HOKIES CLASH WITH IRISH

• Virginia Tech trails the all-time series against Notre Dame, 18-10.

• To date, the Hokies' multi-game series wins against the Irish are as follows:

• **2001** | Two-game doubleheader sweep in Blacksburg (BIG EAST series)

• **2014** | Three-game series in South Bend (ACC series)

• **2022** | One-game, snow-shortened series in South Bend (ACC series)

• Tech has lost nine of its last 11 head-to-head meetings against Notre Dame (includes 0-6 mark at home).

• Overall, the Hokies are 3-8 all-time when hosting Notre Dame in Blacksburg.

TECH'S ICE COLD '22 WIN

• Virginia Tech's one-game series win at No. 12 Notre Dame during the 2022 season was ice cold.

• Tech prevailed, 10-5, through the snow flurries courtesy of its six-run ninth inning rally.

• Trailing, 5-4, Tanner Schobel's one-out RBI double tied the game shortly before Cade Hunter hit the go-ahead RBI single.

• In a frightening scene, Sam Tackett was knocked down by a ball to the face, becoming a hard-nosed (RBI) hit batsman.

• Nick Holesa's sacrifice bunt with the bases loaded was

errantly thrown away by the Irish, resulting in three runs that set the final score at 10-5.

• With snow threatening (and ultimately succeeding) to shorten the series, head coach John Szefc had the luxury of pairing Friday starter Griffin Green with Saturday starter Drue Hackenberg for seven combined innings on the mound (eight strikeouts, one walk).

• Virginia Tech's win marked its first of 12 victories against DIBaseball top-25 opponents during the 2022 season. In triumph, the Hokies notched their second of eventually nine consecutive ACC series victories during the 2022 campaign, setting the program record.

OH, THOSE HAMMERIN' HOKIES

• Virginia Tech pulls into this weekend's series against Notre Dame on the precipice of another roaring offensive season.

• As of March 7, the Hokies rank nationally and among the ACC in the following categories:

• Tech is also averaging 10.05 runs per nine innings and 12.26 hits per nine innings.

• The Hokies have eclipsed double-digit runs during six of their first 11 games of the season (all victories) and have won four games by 10 or more runs.

BACKSTOPS SWINGING FOR THE FENCES

• Virginia Tech has received the most home run production out of its contingent of catchers.

• As of March 7, senior Gehrig Ebel, sophomore Henry Cooke and freshman David McCann have combined to hammer five home runs - the most by a position group on Tech's roster this season.

• McCann's first collegiate home run was mashed during his pinch-hit appearance against Rhode Island on Feb. 24; he remained in the game as the Hokies' designated hitter.

IN DEFENSE OF DEFENSE

• Virginia Tech has ranked among the top defensive teams among NCAA Division I programs during the 2022 and 2023 seasons, though has struggled defensively through the early portions of 2024:

• The Hokies enter ACC play having committed seven errors during their most recent series against Stony Brook (March 1-3). All seven errors were deemed in the act of throwing (stemming from balls hit in play, steal attempts and/or pickoff tries).

• Considering Tech's 13 errors this season (tied for the fourth most among ACC programs), 10 have involved throwing mishaps (stemming from balls hit in play, steal attempts and/or pickoff tries).

MICHEL TO MISS REMAINDER OF '24 SEASON

• On March 1, sophomore first baseman Garrett Michel sustained a badly broken wrist from a collision during the seventh inning of the Hokies' 6-3 victory against Stony Brook at English Field at Atlantic Union Bank Park, requiring him to leave the game.

• Michel underwent successful surgery to medically repair his wrist and is expected to make a full recovery, though it is anticipated he will miss the remainder of the 2024 NCAA Division I baseball season.

• As a rookie with the Hokies during the 2023 campaign, Michel batted .339 and slugged .626 through his 51 starts, compiling 16 doubles, 11 home runs and 45 RBIs. He garnered 2023 Freshman All-American praise as a first baseman from *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper* and *Perfect Game*, in addition to placing onto the 2023 ACC All-Freshman Team.

• Through his nine games played during the 2024 season, Michel had been batting .400 (14-for-35) with five doubles, four home runs and a 1.361 OPS.

• He is slated to return to the Bourne Braves for the 2024 Cape Cod Baseball League season.

IT'S HOW YOU START

• Virginia Tech is projected to roll out its same starting rotation for the fourth consecutive week of the 2024 season when the Hokies entertain Notre Dame this weekend: freshman right-hander Brett Renfrow (game one), junior right-hander Wyatt Parliament (game two) and sophomore right-hander Griffin Stieg (game three).

• This spring, the Hokies' weekend rotation has combined to notch a 5-1 record and a 2.95 ERA spanning 42 and two-thirds innings pitched (nine starts). They are also boasting a 4.2 strikeout-to-walk ratio and a 2.11 walks per nine innings mark.

• During Tech's March series against Stony Brook, the Hokies' starting trio combined to boast a 2-0 record (all three starters departed in line for the win) with a 1.59 ERA, two walks and 13 strikeouts. Together, they shut out the Seawolves during all but two of the 18 innings they pitched in.

WELCOME TO COLLEGE, BRETT

• On Feb. 16 at Charlotte, Brett Renfrow became Virginia Tech's first true freshman pitcher to start Opening Day during the program's ACC era (since 2005).

• Renfrow dazzled during his collegiate debut, pitching the opening five innings of Tech's 10-0 shutout victory against the 49ers. He allowed one hit through the duration of his start, registering seven strikeouts and collecting 15 outs from 17 batters faced.

• The rookie right-hander ended his Feb. 16 start by retiring seven consecutive batters. On Feb. 23 against Rhode Island, he elevated his exit by retiring 10 batters in a row.

• Renfrow has blanked opponents during 14 of his 16 innings pitched this season. He has yet to start an inning with the Hokies trailing on the scoreboard.

• During Renfrow's March 1 start against Stony Brook, 27 of his first 29 deliveries were charted as strikes. He required no more than 16 pitches to complete any of his six shutout innings.

Virginia Tech is 8-1 this season when holding its opponent to five runs or fewer. The Hokies also enter play against Notre Dame having allowed five or fewer runs during seven consecutive games.

PROTECTING AGAINST THE LONG BALL

• Virginia Tech's pitching staff has allowed three home runs at English Field through its first six home games of the season (including four games without surrendering a home run).

• Notre Dame enters this weekend's series ranked second among NCAA Division I programs in home runs per game (2.91) - trailing only Duke - and fourth in total home runs (32).

CANN- HE DO IT? YES HE CANN-!

• Sixth year outfielder Chris Cannizzaro leads Virginia Tech in a bunch of offensive categories, from batting average (.452) to hits (19), RBIs (17) and sacrifice flies (four) while tying for the team lead in home runs (four).

• Cannizzaro took an 0-for-4 on March 3 against Stony Brook, ending his nine-game hitting streak.

• He leads the Hokies this season with seven multi-hit games (spanning 11 games played).

• Last season, Cannizzaro feasted against Tech's nonconference lead-in to ACC play, swinging 33-for-62 (.532 batting average) through his first 13 games with the Hokies before their ACC opener.

• By March 8, 2023, Cannizzaro's 33 hits - four more than the next highest NCAA Division I player - led the nation. He held at least a share of the country's top spot as late as March 14, 2023.

TACKETT MAKING A RACKET

• Redshirt-junior utility man Sam Tackett had a week to remember during Virginia Tech's stretch at Radford (Feb. 27) and against Stony Brook (March 1-3).

• Tackett combined to bat 8-for-13 while making four starts, mashing his first two home runs of the season. He added a double and collected six RBIs, finishing as the Hokies' co-leader in runs scored (six).

• Prior to beginning his hot stretch at Radford on Feb. 27, Tackett had been kept hitless during his previous 12 at-bats, spanning five games.

• Tackett enters play against Notre Dame riding consecutive three-hit games against Stony Brook (6-for-8, home run, three runs scored, three RBIs).

MARTIN COMING AROUND

• Junior second baseman Christian Martin has turned his slow offensive start into a seven-game hitting streak, dating back to Feb. 23.

• After starting the season 1-for-12 at the plate through the first four games of year - his lone hit a home run earned at Charlotte on Opening Day - Martin has since bounced back to hit 11-for-25 (.440 batting average) with six doubles.

• He set a career high with three doubles hit during his 3-for-5 game against Rhode Island on Feb. 24.

BRING ON THE BIG INNINGS

• On Feb. 23, Virginia Tech began its 18-3 victory against Rhode Island by scoring six runs during the bottom of the first inning, erasing the Hokies' 1-0 deficit. The achievement marked Tech's highest scoring total during the first inning since Feb. 19, 2019, when the Hokies plated seven runs against ETSU.

• Two days later on Feb. 25, Virginia Tech delivered nine runs against Rhode Island during the bottom of the fifth inning - the sixth instance of the Hokies scoring nine runs or more during an inning since the start of the 2022 season.

WATSON CELEBRATES SEVEN-RBI NIGHT

• Five games into his NCAA Division I tenure, fifth-year outfielder Ben Watson (transfer from Elizabethtown) tallied seven RBIs during Virginia Tech's 18-3 victory on Feb. 23 against Rhode Island.

• Watson batted 4-for-6 with a bases-clearing double during the first inning, a two-run home run during the fourth inning and a two-RBI triple during the fifth inning, needing a single to hit for the cycle. Leading off the seventh inning, he barreled a ball deep to the left field corner, legging out a proper double at the expense of hitting for the cycle.

• After the game, Watson acknowledged the disappointment his teammates had for him, but admitted it would have been unsportsmanlike of him to stop at first base with the ball still in motion.

• Watson's seven-RBI night was the fourth instance of a Virginia Tech player racking up seven or more RBIs since Rahiem Cooper recorded nine RBIs in 2017:
