season, Hargrove is ranked tied for third in the ACC with three shutouts. She is also ranked seventh in the conference for saves (17), and sixth in save percentage (.850).

FRESHMAN TO WATCH

- Midfielder Courtney Andersen was named to the 2022 TopDrawerSoccer.com Freshman Best XI list! Andersen made one assist in the preseason match against Loyola.

VEITH ON #SCTOP10

- Ava Veith's first collegiate goal - extending Virginia Tech's lead to 5-0 on Aug. 26, 2021 against Elon - received the No. 2 spot on SportsCenter's Top 10 Plays.
- Veith unloaded a 35-yard, curling strike to the top-right shelf, precluding Holly Weber's 30-yard strike that took place on the other side of a 55-minute lightning delay.

SEASON OUTLOOK

- Virginia Tech has aspirations of making the program's 13th NCAA tournament appearance to date this fall, having earned all berths since 2004.

PRESEASON POLLS

- Virginia Tech was voted to finish ninth in the preseason ACC standings this season by the league's head coaches.
- The Hokies will be chasing one of six spots in the 2022 ACC Women's Soccer Championship.
- Of the eight programs picked to finish ahead of Tech, four were ranked among the top 10 national preseason positions per *United Soccer Coaches*:

On December 7, 2010, former Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Jim Weaver announced the hiring of Tech's fourth head women's soccer coach Charles "Chugger" Adair, the associate head coach for the team the previous five seasons. The 2019 season marked Adair's 14th season in Blacksburg and his ninth year as the Hokies' head coach. In that time, he's become the all-time wins leader in program history, ending the 2019 campaign with a 118-53-20 overall record, and became just the second soccer coach at the school to reach the 100-win milestone with the team's victory at Miami on Sept. 23 (Jerry Cheynet, 238 wins, 28 seasons for Tech men's soccer). He's also just the 10th women's soccer head coach to reach that mark in the ACC.

Prior to Adair's arrival on campus, the women's program just once (2004) made the postseason - playing a game in both the ACC and NCAA tournaments. Since, the team has qualified for six ACC tournaments, playing for the conference title twice (2008 & 2013), and earned eight straight bids to the NCAA championship (2008-15) and 10 overall, as the Hokies made back-to-back trips in 2018 and 2019. Tech has reached the Sweet 16 four times under Adair (2009, 2011, 2014, 2018), but enjoyed its greatest success in 2013. That record-setting season included the Hokies posting a school-record 19 wins (most by any soccer team at the school), playing for the ACC title and advancing to the NCAA College Cup, where their season ended with a 3-2 loss to Florida State in a national semifinal game.

Under Adair, Tech has seen the program's three draft choices selected in the NWSL draft. Jazmine Reeves was the 21st overall pick by the Boston Breakers in 2014, while Mandy McGlynn was chosen one spot higher with the No. 20 pick by Sky Blue FC in 2020. Emily Gray made history in 2021 becoming the highest drafted pick at number three by North Carolina Courage. Tech has also had its only three All-Americans under Adair's tutelage - Reeves (1st, 2013), Murielle Tiernan (3rd, 2015) and McGlynn (2nd, 2019) - and two of its three Academic All-Americans - Katie Yensen (3rd, 2014) and McGlynn (1st, 2019).

Along with the great strides the Hokies have made on the pitch, the Tech women's soccer program is also known for producing outstanding students who are major contributors off of it. Each year, the Hokies boast a high team grade point average and have student-athletes who compete for state, regional and national academic recognition. In fact, during the 2017-18 academic season, the team posted a program-tying best ever team GPA of 3.53 in the spring semester. In addition, both Ashley Meier (2015) and Alani Johnson (2017) have received an ACC Postgraduate Scholarship, with Meier also earning an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship as well. Lastly, in 2018, Heather Timothy became Tech's sixth women's soccer player to earn the Skelton Award for Academic Excellence in Athletics - the highest designation handed out by the Tech athletics department.

In 2015, the Hokies went 15-4-2 and won their opening round game in the NCAA Championship, while in the 2014 season, Adair led the Hokies to a 16-6 record and advanced to the Sweet 16 for the third time in school history. During that season, the Hokies set a school record for most goals in a season, with 62, and fewest goals allowed in a season, surrendering just 18, and reached a program-best No. 2 ranking in the country after starting the season at 10-0-0.

In their record-setting 2013 campaign, the Hokies beat three ranked teams during the regular season and then blew out then-No. 1 Virginia 4-2 in the ACC Tournament semifinals. They added two more ranked foes to their list of conquests when they downed West Virginia 1-0 and knocked off Santa Clara by advancing on penalty kicks in the NCAA Championships. The Hokies were a No. 1 seed in the tournament and hosted four games in Blacksburg. The Hokies scored a then school-record 56 goals, breaking the mark of 45 set by the 2012 team, and shut out 12 opponents, tying the mark also set by the 2012 squad. They finished the season with a school-best No. 4 ranking in the country.

In Adair's first season as the head coach (2011), Tech matched its best finish in program history (at the time), making it all the way to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Championship. Adair led the Hokies to a 14-8-1 overall record, which included 11 shutouts.

Adair came to Tech in 2006 and served as the associate head coach under previous head coach Kelly Cagle for five seasons before being promoted. In Adair's first season as an assistant to Cagle, the Hokies suffered a losing season, but have not suffered a losing season since. In 2008, the Hokies advanced to the finals of the ACC Championship for the first time, falling to North Carolina 3-0, and in 2009, the Hokies won 16 games, then a school record, and earned a final ranking of No. 12.

Adair also possesses a great deal of playing experience, having played professionally for 10 years, including stints with the Los Angeles Galaxy of Major League Soccer and the U.S. National Futsal Team. He also spent time playing for the San Diego Sockers, Wichita Wings, Portland Timbers, San Diego Flash, Minnesota Thunder, Seattle Sounders, Milwaukee Wave, Carolina Dynamo and A.A. Ghent (Belgium) from 1993-2003.

Adair played soccer at the University of San Diego after transferring from San Diego State in the early 1990s. He earned All-America honors, was a two-year captain and helped USD to the NCAA finals, where the Toreros lost to Virginia. He scored 27 goals and had 23 assists in his three years at USD. He got his bachelor's degree in business administration from USD in 1993 and he received his MBA from USD in 1996.

Adair is married to the former Shelbylynn McBride, and they have a daughter, Callie Lynn and a son, Austin Tate. He also has two other daughters Alexandra and Madeline, and a son Jack.
