HOKIES IN THE POLLS

• Virginia Tech held strong inside the top 15 nationally after the first week of the season, placing there in three of the five leading polls. The Hokies maintained their No. 14 ranking by D1Baseball while dropping one spot to No. 14 in Baseball America's top 25:

HAMMERIN' HEADLINES

 Virginia Tech has won 10 consecutive multi-game regular season series dating back to its come-from-behind, home weekend against Pitt in March 2022. Eight of its 10 series wins during the stretch have been earned against ACC competition (excludes one-game series win at No. 12 Notre Dame in March 2022).

- The Hokies have outscored their opponents, 44-15, through the opening four games of the 2023 season. Tech's +29 run differential through four games ranks as its third best start under the leadership of head coach John Szefc.
- Heading into Friday's series opener against Bryant, Virginia Tech is seeking to score 10-plus runs during four consecutive games for the second time during Szefc's head coaching tenure. The Hokies' prior instance overlapped March and April 2022 with Tech's four

victories against Radford (10-3), No. 12 Notre Dame (10-5), VMI (13-4) and No. 18 North Carolina (12-1).

• Virginia Tech has come back to win two of the three games it has trailed in this season with all instances having been achieved during its season-opening series at College of Charleston (Feb. 17-19). The Hokies flipped their 3-1 deficit against the Cougars after five innings on Feb. 18 and also overcame their 1-0 deficit to defeat them on Feb. 19.

combined to toe a 2.03 ERA during the season's opening weekend, racking up 15 strikeouts and scattering eight hits across 13 and one-third innings pitched.

- Considering the entire 2023 season, the Hokies' four starting pitchers have combined to concede runs during three of the 17 innings for which they have appeared in.
- Last weekend against College of Charleston, the Hokies' bullpen accounted for a 3.55 ERA across 12 and two-thirds innings, combining for 19 strikeouts.
- Fourth-year reliever Henry Weycker set a career high with 10 strikeouts while closing the final four and one-third innings of Saturday's 12-3 win at College of Charleston. All but three of Weycker's 13 outs came by strikeout, earning him status among Collegiate Baseball Newspaper's National Players of the Week.

SCOUTING THE BULLDOGS

- Virginia Tech is 7-6 all-time against Bryant, having contested all meetings since 2009 - the year Bryant University began reclassifying to NCAA Division I athletics. The Hokies have hosted the Bulldogs during all 13 series meetings.
- Tech's three-game sweep of Bryant in 2020 at English Field at Atlantic Union Bank Park - the teams' most recent head-to-head matchup marks the Hokies' lone series victory spanning four chances. The programs split respective two- and four-game sets in 2010 and 2011 while the Hokies lost the three-game series that was contested in 2019.
- Virginia Tech has won four straight individual meetings against the Bulldogs dating back to the teams' 2019 series finale.
- Bryant is competing in its first America East season since departing the Northeast Conference (NEC), where the Bulldogs were tenured from 2010 to 2022. The program won postseason NEC titles in 2013, 2014 and 2016, advancing to the NCAA Division I Baseball Championship on each occasion.
- In 2016, Bryant entered the NCAA tournament with a 47-10 record and the country's best winning percentage (.825), earning the No. 2 seed in the NCAA Charlottesville Regional - the highest regional seed earned by a NEC member.
- As recently as the opening weekend of the 2022 season, the Bulldogs shocked No. 12 East Carolina

by sweeping a three-game road series against the Pirates.

• Virginia Tech associate head coach Ryan Fecteau served as Bryant's assistant coach and recruiting coordinator between 2011 and 2016.

'22 MEMORIES & '23 DREAMS

- Virginia Tech is the defending ACC Coastal Division champion, having achieved the league's best regular season record (19-9) behind its program records in ACC regular season wins and series wins (nine)
- Tech earned the No. 4 national seed in the 2022 NCAA Division I Baseball Championship - its highest all-time mark.
- The Hokies hosted their first NCAA Regional since 2013, sweeping Wright State and Columbia (twice) to win their first NCAA Regional championship and advance to the program's first NCAA Super Regional (as staged in its home ballpark).
- Following its deepest postseason run, Virginia Tech is one of four preseason favorites to win the 2023 ACC championship, per the 2023 ACC Baseball Coaches Preseason Poll (Louisville, Clemson. Wake Forest).
- The Hokies are seeking their first trip to Omaha at the Men's College World Series.
- Virginia Tech's 2023 roster houses two returning All-Americans (Drue Hackenberg Jack Hurley) and two Freshman All-Americans (Carson DeMartini, Drue Hackenberg).

• Four Virginia Tech student-athletes have garnered 2023 Preseason All-American praise: junior outfielder Jack Hurley (consensus), sophomore pitcher Drue Hackenberg, sophomore infielder Carson DeMartini and sixth-year reliever Kiernan Higgins.

HURLEY NAMED TO GOLDEN SPIKES WATCH LIST

Of its many program records set during the 2022 season, Virginia Tech won nine (of 10) ACC series during the course of the regular season. The Hokies' 19 ACC wins also equated to a program best.

Jack Hurley co-led the 2022 "Hammerin' Hokies" with 38 extra-base hits (matching shortstop Tanner Schobel). Hurley paced Tech with his .375 batting average.

- On an individual level, Hurley has now appeared in the Golden Spikes Award candidate pool during two consecutive seasons. In 2022, he appeared on the midseason watch list released in April.
- Among the 55 players chosen to the 2023 preseason watch list, Hurley is one of 10 studentathletes hailing from the ACC, which ranked second in total representation (17).
- During the summer of 2022, Hurley competed on the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team at Honkbalweek Haarlem in the Netherlands. He accompanied 19 of his Team USA teammates on the 55-player preseason prospect list.
- Hurley led Virginia Tech in batting average (.375) during the 2022 season, registering 23 doubles, 14 home runs, 55 RBIs and a .664 slugging percentage. He was named to the 2022 All-ACC First Team, earned ABCA/Rawlings Atlantic All-Region First Team praise, collected four All-American honors and was a national semifinalist for the Dick Howser Trophy.

HOME, SWEET HOME

- Following Virginia Tech's season-opening series at College of Charleston, the Hokies will return home to English Field at Atlantic Union Bank Park for a 13-game home stand, culminating with Tech's ACC-opening series against Boston College (March 10-12).
- The Hokies posted a 33-7 record at English Field during the 2022 season, including a 4-2 postseason mark during the NCAA Blacksburg Regional and NCAA Blacksburg Super Regional.
- For the first time since 2013, Virginia Tech finished among the top 50 NCAA Division I programs in total home attendance, setting a program record with 43,615 fans entering through the English Field gates.

2022: HISTORY IN REVIEW

- At No. 4, Virginia Tech earned its highest national seed to the NCAA tournament all-time.
- The Hokies made their 11th NCAA tournament appearance and their third since joining the ACC (2010, 2013, 2022).
- Tech hosted its first NCAA Super Regional its first since the completion of its \$20 million renovation in 2018 that outfitted the ballpark with:
 - 1,100+ chair-back seats
 - New club level
 - New premium suites
 - State-of-the-art press concourse
- The Hokies' 2022 NCAA tournament berth marked their first under the leadership of head coach John Szefc.
- Szefc has led three programs to a combined, eight NCAA Regional appearances: Marist (four), Maryland (three) and Virginia Tech (one).
- The 2022 Blacksburg Super Regional marked Szefc's third such appearance and his first at his home.
- Virginia Tech arrived at the 2022 NCAA Blacksburg Super Regional having won 34 of its previous 40 games.
- The Hokies won 14 of their 15 regular season series.

2022 ACC COASTAL DIVISION CHAMPIONS

- Virginia Tech's 2022 ACC Coastal Division title marked the program's first since joining the league in 2005.
- At the beginning of the 2022 season, the Hokies were picked to finish sixth in the Coastal Division.
- Tech won five of its six divisional ACC series while posting a 5-2 record against the Atantic Division, taking series off the top two division finishers (Louisville, Notre Dame).
- Beginning on March 19, 2022, the Hokies prevailed during nine consecutive ACC series and achieved a 19-5 record against conference

opponents (overcoming their 0-4 start to league play).

• The Hokies entered the ACC Baseball Championship as the No. 1 seed for the first time during its program history.

HOKIES AT THE ACC TOURNAMENT

- Virginia Tech's 2022 ACC Baseball Championship berth marked the program's sixth all-time appearance (2005, 2010, 2013, 2015, 2021, 2022).
- The Hokies qualified for the ACC tournament during back-to-back years for the first time as a league member.
- Tech's 18-6 victory against 12th-seeded Clemson on May 26 featured the Hokies setting ACC tournament program records in runs scored (18) and home runs (six).

John Szefc - the 2022 ACC Coach of the Year and ABCA/ATEC Atlantic Regional Coach of the Year - enters his sixth season as the head baseball coach at Virginia Tech and his 18th season as an NCAA Division I baseball head coach. He was hired by Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock on June 9, 2017, following five defining seasons as the head baseball coach at Maryland.

A name synonymous with winning, Szefc has coached his teams to 11 seasons of 30-plus victories, including four 40-win campaigns. He has guided three programs to eight NCAA Regional appearances – Marist (1997, 2000-02), Maryland (2014, 2015, 2017), Virginia Tech (2022) – while advancing his clubs to three NCAA Super Regionals – Maryland (2014, 2015), Virginia Tech (2022).

Through 17 head coaching seasons, Szefc has achieved a performance record of 522-363-4, equivalent to a .589 career winning percentage. On April 15, 2022, he celebrated his 500th career head coaching victory by leading Virginia Tech to its emphatic, 13-2, series-clinching victory against No. 2* Miami, a result that would soon vault the Hokies into *D1Baseball*'s top 10 rankings for the first time during their history.

During his first five seasons at Virginia Tech, Szefc has compiled a 130-104 record in Blacksburg (.556 winning percentage), accented by the program's historic 2022 season.

Among Tech's notable 2022 feats, the Hokies won 45 games – their fourth highest single-season wins total all-time – setting program records in both ACC series victories (nine, as won consecutively) and ACC regular season wins (19). Tech spent eight consecutive weeks ranked in D1Baseball's top 25 poll, including seven straight

weeks inside the top 10, peaking on May 23 as the consensus No. 2-ranked program by college baseball's six leading national publications.

Under Szefc's direction, Virginia Tech championed the ACC Coastal Division for the first time during its 18-year league tenure, locked up the No. 1 seed at the ACC Baseball Championship with the conference's best regular season record and earned the No. 4 national seed in the NCAA Division I Baseball Championship, presenting the Hokies with their first home NCAA Regional since 2013. In front of historic crowds, Tech swept its competition at the NCAA Blacksburg Regional to win the program's first regional title, punching its first ticket to NCAA Super Regional weekend featuring a top-10 matchup against No. 9* Oklahoma.

Behind Szefc's 2022 success, he mentored Virginia Tech's most decorated All-American class to date, celebrating in 13 combined honors for shortstop Tanner Schobel (six), sophomore outfielder Jack Hurley (four), freshman pitcher Drue Hackenberg (two) and third-year outfielder Gavin Cross (one). Additionally, he placed five student-athletes onto ABCA/Rawlings Atlantic All-Region Teams (tying for the fourth most all-region selections nationally) while setting a program record with eight ACC all-conference honorees, including four All-ACC First Team nods.

During the 2022 MLB Draft, Szefc produced Virginia Tech's highest all-time selection in Gavin Cross, who was taken at No. 9 overall by the Kansas City Royals. In total, six members of Tech's 2022 roster inked pro contracts at season's end with four of the Hokies' five MLB Draft picks coming off the board during the opening five rounds.

2018 season, Szefc has coached 16 MLB Draft picks, including seven players who have earned selection during the opening 10 rounds. He has mentored six All-Americans, three Freshman All-Americans and eight All-ACC honorees (nine awards).

Szefc's first four seasons at Virginia Tech were highlighted by great outlook and turnaround. During the 2021 season, the Hokies debuted in *D1Baseball*'s top 25 rankings for the first time during the outlet's history, staying up for seven weeks and peaking at No. 17 (April 12).

By 2020, Szefc had Tech on the verge of a breakthrough season, despite the COVID-19 pandemic wiping out the Hokies' window of opportunity. Led by All-Americans and MLB Draft products Carson Taylor (catcher) lan Seymour (pitcher), Tech posted an 11-5 record before the shutdown.

Prior to his tenure in Blacksburg, Szefc led Maryland to three NCAA appearances during his five seasons at the helm of the Terrapins, achieving a 180-122 record (.596 winning percentage). He became the first Maryland baseball coach to lead the Terrapins to the NCAA Super Regional round, accomplishing the feat twice behind the program's first two 40-win seasons and its first two NCAA Regional crowns.

Nationally, Szefc's Maryland teams achieved the program's highest year-end rankings, placing No. 14 nationally at the conclusion of the 2014 and 2015 seasons. He also led the Terrapins to their first ACC tournament final in 38 years (2014), returning to the conference final during the program's 2015 debut at the Big Ten tournament.

Szefc's head coaching start was earned in 1996 at Marist, where he led the Red Foxes to four conference championships, four NCAA Regional appearances and a 212-137-4 record (.606 winning percentage). At Marist, he was named the 1997 Northeastern Conference Coach of the Year, later collecting 2001 ABCA Northeast Region Coach of the Year honors.

Between head coaching stints, Szefc enjoyed a six-season tenure as the assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Louisiana-Lafayette (2003-08) under the late, legendary head coach Tony Robichaux. Continuing on, he became the assistant head coach and recruiting coordinator at Kansas (2009-10) before transitioning in-state to serve as the associate head coach and recruiting coordinator at Kansas State (2011-12).

Szefc began his coaching career with assistant coach titles at Sacred Heart (1995) and at Drexel (1990-93). He also managed the New York Generals in the Atlantic College Baseball League (ACBL) during the summers of 1995 and 1996, leading the club to a 47-28 record, two consecutive division titles and the 1996 ACBL championship game.

Collegiately, Szefc played two years at Connecticut before transferring in 1987 to Drexel. During his senior campaign with the Dragons, he was tabbed an All-East Coast Conference outfielder.

A native of Middletown, New York, Szefc graduated from Drexel in 1989 with his bachelor's degree in corporate communications. He also holds a master's degree in sports administration from Temple.

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH, OFFENSE & RECRUITING COORDINATOR

Kurt Elbin enters his sixth season on the Virginia Tech baseball coaching staff, having arrived in June 2017 and earned promotion to associate head coach, offense and recruiting coordinator in May 2022. Elbin joined John Szefc's coaching staff after serving as the assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at VCU.

ASSISTANT COACH, CATCHERS & SCOUTING

Tyler Hanson enters his fifth season on the Virginia Tech baseball coaching staff, having arrived in June 2018 as the Hokies' volunteer assistant coach. In June 2022, he was elevated to the title of assistant coach, catchers and scouting.

In his current role, Hanson specializes in the development of Tech's battery, assists with the offense and handles the day-to-day operations of the program's baseball camps. Before joining the Hokies, he served as the assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Eastern Kentucky for three seasons (2016-18).

With Hanson on staff, Tech has become a destination for catchers and has consistently placed among the best pitching staffs in the ACC. Since making his way to Blacksburg, he has placed two catchers on the Buster Posey National Collegiate Catcher of the Year Award watch list – Carson Taylor (2020) and Cade Hunter (2022) – with Hunter earning national semifinalist recognition in 2022.

Hanson's work with Hunter was key to Virginia Tech's historic 2022 season that culminated with the program's first ACC Coastal Division title and NCAA Regional championship. As the Hokies' starting backstop, he batted .330 and slugged .637 with 14 doubles, 17 home runs and 66 RBIs while responsible for catching 11 runners stealing.
